## MINUTES OF THE STUDY SESSION – MAY 14, 2024

The Board of Education of the Alpine School District met in a study session on Tuesday, May 14, 2024, at 4:00 PM. The study session took place in the board room at the Alpine School District office.

Board members present: President Sara M. Hacken, Vice President Julie E. King, Stacy M. Bateman, Sarah L. Beeson, Dr. Mark J. Clement, Joylin Lincoln, and Ada S. Wilson.

Also present: Superintendent Dr. Shane J. Farnsworth, Business Administrator Jason Sundberg, and members of the administrative staff. There were 14 others in attendance.

### 1. School LAND Trust Presentation

Scott Sumner, Executive Director of Leadership, Results & School Achievement, led training on School LAND Trust plans for the school board as outlined in state statute. He reported that the district's allocation for LAND Trust funds for 2024-25 is \$12,333,308, which is approximately \$144 per pupil. Utah Code 53G-7-1206 explains the Trust LAND program, and R277-477-4 outlines the appropriate use of the funds. Board members thanked Scott for the smooth process of receiving and reviewing the plans for their schools. Once the state approves the plans, they go on the state website for the public to view.

### 2. Annual Health Report and Assurances

Jess Benson, PE & Health Specialist (Grade 7-12), gave the annual health report and assurances. The Secondary Human Sexuality Committee approved Health I and II and the videos for CTE child development, medical anatomy, and physiology classes. Health teachers will be going through training to teach the harmful effects of pornography. There were no new maturation items approved for 2023-24. Currently, all schools use the same presentation for the maturation program presented by staff. Kim Lowe, Nurse Supervisor for Alpine School District, reviewed the health department data regarding teen pregnancy, sexually transmitted diseases, and sexual abuse cases.

### 3. Board Governance

Board Member Stacy Bateman led the conversation on chapter 4 about staying connected in the book *Resilient Leadership*.

**Superintendent Farnsworth recommended approval of the routine business. Mark Clement motioned to approve the routine business, Sarah Beeson seconded it, and the motion passed unanimously.**

ACTION ITEMS1. 2024-25 Certified Negotiated Agreement

**Superintendent Farnsworth recommended approval of the 2024-25 Certified Negotiated Agreement.** AEA President Mike Gowans and his team thanked the board for the ability to negotiate and collaborate with the district. He reported that the teachers passed the tentative contract with a 92% approval. **Julie King motioned to approve the agreement with the understanding that the referenced policies will be an action item in future board meetings. Stacy Bateman seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.**

2. 2024-25 Classified Negotiated Agreement

**Superintendent Farnsworth recommended approval of the 2024-25 Classified Negotiated Agreement.** AESP President Lisa Adams thanked the board and the negotiations team for the collaborative effort. **Mark Clement motioned to approve the 2024-25 Classified Negotiated Agreement, and Ada Wilson seconded it. Joylin Lincoln made a friendly amendment to add that the reference policy in the agreement would be an action item in a future board meeting. Mark and Ada agreed with the friendly amendment. The board voted on the motion, and it was passed unanimously.**

3. 2024-25 LAND Trust Plans

**Superintendent Farnsworth recommended approval of the 2024-25 School LAND Trust Plans. Sarah Beeson motioned to approve the LAND Trust Plans, Stacy Bateman seconded it, and the motion passed unanimously.**

4. Resolution 2024-006 – Authorizing a Vehicle Declared Excess for Disposition

**Superintendent Farnsworth recommended approval of Resolution 2024-006, authorizing a vehicle declared excess for disposition. Julie King motioned to approve resolution 2024-006, Sarah Beeson seconded it, and the motion passed unanimously.**

5. Resolution 2024-007 – Authorizing a Vehicle Declared Excess for Disposition  
**Superintendent Farnsworth recommended approval of Resolution 2024-007, authorizing a vehicle declared excess for disposition. Julie King motioned to approve Resolution 2024-007, Stacy Bateman seconded it, and the motion passed unanimously.**
  
6. Resolution 2024-008 – Cell Tower Lease Agreement Between ASD and Verizon (CVHS)  
**Superintendent Farnsworth recommended approval of Resolution 2024-008, acceptance of a cell tower agreement between ASD & Verizon Wireless located at Cedar Valley High School. Julie King motioned to approve Resolution 2024-008, Joylin Lincoln seconded it, and the motion passed unanimously.**
  
7. Resolution 2024-009 – Cell Tower Lease Agreement Between ASD and Verizon (SHS)  
**Superintendent Farnsworth recommended approval of Resolution 2024-009, acceptance of a cell tower agreement between ASD & Verizon Wireless located at Skyridge High School. Stacy Bateman motioned to approve Resolution 2024-009, Joylin Lincoln seconded it, and the motion passed unanimously.**
  
8. Policy 1620 – Community Committee (Revised)  
**Superintendent Farnsworth recommended approval of the revisions to Policy 1620 - Community Committee.** Kraig Brinkerhoff, Executive Director of Legal Services, explained that the District Community Council has been removed from the policy and replaced with a focus on using School Community Councils for ad hoc committees as needed. **Sarah Beeson motioned to approve Policy 1620, and Joylin seconded it.** The board members thanked those who have served on the District Community Council. **The motion passed unanimously.**
  
9. Determination of Configuration to Send to Utah County for Certification  
Superintendent Farnsworth reported that on April 30, 2024, the Board voted to send two reconfiguration options to the county for certification. The district received a letter from the Utah County Clerk stating only one option can be submitted for certification, so the board will need to vote again on which option to send. If certification is received for the option submitted, a board meeting will be held on May 28th to present the feasibility study and open the 45-day window for public comment. The previously scheduled July 12th board meeting will be canceled. On July 16th, the Board of Education will decide whether or not to put a district reconfiguration on the November ballot. Business Administrator Jason Sundberg presented the data for options 3 (two-way split) and 4 (three-way split). His presentation's information is available on the business services website <https://alpineschools.org/business/>, under historical reports and 2024 district reconfiguration.  
  
**Mark Clement motioned to approve sending option 3 to the Utah County Clerk for certification, and Sarah Beeson seconded it.** Julie King, Joylin Lincoln, and Stacy Bateman stated their reasons for opposing Option 3, a two-way split, emphasizing Option 4 aligns with the interlocal agreements 10 of the 14 municipalities have signed. Mark Clement, Sarah Beeson, Sara Hacken, and Ada Wilson shared why they supported option 3. **The board voted in a roll call vote, and the motion to approve sending option 3 to the county for certification passed 4 to 3, with Ada Wilson, Mark Clement, Sara Hacken, and Sarah Beeson voting in favor and Joylin Lincoln, Julie King, and Stacy Bateman voting against.**

## DISCUSSION/ACTION ITEM

### 1. Begin Boundary Study for Black Ridge and Harvest Elementary Schools

Eric Woodhouse presented the committee's findings regarding a potential boundary change for Black Ridge and Harvest elementary schools. The Wildflower development is already within the Black Ridge boundary, but approximately 30 students who live in villages two and three attend Harvest. These students need to cross Mountain View Corridor to get to their school. The Black Ridge enrollment is decreasing for the 2024-25 school year and will go from 812 to 810 with the new boundary. Harvest Elementary will go from 1,018 to 1,020 students. All families affected by the proposed boundary change will receive an email and a letter through USPS notifying them of the study. Utah State Statute 53G-4-402 (section 24-b) regulates the process for boundary changes. An opportunity for public feedback will be given at the following times:

- On May 12, 2024, at 6:00 PM, there will be an open house at Black Ridge and Harvest elementary schools.
- On June 11, 2024, there will be a board meeting with time for public comment. This meeting will follow the 6:00 PM public hearing.
- On June 25, 2024, at 6:00 PM, there will be a public hearing for the boundary study at Lake Mountain Middle School.
- On July 16, 2024, at 6:00 PM, there will be a board meeting with time for public comment.

**Julie King motioned to move this to an action item and begin the study for a boundary adjustment between Harvest and Black Ridge elementary schools. Joylin Lincoln seconded the motion.** The students who live in the Wildflower development on the east side of Mountain View Corridor would remain in the Harvest boundary. The students on the west side of Mountain View Corridor would be in the Black Ridge boundary. **The board voted on the motion, and it was passed unanimously.**

**Julie King** commented on the MTECH graduation. She extended congratulations to all graduates, particularly the ASD students.

### COMMUNITY COMMENTS

**Molly Barrington** feels that there are needs that are not being met in the district and supports interlocal agreements signed by the cities. She also spoke about her frustration with moving special education students and not general education students.

### ACTION ITEM

1. Initiate the Public Comment Opportunity Associated with a Possible Two District Configuration  
Superintendent Farnsworth reviewed that on May 14th, the board approved sending option 3, a two-way district configuration proposal, to the Utah County Clerk for certification. ASD received the certification on May 22nd. Superintendent Farnsworth recommended that the board approve the motion to open the 45-day window for public comment regarding a two-district reconfiguration. Business Administrator Jason Sundberg presented the feasibility study for a two-district split. The complete presentation and data will be available on the Business Services website under Historical Documents and 2024 Reconfiguration. **Ada Wilson motioned to initiate the public comment opportunity associated with a possible two-district configuration, Mark Clement seconded it, and the motion passed unanimously.** Superintendent Farnsworth emphasized that this vote was to begin the process of a 45-day window for public comment. There will be a public hearing on June 11th at 6:00 PM at the district office and the regular board meeting will follow. A second public hearing will be held on June 25th at 6:00 PM at Lake Mountain Middle School. The public can also give input on the feedback button on the district website. The 45-day window for public comment ends on July 12th and state statute requires action within 14 days of the window closing. During the July 16th board meeting, the board could make the decision to put a reconfiguration on the November ballot.

## Transfer of Educators

### Statement of Policy

The Alpine School District Board of Education recognizes that educators may need to be moved by assignment, or may choose to be moved to other district schools. The Board delegates to the Human Resource Department, school level supervisors, and to each school's administration the responsibility for implementing the procedures of this policy.

### Definitions

1. "Transfer" means the assignment of an educator to a different district location. This assignment may be voluntary on the part of the educator or involuntary.
2. **Layoff of specific program: A reassignment because a program or area is:**
  - a. No longer funded by the state or federal agencies and for which no other source of funding is available.
  - b. Eliminated because of insufficient student enrollment based on district guidelines of teacher/student ratios and other appropriate statistical information.
  - c. Consolidated or discontinued.
3. **Part time assignments: When an employee's assignment is less than the regular full time contract.**
4. **Priority list: A list of teachers in the district or at a school (depending on the change being considered) in which teachers are placed based on endorsement areas, personnel needs, seniority in the district, and the results of the employee's performance evaluation. This list will be used in making placement decisions. The list will be created after accounting for natural attrition (retirement, resignation, one year only contracts) at all schools involved.**
5. **Reduction in force: The districtwide need to reduce the number of employees. (See policy [4135](#)) Reductions at an individual school site or in a program shall not be construed as a reduction in force as those employees with ongoing contracts may be placed within the district (see Reassignment)**
6. **Reassignment: In cases of boundary adjustments, school consolidations, school openings, and/or school closures, the placement of contracted employees within the district.**

# Procedures

## 1. INVOLUNTARY TRANSFER OF EDUCATORS

- 1.1. No educator shall be transferred involuntarily without:
  - 1.1.1. Having met with the principal and, upon request, with the Human Resource Department to review the reasons for the transfer and receive the reasons in writing.
  - 1.1.2. The written reasons for the transfer, **if applicable**, will clearly identify deficiencies, available resources for improvement, and a recommended course of action to improve the educator's performance.
  - 1.1.3. Being given the opportunity for a discussion with the divisional supervisor regarding the transfer.
- 1.2. All involuntary transfers must receive final approval by the **Superintendent or designee**. ~~Senior District Leadership Team~~.
  - 1.2.1. The receiving school principal will be notified of the reasons the educator is being transferred.
  - 1.2.2. **If** ~~An~~ educator ~~who~~ is involuntarily transferred **for deficiencies**, they will be placed on probationary status for the next school year.
  - 1.2.3. **An involuntary transfer may be initiated by the district in response to concerns, controversy, or problems of significance at the school.**
    - 1.2.3.1. A principal may not request an involuntary transfer unless the educator has been informed of the concern(s) and provided a written summary.
    - 1.2.3.2. A single issue of significance may trigger an involuntary transfer.

## 2. ASSISTED TRANSFER OF EDUCATORS

- 2.1. An educator may complete an application to transfer within the district. The transfer request must be submitted to Human Resources by March 15th. The Human Resources Department shall prepare bulletins of known vacancies, which will occur for the following year. The Human Resources Department will post weekly on the district website the openings and an electronic copy will be sent to the association president's and the association offices upon request. After the

bulletin is published, it is the responsibility of the teachers on the transfer list to contact the principal within the advertisement period to inquire about a specific position.

- 2.2. In the event an educator needs to be moved to another school due to an issue with their certification, endorsement, or other similar reason; the educator shall be assisted with the transfer by the Human Resource Department and the divisional supervisor. This teacher will not have a change in status regarding qualification as a career educator. In the event the educator is on provisional status, guidelines associated with moving from provisional to career status will be followed according to policy.
- 2.3. Teachers who have applied for a transfer by March 15 have the responsibility to make personal contact ~~with by telephone to~~ the principal with the vacancy. Upon request by the teacher, an interview will be granted.
  - 2.3.1. Teachers interested in more than one opening in a school ~~may will~~ only receive one interview for all applicable openings within that school.
  - 2.3.2. The Human Resource Office will exercise every available option in attempting to honor the voluntary transfer request.
  - 2.3.3. Teachers who have not made an application to the Human Resources Department for transfer by March 15 may still be considered for transfer up to August 1. However, principals are under no obligation to interview these teachers.
  - 2.3.4. In case of a district reconfiguration, additional consideration will be given to teachers with 20 or more years of contracted Alpine district experience based on their district hire date.
    - 2.3.4.1. Educators whose position will be located in the newly created district could be transferred in accordance with the negotiated process of policy 4062.
    - 2.3.4.2. Transfers can only be honored if there are open positions. Teachers need to be placed on the transfer list by March 15

#### ~~2.4. Involuntary Transfer~~

- ~~2.4.1. An involuntary transfer may be initiated by the district in response to concerns, controversy, or problems of significance at the school.~~
- 2.5. An educator must serve a minimum of two years in the school with an expectation of continued employment to be eligible for transfer to another school. Any exceptions must be approved by the appropriate divisional supervisor.
- ~~2.6. When staffing new schools, plans and procedures will be discussed by association officers and the superintendent or his designee prior to the implementation of those transfer plans.~~

### 3. PROCEDURE FOR THE REASSIGNMENT OF EDUCATORS ~~TEACHER TRANSFERS~~

- 3.1. ~~When staffing will change, the association will be notified by the superintendent or designee of the plans and procedures prior to the implementation of those reassignment plans.~~
- 3.2. In the event that it becomes necessary to eliminate or reduce specific positions as a result of declining enrollments, boundary adjustments, layoff of a specific program, school consolidations, school openings, and/or closures, each contracted individual affected will be reassigned according to the following guidelines after accounting for natural attrition (retirement, resignation, one year only contracts):
  - 3.2.1. The individual will be placed in another position within the school for which they are qualified.
  - 3.2.2. The individual will be placed in another position within the District for which they are qualified.
- 3.3. The reassignment will be in accordance with the individual's order on the priority list and in terms of the provisions of this policy. An educator who does not have the proper certification cannot replace a professional educator who has the proper certification. Educators who do not have the proper certification will not be moved from secondary to elementary positions or from elementary to secondary positions.
- 3.4. The District is responsible for placing educators at schools within the District in comparable positions if possible. If there is no position available, the reduction would constitute a RIF and the RIF [policy \(4135\)](#) would be in effect rather than the transfer procedure.

Educators ~~involuntarily~~ transferred will be given first option for any opening within their certification area in the school from which they were transferred provided that vacancy occurs prior to August 1st. This option shall be in effect only ~~to~~ until August 1st of the year the educator was involuntarily transferred. ~~All transfers shall be in accordance with District negotiated Policy No. 4062~~

- ~~3.5. All provisions as stated in the Alpine School District extended contract shall be honored in the inclusive dates of the term of the extended contract.~~
- ~~3.6. The following guidelines are established to be used when transferring educators from schools participating in special programs (extended contract, extended year, productivity, etc.) or schools involved in staff reduction due to declining enrollments:~~
  - ~~3.6.1. Transfer of educators from schools participating in special programs, i.e., extended contract, extended year.~~

3.6.2.5. — The District is responsible for placing educators at schools within the District, in comparable positions if possible. If there is no position available, then the reduction would constitute a RIF and the RIF policy would be in effect rather than the transfer procedure.

3.6.2.6. — Educators involuntarily transferred will be given first option for any openings within their certification area in the school from which they were transferred—provided that the opening occurs prior to Procedure No. 4062 (b) August 1st. This option shall be in effect only to August 1st of the year the educator was involuntarily transferred.

3.6.3. — When it becomes necessary to transfer educators from schools currently participating in special programs, the reduction may be made in the following order:

3.6.3.1. — Normal attrition

3.6.3.2. — Educators in the school who no longer desire to participate in the program may be transferred.

3.6.3.3. — Educators in the reverse order they were assigned to the school after the commencement of the program, may be transferred.

3.6.3.4. — Educators who were assigned to the school at the time the program commenced, may be transferred based upon the least seniority in the school.

3.6.3.5. — Educators who have the least seniority in the District may be transferred.

3.6.3.6. — If the above steps do not accomplish the necessary reduction, educators may be assigned within the school to a position which is

vacant for which the educator holds the necessary certification if this will reduce the probability of transfer to another location.

~~3.6.3.7. The District is responsible for placing educators at schools within the District in comparable positions if possible. If there is no position available, then the reduction would constitute a RIF and the RIF policy would be in effect rather than the transfer procedure.~~

~~3.6.3.8. Educators involuntarily transferred will be given first option for any openings within their certification area in the school from which they were transferred provided the opening occurs prior to August 1st. This option shall be in effect only to August 1st of the year the educator was involuntarily transferred.~~

~~3.6.4. When it becomes necessary to transfer educators, in order to reduce staff due to declining enrollment, the reduction may be made in the following order:~~

# Educator Evaluation as a Professional Growth System

## Statement of Policy

~~Educator teacher~~ evaluation should promote the professional growth of the ~~educator teacher~~ by identifying and reinforcing strengths and establishing goals for improvement. ~~Educator teacher~~ evaluation will provide assistance for those whose performance ~~needs improvement~~ is minimally effective, or not effective. ~~Supervisors will work with the educators who have been identified as minimally effective by providing a written Plan of Assistance (POA)~~

## Definitions:

1. **Career Educator:** an educator who is no longer on provisional status.
2. **Educator:** All licensed staff members
3. **Goal:** the process of taking active steps to achieve one's desired outcome. It is recommended that educators set goals that are specific and measurable. Goals should also be directly connected to a specific element in the Utah Effective Teaching Standards (UETS)
4. **Lines of Evidence:** The data educators gather to demonstrate goals or standards are being met.
5. ~~Formative Evaluation:~~ When an educator participates in: annual self evaluation, goal setting with a supervisor, professional learning, lines of evidence, and time for reflection. ~~Those endeavors which prepare the educator for the Summative Evaluation.~~
6. ~~Summative Evaluation:~~ When an educator participates in: Collecting lines of evidence, reviewing goals, determining that all Utah Effective Teaching Standards are being met. ~~(This will also include the student growth component and stakeholder input component.)~~
7. **Observation:** the scheduled review of an educator's performance for the purpose of providing feedback on the educator's goal. Typically, an observation should be for a minimum of 20 minutes and until the supervisor has the opportunity to view the pedagogy related to the educator's goal.
8. **Performance Expectation:** The Utah Effective Teaching Standards (UETS) ~~Utah Teaching Observation Tool~~ is comprised of ~~5~~ **40** standards that articulate effective teaching and learning ~~(UETS, August March 2023)2013~~. Each standard has ~~four Elements~~ **a**

**Performance Expectation** (1.1, 1.2, 2.1, 3.1, 3.2, etc. that serve as a measurement of performance, a source of information, and a guide for professional learning and support. Each **Element** performance expectation is comprised of indicators from the Utah Effective Teaching Standards that can be referred to for additional support and guidance. For example Performance Expectation 1.1 is comprised of indicators 1a and 2e.

9. Professional Growth Plan: a goal setting plan which incorporates the five, state-required components of a Self-evaluation on all five Utah Effective Teaching Standards, Feedback from Students and Parents, Feedback from Supervisor Observation(s), Evidence of Student Academic Growth, and Continued Professional Growth.
10. Provisional educator: an educator in their first three years of teaching experience or an educator with three or more years of experience but in their first year with Alpine School District. (Provisional status may be extended by a principal/supervisor)
11. Supervisor: Those responsible for the evaluation of other licensed staff members.

## 1. EDUCATOR PROFESSIONAL GROWTH PLAN EVALUATION

### 1.1. Evaluation of pProvisional educators:

1.1.1. The Professional Growth Plan for provisional educators shall encompass the five state-required components as follows:

1.1.1.1. Self-evaluation on all five (UETS).

1.1.1.2. Set a goal for each of the following Elements:

1.1.1.2.1. 1.2 Building Relationships

1.1.1.2.2. 1.3 Respecting Learner Backgrounds and Perspectives

1.1.1.2.3. 2.4 Engagement

1.1.1.2.4. 4.1 Respectful Learning Environment

The supervisor and educator shall use the Utah Effective Teaching Standards (all 10 Standards, including self-evaluations, student growth performance, and stakeholder feedback components).~~
- 1.1.1.5. **Student academic growth—evidence of teacher growth and reflection based on student results.**
- 1.1.1.6. **Continued Professional Growth—This process constitutes continued professional growth and the educator is welcome to provide any other evidence of their professional growth.**
- 1.1.1.7. Educators can contribute additional information to inform their rating throughout the process.

1.1.2. It is our expectation that the results of the professional growth plan should be finalized and submitted to the Human Resource office on or before March 1.

~~1.2. Evaluation of probationary educators:~~

~~1.2.1. Probationary educators. Principals shall conduct a minimum of two observations, of all probationary educators during the term of probation (at least annually). The educator and their supervisor shall engage in setting goals (summative), gathering lines of evidence (summative), and discussing progress of goals (summative). The supervisor and educator shall use the Utah Effective Teaching Standards (all 10 Standards, including self-evaluation, stakeholder input and student growth components). It is our expectation that summative observation evaluations, student growth, and stakeholder components should be finalized and submitted to the Human Resource office on or before March 1 of the current school year.~~

1.3. ~~Evaluation of e~~ Career educators:

1.3.1. The professional growth plan for career e Educators shall encompass the five state-required components as follows:

1.3.1.1. Self-evaluation on all five UETS.

1.3.1.2. Set a goal based on one of the Elements from the UETS (May not include 5.1, 5.2, 5.3, or 5.4)

1.3.1.2.1. The goal may be a school wide goal but should be the choice of the educator

1.3.1.3. Feedback from parents and students.

1.3.1.4. Supervisor Observations–Supervisors shall conduct a minimum of one **scheduled** observation for the purpose of providing feedback.

1.3.1.5. Student academic growth–evidence of teacher growth and reflection based on student results.

1.3.1.6. Continued Professional Growth–This process constitutes continued professional growth and the educator is welcome to provide any other evidence of their professional growth.

1.3.1.7. **Educators can contribute additional information to inform their rating throughout the process.** ~~with three or more years of teaching experience (at least one of which is in Alpine School District) shall develop be evaluated annually using the Utah Effective Teaching Standards (10 Standards; including the self evaluation, stakeholder input and student growth components). These evaluations shall include one self evaluation and one summative by the supervisor. It is important to note that educators who are not meeting standards during their formative years will be moved to probation status immediately.~~

1.3.1.8. **It is our expectation that the results of the professional growth plan should be finalized and submitted to the Human Resource office on or before March 1.**

- 1.4. Probationary educators are addressed in Policy 4132.
- 1.5. An educator who is not satisfied with a summative evaluation may request a review of the evaluation within 15 days after receiving the written evaluation.
- 1.6. An educator may use the same goal in sequential years provided that substantive progress is made each year.
- 1.7. ~~Alpine School District's full evaluation program will consist of using the Utah Effectiveness Teaching Standards within the District's annual evaluation rotation. Year one review will be on Standards: 1,2,3,4,5,6,7,8,9,10, a self evaluation, student growth, and stakeholder input; years two and three shall include no more than 5 performance expectations based on school goals or areas of desired growth, a self evaluation, student growth, and stakeholder input. It is our expectation that summative observation evaluations, student growth, and stakeholder input components should be finalized and submitted to the Human Resource office on or before March 1 of the current school year.~~

# Procedures

## ~~1. REGULARLY SCHEDULED EVALUATIONS~~ ~~OBSERVATION PROCESS~~

~~1.1. At the beginning of the evaluation process an orientation and fifteen days advance notice is required unless otherwise mutually agreed upon. Specific times for announced evaluations is recommended.~~

~~1.2. For the first year provisional teacher (Level 1) performing in an acceptable range (emerging effective, highly effective) two summative evaluations are required. For those who receive a not effective, the process in number 1.5 will be followed.~~

~~1.2.1. For provisional teachers (Level 1) in their second and third year of teaching, performing in an acceptable range (emerging effective, effective, highly effective), one summative evaluation is required if agreed upon by the teacher and administrator. Otherwise, two~~

summative evaluations will be required. For those who receive a “not effective,” the process in number 1.5 will be followed.

1.3. For those career teachers (Level 2) performing in an acceptable range (effective, highly effective) one evaluation is sufficient. A midyear conference is suggested and post-conference is required. If the evaluation will contain any score below an effective or scores which would affect the educator’s pay, it is suggested that the post evaluation conference be held within two working days. This would not preclude principals from working with teachers to improve individual areas of concern (for example, helping teachers improve a score of effective).

1.4. For those career teachers (who have not been placed on probation) who receive an overall score of not effective, minimally effective on any performance expectation of a summative evaluation and who, therefore, need to have additional evaluations, a letter of improvement could be prepared and this process will be followed:

1.4.1. There would be two formative announced evaluations and one summative announced evaluation which are not cumulative. These should occur over at least a period of 30 calendar days. The summative evaluation would be the only one which counts as the final effectiveness rating.

1.4.2. The pre and post evaluation conferences are necessary for all evaluations. It is suggested that the post evaluation conference occur within two working days after the evaluation.

1.4.3. During the formative evaluation an accommodation could be made for not observing all ten standards. This would require agreement between the principal and teacher in the pre-evaluation conference.

1.4.4. If the educator scores effective or above on the summative evaluation, there would be no need to continue the evaluation process.

1.4.5. When an unannounced observation is made:

1.4.5.1. A formal notification of the possibility of unannounced observations should be given to an educator who needs

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~~additional observations because of scoring a minimally effective or below.~~

~~1.4.5.2.—When an unannounced observation is made, an oral debriefing is required and it is suggested that this occur within two working days after the observation.~~

~~1.4.5.3.—It is suggested that a reasonable number of unannounced observations be made. Unannounced observations will be for the purpose of observing areas of concern only (minimally effective or below).~~

~~1.5.—For provisional teachers who have received a not effective on their summative evaluation and probationary teachers an improvement letter will be prepared. For probationary teachers, there will be two formative announced evaluations and one summative announced evaluation. The summative evaluation would be the only one which counts and it is not cumulative. All ten scales will be observed for the two formative and one summative evaluation. Unannounced observations will be for the purpose of observing areas of concern. It is recommended that within two working days after each of the two formative evaluations that feedback be given; however, only the final summative evaluation scores must be given to the teacher. If an improvement letter is needed, the letter must be delivered or mailed within fifteen calendar days of the final evaluation. The contents should be discussed with the educators unless it is necessary to send the letter by certified mail.~~

~~1.5.1.—Alpine School District will comply with State/Board Rule and Administrative Code.~~

# Disciplinary Action ~~Outside of Set~~ Evaluation

## Statement of Policy

The Alpine Board of Education recognizes that employees are expected to model appropriate behavior. When claims of impropriety or substandard educational performance are made, they are to be investigated. If substantiated, appropriate action will be taken. The Board of Education delegates to the local principal or supervisor the right to investigate and take appropriate action in conjunction with Human Resources.

## 1. ~~DISCIPLINARY PROCESS ACTION OUTSIDE OF SET~~ EVALUATION

### 1.1. Investigation Process for Taking Action on Complaints

- 1.1.1. Complaints by administrators, adults, parents, or students must be investigated by the administrator. As part of the investigation the administrator will conference with the teacher regarding the problem. **The teacher may choose to have an Association representative present.**
- 1.1.2. The investigation should be fair and both sides of the issue should be carefully considered.
- 1.1.3. Upon receipt of the complaint. The principal will encourage a meeting between the teacher and the person making the complaint. In the event that the complainant is unwilling to meet with the teacher, the principal will visit with the teacher regarding the complaint and present the complainant the response of the teacher.

- 1.1.4. If disciplinary action is forthcoming based upon the complaint, the teacher shall have the opportunity to know the identity of the person making the complaint unless there are concerns about student safety.
- 1.1.5. In cases where the teacher does not have the opportunity to confront the accuser--be it adult or student--if any further action is warranted or taken, the principal will meet with the teacher to explain the reasons why the action is being taken.
- 1.1.6. The teacher will have the opportunity to submit a written rebuttal.
- 1.1.7. There can be no retaliation.
- 1.2. Anonymous complaints will be investigated to determine the validity before disciplinary action is taken.
- 1.3. Violations of Policy
  - 1.3.1. The administrator would investigate, verify that a problem exists, and counsel with the teacher.
  - 1.3.2. If the problem is of sufficient concern, the administrator creates a statement as to how the teacher has violated the contract, proper procedure or practice. In addition, the administrator will notify the teacher of further action relative to a remediation plan. The teacher, with the assistance of the Association representative (if desired), may provide feedback for consideration on a remediation plan.
  - 1.3.3. If the problem is considered to be remediable, the administrator sets a plan for remediation with the teacher. Recommended contents for a written plan of remediation include:
    - 1.3.3.1. State whether the administrator is issuing an informal **directive**, a written **directive reprimand** (administrator file), issuing a formal written reprimand (personnel file), placing the teacher on probation, or other action being taken.
      - 1.3.3.1.1. **The administrator should consult with Human Resources in making these determinations.**

- 1.3.3.2. Review the policy or concern which is the basis for disciplinary action.
  - 1.3.3.3. State the circumstances, facts, and conclusions of the problem.
  - 1.3.3.4. State what is expected of the employee (requirements for meeting the standard).
  - 1.3.3.5. State the administrator's involvement in remediation.
  - 1.3.3.6. Indicate **that** the failure to comply may warrant further disciplinary action.
- 1.4. **Substandard Educational Performance (Pilot for the 2024-2025 School Year)**
- 1.4.1. **An educator may be placed on probation for substandard educational performance.**
  - 1.4.2. A probationary educator will be evaluated: principals shall conduct a minimum of two observations of all probationary educators during the term of probation (at least annually). The educator and their supervisor shall engage in setting goals, gathering lines of evidence, and discussing progress of goals. The supervisor and educator shall use the Utah Effective Teaching Standards (all five Standards, including self evaluation, stakeholder input and student growth components). It is our expectation that observations, student growth, and stakeholder components should be finalized and submitted to the Human Resource office on or before March 1 of the current school year.
    - 1.4.2.1. Educators can contribute additional information to inform their rating throughout the process.
    - 1.4.2.2. Teachers may add a response to the supervisor's evaluation within ten calendar days of the evaluation review.
    - 1.4.2.3. An educator who is not satisfied with a summative evaluation may request a review of the evaluation within 15 days after receiving the written evaluation.

- 1.4.3. Successful completion of the evaluation will result in removal from probationary status.
- 1.4.4. Failure to show improvement may result in further disciplinary action.

# Guidelines for Reduction in Force

## Statement of Policy

The Alpine School District Board of Education is committed to its dual responsibilities of honoring employee contracts and fulfilling its financial obligations. The Board also recognizes that situations may arise that will cause a conflict between these two responsibilities. In such cases, the Board has delegated to the Superintendent and designees the decision-making ability to correct and ameliorate the issue by making appropriate changes in expenditures which may include a reduction in force. These changes may be necessitated districtwide, at the school level, or by program. This policy will also influence decisions in cases of boundary adjustments, school consolidations, school openings, and/or school closures.

## DEFINITIONS

~~Employee's address and phone number: The employee's address and phone number, as they appear on the Human Resource office's records, shall be used in connection with layoffs, recall, or other notices to the educator. It shall be the responsibility of each educator to notify the Human Resource office of any change of address or phone number.~~

1. General layoff: A reduction in force in all areas of the district.
2. Layoff of specific program: A reassignment ~~reduction in force~~ because a program or area is:
  - 2.1. No longer funded by the state or federal agencies and for which no other source of funding is available.

- 2.2. Eliminated because of insufficient student enrollment based on district guidelines of teacher/student ratios and other appropriate statistical information.
- 2.3. Consolidated or discontinued.
3. Part time assignments: When an employee's assignment is less than the regular full time contract.
4. **Priority list: A list of teachers in the district or at a school (depending on the change being considered) in which teachers are placed based on endorsement areas, personnel needs, seniority in the district, and the results of the employee's performance evaluation. This list will be used in making placement decisions. The list will be created after accounting for natural attrition (retirement, resignation, one year only contracts) at all schools involved.**
5. Reduction in force: The districtwide need to reduce the number of employees. Reductions at an individual school site or in a program shall not be construed as a reduction in force as those employees with ongoing contracts may be placed within the district (see reassignment).
6. Reassignment: In cases of boundary adjustments, school consolidations, school openings, and/or school closures, the placement of contracted employees within the district.
7. Recall or call back: A system of rehiring educators within the provisions of this policy when a reduction in force is no longer necessary.
8. **"Transfer" means the assignment of an educator to a different district location. This assignment may be voluntary on the part of the educator, or involuntary.**

## Procedures

The employee's address, personal email, district issued email, and phone number, as they appear on the Human Resource office's records, shall be used in connection with layoffs, recall, or other notices to the educator. It shall be the responsibility of each educator to notify the Human Resource office of any change of address, personal email, or phone number.

# 1. GENERAL GUIDELINES FOR REDUCTION IN FORCE

## 1.1. Needs for Reduction in Force

1.1.1. The Board of Education may begin a reduction in force only under the following statutory provisions:

1.1.1.1. Enrollment decline

1.1.1.2. Budget reduction

1.1.1.3. School consolidation

1.1.1.4. Elimination of a particular service

## 1.2. Notification of Need for a Reduction in Force

1.2.1. In the event the Board anticipates a lay-off of educators, the Superintendent or his designee will notify the teacher's association of this plan ~~by March 1~~ and shall provide the association with a report outlining the need. Nothing in this paragraph shall limit the ability of the Alpine School District to undertake a reduction in force ~~for which notification occurred after March 1~~ in response to the significant and unforeseen loss of anticipated revenues. Any reduction in force must be preceded by a minimum notice of 60 calendar days.

1.2.2. Reductions other than personnel will be made before a reduction in personnel is effected.

1.2.3. The Board of Education shall use every reasonable means to keep the reduction as low as possible.

## 1.3. Alpine School District School System Priority List

1.3.1. In the event that a reduction is necessary, an Alpine School District priority list of required size will be prepared, by school, from personnel office records. The priority list may be based on ~~the results of an employee's performance evaluation; and~~ a school's personnel needs, **teachers' endorsement areas, seniority in the district, and the results of an employee's performance evaluation.**

1.4. Recall Rights

1.4.1. The recall rights of laid-off certificated personnel will be eliminated two years following layoff.

1.5. Option for Half-Time Employment

1.5.1. In the event of a reduction in force, the opportunity of half-time employment will be offered, as half-time vacancies are identified, to any educator interested in changing to half-time employment. Teachers who accept half-time employment will retain their position on the seniority list for recall to full employment. The fringe benefits provided for a period of two years during lay-off will be limited to the following:

1.5.1.1. For the first year following the reduction in force, teachers who accepted the half-time contract will have health ~~have,~~ ~~health~~ and life insurance benefits ~~will be~~ paid by the district with accompanying monthly premium co-pays paid by the employee, where applicable. After the first year Policy 4225 (half-time educators) will be in effect.

1.5.1.2. All other fringe benefits shall be in accordance with Policy 4225.

1.6. Recall of Staff After a Reduction in Force

1.6.1. When Alpine School District educators are on lay-off status and there is a total district student enrollment and revenue increase, the Superintendent or designee will meet with the Association officers prior to budget adoption to review the effect each increase may have on the recall section of this policy.

1.6.2. Increase in certified staff will be made from the priority list in the reverse order of their reduction.

## 2. PROCEDURE FOR EFFECTING A GENERAL LAYOFF

- 2.1. In the event that a general reduction in force becomes necessary, the district staff and teachers' association representative shall cooperate in the following procedure to insure that the reduction will take place in the following order:
  - 2.1.1. Self-initiated resignations, early retirements and half-time assignments.
  - 2.1.2. Educators not holding a valid teacher's certificate or authorization.
- 2.2. In the event that **the preceding reduction is insufficient** ~~a general reduction in force becomes necessary in accordance with this policy~~, the following procedure will take place.
  - 2.2.1. The staff requirements and projected student enrollment for all schools in the district shall be listed by building for the forthcoming school year.
  - 2.2.2. Staff selection to fill all staffing requirements in regards to the reduction in force, will be made from the school specific priority list in descending order from the highest to the lowest position. ~~provided that where assignments require certification or endorsement by State regulations.~~ Such assignments will be filled by those educators currently holding the necessary certification or endorsement. In the event that educators are not available on the school specific priority list, educators with appropriate licensure will be rehired based upon the **priority list**. ~~results of the employee's performance evaluation.~~
  - 2.2.3. If an educator's assignment will not be available in the forthcoming year, that educator shall be assigned to a position consistent with his certificate or endorsement and in his major or minor field of study.
  - 2.2.4. Individual educators not slotted into a teaching position will be notified of the layoff by one of the following:
    - 2.2.4.1. Personal contact with written notice given.
    - 2.2.4.2. Email to both the educator's provided personal email and to the educator's district email.**
    - 2.2.4.3. By certified mail within (10) ten working days of the decision of layoff. These educators shall be recalled as needed under provisions of this policy.

- 2.2.5. When a reduction in force takes place, the Human Resources office, in cooperation with the employee being laid off, will assist the employees in finding employment in other districts. The District shall also sponsor a free career planning seminar for those educators being laid off.

### 3. PROCEDURE FOR REASSIGNMENT EFFECTING LAYOFFS IN SPECIFIC AREAS

- 3.1. In the event that it becomes necessary to eliminate or reduce specific positions, each individual affected will be reassigned or laid off according to one of the following guidelines (See Policy 4062 Transfer of Educators):
- 3.1.1. The individual will be placed in another position within his own school for which they are qualified.
  - 3.1.2. The individual will be placed in another position within the District for which they are qualified.
  - ~~3.1.3. The individual will be laid off according to the provisions of this policy.~~
- 3.2. The reassignment or layoff will be in accordance with the individual's order on the priority list and in terms of the provisions of this policy. An educator who does not have the proper certification cannot replace a professional educator who has the proper certification. Educators who do not have the proper certification will not be moved from secondary to elementary positions or from elementary to secondary positions.
- ~~3.3. The District may provide an interest free loan to assist in obtaining the certification or endorsement. Before the loan is finalized an agreement will be reached on a payback schedule for the loan. The payback may be handled through payroll deduction. In the event that more than one year is provided for the obtaining of the required certification it will be necessary for the person to earn the fractional part of the total requirement each year of the extension. For example, if three (3) years is allowed to obtain the needed certification, the educator is required to earn twelve (12) semester hours to obtain certification, the educator would be required to accumulate no less than four semester hours before the beginning of the second year of authorization and eight (8) semester hours before the beginning of the third year of the authorization to continue the authorization. Failure to do so will result in the termination of the educator. Thirty (30) calendar days advance notice will be given if termination is to be effected.~~

~~3.4. In the event there are more educator lay-offs than there are vacancies created in other programs, the remaining educators will be considered in accordance with the provisions of this policy.~~

## 4. PROCEDURE FOR RECALL AFTER A REDUCTION IN FORCE

- 4.1. In the event of a recall, the laid-off educators will be notified by phone **or personal email** as their turn comes. It is the responsibility of each educator to notify the Human Resources office of any change of address, or phone number. In the event that the educator cannot be reached by phone **or personal email**, a registered or certified letter shall be sent to his last known address. Any educator so notified shall respond within five (5) working days from the receipt of notice that he accepts or rejects the offered position. If a position is offered to an educator and the educator rejects the offered position, he shall be considered to have resigned from the employ of the District and all benefits shall cease at that time.
- 4.2. All benefits to which the educator was entitled to at the time of his layoff, including but not limited to unused accumulated sick leave and credits toward sabbatical eligibility, will be restored upon the educator's return to active employment. The educator will be placed on the proper step of the salary schedule which corresponds to the educator's experience and education in accordance with negotiated agreement and District policy.

## 5. BENEFITS FOR LAID-OFF EMPLOYEES

- 5.1. It is understood and agreed that although educators properly laid off, according to the terms of this policy and in compliance with existing law, may not have a continuing contract guaranteeing them a teaching position and a salary for the forthcoming school year. Each laid-off educator shall be considered to have employment status with the district for the purposes of priority, insurance, and other fringe benefits as provided below.
  - 5.1.1. The board shall pay the cost of the current health and life insurance benefit program with accompanying monthly premium co-pays paid by the educator, where applicable, for all educators on layoff for six months, beginning the day on which the layoff is effective or the first day of the new school year, whichever is later. The insurance benefits will be terminated on the day the educator accepts new employment. If an

educator was receiving only part of the cost from the district at the time of lay-off, that amount would be paid during the above described period.

- 5.1.2. A laid-off educator shall be considered to have employment status with the district until he/she submits a written resignation, fails to respond within five (5) working days of an offered recall as provided in this policy, or two (2) years have transpired since the lay-off.

# Health and Disability

## Statement of Policy

The Alpine School District Board of Education recognizes that health and disability leave for employees may be needed. Therefore, the Board provides such leave as an important fringe benefit to its employees. The Board has designated the Business Administrator and the Executive Director of Human Resources to work collaboratively to apply this policy.

## Definition

1. “Calendar day” includes contract days, weekends, and holidays combined.

## 1. HEALTH AND DISABILITY

- 1.1. Educators with less than three years of continuous current experience in the district, are granted health and disability leave as follows:
  - 1.1.1. A maximum of up to seven (7) working days may be granted annually in the event of health or disability absence.
  - 1.1.2. Health and disability may accumulate up to a maximum of twenty-one (21) working days at the beginning of the third year of employment.
    - 1.1.2.1. During the absence of an educator for health or disability reasons, the educator's full salary shall be paid for the cumulative days used.
  - 1.1.3. Beyond the cumulative health and disability leave, when an educator is absent because of health or disability reasons, an educator's salary shall be paid as follows:

- 1.1.3.1. A certified educator's salary shall have the cost of a personal day deducted for any health or disability leave taken beyond the earned cumulative days up to a combined maximum of 180 calendar days.
- 1.2. Educators who have completed three or more current consecutive years of employment with the district, are granted health and disability leave for 180 calendar days beginning with the first day of disability
  - 1.2.1. An educator who has exhausted the 180 calendar days of health and disability leave and returns to work on the 181st calendar day must obtain a release to return to work letter from their primary care physician, releasing them to return to work without restriction, or reasonable accommodation.
    - 1.2.1.1. Any accommodation must be in place before the 181st calendar day of absence. (This will mean that accommodations must be requested with enough advance notice for the District to comply.
    - 1.2.1.2. The employee who uses 180 calendar days of health and disability leave and returns to work will be placed on sick leave probation. Sick leave probation begins with the upcoming year and extends to the employee 21 calendar days annually, of health and disability leave for two years. These days are not cumulative. Upon successful completion of sick leave probation, the employee will have their 180 calendar days of health and disability leave restored.
  - 1.2.2. Should an employee be unable to return to work on the 181st calendar day of health and disability leave, they will be separated from employment.
  - 1.2.3. Health and disability leave will be recorded relative to the percent of contract of the employee. (A .5 teacher who takes a sick day is charged one full day of health and disability leave.) There is not an intent to extend to part-time employees more health and disability leave than full-time employees.

- 1.2.4. Employees who use ~~twenty-one (21)~~ **ten (10)** consecutive calendar **contract** days of health and disability leave, or establish a pattern of sick leave usage, which may indicate misuse, will, **upon the recommendation of the principal/supervisor and at the discretion of Human Resources**, trigger the beginning count of the 180 calendar days of sick leave usage. The calendar count will begin with the first day of the illness/disability for which the 180-day sick leave count is considering. The 180 days of sick leave count may only go back for two years, unless a recommendation by the sick leave panel to go beyond the two years is reached.
- 1.2.4.1. Employees whose sick leave usage indicates a possible misuse will be notified in writing of the triggering of the 180 calendar days of health and disability leave.
- 1.2.5. A retired career educator will not be eligible for the 180 days of sick leave benefit. They will earn seven (7) days of sick leave per year which may accrue to a maximum of 21 days. Individuals other than retired Alpine employees who were hired prior to March 1, 2006, are eligible for the 180 days of sick leave benefit.
- 1.3. An educator who is absent from work for a period of ~~twenty-one (21)~~ **ten (10)** consecutive calendar **contract** days for health or disability reasons must **upon the request of the principal/supervisor**, supply the Human Resources department with a medical doctor's statement regarding the exact nature of the disability and shall include the doctor's prognosis of when the employee can return to work.
- 1.4. An educator who has taken ~~twenty-one (21)~~ **ten (10)** consecutive calendar **contract** days or more of health and disability leave in any one school year or who establishes a pattern of sick leave use (~~at least 15 working days or more of health and disability leave in one year~~) which might indicate a possible misuse, ~~may~~ **will, upon the request of the principal/supervisor**, have the reasons for leave reviewed by **Human Resources**. **If Human Resources determines after an initial review that there is possible misuse**, a panel consisting of three administrators to be appointed by the superintendent **will make a formal review of the situation**. The employee ~~will~~ **may** be asked to appear before the panel **and in all cases will have an**

**opportunity to provide an explanation.** In the event it is determined that the benefit is being misused, the panel will make recommendations for action to the superintendent and to the employee.

- 1.5. If the spouse, ~~or~~ child, **or parent** of an educator has surgery or is hospitalized, the educator may be excused up to three days for the admittance, release and the day of surgery, but unless the patient is critical the educator should be in school during the period of recovery.
- 1.6. **An educator may be excused for up to a maximum of two working days annually in the event of a dependent, immediate family member illness.**
  - 1.6.1. **Dependent members of the immediate family may include mother, father, child, brother, sister and person living in the same immediate household.**
  - 1.6.2. **An absence taken under this policy will be construed as health/disability leave.**
    - 1.6.2.1. **Health and disability leave will be recorded relative to the percent of the contract of the employee. (An educator with a .5 contract who takes a sick day is charged one full day of health and disability leave.) There is not an intent to extend to part-time employees more health and disability leave than full-time employees.**
- 1.7. All special requests for health/disability leave beyond that which is specified in this policy shall be referred to the principal for individual consideration. At the principal's discretion up to 5 additional days may be allowed or denied. Upon denial, the employee may appeal directly to the Superintendent to request additional days.
- 1.8. Upon approval of Workman's Compensation (Policy 4224), the Health and Disability leave as described in this policy will run concurrently.
- 1.9. Release to return to work after prolonged illness or disability will be determined by the educator's attending physician. In the event of a conflict with the attending physician and the District administration, a second physician may be consulted at school board expense. In the event of a

disagreement between the two doctors, a third doctor may be consulted to determine disposition of the case.

- 1.10. When poor health seems to impair an educator's ability to carry on work in a satisfactory manner, the Board of Education may request the educator to have a complete physical examination by a competent doctor of medicine.
- 1.11. Educators should plan their work and provide lesson plans so that their work will progress normally whenever they must be absent themselves from school.
- 1.12. Sick leave data is protected by HIPPA and will not be shared with any unqualified District employee or employee representative without written consent of the employee.
- 1.13. Employees may use sick leave for an organ donation.

## 2. LONG TERM DISABILITY

- 2.1. Educators shall be provided with a long-term disability insurance policy with the full cost of the premium being paid by the Board of Education for a full time employee. The benefits of this policy become effective following the expiration of the 180 days **on** health and disability leave. The employee must apply and meet the qualification of Educators Mutual (EMI Health).
- 2.2. Individuals who were on Long-Term Disability prior to the 1988-89 contract year and who qualify to stay on Long-Term Disability beyond the initial two (2) years shall have a waiver of premium to age 65.
- 2.3. Individuals who qualify for Long-Term Disability during the 1988-89 contract year and qualify to stay on Long-Term Disability beyond the initial two (2) years shall be provided a conversion policy for health and accident insurance only to age 65. This benefit will discontinue at the close of the employee's 1988-89 contract year, but no later than August 31, 1989.
- 2.4. Employees who qualify for Long-Term Disability and qualify to stay on Long-Term Disability beyond the initial two (2) years shall be provided a supplemental conversion policy to their Medicare coverage for health and accident insurance for a three (3) year period. This benefit will discontinue five (5) years from the date the individual qualified for Long-Term Disability.

This is a benefit to the employee only and is effective to most employees qualifying subsequent to the 1988-89 school year.

- 2.5. Employees who qualify for Long-Term Disability after June 30, 2011 will no longer be provided a supplemental conversion policy to their Medicare coverage for health and accident coverage for a three (3) year period.
- 2.6. Beginning September 26, 2015 Tier 1 employees (as defined by the Utah Retirement System) who qualify for Long-term Disability (LTD) will have an elimination period of 120 days. Tier 2 employees (as defined by the Utah State Retirement System) who qualify for Long-Term Disability (LTD) will have an elimination period of 180 days.

### 3. POSTPARTUM LEAVE

- 3.1. Employees are allowed to use health and disability leave for postpartum recovery. See [FAQs Maternity/Postpartum Sick Leave](#) for further information.

## Procedures

### 1. EXTENDED SICK LEAVE

- 1.1. An employee absent from work for a period of ~~twenty-one (21)~~ **ten (10)** consecutive ~~calendar~~ **contract** days for health or disability reasons must, upon request of his/her **principal**/supervisor, supply ~~the supervisor~~ **Human Resources** with a medical doctor's statement regarding the exact nature of the disability and shall

include the doctor's prognosis of when the employee can return to work (Policy No. 4019, I.2). The statements from the medical doctor, if requested, are to be forwarded to the Human Resource office for review and placement in the employee's personnel file. (Note: This is a change from earlier directives which required a letter from the employee's physician when the employee had been off work for health or disability reasons for fifteen consecutive days. The principal or district level work unit supervisor of the employee will now determine if such written notice is required.)

- 1.2. Those employees who have been required to supply a medical doctor's statement to substantiate extended health and disability leave are not to be permitted to return to work without a doctor's release. If the employee is given only a partial release, please check with the Human Resource office before allowing the person to return to work. Principals/supervisors are to forward these releases without delay to the Human Resource office so they may be placed in the employee's medical file.
- 1.3. Employees who have been absent for an extended period shall not be allowed to return to work for a day or a few days and then be absent due to health or disability reasons for another extended period of time without proper medical documentation. Principals/supervisors will need to monitor carefully this type of situation.

## 2. ADOPTION

The following section is implemented as a **continuing** pilot for the 20234-20245 school year.

- 2.1. Policy statement
  - 2.1.1. It is the policy of the Board of Education to enable employees of the Alpine School District to obtain paid parental leave for the adoption of a child or children. The interest of the board is to provide reasonable paid leave for employees while protecting the welfare of students and the continuity of their education.

### Definitions

"Young child" means a child under the age of 5

"Older child" means a child age 5-18 or older than 18 years, but incapable of self-care due to mental or physical disability.

“Eligible employee” means a contracted employee of the Alpine School district who has been employed by the district for 12 or more consecutive months

- 2.2. Leave for adoption
  - 2.2.1. Up to 15 work days may be allowed for an eligible employee for the adoption of a young child.
  - 2.2.2. Up to 10 work days may be allowed for an eligible employee for the adoption of an older child.
  - 2.2.3. Up to 3 days may be allowed for an eligible employee for the placement of a foster child.
  - 2.2.4. Employees seeking additional days for extenuating circumstances may make a request to the Executive Director of Human Resources.
- 2.3. An absence taken under this policy may be construed as health/disability leave.
  - 2.3.1. Health and disability leave will be recorded relative to the percent of contract of the employee. (A .5 teacher who takes a sick day is charged one full day of health and disability leave.) There is not an intent to extend to part-time employees more health and disability leave than full-time employees.
- 2.4. Additional days of leave may be taken by FMLA eligible employees under the Family and Medical Leave (FMLA) Policy, which allows most eligible employees to take up to 12 weeks of unpaid leave to care for newly born or adopted children (where both parents work for the District, leave is limited to a combined total of 12 weeks).
- 2.5. Limits on leave
  - 2.5.1. Leave for adoption is granted per adoption decree.
  - 2.5.2. This leave may be taken before the actual placement or adoption of a child if an absence from work is required for the placement for adoption to proceed. For example, the employee may be entitled to leave to attend counseling sessions, appear in court, consult with his or her attorney or the birth parent’s representative, submit to a physical examination, or travel to another country to complete an adoption before the actual date of placement.
  - 2.5.3. Leave to bond with a child after placement must be taken as a continuous block of leave. The continuous block of leave must begin within one week of the adoption placement.
- 2.6. Required documentation
  - 2.6.1. The employee is required to provide notification at least thirty days prior to the anticipated leave when the date is known.
  - 2.6.2. A letter from the applicable agency will be sufficient until an adoption decree is available.

### 3. PARENTAL LEAVE

The following section is implemented as a **continuing** pilot for the 2023~~4~~-2024~~5~~ school year.

#### 3.1. Policy statement

- 3.1.1. It is the policy of the Board of Education to enable employees of the Alpine School District to obtain paid parental leave immediately following the birth of a child or children. The interest of the board is to provide reasonable paid leave for employees while protecting the welfare of students and the continuity of their education.

#### Definitions

“Eligible employee” means a contracted employee of the Alpine School district who has been employed by the district for 12 or more consecutive months

#### 3.2. Educator Maternity Leave

- 3.2.1. All educators who give birth shall receive six weeks of maternity leave.
- 3.2.2. This leave shall run concurrently with the employee’s Health and Disability Leave.
- 3.2.3. This leave is a consecutive calendar count (including weekends and all holidays).
- 3.2.4. The maternity leave count begins the day of the child’s birth.
- 3.2.5. A request for additional days may be approved when accompanied by a doctor's note and for postpartum issues.
  - 3.2.5.1. Additional days of leave may be taken by FMLA eligible employees as provided in policy 4161 (where both parents work for the District, leave is limited to a combined total of 12 weeks).

#### 3.3. Educator Parental Leave

- 3.3.1. Employees who are the spouse of the child bearer or parent of the new born child shall receive up to five contract days of leave.
- 3.3.2. This leave shall run concurrently with the employee’s Health and Disability Leave.
- 3.3.3. This leave is continuous contract days beginning with the first day taken.
  - 3.3.3.1. These days must begin within a week of the birth or the first day that the child is brought home if the child has an extended hospital stay.

#### 3.4. Educators using parental leave may use any accumulated personal days in addition to the five days provided with this policy.

- 3.5. Additional days of leave may be taken by FMLA eligible employees as provided in policy 4161 (where both parents work for the District, leave is limited to a combined total of 12 weeks).

- 3.6. Employees seeking additional days for extenuating circumstances may make a request to the Executive Director of Human Resources.
- 3.7. An absence taken under this policy may be construed as health/disability leave.
  - 3.7.1. Health and disability leave will be recorded relative to the percent of contract of the employee. (A .5 teacher who takes a sick day is charged one full day of health and disability leave.) There is not an intent to extend to part-time employees more health and disability leave than full-time employees.
- 3.8. Additional days of leave may be taken by FMLA eligible employees under the Family and Medical Leave (FMLA) Policy, which allows most eligible employees to take up to 12 weeks of unpaid leave to care for newly born or adopted children
- 3.9. Required documentation
  - 3.9.1. The employee is required to provide notification at least thirty days prior to the expected due date when the date is known.
  - 3.9.2. Once the child is delivered, a letter from your attending doctor with the date of birth and the recommendation for recovery should be provided to the Human Resources Department.

#### HEALTH AND DISABILITY LEAVE INTERPRETATION (NOT POLICY)

Guidelines for administering the health/disability policy are:

1. The principal shall review the health/disability leave policy with the entire staff during the first month of each school year.
2. All special requests for health/disability leave beyond that which is specified in this policy shall be referred to the principal and the superintendent for individual consideration.
3. Absence caused by serious or emergency illness of a spouse, children or parents of contracted educators can be granted by the principal. The following examples are provided as guidelines to educators and principals so that educators may know when to request additional time off for the illness of a family member and principals may have a basis upon which to grant such requests:

Example A. If the spouse or child of an educator has surgery, the educator may be excused the day of surgery but unless the patient is critical the educator should be in school during the period of recovery.

Example B. If the child of an educator has a cold or communicable disease and is not seriously ill, the educator should be in school.

Example C. If a newborn child has an illness but the parent is physically able to return to work and the child is not critically ill, the educator should be at work.

Example D. If an educator must be absent from work for maternity reasons for a period beyond fifteen working days, then a doctor's statement must be submitted to the educator's supervisor identifying the actual complication which might prevent the educator's return to work. In most cases, in the normal birth of a child, the educator shall return to work within fifteen working days or the cost of a substitute's pay shall be withheld from the educator's pay.

# Military Leave

## STATEMENT OF POLICY

The Alpine School Board supports and appreciates the service of members of the Armed Forces. In compliance with Utah Code [71A-8-102](#), leave is extended for the normal Reserve training and instruction requirements of our Reserve employees.

### 1. Military Leave

- 1.1. All state employees and all employees of any county and municipality thereof, who are or shall become members of the organized Reserve of the United States Army, Navy, Air Force, or Marines, shall be allowed full pay for all time not in excess of fifteen days per year spent on duty at annual encampment or rifle competition or other duties in connection with the Reserve training and instruction requirements of the Army, Navy, Air Force or Marines of the United States. This leave shall be in addition to annual vacation leave with pay. ~~(39-3-2)~~
- 1.2. ~~\*(4)~~ Educators are not recognized as state employees by a ruling of the Utah State Attorney General. However, the Board of Education shall allow up to fifteen consecutive calendar days **or 11 contract days** with prior approval of the superintendent for an educator to participate in required military assignments. ~~with the only loss of pay to the employee being the cost of a substitute.~~
- 1.3.
  - 1.3.1. Military leave may be broken into ~~two~~ separate leaves. This shall not be construed to mean that more than 15 **consecutive calendar days or 11 contract days** of leave may be taken, only that **multiple-two** leaves per year will be allowed; not to exceed **11 15-contract** calendar days **in total**.

~~\*Interpretation: Maximum of 11 contract working days per year.~~

## Personal Leave

### Statement of Policy

The Alpine School District Board of Education recognizes the importance of a qualified teacher in every classroom. Further the Board understands that some leave is needed by employees beyond bereavement (Policy 4160) and health and disability (Policy 4162) leaves. Therefore, the Board has designated the business administrator and the executive director of human resources to work collaboratively to apply this policy.

### Definitions

1. “First week of school” means the five student days beginning with the official start of the school year as noted on district calendars. ~~Kindergarten~~, 7th grade or 10th grade days are not part of this count.
2. “Last week of school” means the last five days of the school year. When a holiday occurs on a day which would have been one of the five student days, this day will count as one of the five student days.

## 1. PERSONAL LEAVE

- 1.1. Certified educators may have up to five days of personal leave annually. Educators shall pay per day for each personal leave day used.
  - 1.1.1. Educators may take ~~five (5)~~ **six (6)** personal days annually at no dock in pay. The free personal days may not be used during the first 8 contract days of the school year or the last week of school. Personal Leave days taken on the contract days before the first student days will be treated as other personal days and will be docked at \$60 per day.
  - 1.1.2. Personal leave days may be accumulated up to a maximum of ten (10) days. Personal leave accumulates by carrying the number of unused personal leave days over into the next school year. Only ~~five (5)~~ **six (6)** days of the ten (10) that may be accumulated will be no dock days. All other days **above the 10 accumulated days** will be charged ~~\$60~~ **the**

teacher's daily rate per day, unless otherwise agreed upon through working with the Administrator of Human Resources.

- 1.1.3. Personal leave will be recorded relative to the percent of contract of the employee. (A .5 teacher who takes a personal day is charged one full day of personal leave.) There is not an intent to extend to part-time employees more personal leave than full-time employees.
- 1.1.4. Personal leave without pay for worthwhile absences may be approved by the Administrator of Human Resources.
- 1.1.5. Educators may not take personal leave during the first week of school or during the last week of school.
- 1.1.6. Educators are discouraged from taking personal leave to work for any other organization.
  - 1.1.6.1. Educators who are required to attend any professional meeting related to their teaching area/experience to enhance their teaching, may attend such a meeting without counting against the personal leave total, provided the cost of the substitute is paid by the sponsoring organization.
- 1.1.7. Educators are encouraged to request the leave days in sufficient time to permit a suitable substitute.
- 1.1.8. When an educator adopts a child he/she may take personal leave, up to a number of days they have accrued, without a dock in salary with the Administrator of Human Resource's approval. These days are in addition to the days listed in Policy Procedure 4162.
- 1.1.9. Educators may take the day before Christmas break and after Christmas break as personal days with a personal leave dock in pay.

# Sabbatical Leave

## STATEMENT OF POLICY

Alpine School District acknowledges the value of continued learning with content and/or pedagogy in order to ensure excellence in the classroom. Sabbaticals can provide valuable opportunities for personal and professional growth that benefits students and schools.

### 1. SABBATICAL LEAVE

- 1.1. The Board of Education grants **funding for up to eight (8) employee** sabbatical leaves **each year** under the following conditions:
  - 1.1.1. ~~An amount of money sufficient for granting sabbatical leaves up to 8 certified employees is budgeted yearly. 1% of the total instructional staff is budgeted yearly. 1% of the total instructional staff is budgeted yearly.~~ **Sabbatical leave shall be defined as a leave of absence for the furthering of educational opportunities and development, not to exceed one (1) calendar year in length.**
  - 1.1.2. The amount granted to any educator given sabbatical leave will be one-half the annual salary. The medical insurance program shall be kept intact during the sabbatical leave and shall be paid by the district **as if the employee were full time. The employee is responsible for their premiums and other associated insurance usage costs.**
  - 1.1.3. An educator shall be eligible for the program after serving the district for six years. The applicant must be employed full time when the application is made **and for the duration of the year they apply.** These six years must be qualifying years of service. For a year to qualify, it must be full-time teaching for a full contract year. An educator may receive credit for one qualifying year by adding together two years of half-time or greater service.
  - 1.1.4. The leave shall be granted for the purpose of obtaining further education and shall be awarded to those acceptable candidates who enroll as full-

time students, or who enroll for ~~12.5~~ semester hours (~~18~~ ~~22.5~~ quarter hours) of college credit ~~or and~~ participate in other ~~district Board~~ approved projects.

- 1.1.5. A leave may also be granted for a work leave provided the work leave will enhance the educator's effectiveness and/or enhance ~~their his~~ knowledge of the subject ~~being taught he is teaching~~. Under a work leave the Board of Education will pay the difference in salary between what the educator would receive on the work experience job and what would be received as an educator provided that in no instance will the district pay more than half of the educator's annual salary.
- 1.1.6. A recipient shall be allowed to receive additional financial assistance above the sabbatical grant through assistantships, fellowships, or other grants.
- 1.1.7. Upon returning to the district the recipient, whenever possible, ~~may shall~~ be placed in the teaching position held when the leave was taken, if so requested prior to leaving.
  - 1.1.7.1. The preceding policy is not intended to disqualify the recipients from other positions which they may be eligible for and may prefer more than the previous position.
- 1.1.8. The recipients of the sabbatical leaves upon return to the district will be placed on the salary schedule in the position they would have been if they had been engaged in regular teaching in the district during the year of absence.
- 1.1.9. The recipient of a sabbatical leave must return to the district after the leave and complete one full year's service ~~of full time employment~~ or refund the sabbatical pay and the insurance premium costs expended in behalf of the recipient.
- 1.1.10. The educator hired to take the place of an educator who has accepted a sabbatical leave shall be hired in that position for the duration of the sabbatical leave. Upon a successful experience, the employee hired to fill the sabbatical leave vacancy shall be given priority in the placement within the district.

## 2. SABBATICAL LEAVE SELECTION

### 2.1. Leave Application

- 2.1.1. Application for sabbatical leave is to be made on the official district form. The form is to be completed and submitted to the Personnel Office no later than ~~December~~ ~~October~~ 1, for a leave to be considered for the following school year.

### 2.2. Selection of Participants

- 2.2.1. A committee shall be appointed yearly to assist in the selection of applicants to be nominated to the superintendent for Board approval. At least half of the members of the committee shall be appointed by the association and the rest shall be appointed by the ~~Executive Director of Human Resources~~ ~~assistant superintendent over personnel~~. The committee shall assist the ~~Executive Director of Human Resources~~ ~~assistant superintendent over personnel~~ in the following ways:
- 2.2.1.1. To determine if an applicant's proposal is consistent with the intent of the sabbatical leave program and whether or not the application should be recommended for approval.
- 2.2.1.2. To rank the applicants on a priority scale if the number of applicants exceeds the ~~8 allocated sabbatical leaves~~ ~~one percent quota limit~~.

### 2.3. Selection Criteria

- 2.3.1. Consideration shall be given based on purposes such as the following:
- 2.3.1.1. The applicant has been accepted into a graduate program.
- 2.3.1.2. The applicant has received a grant or university stipend coinciding with the application. The grant or stipend should be ~~Policy No. 4166~~ related to the present teaching assignment or to an identified professional educational goal.
- 2.3.1.3. The applicant has enrolled in a non-degree seeking program which may enable him/her to change assignment within the district.
- 2.3.1.4. The applicant has been accepted for a work-related experience which shall contribute to his/her professional growth.

- 2.3.1.5. The years of successful service with Alpine School District.
  - 2.3.1.6. Current principal/administrator evaluation on educator evaluation or other applicable district evaluation form.
  - 2.3.1.7. The contribution the applicant would make to Alpine School District as a result of the sabbatical leave.
  - 2.3.1.8. Previous sabbatical leaves in Alpine School District.
  - 2.3.1.9. Consideration of balance between elementary and secondary applicants.
- 2.4. Notification of Sabbatical Approval/Denial
- 2.4.1. Human Resources shall notify Sabbatical Leave applicants of the approval or denial of their application status no later than November 24<sup>th</sup>.

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# Retirement Plans

## Statement of Policy

The Alpine School Board is committed to accommodate contracted employees who elect to retire early and to comply with the requirements of the Age Discrimination in Employment Act. The Board delegates to the Superintendent or designee the responsibility to implement this policy.

### 1. RETIREMENT PLANS

- 1.1. Retirement privileges are established by the legislature of the State of Utah and administered by the Utah State Retirement Board. Educators, by virtue of their employment, become a member of the retirement plan.
- 1.2. Every educator is also covered by the Social Security System of the Federal Government. On this program the Board of Education matches the contribution of the educator.
- 1.3. If a negotiated contract is agreed upon, after the retirement deadline has passed, which makes changes to any retirement benefits for the following school year then a retirement window will be opened.

# Retirement Incentives & Eligibility

## Statement of Policy

To accommodate certificated educators who elect to retire early and to comply with the requirements of the Age Discrimination in Employment Act, the following policy has been adopted.

### Definitions:

“Salary Schedule Base” means the salary amount listed on the bottom of the “Educator Salary Schedule”.

“Educator’s base contract amount” means the current lane and step on TCH A (for elementary educators) and TCH B (for secondary educators) for 8 hour contracts.

## 1. RETIREMENT INCENTIVES & ELIGIBILITY

1.1. A certificated educator of the Alpine School District shall receive this benefit if he/she:

1.1.1. submits the ~~written application~~ **online form** to **Human Resources** the ~~Superintendent of the District~~ by February 1 ~~of the contract year in which the educator retires~~ **of the employee’s last completed contract year**, (In the event the Utah State Legislature makes substantial changes to service requirements or the amount of benefit for full retirement under the Utah State Retirement System, the deadline will be extended to April 1st.)

1.1.2. is employed by the District as a certificated educator for the required time period immediately preceding retirement,

- 1.1.3. retires at the end of a contract (~~although for verified health problems~~ **extenuating circumstances** the ~~Board~~ **Superintendent or designee** may allow an educator to retire prior to the end of a contract year and receive this benefit),
- 1.1.4. agrees to, if requested by the District, substantiate the unreduced old age insurance benefits (Social Security) and
- 1.1.5. meets one of the following criteria:

## 2. STIPEND ELIGIBILITY

- 2.1. Has completed immediately preceding retirement, a minimum of 15 current, consecutive, full-time years with Alpine School District to qualify for a stipend, and is or will be, during the contract year of retirement at least 60 years of age, or
- 2.2. Has completed immediately preceding retirement, a minimum of 15 current, consecutive, full-time years to qualify for a stipend and has accumulated sufficient years of service under the Utah State Retirement System rules to qualify for full, unreduced pension benefits.\*\*
- 2.3. Educators who are contracted at .5 or greater, and have completed immediately preceding retirement, a minimum of 15 years of current, consecutive, service with Alpine School District, and are or will be, during the contract year of retirement, at least 60 years of age, shall be eligible for the stipend using the prorated formula defined in 2.4.1. or
- 2.4. Educators who are contracted at .5 or greater, and have completed immediately preceding retirement, a minimum of 15 years of current, consecutive, service with Alpine School District, and have accumulated sufficient years of service under the Utah State Retirement System rules to qualify for full, unreduced pension benefits,\*\* shall be eligible for the stipend using the prorated formula defined in 2.4.1
  - 2.4.1. The prorated formula for calculating the retirement incentives for partial contract service is as follows:
    - 2.4.1.1. The partial contract portion for each of the fifteen consecutive years immediately preceding the retirement shall be added together (e.g. .5 + .6 + .714 etc.).

- 2.4.1.2. The composite total shall then be divided by 15 to arrive at the average percentage of contract over the fifteen-year period.
- 2.4.1.3. The average percentage shall then be multiplied by the benefit/stipend of a teacher who is full-time, and on the same step and lane as the part-time contracted retiree.

### 3. STIPEND CALCULATION

- 3.1. Educators who qualify under this policy shall receive benefits as described below provided that any monthly, full Social Security benefits under the Social Security Act 42 U.S.C. (401 et seq.), which the educator is eligible to receive, whether actually applied for and received or not, shall be incorporated into the stipends paid under this policy. The result that the amount paid by the District plus such full Social Security benefits the educator is eligible to receive shall equal the stipend amount described below:
  - 3.1.1. Educators retiring after July 1, 2017, will receive a stipend equal to 54% of the difference between the salary schedule base of the Teacher's Salary Schedule, and the Educator's basic contract amount multiplied by four, plus the insurance benefit described in 5.0. Part-time contracted employees refer to 5.1.1.1.
  - 3.1.2. Educators who have less than four years remaining to qualify for full Social Security benefits, will have the benefit described in 3.0 offset by the Social Security benefits which the retired educator is entitled to receive when the individual is eligible to receive full unreduced Social Security.
  - 3.1.3. If death of the retired educator receiving benefits should occur, insurance benefits for the eligible beneficiary shall terminate forty-five (45) days following the death, and stipend benefits shall be paid to the retired educator's designated beneficiary. If there is no designated beneficiary, the stipend benefits will be paid to the retired educator's estate.
  - 3.1.4. For purposes of paragraph 4.1 "year" means the consecutive twelve month period beginning with the month benefits start under this policy and each anniversary thereafter.
  - 3.1.5. Beginning July 1, 2019, school counselor's stipend will be calculated on the same length of contract as a teacher.

## 4. INSURANCE ELIGIBILITY- Including Post COBRA Benefits

- 4.1. Has completed, immediately preceding retirement, a minimum of 20 years (15 of which must be current and consecutive) qualify for the 4, 5, or 6 years of retired insurance articulated in 5.0, \*(1) full-time professional service with Alpine School District, and is, or will be, during the contract year of retirement at least sixty years of age.
- 4.2. Has completed immediately preceding retirement a minimum of 20 years, 15 must be current, consecutive, to qualify for the 4, 5, or 6 years of retired insurance in 5.0, \* (2) full-time professional service with Alpine School District, and has accumulated sufficient years of service under the Utah State Retirement System rules to qualify for full, unreduced pension benefits\*\*. This does not include temporary retirement window special rules.
- 4.3. Educators who are contracted at .5 or greater and have completed immediately preceding retirement a minimum of 20 years, 15 of which must be current, consecutive to qualify for the 4,5 or 6 years of retired insurance in 5.0 professional service with Alpine School District and are, or will be, during the contract year of retirement, at least 60 years of age, shall be eligible for retirement incentives under the prorated formula defined in 2.4.1 or
- 4.4. Educators who are contracted at .5 or greater and have completed immediately preceding retirement a minimum of 20 years, 15 of which must be current, consecutive to qualify for the 4,5 or 6 years of retired insurance in 5.0 professional service with Alpine School District and have accumulated sufficient years of service under the Utah State Retirement System rules to qualify for full, unreduced pension benefits.\*\*, shall be eligible for retirement incentives under the prorated formula defined in 2.4.1.
- 4.5. Retirees-who exhaust COBRA benefits may purchase insurance for 106% of the premium.

## 5. RETIRED EMPLOYEE INSURANCE BENEFIT

- 5.1. There are no retired insurance benefits for employees hired on or after March 1, 2006. The retired insurance benefits for employees and/or their eligible dependents hired before March 1, 2006 are as follows (Spouse and dependent coverage may not exceed what is granted to the retiring employee.):

- 5.1.1. Employees who were hired prior to March 1, 2006, and who have not retired prior to July 1, 2006, will have the following post retirement insurance benefit for themselves and/or their eligible dependents. The years of experience are as of July 1, 2006.
  - 5.1.1.1. Part time contracted employees may obtain the insurance benefits accorded full-time employees by paying the percent of the premium which represents the difference between 100% (full-time) and the average percent of contract as defined in 2.4.1.
- 5.1.2. If the coverage in 5.1.1 expires before the employee is eligible to join Medicare the employee may purchase the District designated group health insurance policies at 106% of the regular district rate, after exhausting any COBRA rights, until he/she is eligible to join Medicare. The payments for such extended coverage must be in advance and paid at least quarterly. The employee must maintain continuous coverage, including any COBRA rights of purchase, with the District's designated group health insurance policies for benefits under this policy. Part-time contracted employees qualify for this benefit at the 106% rate.
- 5.1.3. For those educators hired prior to July 1, 2000 the insurance coverage will continue for the number of eligible years regardless of eligibility to join Medicare. Coverage for the retired employee eligible to join Medicare shall consist only of a supplement to Medicare as outlined in Policies 4254 and 4255.
- 5.1.4. If a retiree is covered by a post-retirement medical plan and chooses not to participate in the Alpine School District medical benefits, they may sell the Alpine School District medical plan back to Alpine School District for 25% of the premium for which they qualify.

## 6. RETIRED EMPLOYEE DEPENDENT INSURANCE BENEFIT: Including Post-COBRA Benefits

- 6.1. Insurance benefits for spouse and/or dependents can be earned by educators who qualify for eligibility as defined in 4.0. The benefits for spouse and dependent coverage are defined in 5.0. Spouse and dependent coverage may not exceed what is granted to the retiring employee. Part-time contracted employees may obtain benefits for spouse and dependent coverage by paying the percent of the premium which represents the difference between 100% (full-time) and the average percent of a contract as defined in 2.4.1.

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- 6.1.1. If the spouse or dependent becomes eligible to join Medicare (except as noted in 6.1.5) or is enrolled in another employer sponsored health insurance plan or is eligible for another employer sponsored health insurance plan that is fully funded by the employer, the benefits cease until the spouse is not longer eligible for coverage under the other plan and again applies for coverage under HIPPA, which allows for a special enrollment period to maintain continuous coverage when insurance is lost. The years of spouse and dependent eligibility begin running upon the date the insurance terminates as a result of the educator retirement regardless of eligibility or membership in another health insurance plan.
- 6.1.2. The spouse and dependent coverage in 6.0 shall consist of the District designated group insurance policies. If the spouse and/or dependent becomes eligible to join Medicare, the insurance coverage for the dependent shall consist of the District's supplement to Medicare.
- 6.1.3. If the spouse and dependent coverage expires under 6.0, the spouse and/or dependent may purchase the District's designated health insurance policies at 106% of the regular district rate after exhausting any COBRA rights, until they cease to be a dependent under health insurance rules or are eligible to join Medicare or another employee-sponsored health insurance plan. The payments for such extended coverage must be in advance and paid at least quarterly. The spouse and/or dependent must maintain continuous coverage, including any COBRA rights of purchase, with the District's designated group health insurance policies for benefits under this policy.
- 6.1.4. For those employees hired prior to July 1, 2000, the insurance coverage for the spouse in 6.0 will continue for the period of coverage regardless of eligibility to join Medicare. The insurance coverage for the spouse of those employees hired prior to July 1, 2000 who are eligible to join Medicare shall consist of a supplement to Medicare.
- 6.2. Benefits of the early retirement incentive program provided by the District are independent of the Utah State Retirement System. Retirees should carefully consider the effect of early retirement as it relates to Social Security, State Retirement, Income Taxes, Medical and Life Insurance, etc.
- 6.3. Nothing in this policy should be construed to violate any rights an employee or dependent has under COBRA, ADEA or similar law.

- 6.4. All retirees will participate in a special pay plan until the agreement is terminated by mutual agreement of the Alpine School District and the professional association representing the majority of the teachers. If an individual purchases years of service from the State, this shall be paid without going through the special pay plan. An individual may elect to withhold funds from the special pay plan to be placed in a flexible spending account.
- 6.4.1. Calculations for the retirement incentive will be calculated once at the time of retirement. The total amount will be deposited at the time of the first retirement payment.
- 6.4.2. A supplement to MEDICARE Contingency Fund will be established to help insure the solvency of this benefit. The contingency fund will consist of two separate funds, the "A" fund and the "B" fund.
- 6.4.2.1. The "A" fund will contain the current finances that are set aside for the supplement to MEDICARE. It will also contain the District's annual savings from the retirees participation in the special pay plan. The District may add additional funds as it deems necessary. These funds may be accessed to help fund in part any one or all of the following post retirement benefit costs:
- a. Six year post retirement medical benefit program,
  - b. Retirement stipend costs, or
  - c. Supplement to MEDICARE costs.
- 6.4.2.2. The "B" fund will contain the finances currently set aside to fund a return to self-insured medical plan, should that become a viable option in the future. These funds may be accessed for that purpose if necessary. Interest will accrue on these funds. It is intended that the necessity of continuing these funds be reviewed, by the negotiations teams, at least every five (5) years.

## 7. ONCE SUBMITTED, RETIREMENT FORMS MAY NOT BE RESCINDED

An approved leave of absence will not constitute a break in service if the educator returned immediately following the leave.

\*\*Currently, this means to retire with 30 qualifying years of service at any age.

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\*\*\*The word "another" refers to insurance coverage other than that provided by Alpine School District so long as the district's insurance carrier continues to require only a single premium payment on the spouse with the later birthday when dual insurance coverage exists, i.e. both spouses are employed by Alpine School District.

\*\*\*\* Any changes made to the retirement benefits in current policy that would affect current employees eligible for the benefits, the District will open a 30 day retirement declaration window the year prior to the policy changes going into effect.

# Medical, Surgical, Extended Health Benefits

## Statement of Policy

The Alpine School District Board of Education recognizes that health benefits for employees may be needed. Therefore, the Board provides such employee resources as an important fringe benefit to its employees. The Board has designated the Superintendent or designee to apply this policy.

## 1. MEDICAL, SURGICAL, EXTENDED HEALTH BENEFITS AND LIFE INSURANCE

### 1.1. Full-time employees

- 1.1.1. Full time employees are provided a medical, surgical, extended health, term life, and dependent life insurance program as a fringe benefit. The cost of the insurance program is based on negotiated agreement.
- 1.1.2. The insurance benefits become effective on the day that the employee begins to render service to the district, not at the time the prospective employee signs a contract.
- 1.1.3. A covered employee is continuously insured from the time he starts rendering service on his contract as long as the employee is with the district.
- 1.1.4. For a ~~twelve~~ 12-month employee, the insurance coverage ends at the ~~end of the month~~ ~~time in which~~ the employee terminates their contract. For nine-and ten-month employees who terminate, the insurance shall remain in effect over the summer months until the beginning date of the next school year provided that the employee

has completed the full term of the contract. If a nine- or ten-month employee terminates prior to the completion of the full term of the contract, the insurance benefits cease on the day of termination. ~~In no event will a~~ An employee **will not** receive more than 12 months insurance for one contract year of service.

- 1.1.5. The cost of the District designated medical insurance is paid in full by the Board of Education for all employees who qualify (and make application within 30 days of start of service). Employees new to the district and those wishing to make open enrollment changes will be offered the district designated insurance as the only fully paid option. Those current employees who choose to remain on the EMIA Advantage plan will be charged a monthly copay. FHP and Healthwise will continue to be offered as options. Approved health care options other than the district designated insurance are available. If an option other than the district designated insurance is selected, it shall replace the health and accident coverage with the district designated insurance. In the event the option selected is more costly than the district designated insurance, the employee shall pay the additional premium for this option. Employees must make application and qualify within 30 days of the start of regular contracted service to receive coverage. (See note at end of Policy.)

## 1.2. Part-time employees (formerly Policy No. 4411)

- 1.2.1. A part-time contracted employee (any daily work contract between four (4) and seven (7) hours) may obtain the benefit accorded full-time employees (those who work seven (7) or more hours) by paying the percent of the premium which represents the difference between 100% (full-time) and the percent of a full-time contract worked by the employee
- 1.2.2. Effective July 1, 1984, for insurance purposes the district shall recognize contracted employees in seven (7) or more hour positions as full-time or 100%. Contracted employees with less than four (4) hours employment shall receive no insurance benefits. The board agrees to the following scale for determining insurance premiums to be paid by the district.

- 1.2.2.1. Instead of insurance being based upon hours worked per day, insurance will be factored based upon hours worked per contract year as outlined with the following formula: 1,260 hours and above will have no insurance cost other than the appropriate employee premium contribution; 1070-1259 hours will pay 14% of insurance costs plus appropriate employee premium contribution; 1069-890 hours will pay 29% of insurance costs plus appropriate employee premium contribution; 637-889 hours will pay 43% of insurance costs plus appropriate employee premium contribution. The exception to this policy will be bus drivers who will pay 26% of the insurance costs plus appropriate employee premium contribution.
  - 1.2.3. The District agrees to allow part-time contract employees to waive medical and surgical insurance programs, but still participate in dependent death, employee death and long term disability benefits by paying the prorated percentages for these benefits. (See note at end of policy.)
- 1.3. Term Life Insurance (formerly Policy No. 4406)
  - 1.3.1. The Board of Education shall provide to the employees of the District a term life insurance policy in the amount of \$20,000 (Educators Mutual Insurance shall provide \$15,000 double indemnity/accidental death/dismemberment and the Board of Education shall provide \$5,000). The premium on this policy shall be paid by the school district for full-time employees. Part-time employees may obtain the full benefits by paying the percent shown on the prorated schedule in 1.2.2.1 listed above. (See note at end of policy.)
- 1.4. Dependent Life Insurance (formerly Policy No. 4410)
  - 1.4.1. For full-time employees the District shall provide the cost of \$5,000 for dependent life insurance for all eligible spouses and unmarried dependent children from 14 days through age 22. Part-time employees may obtain the full benefits by paying the percent shown

on the prorated schedule in 1.2.2.1 listed above. (See note at end of policy.) Note: (Information item only) This policy refers to current contracted employees only and those early retirees who are receiving an annual stipend from the district and have not waived the life insurance or other insurance benefits. (See 1.2.3 of this policy.) To be covered, an employee or early retiree must officially make application for these benefits.

~~1.5. The premium contribution for a single person is \$15.00 per month; two-party premium contribution of \$20.00 per month; and a family premium contribution of \$25.00 per month. Should family status change, it is the employee's responsibility to notify the benefits coordinator of the change. Unless this notification is given, the premium contribution withheld will not change nor will it be refunded. It is required that this notice be given within 30 days.~~

# Health and Disability Leave

## Statement of Policy

The Alpine School District Board of Education recognizes that health and disability leave for employees may be needed. Therefore, the Board provides such leave as an important fringe benefit to its employees. The Board has designated the Superintendent or designee to apply this policy.

## PERSONNEL CLASSIFIED

Definition: Calendar day includes contract days, weekends and holidays combined.

## 1. HEALTH AND DISABILITY LEAVE

- 1.1. Provisional contracted employees, those with less than three years continuous, current, experience in the District, are granted health and disability leave as follows:
  - 1.1.1. A maximum of up to seven (7) working days may be granted annually in the event of health or disability absence.
  - 1.1.2. Health and disability may accumulate up to a maximum of twenty-one (21) working days at the beginning of the third year of employment.
    - 1.1.2.1. During the absence of a contracted employee for health or disability reasons, the employee's full salary shall be paid for the cumulative days used.
    - 1.1.2.2. Beyond the cumulative health and disability leave, when the contracted employee is absent because of health or disability reasons, an contracted employee's salary shall be paid as follows:
      - 1.1.2.2.1. A contract employee salary shall have the cost of a personal day deducted (\$30) for any health or disability leave taken beyond the earned cumulative days up to a

combined maximum of 180 calendar days.

1.1.3. A contracted Classified employee, hired on or after July 1, 2011 and who has retired from a government agency, will not be eligible for the 180 days sick leave benefit. They will earn seven (7) days of sick leave per year, which may accrue to a maximum of 21 days.

1.2. Career employees, those who have completed three or more current consecutive years of employment with the district, are granted health and disability leave for 180 calendar days beginning with the first day of disability. (For example: An absence on Friday will count as three sick days, if the employee returns on Monday. Each calendar day counts as an absence, including holidays, as a sick leave day.)

1.2.1. A classified career employee who has exhausted the 180 calendar days of health and disability leave and returns to work on the 181st calendar day must obtain a release to return to work letter from their primary care physician, releasing them to return to work capable of fulfilling all essential functions without restrictions.

1.2.1.1. The employee who uses 180 calendar days of health and disability leave and returns to work will be placed on sick leave probation. Sick leave probation begins with the upcoming year and extends to the employee 21 calendar days annually, of health and disability leave for two years. These days are not accumulative. Upon successful completion of sick leave probation, the employee will have their 180 calendar days of health and disability leave restored.

1.2.2. Should an employee be unable to return to work on the 181st calendar day of health and disability leave, they will be separated from employment.

1.2.3. Employees who use ~~twenty-one (21)~~ **ten (10)** consecutive calendar **contract** days of health and disability leave, or establish a pattern of sick leave usage, which may indicate a misuse, will, **upon the recommendation of the principal/supervisor and at the discretion of Human Resources**, trigger the beginning count of 180 calendar days of sick leave usage. The calendar count will begin with the first day of the illness/disability for which the 180 days sick leave count is to be considered. The 180 day sick leave count may only go back for two years, unless a recommendation by the sick leave panel to go beyond the two years is reached.

- 1.2.3.1. Employees whose sick leave usage indicates a possible misuse will be notified in writing of the triggering of the 180 calendar days of health and disability leave.
- 1.2.4. An employee absent from work for a period of ~~twenty-one (21)~~ **ten (10)** consecutive ~~calendar~~ **contract** days for health and disability reasons in one contract year must, **upon the request of the principal/supervisor,** supply the Human Resource department with a medical doctor's statement regarding the exact nature of the disability and shall include the doctor's prognosis of when the employee can return to work.
- 1.2.5. An employee who has taken ~~fifteen (15)~~ **twelve (12)** cumulative days or more of health and disability leave in any one contract year **or who establishes a pattern of sick leave use which may indicate misuse,** ~~may~~ **will,** be required to submit medical justification upon request of the immediate supervisor **to Human Resources** and may have the reasons for leave reviewed by the administration and in the event the leave is not legitimate the employee's health and disability leave may be restricted. In the event it appears the benefit is being misused the superintendent or his designee will refer the case to a review panel consisting of two employees to be determined by the classified association and a designee determined by the superintendent. The employee will be asked to appear before the panel. In the event it is determined that the benefit is being misused, the panel will make the recommendations for action to the superintendent and to the employee. This review panel will be reviewed annually by the association and the district for its effectiveness and fairness.
- 1.3. Employees shall be provided with a long-term disability insurance policy with the full cost of the premium being paid by the board of education for full time employees as long as the employee has not waived the benefit. The benefits of this policy become effective following the expiration of the 180 day health and disability leave. The employee must make an application to both the social security office and the insurance carrier.
- 1.4. Fitness to return to work after a prolonged illness or disability shall be determined by the employee's attending physician. A letter from the physician is required before the employee shall be allowed to return to work. In the event of a conflict with the attending physician and the district administration, a second physician may be consulted at Board of Education's expense. In the event of a disagreement between the two doctors, a third doctor may be consulted to

determine disposition of the case at the Board of Education's expense.

- 1.5. When poor health seems to impair an employee's ability to carry on his or her work in a satisfactory manner, the Board of Education may request them to have a complete physical examination by a competent doctor of medicine at the board's expense, to determine fitness for duty.
- 1.6. **If the spouse or dependent child of an employee has surgery or is hospitalized, the employee may be excused for up to three days (if the admittance, day of surgery, and release are separate days), but unless the patient is critical the employee should be at work during the period of recovery.**
- 1.7. **An employee may be excused for up to a maximum of two working days annually in the event of a dependent, immediate family member illness.**
  - 1.7.1. **Dependent members of the immediate family may include mother, father, child, brother, sister and person living in the same immediate household.**
  - 1.7.2. **An absence taken under this policy will be construed as health/disability leave.**
    - 1.7.2.1. **Health and disability leave will be recorded relative to the percent of the contract of the employee. (An employee with a .5 contract who takes a sick day is charged one full day of health and disability leave.) There is not an intent to extend to part-time employees more health and disability leave than full-time employees.**
- 1.8. Absence caused by the death of members of immediate families may be construed as health/disability leave. **(See [policy 4416](#))** ~~Members of the immediate family include spouse, mother, father, child, brother, sister, father-in-law, mother-in-law, brother-in-law, sister-in-law, grandmother, grandfather, aunt, uncle, and grandchildren.~~
- 1.8.1. Absences caused by the death of a family member may not be counted as part of the twenty-one (21) consecutive days that would trigger the 180 calendar day count of health and disability leave.
- 1.9. Employees shall provide plans so that their work shall progress normally whenever they must absent themselves from their places of employment.
- 1.10. Employees who schedule treatment, or surgical procedures which are not deemed medically necessary by a doctor, will not be granted sick leave. Any cosmetic or voluntary procedures that are not medically necessary will not be

granted sick leave and days must be taken as personal leave, comp time or vacation.

(Intent-to discourage abuse of sick leave and preserve current benefit)

- 1.11. A supervisor may request medical certification if sick leave is taken before or after a holiday or vacation day.
- 1.12. Sick leave data is protected by HIPPA and will not be shared with any unqualified employee or employee representative without the written consent of the employee.
- 1.13. Upon approval of Worker’s Compensation (Policy 4409), the Health and Disability leave as defined in this policy will run concurrently. If extenuating circumstances exist as a result of a workplace injury, an employee may request in writing to the executive director of human resources a review by a panel the sick leave usage and availability in returning to work as a result of workplace injury.
- 1.14. Beginning September 1, 2015 Tier 1 employees (as defined by the Utah Retirement System) who qualify for Long-Term Disability (LTD) will have an elimination period of 120 days. Tier 2 employees (as defined by the Utah Retirement System) who qualify for Long-Term Disability (LTD) will have an elimination period of 180 days.

# Procedures

## 1. EXTENDED SICK LEAVE

- 1.1. An employee absent from work for a period of twenty-one (21) calendar days for health or disability reasons must, upon request of his/her supervisor, supply the supervisor with a medical doctor’s statement regarding the exact nature of the

disability and shall include the doctor’s prognosis of when the employee can return to work (Policy No. 4412, 1.2). The statements from the medical doctor, if requested, are to be forwarded to the Personnel Office for review and placement in the employee’s personnel file. (Note: This is a change from earlier directives which required a letter from the employee’s physician when the employee had been off work for health or disability reasons for fifteen consecutive days. The principal or district level work-unit supervisor of the employee will now determine if such written notice is required.)

- 1.2. Those employees who have been required to supply a medical doctor’s statement to substantiate extended health and disability leave are not to be permitted to return to work without a doctor’s release. If the employee is given only a partial release, please check with the Personnel Office before allowing the person to return to work. Principals/supervisors are to forward these releases without delay to the Personnel Office so they may be placed in the employee’s personnel file.
- 1.3. Employees who have been absent for an extended period shall not be allowed to return to work for a day or a few days and then be absent due to health or disability reasons for another extended period of time without proper medical documentation. Principals/supervisors will need to monitor carefully this type of situation.

## 2. ADOPTION

The following section is implemented as a **continuing** pilot for the 20234-20245 school year.

- 2.1. Policy statement
  - 2.1.1. It is the policy of the Board of Education to enable employees of the Alpine School District to obtain paid parental leave for the adoption of a child or children. The interest of the board is to provide reasonable paid leave for employees while protecting the welfare of students and the continuity of their education.

### Definitions

“Young child” means a child under the age of 5

“Older child” means a child age 5-18 or older than 18 years, but incapable of self-care due to mental or physical disability.

“Eligible employee” means a contracted employee of the Alpine School district who has been employed by the district for 12 or more consecutive months

- 2.2. Leave for adoption
  - 2.2.1. Up to 15 work days may be allowed for an eligible employee for the adoption of a young child.

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- 2.2.2. Up to 10 work days may be allowed for an eligible employee for the adoption of an older child.
- 2.2.3. Up to 3 days may be allowed for an eligible employee for the placement of a foster child.
- 2.2.4. 1.4. Employees seeking additional days for extenuating circumstances may make a request to the Executive Director of Human Resources.
- 2.3. An absence taken under this policy may be construed as health/disability leave.
  - 2.3.1. Health and disability leave will be recorded relative to the percent of contract of the employee. (A .5 teacher who takes a sick day is charged one full day of health and disability leave.) There is not an intent to extend to part-time employees more health and disability leave than full-time employees.
- 2.4. Additional days of leave may be taken by FMLA eligible employees under the Family and Medical Leave (FMLA) Policy, which allows most eligible employees to take up to 12 weeks of unpaid leave to care for newly born or adopted children (where both parents work for the District, leave is limited to a combined total of 12 weeks).
- 2.5. Limits on leave
  - 2.5.1. Leave for adoption is granted per adoption decree.
  - 2.5.2. This leave may be taken before the actual placement or adoption of a child if an absence from work is required for the placement for adoption to proceed. For example, the employee may be entitled to leave to attend counseling sessions, appear in court, consult with his or her attorney or the birth parent’s representative, submit to a physical examination, or travel to another country to complete an adoption before the actual date of placement.
  - 2.5.3. Leave to bond with a child after placement must be taken as a continuous block of leave. The continuous block of leave must begin within one week of the adoption placement.
- 2.6. Required documentation
- 2.7. The employee is required to provide notification at least thirty days prior to the anticipated leave when the date is known.
- 2.8. A letter from the applicable agency will be sufficient until an adoption decree is available.

### 3. PARENTAL LEAVE

The following section is implemented as a **continuing** pilot for the 2023~~4~~-2024~~5~~ school year.

- 3.1. Policy statement
  - 3.1.1. It is the policy of the Board of Education to enable employees of the Alpine School District to obtain paid parental leave immediately following the birth of

a child or children. The interest of the board is to provide reasonable paid leave for employees while protecting the welfare of students and the continuity of their education.

## Definitions

“Eligible employee” means a contracted employee of the Alpine School district who has been employed by the district for 12 or more consecutive months

### 3.2. Educator Maternity Leave

3.2.1. All educators who give birth shall receive six weeks of maternity leave.

3.2.2. This leave shall run concurrently with the employee’s Health and Disability Leave.

3.2.3. This leave is a consecutive calendar count (including weekends and all holidays).

3.2.4. The maternity leave count begins the day of the child’s birth.

3.2.5. A request for additional days may be approved when accompanied by a doctor's note and for postpartum issues.

3.2.5.1. Additional days of leave may be taken by FMLA eligible employees as provided in policy 4161 (where both parents work for the District, leave is limited to a combined total of 12 weeks).

### 3.3. Educator Parental Leave

3.3.1. Employees who are the spouse of the child bearer or parent of the new born child shall receive up to five contract days of leave.

3.3.2. This leave shall run concurrently with the employee’s Health and Disability Leave.

3.3.3. This leave is continuous contract days beginning with the first day taken.

3.3.3.1. These days must begin within a week of the birth or the first day that the child is brought home if the child has an extended hospital stay.

3.4. Educators using parental leave may use any accumulated personal days in addition to the five days provided with this policy.

3.5. Additional days of leave may be taken by FMLA eligible employees as provided in policy 4161 (where both parents work for the District, leave is limited to a combined total of 12 weeks).

3.6. Employees seeking additional days for extenuating circumstances may make a request to the Executive Director of Human Resources.

3.7. An absence taken under this policy may be construed as health/disability leave.

3.7.1. Health and disability leave will be recorded relative to the percent of contract of the employee. (A .5 teacher who takes a sick day is charged one full day of health and disability leave.) There is not an intent to extend to part-time employees more health and disability leave than full-time employees.

- 3.8. Additional days of leave may be taken by FMLA eligible employees under the Family and Medical Leave (FMLA) Policy, which allows most eligible employees to take up to 12 weeks of unpaid leave to care for newly born or adopted children
- 3.9. Required documentation
  - 3.9.1. The employee is required to provide notification at least thirty days prior to the expected due date when the date is known.
  - 3.9.2. Once the child is delivered, a letter from your attending doctor with the date of birth and the recommendation for recovery should be provided to the Human Resources Department.

## HEALTH AND DISABILITY LEAVE INTERPRETATION (NOT POLICY)

Guidelines for administering the health/disability policy are:

1. The administrator shall review the health/disability leave policy with the entire staff during the start of each fiscal year.
2. All special requests for health/disability leave beyond that which is specified in this policy shall be referred to the administrator and the superintendent for individual consideration.
3. Absence caused by a serious or emergency illness of a spouse, children, or parents of contracted employees can be granted by the administrator. All special requests for health/disability leave beyond that which is specified in this policy shall be referred to the principal/supervisor for individual consideration. At the principal's discretion, up to 5 additional days may be allowed or denied. Upon denial, the employee may appeal directly to the Administrator of Human Resources to request additional days. The following examples are provided as guidelines to employees and administrators so that

employees may know when to request additional time off for the illness of a family member and administrators may have a basis upon which to grant such requests:

Example A. If the spouse or child of an employee has surgery, the employee may be excused the day of surgery but unless the patient is critical the employee should be in school during the period of recovery.

Example B. If the child of an employee has a cold or communicable disease and is not seriously ill, the employee should be in school.

Example C. If a newborn child has an illness but the parent is physically able to return to work and the child is not critically ill, the employee should be at work.

Example D. If an employee must be absent from work for maternity reasons for a period beyond fifteen working days, then a doctor's statement must be submitted to the **Human Resources department** ~~employee's supervisor~~ identifying the actual complication which might prevent the employee's return to work. In most cases, in the normal birth of a child, the employee shall return to work within fifteen working days ~~or \$30 per day shall be withheld from the educator's pay.~~

Example E. Employees may take the day a dependent child or spouse is admitted to, or released from the hospital as family illness upon receiving verification from the hospital.

- ~~4. An employee who has taken 15 days or more of health and disability leave in any one contract year may have the reasons for leave reviewed by the administration and in the event the leave is not legitimate, shall be reviewed by a panel and the employee's health and disability leave may be restricted.~~
- ~~5. If the employee adopts a child under the age of five he/she may take four days of health leave to help the child settle into the family.~~

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# Personal Leave

## STATEMENT OF POLICY

The Alpine School District Board of Education recognizes the importance of a qualified employee in every position. Further the Board understands that some leave is needed by employees beyond bereavement (Policy 4416) and health and disability (Policy 4412) leaves. Therefore, the Board has designated the Superintendent or designee to apply this policy.

### 1. PERSONAL LEAVE FOR CONTRACT EMPLOYEES

1.1. **Contracted** classified employees **that do not have vacation accrual** may have up to ~~five~~ **six** days personal leave annually. **These days will be without a dock in pay. Any other accrued days up to the maximum will receive a dock.** If employees take these days, they will be required to pay 30% of their daily salary for each personal leave day up to a maximum of \$30. Personal leave may be accumulated up to a maximum of 10 days. Personal leave accumulates by carrying the number of unused personal leave days over into the next school year.

~~1.1.1. Contracted classified employees that do not have vacation accrual may take six five personal days per year without a dock in pay. The no dock personal days may not be used during the first or last week of school.~~

1.1.2. **The no dock personal days may not be used during the first or last week of school.**

1.1.2.1. The first week of school is defined as the five student days beginning with the official start of the school year as noted in district calendars. ~~Kindergarten~~, **7th or 10th** grade day are not a part of this count.

1.1.2.2. The last week of school is defined as the last five student days of the school year. When a holiday occurs on a day which would have been one of the five student days, this day will count as one of the five student days.

1.2. **Classified employees that accrue vacation days may have up to six days personal leave annually. If employees take these days, they will be required to pay 30% of**

their daily salary for each personal leave day up to a maximum of \$30. Personal leave may be accumulated up to a maximum of 10 days. Personal leave accumulates by carrying the number of unused personal leave days over into the next school year.

- 1.3. ~~Employees may not take personal leave during the first week of school or during the last week of school.~~ Employees may take a personal day the day preceding or following Winter Break.
- 1.4. Classified employees are discouraged from taking personal leave to work for any other organization.
- 1.5. Classified employees are encouraged to request the leave days in sufficient time to permit the supervisor to obtain a suitable substitute.
- 1.6. Personal leave days must be cleared in advance with the employee's supervisor, otherwise the employee may receive a full dock in pay for each day missed.
- 1.7. Any personal leave days taken beyond what has been accrued, if approved, will be taken at a 100% dock.
- 1.8. When a classified employee adopts a child he/she may take personal leave up to the number of days they have accrued, without a dock in salary with the executive director of human resources approval. These days are in addition to the days listed in policy procedure 4412.
- 1.9. If an employee has 8 hours or more comp time, the employee must take the comp time off before personal leave is approved.

## 2. PERSONAL LEAVE FOR HOURLY EMPLOYEES

### 2.1. ELIGIBILITY

1. Hourly employees hired after July 1, 2013 are not eligible for leave. Any days not worked must be cleared in advance and will be taken at 100% dock.

### 2.2. PERSONAL LEAVE FOR HOURLY EMPLOYEES HIRED BEFORE JULY 1, 2013

- 2.2.1. Hourly employees will be provided three (3) days of personal leave after working 2 years.
  - 2.2.1.1. One additional day may be earned for each additional year for a maximum of five (5) personal leave days.
  - 2.2.1.2. Employees may not take personal leave during the first and last week of the school year. Employees may take a personal day preceding or following Winter Break

- 2.2.1.3. The first week of school is defined as the five student days beginning with the official start of the school year as noted in district calendars. Kindergarten, 7th or 10th grade day are not a part of this count.
- 2.2.1.4. The last week of school is defined as the last five student days of the school year. When a holiday occurs on a day which would have been one of the five student days, this day will count as one of the five student days.
- 2.2.1.5. Classified hourly employees, hired before July 1, 2013, may take up to five personal days annually at no dock in pay. The number of no dock days may vary based on the number of days the employee has earned (see 2.1, 2.1.1 above).

## STATEMENT OF POLICY

The Alpine School Board supports and appreciates the service of members of the Armed Forces. In compliance with Utah Code [71A-8-102](#), leave is extended for the normal Reserve training and instruction requirements of our Reserve employees.

## PERSONNEL CLASSIFIED

### 1. Military Leave

- 1.1. All state employees and all employees of any county and municipality thereof, who are or shall become members of the organized Reserve of the United States Army, Navy, Air Force, or Marines, shall be allowed full pay for all time not in excess of fifteen days per year spent on duty at annual encampment or rifle competition or other duties in connection with the Reserve training and instruction requirements of the Army, Navy, Air Force or Marines of the United States. This leave shall be in addition to annual vacation leave with pay. ~~(39-3-2)~~
- 1.2. \*(1) Educators are not recognized as state employees by a ruling of the Utah State Attorney General. However, the Board of Education shall allow up to fifteen consecutive calendar days **or 11 contract days** with prior approval of the superintendent for an ~~educator~~ **employee** to participate in required military assignments. ~~with the only loss of pay to the employee being the cost of a substitute.~~
- 1.3.

- 1.3.1. Military leave may be broken into ~~two~~ separate leaves. This shall not be construed to mean that more than 15 **consecutive calendar** days or **11 contract days** of leave may be taken, only that ~~multiple-two~~ leaves per year will be allowed; not to exceed ~~11 15-contract~~ calendar days **in total**.

# Retirement Incentive

## Statement of Policy

The Alpine School Board is committed to accommodate contracted employees who elect to retire early and to comply with the requirements of the Age Discrimination in Employment Act. The Board delegates to the Superintendent or designee the responsibility to implement this policy.

## PERSONNEL CLASSIFIED

### 1. RETIREMENT INCENTIVE & ELIGIBILITY

- 1.1. To accommodate contracted classified employees who elect to retire early and to comply with the requirements of the Age Discrimination in Employment Act, the following policy has been adopted.
- 1.2. A contracted classified employee of the Alpine School District shall receive the benefit if he/she:
  - (a) submits the written application form to the Superintendent of the District by February 1, of the contract year in which the contracted classified employee retires, (In the event the Utah State Legislature makes substantial changes to the service requirements or the amount of benefit for full retirement under the Utah State Retirement System, the deadline will be extended to April 1st.)
  - (b) is employed by the District as a contracted classified employee for the required time period immediately preceding retirement,
  - (c) retires at the end of a contract (although, for verified health problems, the Board may allow a contracted classified employee to retire prior to the end of a contract year and receive this benefit),
  - (d) agrees to, if requested by the District, substantiate the unreduced old-age insurance benefits (Social Security) and,
  - (e) they have not retired from another school district or state agency and that are not receiving benefits from those institutions, are eligible for Alpine District retirement benefits.
  - (f) meets one of the following criteria

## 2. STIPEND ELIGIBILITY

- 2.1. Classified employees who have completed, immediately preceding retirement, a minimum of 15 contracted years of service (10 of which must be current and consecutive\*) with Alpine School District to qualify for a stipend, and are or will be, during the current contract year of retirement at least 60 years of age, or
- 2.2. Classified employees who have completed, immediately preceding retirement, a minimum of 20 contracted years of service (10 of which must be current and consecutive\*) with Alpine School District to qualify for a stipend and have accumulated sufficient years of service under the Utah Retirement System rules to qualify for full unreduced pension benefits.\*\* This does not include temporary retirement window rules.

## 3. STIPEND CALCULATION

- 3.1. Contracted classified employees who qualify under this policy shall receive benefits as described below provided that any monthly, full social security benefits under the Social Security Act 42 U.S.C. (401 et seq.), which the contracted classified employee is eligible to receive, whether actually applied for and received or not, shall be incorporated into the stipends paid under this policy. The result that the amount paid by the District plus such full social security benefits the contracted classified employee is eligible to receive, shall equal the stipend amount described below:
  - 3.1.1. Contracted classified employees retiring after January 1, 2006, will receive a stipend equal to ~~25%~~ 27% of the contracted classified employee's salary, multiplied by four, as if the contracted classified employee had continued his/her, plus the insurance benefit as described in 4.0.
  - 3.1.2. The benefit described in 3.1.1 will be paid out in a lump sum. The payment will be offset by unreduced Social Security benefits which the retired contracted classified employee is entitled to receive during the months for which the payments are made in a similar manner as described in Section 3.1.1 for stipend payments.
  - 3.1.3. If death of the retired contracted classified employee receiving benefits should occur, insurance benefits for the eligible beneficiary shall terminate forty-five (45) days following the death, and stipend benefits shall be paid to the retired contracted classified employee's designated beneficiary or, if there is not a designated beneficiary, to the retired contracted classified employee's estate.

## 4. INSURANCE ELIGIBILITY- Including Post COBRA Benefits

- 4.1. Contracted classified employees who have completed, immediately preceding retirement, a minimum of 20 years (15 of which must be current and consecutive) qualify for the 4, 5, or 6 years of retired insurance articulated in 5.0, and must meet either of the following criteria:
  - 4.1.1. have completed immediately preceding retirement, a minimum of 20 years of service with Alpine School District (15 of which must be current and consecutive) and are, or will be, during the contract year of retirement, at least 60 years of age, or
  - 4.1.2. have completed immediately preceding retirement, a minimum of 20 years of service with Alpine School District (15 of which must be current and consecutive) and have accumulated sufficient years of service under the Utah Retirement System rules to qualify for full, unreduced pension benefits\*\*.

## 5. RETIRED CLASSIFIED EMPLOYEE INSURANCE BENEFIT

- 5.1. There are no retired insurance benefits for educators hired on or after March 1, 2006. The retired insurance benefits for educators and/or their eligible dependents hired before March 1, 2006 are as follows:
  - 5.1.1.1. Classified employees who have completed 1-10 years of service in Alpine School District as of July 1, 2006, will be eligible for 4 years of post retirement insurance.
  - 5.1.1.2. Classified employees who have completed 11-19 years of current consecutive experience in Alpine School District as of July 1, 2006, will be eligible for 5 years of post-retirement insurance.
  - 5.1.1.3. Classified employees who have completed 20 or more years of current consecutive experience in Alpine School District as of July 1, 2006, will be eligible for 6 years of post-retirement insurance.
- 5.2. If the coverage in 4.1 expires before the retiree is eligible to join Medicare the retiree may purchase the District designated group health insurance at 106% the regular district rate, after exhausting any COBRA rights, until he/she is eligible to join Medicare. The payments for such extended coverage must be in advance and

paid quarterly. The retiree must maintain continuous coverage, including any COBRA rights of purchase, with the District's designated group health insurance policies under this policy.

- 5.3. For those educators hired prior to July 1, 2000 the insurance coverage for the educator, spouse, and/or dependent in 6.0 will continue for the period of coverage regardless of eligibility to join Medicare. The insurance coverage for the spouse and/or dependents of those educators hired prior to July 1, 2000, who are eligible to join Medicare shall consist of a supplement to Medicare.

## 6. RETIRED CLASSIFIED EMPLOYEE DEPENDENT INSURANCE BENEFIT: including post Cobra benefits.

- 6.1. Insurance benefits for a spouse and/or dependents can be earned by contracted classified employees who qualify for eligibility as defined in 4.0. The benefits for spouse and/or dependent coverage will be the same as for the employee as described in 5.0.
  - 6.1.1. The spouse and dependent coverage in 6.1 shall consist of the District-designated group insurance policies. If the dependent becomes eligible to join Medicare or is enrolled in any employer-sponsored health insurance plan or is eligible for another employer-sponsored health insurance plan that is fully funded by the employer, the benefits cease until the spouse is no longer eligible for coverage under the other plan and again applies for coverage under HIPAA. The insurance coverage for the dependent shall consist only of the District's supplement to Medicare.
  - 6.1.2. If the spouse and dependent coverage expires in 6.1, the spouse and dependent may purchase the District's designated health insurance policies at 106% of the regular district rate, after exhausting any COBRA rights, until they cease to become a dependent under health insurance rules or are eligible to join Medicare or another employee-sponsored health insurance plan. The payments for such extended coverage must be in advance and paid at least quarterly. The spouse or dependent must maintain continuous coverage, including any COBRA rights of purchase, with the District's designated group health insurance policies for benefits under this policy.
  - 6.1.3. For those contracted classified employees hired prior to July 1, 2000, the insurance coverage for the employee, spouse, and/or dependent in 6.0 will continue for the period of coverage regardless of eligibility to join Medicare. The insurance coverage for the spouse and/or dependents of

those classified employees hired prior to July 1, 2000, who are eligible to join Medicare shall consist of a supplement to Medicare.

- 6.2. Benefits of the early retirement incentive program provided by the District are independent of the Utah State Retirement System. Retirees should carefully consider the effect of early retirement as it relates to Social Security, State Retirement, Income Taxes, Medical and Life Insurance, etc.
- 6.3. Nothing in this policy should be construed to violate any rights an employee or dependent has under COBRA, ADEA, or similar law.
- 6.4. All retirees will participate in a special pay plan until the agreement is terminated by mutual agreement of the Alpine School District and the Alpine Classified Association. If an individual purchases years of service from the state, this shall be paid without going through the special pay plan.
  - 6.4.1. Calculations for the retirement incentive will be calculated once at the time of retirement. The largest amount allowable by IRS rules will be placed into the special pay plan each year until the total amount has been distributed.

## 7. POST-RETIREMENT INSURANCE FUND

- 7.1. The District shall establish a post-retirement fund to help meet OPEB (Other Post-Employment Benefits) requirements. This fund shall include, but not be limited to the following:
  - 7.1.1. Funds previously set aside for return to self-insured (approximately \$3,700,000).
  - 7.1.2. Other funds set aside as of September 1, 2007, to fund post-retirement insurance.
  - 7.1.3. The District's Social Security savings from participation in the special pay plan and from those who use the stipend to purchase additional service credit from the Utah Retirement System.
  - 7.1.4. Prescription subsidy payments from the Federal government.
  - 7.1.5. Additional contributions will be added as determined by the Board of Education.
  - 7.1.6. \$6,000,000 additional in the 2007-2008 school year.
  - 7.1.7. The District will provide the professional association representing the majority of the teachers, with an annual accounting of the fund by October 31, each year. As a minimum, this shall include contributions, interest, and withdrawals. \*An approved leave of absence will not constitute a break in service if the educator returned immediately following the leave.

\*An approved leave of absence will not constitute a break in service if the contracted employee returned immediately following the leave.

\*\*Currently, this means to retire with 30 qualifying years of service at any age.

\*\*\* If any changes are made to retirement benefits in current policy that would affect current employees eligible for the benefits, the district will open a 30-day declaration window the year prior to the policy changes taking effect.

# Rights of Employees

## STATEMENT OF POLICY

The Alpine School Board of Education recognizes the right of employees to engage in organizing, joining, and bargaining collectively through representatives of a labor organization. The Board also recognizes that employees may choose not to participate in these activities. The rights and responsibilities of employees in these matters are delineated in this policy.

### 1. RIGHTS OF EMPLOYEES--COLLECTIVE BARGAINING-- RIGHT TO REFRAIN ALSO

- 1.1. Employees shall have the right to self-organization, to form, join, or assist labor organizations, to bargain collectively through representatives of their own choosing, and to engage in concerted activities for the purpose of collective bargaining or other mutual aid or protection; and such employees shall also have the right to refrain from any or all of such activities. (2-12-3)

### 2. RIGHT OF EMPLOYEES TO ORGANIZE

- 2.1. It shall not be unlawful for employees to organize themselves into or carry on labor unions for the purpose of lessening hours of labor, increasing wages, bettering conditions of members, or carrying out the legitimate purposes of such organizations as freely as they could do it acting singly. (2-12-1)

### 3. RECOGNITION

- 3.1. The employee organizations with the majority membership shall be recognized as the negotiation bodies to represent the employees in negotiation problems between the district administrative staff and/or the Board of Education and the organizations.

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## 4. LEGAL STATUS VOLUNTARY MEMBERSHIP

- 4.1. It is unlawful for any employer, person, firm, association, corporation, employee, labor union, labor organization or any other type of association, officer or agent of such, or member of same, to compel or force, or to attempt to compel, or force, any person to join or refrain from joining any labor union, labor organization or any other type of association. (2-12-10, 34-34-7)
- 4.2. No employer shall require any person to become or remain a member of any labor union, labor organization or any other type of association as a condition of employment or continuation of employment by such an employer. (34-34-8)
- 4.3. No employer shall require any person to abstain or refrain from membership in any labor union, labor organization or any other type of association as a condition of employment or continuation of employment. (34-34-9)
- 4.4. No employer shall require any person to pay dues, fees, or other charges of any kind to any labor union, labor organization or any other type of association as a condition of employment or continuation of employment. (34-34-10)

## 5. NEGOTIATIONS

- 5.1. One of the most vital and important and at the same time delicate problems of the school board is to develop and maintain high morale among employees and retain the services of the most capable.
- 5.2. The right of individuals to discuss with the Board of Education conditions concerning their employment has long been recognized. The right of the individual employee to delegate to an organization the right to represent him has also long been recognized.
- 5.3. In order that the Board of Education and the employee's organization may resolve problems of mutual concern, certain basic concepts for reaching agreement must be understood. This section deals with some of these concepts.

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# Procedures

## 6. NEGOTIATION PROCEDURE

### 6.1. Recognition

6.1.1. The members of the classified staff of the Alpine School District constitute what the parties hereto believe to be an appropriate unit for the purpose of negotiating terms and conditions of employment as contemplated by Section 34-1-9 Utah Code Annotated 1953.

6.1.2. The Board of Education agrees to recognize the organization hereafter referred to as the association that has the greatest number of classified staff as members by December 1, of each year as the exclusive representative of members of said classified staff. Any employee or group of employees shall have the right at any time to present grievances to the Board. Nothing herein shall be so construed as to deprive any individual of his rights under Chapter 16, Title 34 Utah Code Annotated 1953. (Utah Right-to-Work Law).

### 6.2. Negotiations

6.2.1. A meeting date to open negotiations shall be set no later than the 21st day following the adjournment of either the regular or the budget session of the Utah State Legislature. Preliminary discussions relating to negotiations may be held at any time to help establish priorities and exchange information.

### 6.3. Negotiation Teams

6.3.1. The Board, or designated representatives appointed to serve as its team, will meet with representatives designated by the association for the purpose of establishing ground rules for negotiation sessions and reaching mutually satisfactory agreements.

### 6.4. Opening Negotiations

6.4.1. Any proposal that may arise which affects terms and conditions of the services of the classified staff shall be negotiable, including salaries, budgetary items, fringe benefits and working conditions and other matters of mutual concern. The Board and the association shall submit in writing, no later than the second negotiation meeting, all issues upon which they wish to negotiate. Additional items will only be added by mutual consent. Negotiations mutually agreed upon will be conducted at times and places mutually agreeable to the negotiators named by each party. Negotiation meetings shall continue to be held at the request of either party until an agreement is reached. If negotiations are scheduled during the school day, negotiators shall be released from their regular duties without loss of pay. Either party may utilize the services of consultants to assist in the negotiations. During negotiations the Board and the association will present relevant data, exchange points of view, and make proposals and counter proposals. Upon request of either party, the other will make available for inspection to the requesting party its records and data pertinent to the subject of negotiations.

6.5. Joint Study Committees

6.5.1. The negotiators for the Board and the association are empowered to create joint study committees.

6.6. Adopting Agreements

6.6.1. When a substantive agreement is reached, it shall then be made in writing and submitted for ratification to the Board and to the Association. When approved by both parties, it shall be signed by their respective presidents and shall be entered into the official minutes of the Board. Thereupon, the agreement shall constitute a revision of school policies

6.7. Impasse

6.7.1. If, after serious consideration of a negotiable item, agreement has not been reached, the Board and/or the association may declare that an impasse exists and the following procedure shall be followed;

- 6.7.1.1. A mediator/fact finder shall be selected within ten (10) days from the impasse declaration through joint consultation with association and Board representative.
- 6.7.1.2. The mediator/fact finder shall endeavor to assist the parties to overcome the impasse and arrive at agreement on the issues before them
- 6.7.1.3. The parties agree to cooperate with the mediator/fact finder by providing him with such available information as he requests and to meet promptly for the presentation of the issues.
- 6.7.1.4. Upon completion of his inquiry and within twenty (20) calendar days from the date of his selection the mediator/fact finder shall submit his recommended solution to both parties.
- 6.7.1.5. The report of the mediator/fact finder shall be advisory only.
- 6.7.1.6. Both parties shall take official action of the report of the mediator/fact finder no later than five (5) days after receiving said report.
- 6.7.1.7. The parties agree to share equally in the expense of the mediator/fact finder and to assume the full costs of their own representation.
- 6.7.1.8. The mediator/fact finder shall be limited to the issues of impasse.

# Orderly Termination

## Statement of Policy

It is the policy of Alpine School District to protect public interests and to maintain the faith and confidence of citizens in the integrity of the public schools and school employees by setting standards of employee conduct. Additionally, the Alpine School Board believes that employees should be provided opportunities to align their behavior with these standards. In cases where employees fail to meet the standards, the Board delegates to the Superintendent or a designee the responsibility of investigating inappropriate employee behavior and conduct and taking appropriate action.

PERSONNEL CLASSIFIED

## 1. ORDERLY TERMINATION POLICY FOR CLASSIFIED AND PROVISIONAL PERSONNEL

### 1.1. Definition of Terms

- 1.1.1. CAREER EMPLOYEE: Any employee who has completed three or more consecutive successful years of contracted employment in Alpine School District. Employees with prior service in the district may also be classified as career employees as outlined in 1.1.2.1 below. Such individuals have a reasonable expectation of continued employment. Hourly employees that have earned a contract based on service hours will be considered a career employee. (see policy 4456 2.0).
- 1.1.2. PROVISIONAL EMPLOYEE: An employee who has served less than three full consecutive years in the district. A provisional employee does not have an expectation of continued employment beyond the immediate contract term.

- 1.1.2.1. Any employee who returns to Alpine School District with at least two years of successful contracted experience in the job they are returning to ~~will~~ ~~may~~ be moved to the career employee status ~~upon the written recommendation of their supervising administrator~~ after one year of successful provisional status **unless the provisional status is extended by the supervisor.**
- 1.1.2.2. An hourly employee with at least two years of successful employment with ASD immediately prior to being awarded a contract position, ~~will~~ ~~may~~ be moved to the career employee status ~~upon the written recommendation of their supervising administrator~~ after two years of successful provisional status **unless the provisional status is extended by the supervisor.**
- 1.1.2.3. Only regular contracted employment in Alpine School District may be used for purposes of establishing the number of years of prior experience.
- 1.1.3. EMPLOYEE: All contracted classified personnel of the school district.
- 1.1.4. PROBATIONARY EMPLOYEE: A career employee who, because of unsatisfactory performance, is placed in a probationary status for the purpose of remediation. Employees on probation will have an annual review to evaluate the probationary status. Appropriate levels of improvement will require the employee to be removed from probation.
- 1.1.5. CONTRACT TERM: The period of time during which an employee is engaged by the school district under a contract of employment, whether oral or written. Contract term is the effective date on the employee's contract.
- 1.1.6. TERMINATION OR DISMISSAL: Termination or Dismissal means:
  - 1.1.6.1. Termination of the status of employment of an employee;
  - 1.1.6.2. Failure to renew the employment of a career employee;
  - 1.1.6.3. Reduction in basic salary of an employee which is not generally applied to all employees of the same category employed in the school district during the employee's contract term; or

- 1.1.6.4. Change of assignment of an employee with an accompanying reduction in basic salary pay, unless the assignment change and basic salary reduction are agreed to in writing by the employee.

## 2. TERMINATION PROCEDURES

### 2.1. PROVISIONAL EMPLOYEES:

- 2.1.1. If the superintendent determines that a provisional employee will not be offered a contract, or retained on provisional status, for the following year, written notice of the same will be given to the provisional employee. The superintendent or a designee shall hand deliver the notice to the employee or send it by certified mail to the person's last known address. The notice shall be delivered at least two months prior to the end of the contract term.
- 2.1.2. A provisional employee may be terminated for cause during the contract. Whenever a provisional employee is terminated for cause during the contract term then the school district shall follow the termination for cause procedures set forth in paragraph 4.0 of this policy.
- 2.1.3. Nothing in this policy shall be construed to require the school district to complete evaluations or a successful remediation prior to termination of a provisional employee's employment. Nothing herein shall be construed to grant any provisional employee an expectation of continued employment beyond the immediate contract term.
- 2.1.4. A provisional employee does not have a right to grieve the Alpine School District's decision to not offer a contract for the following school year. Provisional employees do not have an expectation of continued employment beyond the end of the current contract term.

### 2.2. CAREER EMPLOYEE

If the district intends not to renew the contract of a career employee, the following procedures will be followed:

#### 2.2.1. The superintendent or a designee shall:

- 2.2.1.1. Notify the career employee in writing at least one month prior to issuing notice of intent not to renew the employee's

contract that continued employment is in question. The notice shall also state the reasons for an anticipated non-renewal.

2.2.1.2. The notice shall inform the career employee that he/she shall be given a period of time in which to correct the problems giving rise to anticipated non-renewal. This time shall be for one month. At the discretion of the supervising administrator in consultation with district officials, the length of the probation/remediation period may be increased beyond one month. The remediation shall be reviewed at least yearly.

2.2.1.3. The supervising administrator shall develop and implement a plan of assistance for career employees whose performance is unsatisfactory. The plan shall identify specific, measurable and actionable deficiencies, available resources and a recommended course of action to improve employee performance.

2.2.2. If a supervising administrator, in conjunction with district administration, determines after the opportunity for correction that the career employee's contract should not be renewed for a following year, the superintendent or a designee shall notify the career employee of the district's intention not to renew the career employee's contract. This written notification must be issued at least two months before the end of the career employees' contract term.

2.2.2.1. The notice shall be in writing, bear the date of issuance, and contain a clear and concise statement that the individual's contract will not be renewed and the reasons for the termination. The notice shall be served by personal delivery or by certified mail to the career employee's last known address. The notice shall state that the employee may request an informal conference with the superintendent or designee.

2.2.3. If an employee desires an informal conference with the superintendent or his designee, a request must be submitted in writing to the superintendent within fifteen days of the date on the notice of non-renewal. The conference will be held as soon as

practicable. No legal counsel or witnesses will be permitted at the conference. The employee may bring an association representative, other than an attorney, to the conference.

2.2.4. If an employee does not desire an informal conference with the superintendent or his designee, but does desire a hearing before a hearing office appointed by the Board of Education, the employee must submit a written request of the same to the superintendent within ten days of the date of the notice of non-renewal or termination. The employee may not appeal directly to the Board of Education.

2.2.5. If an employee meets informally with the superintendent or his designee, to challenge the non-renewal, or termination, he may request a hearing before a hearing officer appointed by the Board of Education with input from the Alpine Classified Employees Association. The employee may not appeal directly to the Board of Education. The request must be in writing to the superintendent within ten days of the date the informal conference is held with the superintendent or his designee.

2.2.5.1. If an employee requests a hearing before the Board of Education hearing officer, the hearing officer shall be appointed by the Board of Education Policy No. 4432 (d) with input from the Alpine Classified Employees Association. The hearing officer will be selected within twenty-one days following the employee's request to the superintendent.

2.2.5.2. Upon selection of the hearing officer, the hearing officer shall request the superintendent to send written notice of the date, time and place of the hearing by personal delivery or certified mail to the employee's last known address. The hearing shall be scheduled as soon as is practicable.

2.2.5.3. 2.2.5.3 At the hearing the career employee has the right to counsel, to produce witnesses, to hear testimony against him or her, to cross examine witnesses, and to examine documentary evidence submitted to the hearing officer.

2.2.5.4. 2.2.5.4 At the conclusion of the hearing, the hearing officer will retire and deliberate. Upon reaching a decision the hearing officer will make written findings of fact and its

conclusion regarding non-renewal or termination. A copy of the hearing officer's findings and conclusion shall be delivered by personal delivery or certified mail to the career employee. The findings and conclusions shall be dated, and shall be served or mailed on that date.

- 2.2.6. The district or the employee may seek review of the findings and conclusions of the hearing officer by the Board of Education by delivering written notice to the superintendent's office within ten days of the date of the hearing officer's written findings and conclusions. The board may review the findings and conclusions of the hearing officer with or without holding its own hearing at the board's discretion. If the board elects not to hold a hearing, it will review the hearing officer's findings and conclusions and issue its decision within sixty days of the date the review notice is delivered. If the board elects to hold a hearing, the board will notify the employee and the district administration of the hearing date, which will be scheduled within sixty days of the date the appeal notice is delivered.
- 2.2.7. If a board hearing is held, the board may elect to adopt the findings of the hearing officer as its own rather than hear further presentations of evidence. This determination may be made in advance of the hearing or at the hearing at the board's discretion. At the conclusion of the hearing, the board may adopt the conclusions of the hearing officer, or issue its own conclusions. The board's findings and conclusions will be in writing. A copy shall be delivered to the career employee, either personally or by certified mail to the employee's last known address.
- 2.2.8. If the employee does not request in writing a hearing within ten days of the date on the non-renewal or termination notice, the non-renewal will be considered complete, and the written notice of intention to not renew employment or terminate will also serve as a written notice of final termination by the board.
- 2.2.9. Nothing here shall be construed to limit the right of either the board or the employee to appeal to an appropriate court of law.

2.2.10. The district may determine not to renew a career employee's contract for cause. Causes which may be considered for such action include, but are not limited to:

- 2.2.10.1. Breach of contract
- 2.2.10.2. Violation of board policy
- 2.2.10.3. Violation of negotiated agreements
- 2.2.10.4. Incompetency or inefficiency in the performance of duties
- 2.2.10.5. Insubordination, including but not limited to, refusal to do assigned work within one's job classification

### 3. SUSPENSION PROCEDURES

The active service of an employee may be suspended pending an investigation or hearing when it is determined by the superintendent in his sole discretion that the continued employment of that individual may be harmful to the students or to the district. Written notice of suspension is prepared by the superintendent or a designee and shall be hand delivered to the employee being suspended or mailed by certified mail to the employee's last known address. The letter must state the reasons for suspension and advise the employee of his right to request a hearing. If suspension is without pay, and if the employee is subsequently reinstated, back pay must be awarded. Fringe benefits will not be terminated during suspension.

### 4. TERMINATION DURING CONTRACT TERM

An employee's contract may be terminated during the contract term for cause. If the district determines to terminate an employee's contract for cause, written notice of termination shall be delivered by personal delivery or by certified mail addressed to the individual's last known address. Notice shall be given at least thirty days prior to the proposed date of termination. The notice shall state the date of termination and detailed reasons for termination. The notice shall also state that the employee may request an informal conference with the superintendent or designee. Such request must be made in writing within ten days of the date of the notice. If the employee wishes, after meeting informally with the superintendent or designee he or she may request a hearing before a board appointed hearing officer, pursuant to the procedures outlined in section 2.2.4 through 2.2.9.

- 4.1. Termination during the contract term may be for cause. Causes which may be considered for such action include, but are not limited to:
- 4.1.1. Violation of board policy
  - 4.1.2. Violation of negotiated agreements
  - 4.1.3. Incompetency or inefficiency in the performance of duties
  - 4.1.4. Insubordination, including but not limited to, refusal to do assigned work within one's job classification
  - 4.1.5. Dishonesty on the job
  - 4.1.6. Conduct involving moral turpitude
  - 4.1.7. Commitment or conviction of a criminal act
  - 4.1.8. Bringing an intoxicant into or consuming an intoxicant on school property, or reporting for work under the influence of an intoxicating liquor

  - 4.1.10. Addiction to or being under the influence of a narcotic or any other habit forming drug, the effects which would impair the efficiency of the employee

## 5. REDUCTION IN FORCE

Nothing in this policy shall be construed to preclude staff reduction when necessary to decrease the number of employees because of the discontinuance of a particular service, because of decreased student enrollment in the district, because of the shortage of anticipated revenue after the budget has been adopted or because of school consolidations. Reduction in force shall be governed by the Reduction in Force policy.

# Job Study Program

## Statement of Policy

The Alpine School District Board of Education is committed to hiring and retaining high quality employees. Ensuring that compensation for our employees is competitive with market value is an essential part of that commitment.

## PERSONNEL CLASSIFIED

### 1. JOB STUDY PROGRAM

- 1.1. The Alpine School District is committed to the process of job analysis and job evaluation to determine compensable factors that have the power to establish relative values of all jobs in the organization.
- 1.2. The District shall make every effort to ensure that its pay schedules are maintained on an annual basis. All schedules must be adjusted annually to reflect the local labor market responses to cost of living
- 1.3. No employee, as a result of these schedules, shall experience a decrease in pay. Measures for bringing individual jobs in line with the schedules shall be adjusted over time to minimize individual hardship.
- 1.4. The District shall assign the responsibility for schedule administration to the Human Resource Director for Classified Employees. It shall be the responsibility of this individual to see that job changes are evaluated as to the impact on specific jobs and to coordinate all employee appeals as outlined under that section below (Section 1.9). The Personnel Director shall:
  - 1.4.1. Gather needed information, do needed research, prepare agendas, keep minutes and notify employees of actions taken. It shall be this individual's responsibility to hear complaints, receive new job descriptions, write new job descriptions when appropriate, and prepare information for presentation to the Appeals Committee.

- 1.4.2. Keep personnel files updated with respect to salary issues. This should include performance review data justifying proposed changes in pay or justifying no change in pay. This shall provide a back-up for EEO investigations or potential civil actions.
- 1.4.3. Accumulate, analyze and file for reference, data concerning salaries paid in the markets that represent each key job. This shall be of great value in the annual pay negotiations.
- 1.4.4. Be thoroughly acquainted with all federal, state, and local legislation dealing with salary administration.
- 1.5. This District complies with all federal, state, and local laws including employment and salary administration and is an equal opportunity employer
- 1.6. The District shall maintain current job descriptions for all salaried employees showing required activities, job requirements, responsibilities and conditions.
- 1.7. The District shall communicate the salary schedules to all covered employees clearly and completely. Each employee shall have access to his/her job description, job requirements and pay range that represents the lane in which the employee is placed. Supervisors shall be encouraged to direct the attention of employees to those documents, and to indicate that only a change in the job description and job requirements can result in a change in job value.
- ~~1.8. Twelve steps shall be established to each lane. District officials shall decide the appropriate hiring step based on the qualifications of the person being considered in accordance with policy 4444. The employee shall be advanced yearly on July 1, if step increases are successfully approved in the annual budget.~~
- 1.9. If an employee feels that his or her job description does not adequately reflect the major responsibilities and duties actually assigned, or if the job has changed substantially since the job description was written, the employee may file an appeal requesting that the job description be revised and that the salary lane classification of the job be reviewed. If the District Board of Education, Superintendent or designee decides to create a new job or revise existing jobs, the job description shall be written and submitted to the Appeals Committee for evaluation and lane placement.

- 1.9.1. When an employee decides to appeal perceived discrepancies in his or her job description, the employee must first obtain a copy of the current job description and an appeal form from the District Human Resource Office or from the Employee Association representative. In filling out the form and filing the appeal, the employee has the obligation to provide sufficient reason and substantiation for making the appeal, by submitting all applicable documentation. Before submitting the completed appeals form to the District Human Resource Office, the employee must secure the signatures of both the Employee Association representatives and the immediate supervisor. In signing the form, the representatives and the supervisor must indicate whether or not they believe the changes recommended by the employee would make the job description more accurate.
  - 1.9.2. Upon receipt of the appeals form, the Director of Human Resources or his designee shall review with the District administration the changes in job description proposed by the employee. This step is particularly important in view of the fact that any changes in a job description could affect all employees working in that job classification, not just the employee who filed the appeal. If the proposed changes do not accurately describe actual job requirements, the Personnel Office may attempt to resolve the appeal at this point by administrative clarification of the duties intended, or not intended, for this position. If the appeal cannot be resolved by administrative action, the Personnel Office shall forward the appeal to the Job Appeal Committee, along with any suggestions the Personnel Office may wish to make regarding the appeal and the job description
  - 1.9.3. In order to ensure objectivity and a thorough review of the job appeal process, the District agrees to provide and fund a third-party consultant to provide input and training as needed to the job appeal committee.
- 1.10. The Appeals Committee shall meet at least yearly to review and act upon the submitted job appeals. The regular meeting shall be scheduled as early in the school year as is practicable. The Job Appeal Committee shall

schedule as many meetings as necessary to thoroughly review all job appeals. The Appeals Committee shall consist of seven members.

- 1.10.1. Director of Human Resource or designee, and two administrators chosen by the district representing administration
  - 1.10.2. Employee Association president and two members chosen by the association representing employees
  - 1.10.3. Third-party consultant
  - 1.10.4. The role of the third-party consultant shall be to consult and advise other members of the committee. However, to insure against a stalemate and committee ineffectiveness, the third party recommendation shall be followed in the event of a tie vote. The decision of the Appeals Committee shall be binding, and shall be communicated in writing to the employee who filed the appeal.
- 1.11. Action on Appeals Committee decisions shall be subject to yearly budget considerations. All recommendation of the Appeals Committee shall be funded from a negotiated contingency fund, provided that:
- 1.11.1. If approved appeal costs exceed the budgeted contingency fund, the funds shall be equally shared among all of those who are to receive level advancements.
  - 1.11.2. In the event that the contingency fund is entirely depleted, appealed cases requiring lane changes shall be adjusted in the new contract year, provided negotiated contingency funds are available.
  - 1.11.3. Salary lane classifications resulting from appeals shall become effective on the date of the Appeals Committee approval. In exceptional circumstances the Appeals Committee may set a different date.
  - 1.11.4. In the event of an employee being promoted to another pay lane, the policy shall be that the employee shall, at a minimum, retain his current salary so that no pay shall be lost.
- 1.1. Employees wishing to advance within the organization and job applicants from outside the district must meet the basic job requirements of the position they seek. This in no way restricts management from making changes in these job descriptions as the technology and circumstances dictate and with the approval of Human Resources.

- 1.12. The District shall perform an audit of the salary plan at least every five years to determine, among other things:
  - 1.12.1. The currency and accuracy of job descriptions
  - 1.12.2. The extent to which the appeal system is working
  - 1.12.3. The currency and accuracy of job evaluation
  - 1.12.4. Salary competitiveness
- 1.13. This audit shall be subject to yearly budget considerations.

# Reduction in Force

## Statement of Policy

The Alpine School District Board of Education is committed to its dual responsibilities of honoring employee contracts and fulfilling its financial obligations. The Board also recognizes that situations may arise that will cause a conflict between these two responsibilities. In such cases, the Board delegates to the Superintendent or designee the decision making ability to correct and ameliorate the issue by making appropriate changes in expenditures which may include a reduction in force. These changes may be necessitated districtwide, at the school level, or by program. This policy will also influence decisions in cases of boundary adjustments, school consolidations, school openings, and/or school closures.

## DEFINITIONS

1. General layoff: A reduction in force in all areas of the district.
2. Layoff of specific program: A reassignment relocation because a program or area is:
  - 2.1. No longer funded by the state or federal agencies and for which no other source of funding is available.
  - 2.2. Eliminated because of insufficient student enrollment based on district guidelines of teacher/student ratios and other appropriate statistical information.
  - 2.3. Consolidated or discontinued.

3. Part time assignments: When an employee's assignment is less than the regular full time contract.
4. Priority list: A list of employees in the district, in a department, or at a school (depending on the change being considered) in which employees are placed based on personnel needs, seniority in the district, and the results of the employee's performance evaluation. This list will be used in making placement decisions. The list will be created after accounting for natural attrition (retirement, resignation, one year only contracts) at all locations involved.
5. Reduction in force: The districtwide need to reduce the number of employees. Reductions at an individual school site, department, or in a program shall not be construed as a reduction in force as those employees with ongoing contracts may be placed within the district (see reassignment).
6. Reassignment: In cases of boundary adjustments, school consolidations, school openings, and/or school closures, the placement of contracted employees within the district.
7. Recall or call back: A system of rehiring employees within the provisions of this policy when a reduction in force is no longer necessary.
8. "Transfer" means the assignment of an employee to a different district location. This assignment may be voluntary on the part of the employee or involuntary.

## 1. REDUCTION IN FORCE

- 1.1. Reduction in Force Policy - If the Board of Education, in its discretion, determines that a reduction in the number of classified employees is necessary because of lack of work, lack of funds, declining enrollments, discontinuance or substantial reduction of a particular program or service, school consolidation, or for other just reasons, such reduction shall be accomplished as follows:
  - 1.1.1. Employees to be so released shall be given thirty days written notice.
  - 1.1.2. The order of reduction of employees will not utilize a last-hired, first-fired layoff program.
  - 1.1.3. The district ~~may~~ will use a priority list which will consider personnel needs, seniority in the district, and the results of the employee's

~~performance evaluation.~~the results of a classified employee's performance evaluation, school/department personnel needs when terminating the district's employees under this policy.

- 1.1.4. Employees who have been laid off have the right, if they so desire, to the first vacancy of equivalent hours per day in any classified department, if qualified, as determined by Personnel Policies and Procedures, for up to 180 days from the time of the reduction. If more than one laid off employee is qualified and desires the position, then only the interested and qualified laid off employees will go through the hiring process for that position.
- 1.1.5. An employee who is rehired shall be placed on the salary closest to previous hourly rate, and shall be placed on one year probation without a loss of benefits.

## STATEMENT OF POLICY

The Alpine School District Board of Education recognizes there are emergency situations and/or labor to be performed on designated holidays that require employees to work beyond their contracted hours. These situations should be extenuating circumstances and are governed by this policy. The Board delegates to the Superintendent or designee the responsibility to administer this policy.

## 1. EMERGENCY WORK AND/OR ASSIGNED OVERTIME HOURS

- 1.1. The administration agrees to implement the following practices effective in the 1985-86 contract year:
  - 1.1.1. Emergency Work: When classified personnel are called out for emergency work beyond their contracted hours, they will be reimbursed as follows:
    - 1.1.1.1. Travel pay - From home to district vehicle or work site and return at the approved district rate.
    - 1.1.1.2. Time - The hourly rate of pay shall be determined upon the actual time to complete the task plus one hour to compensate the employee for travel time. In no event will less than one (1) hour of total time be awarded.

1.1.2. Overtime: It is the responsibility of the principal at each school and the department heads to make sure that no employee covered by the Fair Labor Standards Act works in excess of forty hours unless it is requested and approved by the employee's principal/supervisor. Payment of one and one-half times the regular rate must be approved by the employee's **principal/supervisor**. ~~a Cabinet level administrator.~~

1.1.3. Generally, holiday work is limited to emergencies that relate to maintenance and custodial employees at the school plant. **Other situations exist that may require work on a holiday.** Time and a half compensation is given for working the holidays as listed without regard to the over 40 hours worked provision.

7. "Transfer" means the assignment of an employee to a different school or location within the district, but in the same job classification and at the same pay. This assignment may be voluntary on the part of the employee or involuntary.

## 1. VOLUNTARY TRANSFER

- 1.1. Transfer shall mean reassignment to work at a different school or location, but in the same job classification and at the same pay.
- 1.2. To apply for a transfer, employees must file a request for transfer in writing with the Human Resource office. Employees are to notify the Human Resource office when they are interested in transferring to a position that has been advertised. Any job transfer is dependent upon supervisor selection.
- 1.3. Employees must work two years in a position before they may apply for a transfer, except with Director and DLT approval.
- 1.4. **In case of a district reconfiguration, additional consideration will be given to employees with 20 or more years of contracted Alpine district experience based on their district hire date.**

- 1.4.1. Employees whose position will be located in the newly created district could be transferred in accordance with the negotiated process of policy 4466.
- 1.4.2. Transfers can only be honored if there are open positions within Alpine School District.

## 2. INVOLUNTARY TRANSFER

- 2.1. When an employee has received notification that he/she is to be involuntarily transferred to another work unit, the employee may request a hearing with his/her immediate supervisor, the classified human resource director and the representative from the Classified Association prior to the transfer. This committee will review the facts and make a recommendation concerning the transfer to the Superintendent on their findings.

~~Note: Transfer means the same position with the same pay.~~

## 3. REASSIGNMENT

- 3.1. In the event that it becomes necessary to eliminate or reduce specific positions as a result of declining enrollments, boundary adjustments, school consolidations, school openings, and/or school closures, each individual affected will be reassigned according to the following guidelines after accounting for natural attrition (retirement, resignation, one year only contracts):
  - 3.1.1. The individual will be placed in another position within the district for which they are qualified.
  - 3.1.2. The reassignment will be in accordance with the individual's order on the priority list and in terms of the provisions of this policy.
    - 3.1.2.1. An employee who does not have the proper qualification cannot replace an employee who has the proper qualifications.
  - 3.1.3. The District is responsible for placing employees at schools/departments within the District in comparable positions if possible. If there is no position available, the reduction would constitute a Reduction in Force ("RIF") and the RIF policy would be in effect rather than the transfer procedure.

# Vacation

## STATEMENT OF POLICY

The Alpine School District Board of Education recognizes the importance of a qualified employee in every position. Further the Board understands that some leave is needed by employees beyond bereavement (Policy 4416) and health and disability (Policy 4412) leaves to rest, renew, and rejuvenate. Therefore, the Board has designated the Superintendent or designee to apply this policy for our twelve-month employees.

### 1. VACATION

- 1.1. All employees working under a twelve-month contract with the Board of Education are entitled to an annual vacation. Vacation shall accrue on an annual and monthly basis as follows:

- 1.2. ~~Vacation leave policy for classified employees shall be amended to allow vacation leave to begin on July 1 and to end on June 30 of each year.~~ Employees shall be allowed to accumulate a maximum of 30 days and shall not earn additional vacation until they have fallen below the 30 day total. Accumulated vacation shall be paid upon termination, retirement or death of the employee except that final payment shall be limited to the amount of

money that ~~the employee has earned up to the last day worked~~ ~~e has earned on his contract during that~~ ~~the final~~ contract year plus **any accrued vacation** up to 20 days ~~of accrued vacation~~.

- 1.3. The time of vacation must be cleared with the employee's immediate supervisor. Employees may take a personal day the day preceding or following Christmas vacation.
- 1.4. The Board of Education believes that an annual vacation is important and necessary for the well being of each employee, therefore, each employee is encouraged to use his full vacation each year. Any employee who has earned vacation while working as a twelve-month employee and is then changed to another status shall be entitled to the full use of those hours earned or be paid for those hours.
- 1.5. Any employee who has been working a nine, ten, or eleven month position and is transferred into a twelve position, may be granted longevity credit on the vacation schedule for the purpose of vacation accrual.
- 1.6. Vacation is ~~accrued~~ **recorded** at the end of the monthly time and attendance cut-off period.

# Procedures

## 1. VACATION

- 1.1. Employees who change their FTE (full-time equivalency) status and have earned vacation will have the option of being paid for those days based on the former FTE status and salary amount or may choose to have the days converted proportionately to the new FTE status.

- 1.1.1. Example: An employee who goes from a half-time (.50) FTE to full-time (1.0) FTE and has accrued twelve vacation days may be paid for the twelve days at the employee's former daily rate or may convert the twelve days to six days at the full-time FTE rate.
- 1.1.2. An employee who goes from a full-time (1.0) FTE to three-quarters (.75) FTE and has accrued twelve vacation days may be paid for the twelve days at the employee's former daily rate or may convert the twelve days at the employee's former daily rate or may convert the twelve days to sixteen days at the three-quarters (.75) FTE rate.
- 1.2. A classified employee may only accrue up to 30 days in any given FTE position. Therefore, an employee going from a 1.0 position to a lower FTE position would be required to receive money in lieu of vacation days at the former FTE rate for any days accrued beyond 30 after the conversion process.

Note: The formula for determining the new total of vacation days is as follows: Current FTE days X current FTE ÷ by new FTE = days under new FTE.

# Safety, Health and Welfare

## STATEMENT OF POLICY

The safety, health and welfare of every student is important to the Alpine School District Board of Education. Addressing these needs, provides the best results for student learning. This policy outlines school supervision, illness and accidents at school.

### 1. SAFETY, HEALTH, AND WELFARE

- 1.1. Elementary students who are on school property shall be under the supervision of school authorities from the time school doors open--15 minutes before the starting bell sounds--until the end of the school day. Students who are transported to and from school by the school district shall be under the supervision of school authorities from the time they board the school bus until the time they leave the school bus.
- 1.2. It is the responsibility of the principal to provide for adequate supervision of playgrounds and other school facilities while they are in use by students during regular school hours on regular school days.
- 1.3. Students shall be under the schools' supervision at all school-sponsored functions--on or off campus--such as athletic contests, class parties, musicals, plays, etc. Students are required to behave in a responsible and acceptable manner or they may be ~~removed~~ eliminated from the activity.

# Procedures

## 1. HEALTH-ACCIDENTS AND ILLNESS

- 1.1. In accordance with [UC 53G-9-202](#), a public school shall notify the custodial parent and, if requested in writing by a noncustodial parent, make reasonable efforts to notify the noncustodial parent of a student who is injured or becomes ill at the school during the regular day if:
  - (a) The injury or illness requires treatment at a hospital, doctor’s office, or other medical facility not located on the school premises; and
  - (b) The school has received a current telephone number for the party it is required to notify or make reasonable efforts to notify.
  
- 1.2. When a student becomes injured or ill at school, appropriate health care should be provided while arrangements are being made for the parent, guardian, or a responsible adult (designated by the parent or guardian on the student health form) to come **pick up** for the student.
  
- 1.3. The following steps shall be followed when an illness, accident or injury has occurred:
  - 1.3.1. In case of a serious illness, accident, or injury the parent or guardian is to be notified immediately.
  - 1.3.2. The-school supervisor is also to be notified as soon as possible.
  - 1.3.3. In the case of a life threatening situation or emergency, the principal or designee has the authority to call an ambulance or seek appropriate medical attention.
  - 1.3.4. The name of the family medical advisor, to be used in case of an emergency, is a part of the registration kept for each pupil. When a school employee handling the case calls the medical advisor, it should be made clear that the school district shall not assume financial responsibility.

- 1.3.5. In case of minor illnesses, accidents or injuries, first-aid may be given by a teacher or employee of the school district who has had first-aid instruction. Instructions should be posted in every first-aid cupboard. Instructions should include the type of illnesses or injuries that may be treated.
  - 1.3.5.1. The teacher or employee will make a [log](#) of the illness, accident or injury, list the care administered and notify parents of the illness, accident or injury as soon as practicable and at a minimum prior to the student leaving school for the day.
- 1.3.6. In all cases of serious illness, accidents or injuries, the pupil accident report should be made out as soon as possible. One copy is to be filed with the principal to be kept in the school for future reference and a copy shall be sent to the **District administrator over Risk Management**, Business Services or designee. The District's insurance carrier is to be notified by the District administrator as soon as possible.
- 1.4. Every school shall establish emergency procedures to be followed in the event of a medical emergency.
- 1.5. **Parents/guardians are responsible for their children's accident expenses, including during the school day and with after school and extracurricular activities.**
