Mayor O'Hare said Good afternoon, everybody. We'd like to welcome you to 6 pm on May 8th, 2024 we are first going to have a public hearing. The public hearing is going to go over the CDBG, the second hearing for the grant that we are receiving. And also we are going to go over five public hearings for 5-1-7 control of rabies and rabbit animals. Resolution number 2024- 05-01, I'd like to recognize Rod McGary Council Member, Rod McGarry LuAnn Johnson, Heather O'Hare, as well as Tammie Morgan and Stacey Hill, our Clerk and Treasurer, and I am Mayor O'Hare, so we are going to open up the hearing. We'll go ahead and start and we'll have Tammie go ahead and read the CDBG second hearing paperwork.

Tammie Morgan said All right, so we are holding the public hearing. It's the second public hearing for the CDBG grant. This hearing is called to allow all citizens to provide input concerning the project that was awarded under the 2024 Community Development Block Grant Program. The town has amended its capital investment plan and decided to apply for funds to provide the local funding match requirements for the reconstruction of the Deep Creek Bridge. I will be the project manager for the grant. And the application was successful in the regional rating and ranking process, and the town has received \$292,000 towards the project. The funds will be used to reconstruct the bridge on 25600 North over Deep Creek. So we just need, if anybody has any questions or comments, now's the time to ask. If there aren't any, we can just close the public hearing. So

Mayor O'Hare asked I want to ask first if I could. LuAnn, do you have anything to add to it, since you're over the roads and bridges?

LuAnn said Nope. I get all my info from that woman right there, who knows everything?

Mayor O'Hare said Awesome.

Then now we'll open it up to the town for anybody that has any comments. Mr Morgan,

Mike Morgan asked why did they decide on what kind of a structure they're going to do. Are they going to replace it, just like it is the same type of structure?

Tammie said I'm not 100% sure they were going to go look at the road down by the dairy there with the little culvert that's under it. They're going to try to do it as cheap as possible. LuAnn and I met with not Nick, the one from Zach. So Nick, he says he's, he wants to do it as cheap as possible and as simple as possible. So

LuAnn said it still has to be, what the federal government.

Mayor O'Hare said yeah.

LuAnn said Well, let us do.

Mayor O'Hare said since it's a creek water, yeah, for environmental.

Tammie said anyway, so those funds will just be used for our match for the \$4 million project.

Mayor O'Hare asked so it's 4 million now?

Tammie said well.

LuAnn said 3.7 million give or take.

Mayor O'Hare said Okay, so when we started this, well before it was at 3.6 million in our and our part was \$246,000 that was the last time when we were getting ready to do it, when we didn't get the grant, and that was last year. So that's where it sat, then our portion was \$246,000 started out.

Tammie said yeah.

Mayor O'Hare said yeah when it first started, yeah, it was a million dollar project, million and a half, and now it's at 3.7

Tammie said and we were the very last community right on the list, yep, with UDOT to get the funding through UDOT, so we lucked out.

LuAnn said we were very lucky.

Mayor O'Hare asked if Anybody else had any comments.

Rod asked Time Frame.

Tammie said Time Frame.

Rod said Yeah.

Tammie said it's going to be a long process, probably next. Did they say next summer?

LuAnn said Yeah, they'll start it next summer, the beginning of the summer, late spring, early summer, and the it will take approximately three months.

Rod asked So these funds that we have, they're going to be locked in. They're not going to creep up to inflation?

Tammie said Nope. So we actually had a Zoom meeting just yesterday, LuAnn and I with the UDOT and the CDBG people, because they're two different, you know, people trying to work together. They're both giving us free money, if you could call it that. But so they're, we're all working together. And they they know CDBG knows what UDOT needs, and UDOT knows what the CDBG needs, so I think we're going to be fine. LuAnn said I do too.

Tammie said We're out there going to be working together and keeping us in the middle of it.

LuAnn said they were very knowledgeable and super helpful and on board with everything, so.

Rod asked are they going to let us know what structure-type thing that they're going to actually implement, because you said they were hard to do a study to see.

Tammie said Nick said he would come out to a council meeting before they put it out.

LuAnn said we'll have a construction meeting also that will give us the details.

Rod said Okay.

LuAnn said all those, all the details.

Tammie said they're all required.

Rod asked So if they do go cheaper, what happens to the CDBG?

Tammie said we would just turn it back. If we don't use their need at all. We can't use it for it.

LuAnn said we can't use it for anything else just for that.

Mayor O'Hare said but we can use it for that area, though, right? So like, once they put the bridge in, if we wanted to work on the sides the drainage.

LuAnn said well, they're going to do all that, and then they put the road back too.

Mayor O'Hare said I'm talking about, if you go up there on the west side, southwest side of where the bridge is, there's that drainage that comes down and it's filled with concrete and all kinds of stuff.

Tammie said this grant was given to us for the match for the bridge.

Mayor O'Hare said okay, okay.

Tammie said I don't believe we'll be able to use that. Mayor O'Hare said Okay, okay.

Rod said that was my question. So good.

Mayor O'Hare asked Heather, anybody else from the town? Okay, if that's all, then we will close the public hearing for the CDBG grant. This will be the second hearing, we will now go on to resolution number 2024-05-01, it's going to be for Title Five, police regulations, chapter one, animal control. It's under 51-7, controls of rabies and rabbit animals. We want to and I will read it, and then I will read what we want to add as the resolution at the present time. It reads rabies vaccines required. Every dog shall have a rabies shot every two years, and proof of current rabies shot, or as required herein, must be presented at the time of the application of a dog license. For every dog older than six months of age, no license will be issued without such proof, except for dogs under six months of age. Whenever the owner or persons having custody or possession of any dog shall have reason to believe that such dog has rabies or has shown symptoms of rabies, such owner or person shall immediately notify the animal control officer who shall cause to have an inspection or examination of such animal performed the owner or persons having custody shall immediately confine such animal until the inspection or examination is made by the animal control officer. We are proposing that we add the following wording, a rabies vaccination waiver will be accepted for any licensed dog within the corporate limits of Snowville. The rabies vaccination waiver must be issued and signed only by a licensed Utah State Veterinarian in good standing with the state of Utah. At the time the waiver is issued, and we will a waiver will have no expiration as long as the dog resides within the corporate limits of Snowville. So we will open it up for any comments from the town or or the Council.

Mr Heyder,

Tim Heyder asked Stacey, I'd like to ask you a question. First, Stacey, does the town of Snowville require that every dog that resides in the town of Snowville required by ordinance to be licensed?

Stacey said Yes,

Tim Heyder said okay. After a town board meeting three months ago, it was opened up to the public. I was very subdued of what happened at that town

board meeting. I took a lot of time to spend a lot of my own money to research the facts about rabies and dogs. Rabies is a disease of the nervous system caused by a virus that can occur in humans and animals. In humans, rabies usually results from exposure to an animal with rabies. Rabies in humans is fatal almost 100% of the time there are two types of exposure, bite and non-bite. A bite is when the skin is broken, and non-bite is when you're exposed through saliva, brain tissue, or spinal fluid, or enters through your eyes. Rabies is transmitted from bats, which we have in the town of Snowville, coyotes in the town of Snowville, boxes in the town of Snowville, skunks, and raccoons. Last year, I trapped in my own yard three raccoons and a couple of skunks. Like I said, rabies is almost 100 Percent fatal in humans once a person shows signs of rabies. In humans, there's no treatment for a goner. In animals, the only way you can test for rabies in an animal is I have to use a knife the animal sends his brain off to be tested, and be vaccinated for rabies. It's a \$5,000 cost to be vaccinated for rabies in a human. I couldn't get the cost. If you've been bitten by a dog, your skin's broken. There's a series of shots that you have to take. No one. I could not get the cost of what that series of shots takes. And if you go in and want to be vaccinated, it's \$5000 bucks. They don't keep the vaccination on hand, but that's what it costs. I've been in contact with the local and state health departments. They don't get involved until there's rabies actually proven, but they put me in contact with the state head man veterinarian. I'm going to come back to him in a minute. I visited several cities and towns in Fielding, Utah, to Lehi, and down to Helper to see what their ordinances said. Every one of the towns that I contacted, almost all of them in Box Elder County, requires vaccination, license, and vaccination with no exceptions. Every dog shall be vaccinated, with no exceptions, except one town that's Willard. The only thing that they allow is if your dog has been operated on at the time of being vaccinated when that dog is healed, then it has to be vaccinated. It shall be vaccinated. I've talked to two lawyers and spent my own money. Want you to know that your ordinances are created from state law. You can tighten up those laws, but you cannot loosen them. Loss the state laws in your ordinances. I talked to the lawyer about shall versus should, if your Lawyer is to say, shall you have to if they should to recommendation. I talked to him about freedom of speech, the removal of someone from town meetings. There's only a few things that you can remove a person from town board meeting once you open it up to the. Mayor O'Hare said Excuse me. Excuse me. We're talking about rabies right now.

Tim Heyder said so this comes back.

Mayor O'Hare said This has nothing to do with rabies.

Tim Heyder said opened it up to me.

Mayor O'Hare said and opened it up to rabies. That is what we're talking about.

This is an open hearing. It has nothing to do with anything else. If you want to talk about that, you can talk about it when we open up the meeting, not for this, not for this.

Tim Heyder said don't argue with me, Scott.

LuAnn said Just listen, go for it.

Tim Heyder said That is disorderly conduct and a threatening manner. I talked to him about comfort dogs and service dogs, if you ordered to say, shall they have to be vaccinated? Also, there's been some questions about that. I talked to him about ethics training and conflict of interest that has to do with rabies shots and voting on a town council, conflict of interest. Think about it, if you own dogs and you're voting, think of a conflict of interest. Go read your ethics training State of Utah. Now let's go back to the veterinarians. I've contacted several vets in the state of Utah and a couple out of the state of Utah, and there is no reason, absolutely no reason for a dog not to be vaccinated for rabies because of age or because of the vaccine itself. The problem you have with the vaccine is when you mix vaccines with other vaccines at the same time, then you start to have a problem with the vaccines.

Heather said actually, that's incorrect.

Mayor O'Hare said Oh, go ahead. Sorry, sorry.

Tim Heyder said and you can call the state vet, who is the head vet in the state of Utah if you want to ask me his name. After and get his phone number, Scott, or you're the mayor, I'll be glad to give you his name and his number. When you call him, you'll get a recording, and then he will call you back. That might take him a day or day and a half to call you back. He's a busy man, but he will be glad to call you back and give you that same information. When I called him, he asked me what I was talking about, and I told him what he was trying to do with this ordinance. He says, send me a copy of that ordinance. So I sent him a copy of that ordinance, and he turned it over to the State of Utah legal department. The state of the Utah's legal department got with me, and they sent me this. It's code. Write this number down, 386702-12, which became effective April 15, 2024, is

still effective 11-2- 2024 because they are trying to change it to make sure all dogs in the state of Utah gets vaccinated. Right now, it's a state law. Sub-step four measures for standard, standardized standards of IDEs, and rabies control practices as follows. step D, a county, city or a town or political subdivision that requires license, which you just told me that this town Does of animals shall, shall, means you have to also requires rabies vaccination as a prerequisite to obtain a license. That is Utah State law. So you have to do rabies vaccination in this town?

Mayor O'Hare said can I ask you, are you done? Or can I ask a question? Yes, okay, so that says if the town requires licensing.

Tim Heyder said yes.

Mayor O'Hare said okay.

Tim Heyder said and you require a license, and you get it.

Mayor O'Hare said okay, so if the town doesn't require a license for a dog, then they don't have to have a rabies vaccine.

Tim Heyder said but you did it for this fiscal year. So this fiscal year, every town that resides, every dog that resides in this town for this year has to have a license.

Mayor O'Hare said okay.

Tim Heyder said you can have the Vet.

Mayor O'Hare said right.

Tim Heyder said and they're going to update this by June.

Mayor O'Hare said June 11, 2024,

Tim Heyder said that every dog in the State of Utah, whether you live in the county or any town, has to have a rabies vaccination because it is becoming a health hazard because rabies or is coming back.

Mayor O'Hare said Okay.The other thing.

Tim Heyder said I will give you his name.

Mayor O'Hare said and his that's fine. The other thing is,I lost what I was gonna say. You also stated that the state said they will not, will not get involved with any town or city about rabies vaccination until there is a positive report of rabies. Is that correct?

Tim Heyder said No.

Mayor O'Hare said that's what you said. What did you say?

Tim Heyder said I did not say that.

Mayor O'Hare said What did you say?

Tim Heyder said What do you mean? What? I don't know, what you're asking me.

Mayor O'Hare said You said the state and local won't get involved until rabies is until the rabies is been verified. That's what you said. Okay, you can go back on.

We can go back on the tape because we got it recorded.

Heather said The health department.

Tim Heyder said the health department won't get involved.

Mayor O'Hare said State and local.

Tim Heyder said State and local health departments don't get involved,

Mayor O'Hare said okay.

Tim Heyder said Until rabies has been verified.

Mayor O'Hare said Okay, so that's the state and health department,

Time Heyder said then they get involved.

Mayor O'Hare said That's what I wanted to get health department.

Tim Heyder said That's when the health department gets involved.

Mayor O'Hare said Okay, anything else? That's all anybody else has anything to say on the matter, Town Council? Do you have any questions for

Mr Heyder? No questions. Okay.

Okay, we will go ahead and close the public hearing at this time. Thank you.

Mayor O'Hare said okay, we will now open up the town hall meeting for April. I'm sorry, May the eighth, 2024 I'm Mayor Scott O'Hare presiding. We want to recognize our town council members, Rod McGary, Luann Johnson, and Heather O'Hare. We also like to recognize Stacey Hill and Tammie Morgan, our clerk and treasurer. We also like to recognize Box Elder County Sheriff Deputy Shaw is with us tonight. We'd also like to recognize Chief Pugsley with the fire department, President Dave Smith with EMS, as well as AJ Morgan, Director of Water for the town. At this time, we'll have the pledge by Rod McGary and then the opening prayer by Heather O'Hare.

I pledge allegiance to the flag of the United States of America and to the republic for which it stands, one nation under God, indivisible with liberty and justice for all.

Heather said our Heavenly Father, we thank you, thankful that we're here, that we did come in safety, and that this meeting will go well, and that we will all make it home in safety and say so in the name of Jesus, Christ. Amen.



Mayor O'Hare said Amen, thank you, Rod, thank you, Heather.

Uh, the town council was mailed the acceptance of the agenda, I'm sorry, the agenda for tonight, as well as the minutes from the previous meeting. Did anybody have any questions about that or any additions?

Rod Said No.

Mayor O'Hare said I have one addition. Would like to talk about the Beehive slash Frontier phone that we have frontier right now, but I'd like to talk about that, so I'm gonna add that to the bottom here, or we'll add it when I'm here. So if we have no additions, do I have a motion to accept the agenda and the minutes from the previous meeting,

Rod said I'll make a motion to accept the agenda for the month of May and meetings from April, with the addition of Mayor O'Hare's comment.

Mayor O'Hare said do I have a second. LuAnn said second All in favor? Any opposed passed.

Mayor O'Hare said Mr. Jimenez here. Okay, so Mr Jimenez, I will go ahead and brief the Council on that. Mr. Jimenez lives right up here on the north, I'm sorry, the east side of Mollies, he's the one that has the, the, actually it's, he has the violation. Oh, shoot, sorry, sorry, I didn't mean to say that. Anyway, he lives up here with the old junk cars there, so he wanted a permit to build after further review, is Eric here? There. He is Eric. What was the name of that? Again, it's called zone one where they can't put a septic tank in the ground.

Eric said Yes, zone one.

Mayor O'Hare asked but what? What is the, what's the project that does that?

Eric said The source protection zone.

Mayor O'Hare said the Source Protection thing. Thank you. So the Source Protection will not allow him to put a septic tank in that property.

LuAnn asked and what's that for? Why is that?

Mayor O'Hare said so, Source Protection? AJ, can you explain it?

AJ Morgan said protecting the groundwater. It's too close to the well.

LuAnn said Oh.

AJ Morgan said so it's all part of our Source Protection. As far as you get away from the well, it changes. It changes zones, and you can do different things, but in Zone One, it's pretty limited.

LuAnn said okay

LuAnn said what you can do is to protect the drinking water for the town in simple terms.

Mayor O'Hare said so since he's not allowed to put a septic tank in there, he's not allowed to build a home on the property, we can't, we can't give him a building permit for leaving there. Okay, so that's the Well, no, because our ordinance of state, you can't live in a trailer on the property. But the town council, he would, he was going to come in and request, but I guess he hasn't. He's only here for six months. He works at OSI. He's only here for the six months working at OSI, so he was going to say, if he can't build, could he get permission to live in his home during the time he's working at OSI? And that would be something that the town council would have to decide whether to approve or not. We have approved stuff like that in the past for OSI. Over off of 800 North on the Morgan's old Morgan farm there, but they had stipulations that they had to abide by, and so, and this is right in the middle of town. So again, that's something the town council would have to decide. But he's not here to request it, so we're not going to request it on his behalf. He might have changed his mind on things so, but so that's why he was going to come in and talk to you guys about violations. Update you guys have. There's only three of them that we have, SVO, 010,011, and 012, so the 010, we've kind of discussed part of that, and then the other part has not been done. I've sent you guys pictures. The last picture I sent you is that the violation has not been taken care of yet, so he's got 30 more days to take care of it. And according to his violation, he has until June 9. So on June 9, if he doesn't have it taken care of or has come to us and let us know why and what his plans are. Left, send it over to the attorney. The next one is 011, I sent you pictures, one picture that one, that one's been, that one's been taken care of pretty well. There still are a few unlicensed vehicles that are on the property that now, if you go to another ordinance that we have, you can't have more than two. And there's, I think, three on there, so, but again, they've got until the end of the next month as well. And then the other one is 0012, which is or 012, which is the one down. We know which one is down here.

LuAnn asked Oh, yeah. So this other one's on 300 Mayor O'Hare said Yeah, the one picture is on 300 it's got an old trailer, old single wide mobile home. There's nobody living in it. I've checked it. There's nobody living in it. And then a couple of vehicles, they've cleaned it up a lot. It was really and they've taken the cars off the roadway and put it back, so at least they're working on it, which is good. LuAnn said Yeah.

Mayor O'Hare said the one over here, over here, they, they're, I mean, I've been taking pictures, and it looks like they're doing some type of cleanup, so, but they've got, we've given them six months to get that completely taken care of. They plan on building, they want to build a home there. So we've kind of discussed the options of what they're what they can do with the building a home, and get permits for that. So whether that comes to fruition, we don't know. Any questions on those next council member seats? Have you heard back from Mr Smoot?

Rod said, No

Mayor O'Hare said Okay. Anybody else had any

LuAnn said just no.

Rod said we had one other person I asked, but they haven't been here long enough.

Mayor O'Hare said Okay, we'll just keep working on that. Mr Oman here. No, I do want to thank Keith Oman, even though he's not here, I like to keep it on the record for him and his crew for the timely manner they were able to get the signs and get them put up. If you guys have noticed, on the both stop signs here now we have signs that say cross traffic.

LuAnn said We're actually we me and Brent were actually putting them up. But I was hoping they were actually straight.

Mayor O'Hare said Okay, well, I'm not sure. Okay, well, thank you.

LuAnn said I'm laughing And they came out and helped us.

Mayor O'Hare said Okay, well, thank you for putting those up, and it looks good.

LuAnn said He donated the signs. He paid for the signs, and everything Keith Oman did, and then we got him put up. So hopefully that helps.

Mayor O'Hare said and that's good, excellent. And then the sign Eric comes up with his time, and then we'll talk about the other one. But yeah, thank you for putting those up and make sure Brent knows. Thank you.

Mayor O'Hare said Park and Cemetery. Okay, so we have contacted the church for the new contract with them. They have, well, I have called the church five times and left a message for the lady five times. She has not returned my calls. This has been for the last month and a half, Stacey has emailed three times with no response from them, the person that was taking the job to mow the park and and the ball field. Since we don't have a contract with the ball field, we only have

the park now, which is going to drop the hours tremendously, by 40 hours. He's decided he can't afford to drive up here to do that, to do the park. Work, so he's kind of backed out of it. As far as the church goes, they haven't contacted us. We don't have a contract, so we can't do anything for the ball field.

LuAnn asked, does anybody know of a contact that we could get?

Stacey said This lady is the one through.

Mayor O'Hare said She was the contact.

Stacey said she was the contact lady. She gave me, like, her number and everything that's all here.

Mayor O'Hare Yeah.

AJ said the only thing I can say is, if you put some pressure, you ask Bishop Page.

LuAnn said I was just going to say ask the Bishop.

AJ said he could just tell you to get to the FM group member and then try to put some pressure that way.

Mayor O'Hare said that's who we're talking to. FM. I even called the emergency line.

AJ asked Is it the local one that comes and works at the church here?

Mayor O'Hare said it was some lady

AJ said There is a page that can put a request online for maintenance and stuff done. And I bet you he could probably put that in also for them to respond back on the part.

LuAnn said okay

Mayor O'Hare said yeah, I didn't want to, call the Bishop, just because I didn't want to get him involved with it. I didn't want to go over anybody's head.

LuAnn said that is the church's park, so we can. I'll call the bishop tonight and ask him if he can help.

Mayor O'Hare said So if that's the case, if we if they decide they don't want the contract, because we did up the price if they come back and say, no, they don't, they'll take care of it themselves, or whatever. Then. So then we will only have our park to do. Right now, we have 120 hours allocated for the Park in the Cemetery. We've, as of last year, divided it in half, 60 and 60, if we only have the park over here to do it. I'm thinking now this is just my two cents. Of course, it's totally up to the three of you. 20 hours, I think, would be sufficient for the park for the month, and then we could throw the other 40 hours to the cemetery if they need it.

LuAnn said Yeah, they probably wouldn't need that many hours, but it would be available if they did.

Mayor O'Hare said mostly, just so right now we have 120 hours to do, to do the park, but that includes the ball field too, though. So if we don't do the ball field right now, we have an extra 20 hours. I'm wondering if we could get Brent and Rios to be able to come over and do the park and get it mowed and stuff. I haven't got the water turned on yet. I need to get the water turned on the sprinkler system. I just kind of wait until we can get that first mow done.

LuAnn said I don't know if they would or not.

Mayor O'Hare asked If they had time to do it. We can have some.

LuAnn said I don't know.

Mayor O'Hare said So that's the only, thing we have,

Rod said yeah, I think we gotta wait for word back, one way or the other.

Mayor O'Hare said yeah but unfortunately, we can't wait too long, because we got it. We need to mow our park. The park needs to be mowed and the water needs to be turned on. We're doing that right now.

Tammie said I'm sending another email

Mayor O'Hare said Okay.

Tammie said it is an urgent response that needs to be mowed, so either come out and mow it or let us know.

Mayor O'Hare said Yeah, and we need to have a contract signed with them before we go out to mow it, though, because we can't be liable for anything if they don't, you know if they say yes, go ahead and start mowing. I said, well, we need to get that contract signed and back to us before we put a person on the property.

Stacey said I put her name on it so she should sign it. Mayor O'Hare said Yeah, yeah. As long as we

get a signed contract back from them. We can go ahead and start mowing. And if that's the case, I can call Brian back and let him know that the church did get back. And then I'm sure he'll come out and do it, then he'll come out and take care of it. Any questions about that? No.

Mayor O'Hare said okay, Memorial Day, how's Brent? And then they're gonna they so we got the new flags, right? You got the new flags, and then Brent Rios will get those put up when is it? Is it the week prior?

LuAnn said Oh, just a couple of days or something before Memorial Day.  
Mayor O'Hare said And then they'll take them down after Memorial Day. And then on Memorial Day, the honor guard will be here at 9 am correct?  
Stacey said The new flag will go up then they'll bring it back down.  
Mayor O'Hare said Okay.  
Any questions on Memorial Day?  
LuAnn said Nope.  
Rod asked Do they needed any help.  
LuAnn said Yeah, I'm not strong enough to lift them up and be much help to Brent. So he could use a little help putting the flags up. But you're probably working because it'll be probably on a Saturday, probably Saturday, but he put them up on Friday.  
Stacey said Friday 24th of May.

Rod said Okay, well, if Brent will give me a call tell him I'd love to help you.

LuAnn said Okay.

Rod asked if I'm available.

Tim Heyder said I will help him.

LuAnn said I would appreciate that. Thank you.

Rod said do you want my number so he can call me or he has it? I guess.

LuAnn said Yeah, I've got it and yeah, we've got it written down on the fridge, right in front.

Rod said Yeah, tell him I'd be glad to help.

LuAnn said Okay.

Mayor O'Hare said so we have Rod McGary and Tim Heyder that will help if they need help with that.

Tim Heyder said Yeah.

Mayor O'Hare said And the pole should be in here, right behind here. Does he know where they are?

LuAnn said Yes.

Mayor O'Hare said there in this room behind us.

LuAnn said so he can come down and get them.

Stacey said I should be home.

LuAnn Okay.

Stacey said after three.

LuAnn said okay, thank you again.

Stacey said yeah, we can get a flag there because the flag is an office.

LuAnn said okay.

Stacey said I have a nice, brand-new flag.

LuAnn said Nice. yeah,

Mayor O'Hare said next on the agenda is the resolution that we just went over control of rabies and rabid animals. So we had comments from Mr. Heyder on that for the town council to go over the council. Have any questions, or comments, or on this resolution, on adding to the resolution?

LuAnn said I want to table that for now. I don't want to vote on it tonight, because I want to do some research on my own. I happen to know a Vet and I want to call him and see what he says and what his thoughts are. And I think we need to talk to the state veterinarian and find out where, what, where they stand on that. I think there's more information that we have to have as a council before we can make an informed decision on this particular thing. So I'd like to table that and not vote on it tonight.

Mayor O'Hare said to table it till June. We'll put it back. Can we put that back on the agenda for June, please? Stacey said yeah.

Mayor O'Hare said and Mr. Heyder did bring up that he talked to multiple vets, and they said that there's no reason not to have a vaccine. But as we all know, every vet has their own opinion, and even though we have a State Vet, doesn't mean he Trumps everybody else. So as far as Vets go in there and their opinions, so I do encourage the council to make their informed decision.

Mayor O'Hare said also, Mr. Heyder also brought up the conflict of interest in voting. Also, remember, every ordinance in the book is a conflict of interest when it comes to you. You are a resident of Snowville,

LuAnn said exactly right.

Mayor O'Hare said so that doesn't play a part, that doesn't play a part in your life. You can still vote on whatever it's every ordinance is a conflict of interest. When you sit as a member of the town council.

LuAnn said the only conflict of interest, in my opinion, that we're going to have is because we have a husband and wife on them, and you're the one that will break the tie.

LuAnn said so, but I vote, if I vote nay, and these two vote, yay, then you break the tie. I mean, you know what? I mean.

Tammie said then it won't be, it wouldn't be a tie.

LuAnn said Oh.

Mayor O'Hare said we would have to have a fourth person for it to be a tie.

LuAnn said okay.

Mayor O'Hare said yeah.

LuAnn said So I

Mayor O'Hare said So right now there is, right now I have no vote. Since we don't have a seat or a fourth person, I have no voting period, right? There is no such thing as a tie right now we get.

LuAnn said if we get the council member that, and that was brought up at the last meeting too, and hopefully, we have opened enough minds that we can, we can work around that and not have that be a conflict of interest. But it does. It is perceived as a conflict of interest by some house people we have to acknowledge it.

Mayor O'Hare said It can be perceived that way. But there's always been somebody that's been married to somebody or related to somebody on this council. So and again, we're put here to make decisions as we think we should make them for the benefit of the town. So yeah, as long as everybody goes by their conscience and by what they think is right, agreed. Anything else from the Council on this matter? No, okay, so we'll go ahead and table this resolution until June, and we'll revisit it at that time, but we'll put it on the agenda in case there is a vote, okay.

Mayor O'Hare said and then the next one will be the acceptance of the electronic meeting. Now this is the one that we did last month. We did a public hearing for the electronic meetings. Mr. Heyder brought it to the attention of the town council that we are not a city and a stated city in it. So we have changed the wording. We're going to read out the wording, and we've changed everywhere, where it says city to town, and then if anybody sees anything wrong with this after I read it, we'll give everybody a chance to say something at that time. Just well, we'll kind of break our rules of waiting until the end of the meeting for people to talk. But if anybody has something to say, we'll allow them to say it before they before



it's voted on ordinance. Number 20, number 2024, dash, 0401, electronic meetings. Authorization and requirements in order to include members of the Town of Snowville Council through an electronic connection, a request for an electronic meeting must be made by a member of the Snowville Town Council up to three days prior to the meeting to allow arrangements for the electronic meeting to be made. A. Quorum of the council members must be present at a single anchor location for the electronic meeting to be held. However, if a proclamation of local state or national emergency is in effect, a majority of the Quorum of the Snowville Town council need not be physically present at a physical location from which the electronic meeting originates, or from which the Town of Snowville, Snowville Town council members are connected to the electronic meeting. In order for an electronic meeting to be held, Snowville Town Council shall provide space and facilities at the anchor location so interested persons and the public may attend and monitor the open portions of the meeting. If comments from the public will be accepted during the electronic meeting, facilities at the anchor location shall be provided so that the interested persons and the public may attend, monitor and participate in the open portions of the meeting. The Snowville Town Council may restrict the number of separate connections for members of the Snowville Town Council that are allowed for an electronic meeting based on available equipment to pass capability or establish other procedures, limitations, or conditions governing electronic meetings not to conflict with this section B. In order to participate in meetings electronically, the Snowville council members shall establish and maintain their electronic connection for the entire and then it says the Snowville Town Council meeting includes all work sessions or other scheduled items appearing on the meeting agenda. Small disconnections due to technical problems are allowed in order to meet the intent of the intent of this requirement. C, if the Snowville Town Council convenes or conducts an electronic meeting, they shall give public notice of the meeting in accordance with the state statute, and post written notice at the anchor location. The Town recorder shall provide notice of the electronic meetings to the council members at least 24 hours before the meeting, so they may participate in and be counted as present for all purposes and descriptions of how the members will be connected to the electronic meeting. The Snowville Town Council may prohibit or limit electronic meetings based on budget, public policy, or logistical considerations. And I like to thank Stacey for going and changing all the wording and typing this up for us.

Rod said So do we need to do something on B who that was?

Mayor O'Hare said Yeah.

Rod said Right.

Mayor O'Hare said yeah. So on B, there's actually a couple of them. If you go back up to A, about halfway down, it says you'll see it over on the left, it says of Snowville town council. It says electronic meetings originates or from which the Snowville part needs to be taken out, and then it just says Snowville Town Council members. And then down here on B, electronic connections for the entire and we need to take the V out, yes, and just have Snowville Town Council meeting Rod said agreed.

Mayor O'Hare said Yep. Heather, do you have any comments on this? LuAnne.

LuAnn said no.

Mayor O'Hare said anybody we're gonna go ahead and open it up if anybody has commented on this since it was a resolution. Okay, so, Tammie, I mean, Stacey, I have the two parts here that need to be pulled out, the two words, I've got it marked here on mine. You've got it marked as well. Okay, so I'll give this to you after the meeting, and then you compare to make sure we got the right spots. And then we'll need to pull those out if it's if it's passed. So since there are no more comments on it, we will go ahead and put this up for vote to add this to our ordinances, and I will need a Motion.

Rod said I will make a motion to incorporate the ordinance for electronic meetings with the edits as prescribed.

Mayor O'Hare said I have a motion from Rod, do I have a second?

LuAnn said second.

Mayor O'Hare said Luann, second. Is it All in favor? Aye, any opposed? Okay, it's passed. Can you hand this down to Stacey for me? Please?

Thank you.

Mayor O'Hare said this down to Stacey as well, please. Thank you. Okay, so that's accepted. We're gonna go ahead and move over to the Box Elder County Sheriff's Department. We have Deputy Shaw with us tonight. Deputy Shaw, welcome.

Deputy Shaw said hello so apologies if I'm a little bad at this. This is my first time actually being able to do it. So I was only able to pull the stats for the month of April of this year, because, for some reason, they may get a 15-minute long process to get a single piece of paper with some words on it. So it's kind of a pain, kind of rough, to write down the total number of cases, but I do not have

access. I do have access to these case numbers. I do not know what happened in the cases, so I'm not really able to describe much, but in the month of April, there were three suspicious calls. There were two alarms. There were two property damage accidents. There were two cases of found property. There were two VIN inspections done. There was one that was a trespass. There was one threatening call, one fraud call to school safety, check a citizen, assist a citizen, and dispute an animal problem. There were two traffic stops made in the town of Snowville, and there was one death investigation.

Mayor O'Hare said Okay.

Deputy Shaw said so again, if anybody has any questions, I can answer what I'm allowed to, what I am at liberty to discuss. Again, I don't have access or full understanding of what happened and everything. There are three other crews. A lot happens. So if anybody has any questions, I can answer what I can.

LuAnn asked and where do you come out of? Tremonton.

Deputy said I live in Garland.

LuAnn said Garland.

LuAnn asked How often do you come out?

Deputy Shaws said I come I love to try and come out here as often as I'm able to. Unfortunately, over the past little bit, we have had some issues with staffing, where we just, want to try and keep us a more centralized County as often as possible. I again, try and get out here when I can, but it doesn't always work out.

LuAnn said Yeah.

Deputy Shaw said so and I've put out before that, we'd like to try to start seeing more activity here in Snowville, but I can't really force people to do what they don't want to. So

Rod said we do appreciate seeing your presence here.

Deputy Shaw said I also heard that Mollies is the place to eat. I haven't been there yet, but it is on the bucket list to go to. I have had Ranch Country Diner a few times. I've never been disappointed. So yeah.

LuAnn said both are good.

Mayor O'Hare asked are you going to be here until

the end of the meeting.

Deputy Shaw said if you need me to be.

Mayor O'Hare asked if it was possible.

Deputy Shaw said Yes.

Mayor O'Hare said okay, if you have to go, I understand, but I would like to speak with you after the meeting.

Deputy Shaw said yeah, that's fine.

Mayor O'Hare said Perfect. Does anybody else have any questions for Deputy Shaw?

LuAnn said no, appreciate your service.

Mayor O'Hare said we really do appreciate you. Thank you so much.

Deputy Shaw asked for any requests.

Mayor O'Hare said nope, okay.

Mayor O'Hare said let me go next to Eric.

Deputy Shaw, you can sit down.

Deputy Shaw said I know I sit down all day long.

Clots out of the legs. Sounds good.

Eric said Let's see the stop signs. Stacey and I talked about the Stop sign. The piece is gone, I see.

Luann asked, "What was wrong with it?"

Stacey said there was a Landmark guy who took the solar panel off the Stop sign.

Eric said the whole mechanism.

Mayor O'Hare asked if there was a piece to replace it.

Eric said I think it was finding what's wrong with it? Stacey said Yeah,

Eric said I mean, he took the whole unit.

Stacey said I was going to be nosy and stop and say, What are you doing? But I didn't.

Eric said I called on the phone. (To someone I didn't catch their name).

Eric said he hasn't worked for me anymore, but he made the phone call to Heather, and I called him to Landmark.

Stacey said Oh, thank you.

Mayor O'Hare said Well, I'm just gonna speak bluntly, sure they didn't make it happen. It's been three months. Eric said Oh

Mayor O'Hare said and for them to take it and not replace it with one that works.  
Eric said yeah,

Mayor O'Hare said is now a problem. And I'm trying to figure out if we have somebody that runs it or something, and that, you know, if it, I understand, there's another light up there flashing, but it's, you know, I'm, I'm kind of a little petite, that they didn't bring a replacement out, right, and put it up, especially if it's under warranty.

Eric said Yeah, that's true, so just do it.

Mayor O'Hare said yeah, just get it fixed. If you could tell them, we'd just like for them to bring it. It would be nice if they could get it fixed. It's been three months. It's been out.

Eric said okay.

Mayor O'Hare said yeah, it's been three months, and we've had it on the agenda the last three months. This is the third month it's been on the agenda if you could. And that's nothing against you, Eric, I see that before that that wasn't.

LuAnn said yeah, we had people buy a battery for it, put a battery in it, and that wasn't it.

Mayor O'Hare said because I saw, I mean, I heard that they were out here working on it, and I was like, Well, why did well, why didn't they just replace it? That's my thing. If it's under warranty, just just bring a new one out and replace it.

Eric said Yeah, I think that is the vendor who supplies the light. Was quite a character.

Mayor O'Hare said okay, yeah, if you just let them know that we would like for them just to bring something.

Eric said Kate did one more. That was the case.

Let's see.

Mayor O'Hare said tell her would be tough back on them if we have to for it.

Eric said sounds good. Deep Creek Bridge. The application is for you. Doug, that's going okay for you then.

Tammie said yeah, I should have had you in on that meeting if you wanted to be, but we had a meeting yesterday with UDOT and CDBG.

Eric said okay.

Tammies said so that they're talking and making sure we're not doing double the work because CDBG requires me to do an environmental review, but UDOT is already doing that, so we're just now, can we just be? That I'm trying to work with Brian on, if we can just upload that to our web grants instead of, I think so too, but he's, he's gonna look into it and see if.

Eric said it's an existing bridge.

Tammies Yeah, so there's just a few little things, but it's going forward.

Eric said Okay, had that question for you, yeah. And then Mary, you wanted to do a wastewater feasibility study with Dennis Gunn. Is that still something you want to do?

Mayor O'Hare said we want to do that? Do we?

Eric said Yeah, I think it's something we were talking about.

Eric said Is it your fault? My fault? Okay,

AJ said I have nothing to do with wastewater.

Eric said Oh.

Mayor O'Hare said so he was talking about, he came and met with AJ me, and was talking about getting some type of wastewater put in or something to the effect of, you know, we need to do a study on it. And he can, he said he could get the money to get it, get it done.

Eric said Yeah, so he asked me to get us to get him a kind of kickoff meeting, to find out. I suggest we do just the business out there, just a business district. I've had a long discussion with Bob Baker, wow, five, six years ago, the old EQ director and I got shot down, chewed on, and spit out of the back door.

LuAnn asked Wastewater, like, What do you mean? Mayor O'Hare said like, sewer water.

LuAnn said sewer system?

Eric said they'll entertain the business, the Sinclair, the Flying J, Mollie's, here, the hotel.

Eric said yeah, they said absolutely,

Mayor O'Hare said yeah, if they're gonna pay for it, and they can get the money to do it, I say we do it. At least we get some information.

Eric said Yeah, we can show a good cause with the mind sitting out there, coming on one line here pretty quick that we have any issue. We need to harass ourselves. And I have one more thing, by the way, you guys.

LuAnn said we can't add that we didn't go to school. Eric said What?

LuAnn said Sorry, you're gonna have to add them up for us. We'll write down all the numbers. You add them up, and then you write down the total.

Eric said I brought this back to Mary Ann. She passed out. I had to kind of rebuy her on the floor.

Rod asked can you could tell us who was making their mistakes or who was it? Mayor O'Hare said that is confidential.

LuAnn said and you said to do it on number three, right?

Eric said sure, so here's the deal. So my recommendation, I can't, I can't dictate or I'm a consulting agent. I'm consulting you to look into the well, first by identifying the area, AJ, maybe someplace up north. We find some areas that can do a geophysical investigation across the ground. They always work in good places, really well. And then I suggest we do a test well. And if the test well pans up well, then we have good water, it pans up that option off the table. That's just, that's a done deal. So, that's it. That's my recommendation. Alter number three, make that number one is this kind of recommendation. Alternatively, number one would be the best option. If this well does not pan out the waters and Polly is not there, then ozone is the best way to go. In my opinion. We did Greensand we either AJ with the greens, then

Mayor O'Hare said we agreed. Number four, we weren't going to do it all right. LuAnn said right?

Eric said yeah, so Greensand did not taste well, in my opinion. Had kind of a peroxide taste to it. I didn't care for it. Allan didn't like it.

Mayor O'Hare said That's probably what the problem was.

Eric said Yeah, fact, you were telling that one. Were you there attempting with that one? Alan, I out there a little well-tasting that water just isn't a very good alternative before is in-home treatments.

Mayor O'Hare said No, is that why we put zeros in there? And there's not supposed to be any zeros. You have to put one right because there is no zero. Was that the problem that we had?

Eric said Yeah, somebody put zeros in there.

Mayor O'Hare said That was me.

Eric said But you're welcome to do it now or do it, take it home when you're going.

Mayor O'Hare said We'll do it now. We'll give it to her after we're done.

Eric said Okay, meeting all right, so you'll fill that out, and then, like, that, was it for me?

Mayor O'Hare said I do have a question for you.

Eric said yes.

Mayor O'Hare said so down here at Hollow, what is it called Potter's Hollow, is that the one that flooded last year? So if we wanted to fix that, because right now it's a 36-inch pipe that goes through underneath.

Eric said it's a 48.

Mayor O'Hare said okay, so if we wanted to get funding and put concrete,

Eric said Yeah.

Mayor O'Hare said yeah. Was that something that you need to be involved with to get started?

Eric said so I talked to Tracy Harrison on that box covert, explaining the situation. We've already been to FEMA once, and it was \$10,000 to fix what we have there now, which was driving the bucket.

Mayor O'Hare said right.

Eric said she said they have a new program called Brick funding.

Mayor O'Hare said Okay.

Eric said It's competitive, it's nationwide. Then they give the state, like two, \$50 million a year to do our stuff. He says, go ahead and put an app based on it.

Mayor O'Hare said okay because we were gonna me and I'm sorry, LuAnn and myself were talking about and we have the application for the Mayor Association to apply.

Eric asked if didn't the county help put that in. Is that correct?



Mayor O'Hare said The county came out and did the repair on it, yeah. So they would. So this is the thing. I went down and talked to Darren McFarland. He's with the roads of Box Elder County.

Eric said yeah.

Mayor O'Hare said I believe you, did you speak with him as well.

LuAnn said I met with him last week and Tyler.

Mayor O'Hare said so there's a project that

He showed me. They've already got the drawings for it and everything, and it's exactly what I envision. What we had talked about putting the box covered in here, and Eric said yeah.

Mayor O'Hare said they're doing it over in another part of Box Elder County for their road that got washed out as well.

Tammie said We talked to UDOT about that, and they said that they're in big trouble for doing that.

Tammie said yeah they didn't follow the rules.

LuAnn said So they might all have to come back out, yeah?

Mayor O'Hare said well, they haven't started it yet. So this is some a new project. Because this is just runoff water, that's all. This is over here. It has nothing to do with the creek or anything.

Tammie said I don't know.

LuAnn said I was just number three not doing it correctly.

Mayor O'Hare said Oh, really.

LuAnn said Oh, I have to do it all.

Tammie said I'm sorry.

Mayor O'Hare said No, no, no, you're fine. I was just gonna Okay. And I don't know if that's the one that they're talking about. It might be, I'm not sure. But anyway.

Eric said funny, so we can get the county to help us out and do the brick funding through FEMA.

Mayor O'Hare said Okay.

Eric said I think she, Tracy said she's a state funding manager.

Mayor O'Hare said so the thing that I'm thinking about, and I was talking to other people, trying to get that, will we have the proper flow of water going underneath that road so we don't have that problem again? But that water goes down, and it crosses over, and then it comes out at, I believe it's Cemetery Road. It comes

down that that's the east side of the road there, and then that gets flooded down there. So to probably a project of doing this, plus doing a new drainage down Cemetery Road.

Eric said I will talk to our Engineer, he wants to look at the Deep Creel and find out what, how big it's got to be. Mayor O'Hare said Yeah

Eric said and that same bridge is running right.

Mayor O'Hare said gotcha.

Eric said so we want to size that thing too.

Mayor O'Hare said Okay.

Eric said you mentioned the 408, didn't you?

Mayor O'Hare said Well, this one we were talking about was the eight by 16. It was eight feet by 16. Well, that's probably overkill. So it'd be, could be one of them, or two of them, or whatever. Yeah, I probably do. But you can do what. I mean, whatever you think, what, whatever you think we need to have. But I just needed to find out where we need to start this process so we can start working and trying to strive to get that

Eric said Yeah. Tracy Harrison,

Mayor O'Hare said okay,

Eric said to use that free money to see what she says. Okay, that's competitive.

And I think we have a pretty common when we get the county back to set the UD to say, yeah, get her done. I would help us out, too. So, okay, I can shoot you information. I will give it to you.

Mayor O'Hare said Okay

Eric said yeah.

Mayor O'Hare said because we can also, I can also take it to the Mayor Association, to the club, and request funding for that.

Eric said Okay.

Mayor O'Hare said anybody else got any questions for Eric? Let me have one.

LuAnn said Here's a copy. What if we're wrong?

Eric said number one was the good. Anything else for me?

Mayor O'Hare said okay, thanks, Eric, there you go. Thank you, Chief Pugsley

Jed said just a couple of quick things. The first one is our SCBAs, which are our breathing apparatuses, fire for firefighter air. They're supposed to be on a yearly calibration schedule. It's been since 2021 they've been calibrated. So I set up maintenance with the SCBA company to come out. I think it's going to be two Fridays from now to come out and perform that maintenance, as well as our large compressor to fill the cylinders. I'm unaware of the cost of that right now, but just put on your radar that'll be coming in with almost over \$500 under \$500 what? But it will be there. So just a heads up on it, the Cassia County contract was signed by the attorney. It's been turned back to the back to the county, and so they're gonna get it all finished out with Cassia County. Just allow us to respond out on Highway 30 past the. I passed the Idaho board, I guess to be 42 technically, everything has been done and completed with the new radio system. Mayor O'Hare said nice.

Jed said the towers all seem to be working great. In contact with the County. Mayor O'Hare said is it superb?

Jed said Very nice. Might be working on a thing with the county now to tie our 800 megahertz system in with it. We'll just kind of see how it goes. But the county would be kind of working on it,

Mayor O'Hare said and that's something that the people that own the tower and the equipment are, they're hunky dory with it. Perfect. That'd be nice.

Jed said Other than that, we'll just Eddie a quick few minutes from Fourth of July stuff, just as your update.

Mike Morgan said just a question on that, yeah, so contacting Oneida County, we can do that in the ambulance now, with the frequency we have set up in there. Now,

Jed said yep, ambulance and the crash trip. Hold, perfect. There's a separate radio that's right. There's a new radio on the side there, so it'll put us straight into Oneida dispatch, Oneida fire, Oneida rescue.

Mayor O'Hare said Okay, thank you. Chief.

Mayor O'Hare said Eddie, Carson.

Carson said it's coming just fine.

Tammie said well, yeah, so we have these flyers. They're not this is really, really rough, so don't just keep them with your stuff, and don't let them, like, fly around. It's not official yet.

Mayor O'Hare said okay.

Tammies said like the times and stuff. So I would hate for somebody to get an old flyer or something, and then be mad that time for change or something.

LuAnn said 7:30am Fun Run.

Carson Yeah, I have a lot of sponsors. The Mine we're gonna EMS is gonna do a pancake breakfast. The mine's gonna sponsor that.

LuAnn asked is the mine and they're gonna do it and everything?

Carson said EMS will do it, fire whoever the Mine's gonna sponsor all the money.

LuAnn said Awesome.

Carson said So, yeah,

Mayor O'Hare said excellent.

Tammie said we're gonna do the food.

Carson said Gonna be great. Gonna be the majority of the bill.

Tammie said Yeah, do you want to go good with the food?

Mayor O'Hare asked if that is what you're getting if it catered for Maddox. Oh, gotcha, gotcha, gotcha.

Carson said the only question I did have was that we were trying to decide on Grand Marshall's mom and had to bring it up to you guys. So you guys wanted.

Tammies said well, I was going to ask Mike, because, you know, this all was a great Marshall.

Carson said We thought about Dennis and Kathleen. Rowe.

Mike Morgan asked Tim if Dennis and Kathleen had ever been. I don't remember.

Tammie asked Well, Have either of you guys as Tim, you have been Mike? Mike, Tim hasn't been. Tim hasn't

why Kathy.

Tim Heyder asked Who's the oldest in the Valley?.

Mayor O'Hare said What do you guys think? Just leave it up to them.

LuAnn said Yeah.

Mayor O'Hare said I think it's you should you're on that steering wheel. I think you should drive it home.

Tim Heyder said I think Sharon and Sid are the oldest couple in the Valley.

Mike Morgan said I think they have, they we could ask

Them.

Tim Heyder said I think it was a long time ago if they have.

Mike Morgan said Yeah,

Carson said so we'll decide at our next meeting on that if you guys don't care.

LuAnn said Yeah whoever you pick is good with me.

Tammie said but we've also decided we got a good idea for someone's problem of people mad in games and trying to get the young women to do them. But we're gonna, we've reached out to the businesses, and we're only going to do it for like, an hour, yeah, for the kids, each business just sponsor like a ring toss, pop toss or, you know, just a little fun things like that that don't cost a lot of money, plus getting them involved.

Heather said I think there's actually, like, those ring tosses I bought for the Easter stuff, Easter. And then there are also bags.

Tammie said we might just turn it over, they can kind of do what they want.

Mayor O'Hare said It's them advertising cars up the fire department upstairs.

There's the Easter black orange top containers, and the Easter stuff in there. And we got money sacks and all that stuff in there for, you know, jumping into stuff.

And. You know, feel free to have the Easter Bunny show up if you want to. You know, you put somebody in, who's the music.

Carson said Dennis Poulson is going to just do it all.

Mayor O'Hare Okay.

Carson said we're going to do it, he's going to sing just after dinner. But before that, we're just going to have, like, just play music.

Mayor O'Hare said Yes, perfect.

LuAnn said just say no.

Carson said I probably will.

Mayor O'Hare said Yeah. I had a phone call about music, and I just sent them your way. So I told them I had nothing to do with it. You call the Yeah, that's your thing.

LuAnn said I think that's better.

Mayor O'Hare said Perfect. Looks good. Looks like it's gonna be a good time.

LuAnn said Looks great. And if you need help.

Carson said we might be serving dinner.

Tammie said Okay, no, I delegated over. Just head up Melissa is doing the run again. She's really good at that. She's going to be looking to the community. She wants to put signs up along the way for people who serve as first responders or people who have been in the wars. It just kind of brings back patriotism.

Mayor O'Hare said yeah.

LuAnn asked then you guys need to be able to parade, yeah?

Carson said we are trying to delegate someone, Isha or my grandma, to help us. We can quite get somebody to commit.

Tammie said that's why this is really, we don't have a name on there yet.

LuAnn said this looks great.

Mayor O'Hare said yeah, it's really good.

LuAnn said I like that land of the free because of the brave. That's good.

Carson said we're gonna try to get some County involvement too, as far as some floats. Gonna talk to the county. Get an officer out here for the fun run. Melissa's worried about traffic for the run.

Mayor O'Hare yeah, if you need help with that, let me know.

Carson said Okay.

LuAnn said it sounds good.

Carson said Did you put the shirts on? We're gonna sell shirts off the shirt, but let's go back into the budget.

Good for next year.

Mayor O'Hare said it looks really good. Good job.

LuAnn said super good you guys. Thank you so much.

Mayor O'Hare said Does anybody else have any questions for Eddie?

Mayor O'Hare said Snowville, EMS, Mr Smith, the only thing that we really have going on, we've got the tablet here from FirstNet. Haven't done a whole lot with just been working on downloading some apps, so communicate with our devices there. But, and do we have the other phone canceled?

Tammie said I was just telling Stacey, I did try to log in online, and it won't let me, so I've got a call.

Stacey said so I didn't get the actual bill to call everything so early this time.

Dave Smith said so we don't, we really don't need it anymore and then the only other thing is Ayesha's tuition. We're still working on that. On the State versus in State, I see you send an email.

Tammie said I emailed you like you meet Aisha and Sam Yates.

Dave Smith said yeah, and Aisha talked to somebody, and they were supposed to give us an answer. She thought we'd get an answer that day. That was on Monday when she talked. Tammie said they sound really promising when you call like, they're so helpful, and then crickets you don't hear, Dave said yeah. So we paid the amount for the in-state tuition. Correct. LuAnn asked, "What is the \$836 or whatever it was? We did two of those for Aisha, and who was the second one? Dave said No, we just had Aisha. LuAnn said Oh, wasn't there two? Tammie said on the credit card. Rod said did you see this? Mayor O'Hare said Yeah, just pull it up public comment expenses, Dave said yeah, so we may, we may end up having to still pay a little more on that because Isha has done the class and everything's good there if they'll work with us on that dumb rule. Since she lives across the border. LuAnn said barely. Dave said yeah, she could throw a rock out her back door. Tammie said so while visiting with Sam, she said the whole thing was supposed to be free. I know we weren't even supposed originally. Dave said But also, Sam sometimes says more than we get from her. Tammie said well, we're gonna see Sam again on Saturday, getting AJ stitches out. Dave said yeah, remind her. Carson said oh, he's getting old. Mayor O'Hare said Anything? Else. Mr Smith, thank you so much. Appreciate that. Does anybody have any questions for Dave? Tammis Snowville Clerk oh, I think we've talked about it enough. It's basically the same thing. We're good to go with that. Mayor O'Hare asked does anybody had any questions for Tammie about the CDBG grant or the funding or the UDOT, Rod said just appreciate all you did. Mayor O'Hare said I know there's a lot to do. LuAnn said Yes, thank you. Tammie said I went to that training too. LuAnn said I forgot that you did. She went to the training in Salt Lake. Mayor O'Hare said to sure we get that money.

Tammies said you have to be careful because they'll get to follow everything.

Mayor O'Hare said Yeah, next on the agenda is our treasurer, Stacey. So we talked about the church, yep, not responding. So I just want to thank everybody for when we did the dog licensing, LuAnn and Heather came down and Carson, thank you for sweeping out the fire station thank you for doing that. It was cold, but we made it through. Mayor O'Hare said Always is.

Mayor O'Hare said okay. Next is AJ Morgan from the water department. Nothing. Okay,

AJ said unless you guys want to hear something, but I don't have any. Oh, that didn't happen on the water.

Mayor O'Hare said I was getting ready to ask you, is that a workman's comp?

AJ said manhole out here?

LuAnn said Oh, yeah, thank you for fixing that too. Mayor O'Hare said Yeah. Looks good.

Council member McGary, do you have anything for the town council No, not tonight. And council member Johnson we have a road repair and new signs on the stop sign.

LuAnn said Okay? So I met with Darren McFarland last week and with Tyler Wagstaff today. And so what we're what we decided to do. He's gonna Tyler will get back to me as soon as he can. And so this is what we have planned right now. We're gonna do one mile of crack seal. No, not crack seal. Of what's the one where you put the chip Yeah, chip seal. We're doing that a mile of chip seal. We're doing 800 North on the east side of that road, 300 1/5 of a mile. 100 east, a half a mile will be the whole basket in front of the church. So we're gonna go all the way down, all the way down that whole road 100 east, up around the corner in front of Vit's, down to the corner of where Mollie's parking lot starts, or so that we'll have all those edges fixed and done. So we're gonna ship seal all of that. And on 800 North, on that on the north side of of the church house, that road, we're gonna, we're gonna save that one for next year because they're, they're too busy this year. But that one we have to completely reconstruct. We have to, like, chew it all off and start from scratch on that one and on the on-the-top road by Simon's just this part of it. So we're gonna, we're gonna chip seal from the stop



sign on this, on and on the and go down the dip up to the corner of where Simon's is, into where you used to go to your house. We're going to chip seal all that, and then from there on, next year, we're going to do the reconstruction, and we just because it's all broke up, so we can't do a chip seal and we can't do a crack sale, and we can't do potholes. It's just dug off and then redone. And that'll just go up to just a little ways up to where it's not broke out. So, and then the Cemetery Road, that's a county road. So they're going to come out and they're going to do the they can't do crack seals. They don't do crack seals anymore. So we have to in the fall, is when we do the crack seals. And so Darren McFarland is, I will call him, like, when would I do that? Like the first of October, or before that, to get it scheduled, like September, maybe. And anyway, and then I'll get the bids. And he said, You can do a ton of crack seals for very little money. So he said you could probably crack seal every rule that you had to crack seal for less than \$30,000 that was a guess, but he said they did a whole bunch of it. And so we have to get the bids and see which one is the best, and then we'll have them come out and do all the crack seals. And they're going to crack seal Main and Cemetery Road, but this county will pay for that one, so that will be that will help our budget. And then all the other roads that we're not doing chip seals on, we're going to do crack seals on, because we should have enough money to do all that. We asked the Rose Ranch if they would sell. Use the gravel. They can't, because it's not their gravel, so they're gonna have to have a gravel out. So that's gonna be a little bit of an added expense. But I told him what budget we have, and he said that we shouldn't even come close to that. I don't want to use it all, no, because we have a year, because we have a mile. So I said, Let's do a mile. And so when, when we measured it at all today, all of all those roads, I told you, that's a mile, and that's a lot. So I don't know what the bid will be, but as soon as he gets back to me with the bid, then I will contact each one of you guys and get your approval on the bid. We don't have to have to have a motion or anything, right?

Mayor O'Hare said we just have to vote on it.

Tammie said well, actually, that those are funds used B&C funds we can just use.

Mayor O'Hare said yeah because that's.

LuAnn said oh gosh, we don't have to, you guys, know, and make sure you all are okay with whatever the bid they give me. And then I'll tell him, and then he'll get us on the schedule, and then we'll get that done ASAP, and then the crack

seals will do in the fall, perfect. So it looks like we're and they'll do the shoulder work. The only one I don't know who to ask to fix that culvert by the side of the school on that one is that 100 200 is that 200 200 Who do I call to do that? I don't know who to ask.

Tammie said Will Thomas's house.

Jed said the one that crosses underneath the school.

LuAnn said yes because there's a hole in the culvert and it's gone right through the blacktop. So we're going to chip seal that road anyway, and so we need to get that done before they do the chip seal. We need to get that culvert replaced. I just don't know who to ask. I asked him, and he said, he said, they don't have time. I don't know how. I don't know who to ask. No, we can't do that because it's a crashed culvert. It's like, oh, squished.

AJ said oh, it is squished.

LuAnn said yeah and instead of holding it it squished on both sides, I know, so I don't know who to ask. Anybody have an idea who I can ask?

AJ asked, is it one of the town roads?

LuAnn said Yeah.

Eric said it will be 16 inches.

LuAnn said but I asked Tyler today. I said, Well, can they, can the county do that? And he said I don't know. And so he says, we're we? They're just booked right up, responsibility.

Carson said liability. That's a responsibility,

LuAnn said but they're gonna, they're gonna bring the grader out and do the shoulder work because Mr. McFarland told me that in order to keep our roads from breaking, we have to keep it, the water off of them, and that the reason that we're having the breakage is that the water is sitting on the edges when we have a storm. So they're going to come out and do some shoulder work that will slough them off, so the water will go away from the blacktop. So anyway, I'm learning.

Rod said Cemetery Road is really bad for that.

LuAnn said Yeah, and that's a county road, so, and he just, he just called me tonight, right before I came, and says, that's a county road. And I said, Oh, cool. That'll be good for our budget. You guys can fix it. He said they're gonna do it.

Mayor O'Hare said the town line goes just to the east of them.

LuAnn said we just need to call.

Mayor O'Hare said I thought it was on the other side.

Rod said I thought it was halfway.

LuAnn said Tyler's the one who decides all the stuff that we did today. But what? So should I call Mr. McFarland again and ask him if they can do the culvert or do I need to run that through Tyler? I asked Tyler already, and he kind of was waffly. Tyler would be the one who decided, yeah, they're way busy. They've got What'd he tell me, 68 miles of chip seal to do, or something. So if anybody has an idea, we gotta get that fixed before we chip seal/

Mayor O'Hare said so I would say, send it out for bids.

LuAnn said but I don't know.

Tammie said you might not even get anybody, and then you just take your best, best option.

Mayor O'Hare said, don't we have to get three bids on it, though?

Tammie said Yeah.

Mayor O'Hare said well, we have to put it out for bid. We have to put it out for bid.

LuAnn said and advertised it where.

Tammie said like, Who am I Oh, in the newspaper? Because everyone reads the newspaper still, that's how you have to do it. So dumb. I don't know.

LuAnn said I don't know what to know about this website.

Tammie said okay, at least put it out there.

LuAnn said yeah, they're gonna fit, and then we're gonna fix the potholes before they even check yours.

Perfect. Thank you. LuAnn, appreciate that anybody has questions. Heather?

LuAnn said and then the new signs under the south side.

Mayor O'Hare said right, which is great, perfect.

LuAnn said Okay, now that's it.

Mayor O'Hare said Councilmember O'Hare Heather.

Heather said so we have the Cemetery mice that are kind of rooming the markers. So what do we just need to know about the process of getting an exterminator out there?

LuAnn said a million voles. They're tipping over our gravestones. We've never had it.

Mayor O'Hare said we've never had an exterminator out there before. No, have we run an exterminator before?

Tammie said well, they're just going to come back because they are all around. We're surrounded in this field.

LuAnn said so we probably just need to buy we have the order decon because I can't find it anywhere we ordered it.

Mayor O'Hare said yes, Eddie,

Carson said I have my private pesticide applicator license. I can get you the chemical. I can get you the stuff to do it.

LuAnn asked let me see if you can get us this one.

Mayor O'Hare said are you gonna apply it? Do you want the job to do it?

LuAnn said can you get zinc phosphate?"

Carson said I don't know.

Mayor O'Hare said he can get it, though, whatever it is.

LuAnn said my son killed 56 voles in one day with zinc phosphate.

Carson said if you want me to I can bring my smoke machines and kill them that way.

Mayor O'Hare said we want to make sure that you're not liable, you know? So I'm saying, Yeah,

LuAnn said 56 voles in one day. They destroyed the garden, but we can't buy it. He can, well, he can buy it, but only a pound at a time online, and if you have your exterminator license you can get it.

Mayor O'Hare said that is what I'm saying. If you're, if you're buying stuff that requires, yeah, that I think, then you should probably do the do if you have time to do the job, to do it, do what you got to do. If you've got to lock it off for 10 days or whatever.

Carson said it will just spread it so you'll put it in a little spreader and just spread it through the whole everything. Okay? And reminds me what they eat. LuAnn said what about the birds? Trevor just dumped him down the hole.

Tammie said oh, you're on a recorded line here.

Mayor O'Hare said but, yeah, okay, Heather.

LuAnn said because it goes a long way.

Mayor O'Hare said yeah, so I would do that, get up with Brent. And yeah, but Brent, because he's, he's a Sexton for it, so he makes all the decisions for the Cemetery. Anything else? Heather, okay. And then we cut off the bottom. So we're gonna, we're gonna open up the meeting now for public comments, for anybody that has public comments that need to say, anything that wants to

address. These are just comments. They're not asking question and answer time. This is just for comments.

Eric said I have a mayor, yes, sir.

Eric said I'd be happy to fix your lights problem.

Mayor O'Hare said Yes, and we've got new bulbs, we just haven't gotten put up yet. We have brand new LEDs for these lights. Yeah, they're in the back. They just haven't been installed yet. So, yeah, anybody else?

Stacey said I have a couple of things.

Mayor O'Hare said yes.

Stacey said so Monday, Wayne Gamble came in, and he asked if that.

Mayor O'Hare said oh, gotcha.

Stacey said yeah, Wayne gamble, you guys know him. So he asked about the ditch that runs in front of his house.

Mayor O'Hare said Yep.

Stacey said Does he have to talk to somebody he wants to put culverts in because he's afraid it's going to start washing away. Does he have to talk to?

Carson said the east canal?

Stacey said Okay? Thank you.

Mayor O'Hare said Yeah if it's not on his property

Stacey said so Josh and those guys,

Mike Morgan said yeah, Roy is the president, so talk to him.

Stacey said okay. And then he said something again, about Beehive I remember, yeah, he said something about that. But I can't remember.

Mayor O'Hare said what he said that there was, it was where they had dug and did it. It was caving in.

Stacey asked so does Beehive take care of that?

Mayor O'Hare said yeah, that's Beehive's problem. Stacey said yeah, okay, that's what he just asked me, and I can ask. It's on record that I tried.

Mayor O'Hare said Anybody else,

Justin, did you? Did you want to address something?

Justin Vit said can I talk to you about the meeting?

Mayor O'Hare said Yes, sir, you got the only thing we need to get, the landfill.

Stacey said oh, yeah, there's people been asking about that,

Mayor O'Hare said yeah, I've had somebody text me about it. We need to get it open. But we got it, we can't open it until we get the signs correct. That's what you understood as well.

Tim Heyder said Yeah.

LuAnn asked what do the signs have to say,?

Rod said the exclusion of what can be dumped.

Mayor O'Hare said Yeah, what can be dumped, what can't, what we won't take. I think we need to figure out what we don't want to sign. That's a huge sign that says, I just say what we take and that's it, you know, keep it very simple.

Snowville town, yeah, the regulation that he sent over,

LuAnn said somebody made a sign.

Mayor O'Hare said We'll have to have somebody make a sign. Yeah, I figured we'd just go to FedEx copy or whatever, and just have them get up something that the elements won't destroy, and get it, get it professionally done, yeah that makes sense, yeah?

Tim Heyder said there was a piece of plywood with stencil on it. That is what is on it there before?

Mayor O'Hare said Yeah.

Tim Heyder said Just some simple.

Mayor O'Hare said so we gotta make it to where it doesn't fade or, you know, I'm sure it's, you know, make sure it stays with the elements. And then once we get that, we need to get all that stuff thrown in the dumpster and get the dumpster taken out and a new one brought in. So that's the other thing. Is trying to get somebody with a, I'm thinking, somebody with a front end loader or something, that they can scoop that stuff up and just dump it in the in that thing, and then call Rupp's and have them come and bring us a new one and take that one away with all that stuff that's around the sides, all the metal and everything, we need to have it completely cleaned out nice and pretty.

LuAnn asked if we're gonna stay with Rupp's, or where we're gonna do that.

Mayor O'Hare said Never got that guy never got back to us.

LuAnn said okay, Rupp's work.

Mayor O'Hare said so I say just stay with Rupp's. Yeah. I mean, that's my suggestion.

Mayor O'Hare said Yes, sir.

AJ said One more comment, the dump down there needs to be sprayed. I've sprayed my property line in the Canadian Thistle but the dumps are terrible, and they're just little right now, so I don't know what the town wants to do about spraying their property there.

LuAnn said we've got a sprayer on the side-by-side. That's what Brent use for the Cemetery and Wilma's and everybody's so we will go spray it.

AJ said whatever you want to do

Mayor O'Hare asked does Rod Arbon not spray.

LuAnn said Rod sprays for that as well, around here, he was doing it yesterday.

Mayor O'Hare said If he's out spraying, can we get him to run down to the dump and spray?

Rod said the county is supposed to have the chemicals that they can get.

LuAnn said if someone will answer a damn phone.

Mayor O'Hare said I think Rod went down and got a bunch of chemicals.

Stacey said Wyatt lives here now. He lives out the flats.

Rod said, Wyatt Freeze? Yes, Wyatt is the guy.

Stacey said I told Brent he was gonna get a hold of him.

Mayor O'Hare said we'll get that sprayed.

AJ said yeah and I was another thought, dude, I bet you, since it is the town, you may even get the county to go spray it for you if you talk to him since it county around it, but it's town property, but they may do it for the town.

LuAnn asked and would that

Wyatt Freeze be able to he would be the contact?

AJ said That's who I'd ask.

LuAnn said All right I do want that.

Mayor O'Hare asked Are you gonna call?

LuAnn said I'll do it.

Stacey said I didn't know that was him until moved out here.

AJ said it's best if you spray them as soon as they get to a point of hard to kill.

LuAnn said they are, we've been spraying them down in our bottoms.

Mayor O'Hare said Okay, anything else? Any more comments? Okay, if that's it, the town council was emailed the expenses. Also, you've looked at the expenses, we need to go ahead and make a motion for to pay the bills.

LuAnn said Okay, I'll make a motion to pay the bills.

Stacey said so there is some additions, because where it is so early in the month. So the Rocky Mountain Power, I haven't got Verizon, IDAWY.

LuAnn said I got my Rocky Mountain yesterday.

Stacey said It's probably there today.

Mayor O'Hare said so there's a couple okay, so I'll need a motion to pay the expenses with the additions of the Rocky Mountain Power, Verizon, and any last minute that come up, yeah,

LuAnn said okay. I make a motion to pay the bills with the addition of anything else that comes in.

Mayor O'Hare said I have a motion from LuAnn.

Do I have a second?

Heather Second?

Mayor O'Hare said Heather, Second. All in favor, any opposed. It's passed, and I forgot to add, to say this before we adjourn. So everybody saw the frontier. We need to see about getting Beehive phone in here. Have you talked to them at all? Or do you want to give them a call? Ask them how much it would cost. Tell them that, you know, just tell them we have a business account with them and that we would add, we would like to add a landline.

Stacey asked So what is with the one in here for the pagers.

Mayor O'Hare said that's right and they both left, is that on Frontier as well? Is that, do they have their own phone number? So this, this, this \$250 almost \$300 that we're paying.

Stacey said for two phone numbers, lines Well, one was at the fire station, but I think that one down, yeah, but there's, I think there's, there were four. And then I told them that I wanted that other one taken off. And they said, We have to call back later, and I haven't called back.

LuAnn said Why is it so much money?

Mayor O'Hare said Yeah, that's what I was saying. We have Beehive now. So tell Beehive. We have a landline for the, for the town, a number, and we also have a number for our communications, okay? And see what they would, what, what it would cost to have two land, two numbers attached to make to turn those into the beehive. And then if I'm sure, it's going to be under \$300 since we can just put it in a package deal with the, with the internet, and hopefully we can get it.

LuAnn said good service.

Mayor O'Hare said yeah, well, I'm sure it's fiber. I mean, it's, I don't know if anybody's had problems with theirs. Oh, really, not personal bad things with Beehive. Really, you guys are having problems we'll talk about later. I know they



were out here the other day, yesterday. Okay, so, yeah, if you want to check with them and just find out what it costs, if it's we're gonna save any money that way. Okay, if not, we'll just leave it the way it is. Okay. That's it. And need a motion to adjourn.

Rod said Motion to adjourn, meeting of May.

Mayor O'Hare asked for a second.

Heather said Second.

Mayor O'Hare said all in favor, aye, All opposed. We adjourned.
