

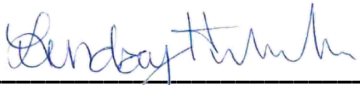

2. PUBLIC COMMENTS

Chree Bohn was present and stood in front of the Council with her fellow Cottonwood subdivision residents, Stormy & Denise Trujillo, and Tony Barne. Chree commented that the park was a disaster and a disgrace that the previous Tree Committee left. There are overgrown trees, no play equipment, a broken table, and unkempt weeds, that now flow into their yards. The bugs are terrible and the trees planted have huge thorns. The trees have never been pruned. The lawn is mowed, but that's it. This group has addressed the issues at this park a few times. They are willing to help as a community. They asked that the administration and Council take them seriously.

Denise Trujillo noted that her home sits against the park. There was also an issue when the wind blew. She has been there for 7 years. They have problems with foxtails and goat heads. Her dog had to have surgery twice because of the goat heads. They are all asking for help and noted that 865 Canyon Road was a good home to look at. They have been told that there was no money to keep the park nice. The group mentioned the Enoch City Tree Committee had found money to plant over 130 trees in that park.

Tony Barne spoke to the Tree Committee about those trees being a mistake. The Barne family cleans that road into the park. The city brought dirt in and left it for a couple of years. Ultimately, it was not long-term sustainable. The trees will grow into the power poles eventually. They all asked what their next steps would be. Mayor Chesnut said he would talk with the City Manager and the department heads to figure out what the next steps would be. They can also reach out to the City Manager or other staff. Council Member Ross said she was on the Tree Committee during the time when those trees were planted. There was an arborist and a tree plan. The arborist switched the trees on the committee. They were not supposed to be barbed. They were supposed to be sustainable and approved by Utah Power. It wasn't until they were all on the ground that he surprised everyone.
