

BSTA Reintegration Plan
HB 304 requires a school to develop a reintegration plan

When Beehive Science & Technology Academy (BSTA) receives a notification from JJYS (, the juvenile court, or a law enforcement agency (Utah Code § 80-6-103, Part 3(a)) that a student was arrested for, charged with, or adjudicated in the juvenile court for a violent felony or an offense in violation of (Utah Code § 76-10-5, Weapons), BSTA shall develop a reintegration plan for the student with a multidisciplinary team, the student, and the student's parent, within five days after the day on which the school receives a notification. The multidisciplinary team means: the local education agency, the juvenile court, the Division of Juvenile Justice Services, a school resource officer if applicable, and any other relevant party that should be involved in a reintegration plan, as outlined in Utah Code § 53G-8-213.

The BSTA team will develop a plan that includes a system of support in Behavior, Short-term, Mental Health and /or Counseling Services, and Academic Support. It will be outcome oriented and promote positive progression. The plan will be based on the Toolkit provided by USBE (USBE Reintegration Plan Toolkit 2024) or its replacements as they are provided. The School may deny admission for the student until the team completes the reintegration plan.
