Minutes: Commissioner Brian stated that we are holding a public hearing for funding for an emergency services building & turned the time over to Brock Jackson from R6. Brock Jackson stated that the county is applying for all grant for CIB. CIB may offer all grant or a loan repayment may be requested. The project is very similar to Marysville with an extra garage bay. The space will provide a space for training. The existing building are in adequate in end providing better services. The bid came back at 2.989 million. The Office of Tourism is in support of this project. The application will be turned in today and the County will go in front of the board in August or September. The area of the building will be 138X100. Commissioner Blackburn would like to put \$500,000. This money will be coming from LATCF (Local Assistance Tribal Consistency Fund).

Brennan Ellett asked why the sheriff department is not included. Commissioner Brian stated that the building is basically for storage and there will be only 1 office in the building. In the future hopefully there will be an administration building including office space for the sheriff office.



Center for future trainings.


