1. Title: RANGE IMPROVEMENT PROJECT #382 - TARANTULA
MESA PIPELINE AND TROUGHS

Applicant: Trust Lands Administration

Description: SITLA grazing permittee, Utah Division of Wildlife Resources (UDWR), in cooperation with the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) and the Tercero Corporation (grazing permittee), proposes to install 8.7 miles of pipeline, one storage tank, and five water troughs for livestock and wildlife on Tarantula Mesa - Henry Mountains. This pipeline and troughs will actually replace an existing dilapidated pipeline that does not currently function. Approximately two miles of 1.5 inch diameter pipeline, one storage tank, and one trough will be located on trust lands and the remainder on BLM administered lands. The pipeline is planned to be installed with a ripper pulled by a dozer adjacent to an existing road. The BLM and SITLA both hold water rights on a well that was constructed in 2008 that will supply the water for this proposed pipeline. Project funding is planned through the Utah Watershed Restoration Initiative. (Garfield County. Legal locations are: T32S, R9E; Section 32; T32S, R8E, Section 36; T33S, R8E, Section 2; SLB&M)

1. Title: RANGE IMPROVEMENT PROJECT #383 & 384 - SOUTH JOHN'S VALLEY WELL AND TROUGH

Applicant: Trust Lands Administration

Description: SITLA grazing permittees, Phil Allen and David Sorensen, in cooperation with the Utah Department of Agriculture & Food Grazing Improvement Program (GIP), propose to drill two six inch diameter wells approximately 200 feet deep and install solar pumps and two water troughs on-site for livestock water. SITLA has applied for a water right transfer to move water to the well sites. Project funding is planned through the GIP program under a cost-share basis. (Garfield County. Legal locations are: T34S, R2W; Section 29; and T35W, R3W, Section 20; SLB&M)
