A. FIRE DEPARTMENT CITIZEN RECOGNITION		
Petitioner	Fire Chief David Olsen	
Discussion	<p>Chief Olsen explained that on May 6th, 2024, a little after 1 AM in the morning the Clinton City Fire Department received a 911 call of a structure fire at the Clinton Towne Center Apartments, Apartment 203. Dispatch reported fire at the front door with 5 people trapped inside and they could hear a female screaming.</p> <p>Mrs. Lana Ionashku was in her apartment washing some dishes when she noticed her son’s electrical scooter had started to smoke. She rushed over to the scooter and unplugged it from the wall outlet and picked it up and placed it outside their front door in the apartment breezeway. She went to her son’s bedroom and woke him up. Mr. David Ionashku hurried to get dressed to go outside to check out his scooter. Before he could get to the front door there was a loud explosion. He rushed to the front door and opened it, where he saw there were multiple fires that started all over the second-floor level staircase landing and it was spreading fast up the vinyl siding that lined the walls in the staircase breezeway. The fire essentially trapped everyone that lived on the 2nd and 3rd floors of this building.</p> <p>David with his quick instincts and actions, ran out to their 2nd floor balcony and jumped down to the ground level, ran over to a nearby building complex, and grabbed a fire extinguisher. Running back to the fire, David was able to extinguish the fire.</p> <p>David’s selflessness instinct and actions saved lives and property that morning and I am honored to recognize him for his Courageous Actions tonight.</p>	

	The City Council expressed appreciation and recognition to David for his quick thinking and action.
<b>B. POWER LINE PARK</b>	
<b>Petitioner</b>	David Williams
<b>Discussion</b>	<p>Staff has been working with Rocky Mountain Power for over a year to get permission to install a restroom in Powerline Park. We are finally close enough to purchase this restroom. This restroom is similar to those installed at Pond Park and Kestrel Park. These are cost effective units and have served these parks well. CTX is on the state bid list. This will be a great improvement to this park.</p> <p>GL 34-4073 \$130,593.00.</p>
<b>CONCLUSION</b>	<i>Councilmember Dougherty moved to approve the purchase of a restroom from CXT for powerline park for \$130,593.00. Councilmember Searle seconded the motion. <b>Discussion</b>	<p>Mayor Stanger reported Planning Commissioner Ed Olsen has resigned. Clinton City appreciates Ed for his service. His resignation leaves a vacancy.</p> <p>The Mayor went on to explain that in 2023 Jennifer Christensen applied for a City Council vacancy. Her resume, experience and enthusiasm were impressive. He feels she would be a great addition to the planning commission and will bring a unique perspective. He is recommending Jennifer be appointed to the Planning Commission to serve the remainder of Ed's term.</p> <p>Ms. Christensen stated she is eager to serve the community and is looking forward to serving as a member of the Planning Commission.</p>
<b>CONCLUSION</b>	<i>Councilmember Searle moved to ratify Mayor Stanger's appointment of Jennifer Christensen to the Clinton City Planning Commission with a term ending December 2025. Councilmember Tyler seconded the motion.
