

Minutes of the Special Payson City Council Meeting held Wednesday, July 23, 2014 at 6:00 p.m.

ROLL CALL: City Councilmembers: Kim Hancock, Mike Hardy, Scott Phillips, and JoLynn Ford and City Manager David Tuckett. Excused, Mayor Rick Moore, Councilmember Larry Skinner, City Recorder Jeanette Wineteer and City Attorney Mark Sorenson.

Motion to appoint Councilmember Ford as Mayor Pro Tempore by Councilman Hancock; second by Councilman Hardy. Motion Carries.

PRAYER & PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Prayer offered by Councilman Hancock and Pledge of Allegiance led by Councilman Hardy.

DISCUSSION REGARDING FIREWORKS RESOLUTION

Manager Tuckett introduced the Resolution to restrict fireworks and described the area mostly around the canal and toward the golf course. The restrictions will only be effective until Monday and then State law kicks in and prohibits fireworks. Councilwoman Ford asked about the last time we restricted areas which included the west side of I-15. Manager Tuckett explained that with the recent annexations west of I-15, he didn't feel that we should restrict all the newly annexed areas. Councilman Phillips asked about citizens on 600 East lighting fireworks in the street. Councilman Hardy explained that on the 4th of July his home has some holes in his landscaping fabric. Manager Tuckett explained that the area described includes land east of 680 East. Manager Tuckett explained that he was working on an ordinance that will make a permanent restricted area in August for future years. Council stuck with the boundary of 680 East.

MOTION by Councilmember Phillips to restrict fireworks in certain area of Payson City; second by Councilman Hardy. Discussion about enforcement. The Fire Department will be distributing the resolution to all of the fireworks stands. The Fire Department will also be patrolling. A Church leader has already asked his congregation not to light off fireworks. There will also be a message sent out on the Parlant communication system. Motion Carries.
