

Findings of Fact:

The **Food Service Sanitation Regulation** was adopted by the Davis County Board of Health in 1980 to establish standards for providing food that is safe, unadulterated, and honestly presented within retail food establishments. The changes to the **Food Service Sanitation Regulation** include:

- Updating the name of Utah Administrative Code R392-102 from Food Truck Sanitation to Mobile Food Business Sanitation.
 - Removing the Limited-Use Food Establishment permit and associated requirements.
 - This was primarily used to permit food carts. They are now included as Mobile Food Businesses.
 - Specifying requirements for commissaries.
 - Adding language to specify that a food establishment permit is required if you advertise offering food for public consumption.
 - Revising the renewal language to require payment 30 days prior to operating each year rather than 30 days prior to expiration so that this regulation also applies to food operations that only operate seasonally.
 - Updating the fee schedule, including adding fees to review a HACCP plan, conduct a Residential Care inspection, and combining the plan review fee for Temporary Food Establishments into the permit fee.
1. The proposed changes and the new Davis County Regulation are not in conflict with Federal Law, State Statute or Rule.
 2. The Board of Health provided a public hearing as required by law. The hearing was held on June 27, 2024, and written comments were received until July 5, 2024.

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Conclusions of Law:

1. The proposed changes to the Davis County Board of Health **Food Service Sanitation Regulation**, as approved for public hearing at a regularly scheduled Board meeting, have been reviewed and commented on by the general public and interested parties.
2. The proposed **Food Service Sanitation Regulation** protects the public's health.
