Councilman Madsen expressed frustration over the frequent malfunctioning of these signs and proposed discontinuing their expenditure, recommending the installation of speed limit signs with flashing lights instead.

Councilman Beesley asked if the batteries for the current signs had been delivered yet. Colter Allen stated they were ordered but not here yet.

Councilman Cade Beck inquired about the availability of a speed trailer that could be rotated around. He also wanted to see if this could be part of our road master plan as well.

Colter Allen volunteered to investigate the possibility of acquiring a flashing speed limit sign.

7. Discussion/Action on the following items:

a. Out of State Travel- Fire Department

The out-of-state travel is intended for Sam Draper and Mark Hightower to conduct a final inspection of the new fire truck. Councilman Paul Madsen questioned the necessity of both individuals attending.



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The discussion was tabled to assess if Sam could attend alone.

Sam's attendance at the meeting clarified that they would be traveling to in Minnesota and the Sanpete County Fire District had already covered the travel expenses. The approval was sought due to the out-of-state nature of the travel. Depending on the inspection outcome, there was a possibility the new fire truck could be driven back.

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9. Council Reports

Cade Beck:

- Attended the Main Street Committee Meeting this morning
- Updated that the arena project completion is now projected for the end of September rather than the end of July
- Reported a gas leak at the armory handled by the fire department other calls were false alarms
- Treatment plant remains on track for October
- Discussed Community Earmark Money for the million-gallon water tank
- Councilman Beesley inquired about the sprinkler system; Cade replied the discussion was brief

Rondy Black:

- Transportation master plan kick-off meeting scheduled for tomorrow, Wednesday at 12:30 with Sunrise Engineering
- Hales Sand and Gravel finishing up the flush coating, project is within budget
- Councilman Beck acknowledged Colter Allen for helping save money by completing some prep work for Hales.

Russell Keisel:

- Spoke with Shane Ward; Power Dept has completed the transmission line between the substation and switchyard
- Reported everything is going well at the pool
- Visited Lehi Metal Art Building; they have two clay molds for the memorial statues priced at \$40,000-\$45,000, A quote will be received soon.
- Announced a meeting tomorrow night for the veteran's memorial
- Planning to advertise for missing names as the memorial project progresses
- Restroom construction bid for the cemetery has been issued
- Toby Beesley wanted to let the council know Gavin Christensen passed his 2nd year step test

Paul Madsen:

- Expressed gratitude for the power department for getting the tree removed at the park also thanked Colter Allen for the sprinklers
- Drinking fountain installation scheduled for this week



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Lynn Beesley:

- Spoke with other towns about getting help for Stephanie Blain
 - Fairview has hired someone for building and grounds, also working on sports; Fairview Mayor is willing to let this person help Stephanie Blain
 - Moroni Mayor is also willing to offer some assistance
- Suggested considering an interlocal agreement with other cities
- Reported Steph is finishing up City League softball and baseball
- Inquired about a limb hanging over the road, suggesting it would take about 5 minutes to cut down; believes the situation should be reconsidered
- Discussed options for managing trees, showed pictures of problematic trees and a pothole that was chip-sealed over
- Proposed offering doggie bags at the park and placing signs to keep dogs on leash and ensure owners clean up after them

10. Mayor Report

- City Attorney Kevin Daniels and Dave Oxman reviewed the new City Policy book
- Transportation plan awarded to Sunrise; mayor wants to consider implementing a park impact fee
- City Attorney Kevin Daniels sent another letter to the Attorney for HMH
- **Colter Allen:**
 - Met with Wasatch to discuss drainage down to Breaux

Talked to Kevin Daniels, Dave and Kevin looked through the new City Policy book. We awarded the transportation plan to Sunrise would like to do a park impact fee. Kevin Daniels sent another letter to the HMH Attorney.

Colter met with Wasatch on the drainage down to Breaux.

11. Adjourn

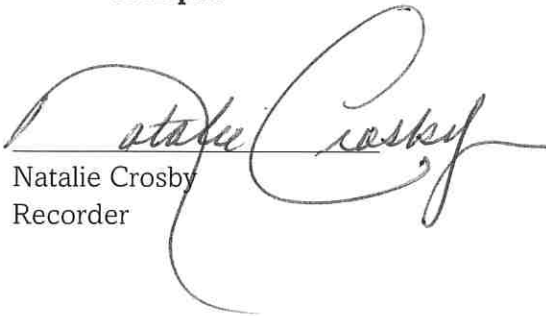
