The Utah State Board of Education approved <u>Board Policy 2005</u> Complaints Against Individual Board Members on November 4, 2021. Since passage of the policy, a number of complaints have been received, some of which—with related analyses, documents, etc.—have been subject to GRAMA requests by various entities and individuals.

4. What are the suggested legislative solutions? Include code references and suggested language where possible:

Requested language is anticipated to be similar to the language in Utah Code Section 63G-2-302, just specific to the Utah State Board of Education. However, Board Policy or Utah Code Section 53E-3 Part 4 may also need to be updated to include language regarding a similar summary data report or other type of final resolution document.

(1) The following records are private:

- (d) records received by or generated by or for:
 - (i) the Independent Legislative Ethics Commission, except for:
 - (A) the commission's summary data report that is required under legislative rule; and
 - (B) any other document that is classified as public under legislative rule; or
 - (ii) a Senate or House Ethics Committee in relation to the review of ethics complaints, unless the record is classified as public under legislative rule;
- (e) records received by, or generated by or for, the Independent Executive Branch Ethics Commission, except as otherwise expressly provided in Title 63A, Chapter 14, Review of Executive Branch Ethics Complaints;
- (v) records received by or generated by or for the Political Subdivisions Ethics Review Commission established in Section 63A-15-201, except for:
 - (i) the commission's summary data report that is required in Section 63A-15-202; and
 - (ii) any other document that is classified as public in accordance with Title 63A, Chapter 15, Political Subdivisions Ethics Review Commission;

Provide details, sources, research, and analysis to which forms evidence-basis for this request or the associated program (e.g, cost benefit analysis, program evaluation, results from pilot program, etc). Include whether this data is currently collected and available or whether new data will be collected:

From November 2021 – July 2024, Internal Audit has completed 45 preliminary analyses in accordance with <u>Board Policy 2005</u>. Of the preliminary analyses completed as required, 44% (20) resulted in a referral to board leadership for additional consideration. Fourteen of the 45 preliminary analyses, with related documents, were subject to GRAMA requests and related to the requests there were questions about records classification.
