<p><b>SCHOOL DISTRICT REIMBURSEMENT</b> Utah Code <a href="#">53G-10-5</a></p> <p>An LEA that maintains driver education classes that conform to the rules and regulations approved by the Utah State Board of Education may apply for reimbursement by completing the student reporting form provided by the state. LEAs in compliance will be reimbursed:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• \$100 per student who has completed the driver education classroom training and behind the wheel training;</li> <li>• \$30 for the student who only completed the classroom training either with a school- or state-approved online program.</li> <li>• \$70 for the student who only completed the behind-the-wheel training with the school.</li> </ul> <p style="text-align: right;">Page 9</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>\$150</b> per student who has completed the driver education classroom training and behind the wheel training;</li> <li>• <b>\$45</b> for the student who only completed the classroom training either with a school- or state-approved online program.</li> <li>• <b>\$105</b> for the student who only completed the behind-the-wheel training with the school.</li> </ul>	<p><a href="#">HB250</a></p> <p><b>General Description:</b> This bill makes changes to the way a local education agency may fund driver education classes.</p> <p><b>Highlighted Provisions:</b> This bill:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▶ allows for additional funding to be used by a local education agency to fund driver education classes; and</li> <li>▶ increases driver education student reimbursement amounts.</li> </ul>
