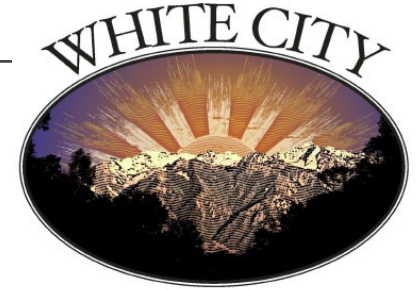

HOW DO I KNOW IF I NEED A BUILDING PERMIT?

Are you thinking about finishing your basement, remodeling your kitchen, or adding to your house? Do you know that you will need to apply for a Building Permit from the Municipal Services District?

Along with a building permit, you will need to arrange an inspection. Call the Building Permit hotline at (385) 468-6690 before 3:00 pm to schedule your inspection for the following business day. The morning before your inspection, call (385) 468-6688 to set up the time.

Building permits must be purchased from the MSD for many construction projects, including:

1. Expanding a building or a structure (garages, carports, decks and roof projections).
2. Building any detached structures (garages, barns, tool and storage sheds, playhouses, pool or hot tub enclosures, when the structure exceeds 200 square feet).
3. Retaining walls that are taller than four feet.
4. Adding, removing or altering any existing plumbing fixtures.
5. Altering the electrical service equipment (meter, electrical panels or electrical circuits).
6. Installing or replacing a furnace, water heater, boiler, air conditional evaporative cooler, heat pump or baseboard heating (including ductwork).
7. Window replacement
8. Replacing siding or stucco
9. Remodeling to include deleting interior walls, finishing rooms previously unfinished (including basements).
10. Changing or lowering kitchen cabinets and countertops.
11. Installing hot tubs, jacuzzis, saunas or spas.
12. Reroof or reshingle.

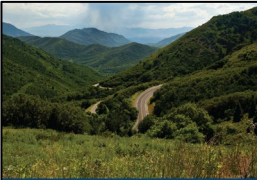

To My Emigration Canyon Family,

We have had an excellent summer, and I have appreciated all of the people who turned out to the fireless event, Chipper Days and canyon cleanup.

Road Construction Projects.

Slope stabilization work on the "Red Wall" (Sageen, M62 Emigration Canyon)
This project is almost complete.

Culverts at Sky Crest and Cedarcliff. As of the end of August, the culverts at Sky Crest and Cedarcliff have one in the design stage at about 50% completion.

Round Bells. In September you will see reports being done on guard rails in several places in the canyon. We budgeted money for this project three years ago, but have had a hard time getting the contractor to respond, so we have another contractor and are moving ahead.

Neighborhood Dumpsters. We have had a problem with other people depositing items into the neighborhood dumpsters for those homeowners who do not have outside waste removal. We have put locks on these dumpsters, and only those people living in the area have access to deposit their waste in these dumpsters.

White City Capital Projects

Sage Lily Drive Roadway Improvements - This project adds curbs, sidewalks, pedestrian crossings, and bike lanes to Sage Lily Drive. It also includes repaving the road and several other improvements. This project will be completed in September-October.

Sage Lily Crossing at 1300 E - Sage Lily Drive is steeply approaching the intersection at 1300 East. This does not allow for accessible crosswalks at that intersection. This project will repave the east end of Sage Lily Drive to allow for a more level connection at 1300 East. This project has been funded through the environmental impact assessment prior to design and construction. That environmental impact assessment is currently underway and expected to be completed in September, after that is complete, design will begin. This project is expected to be constructed in spring of 2025.

Marble Street Storm Drain - This project will study storm drainage at Marble Street. There are known drainage issues during Marble Street that cause stormwater to continue west along Sage Lily. The project will then construct improvements for this storm drain.

Lakeview Drive Safety Improvement - This project is expected to include funding from WVC to improve pedestrian safety. The project will include two-sided curbs along with built-out driver feedback signs, storm drainage, and pedestrian ramps along Lakeview Drive. The funding is expected to be available in 2025.

Upcoming Events, The Car Parade is on September 7th, starting at 5:00 pm. The parade starts at 6:00 pm at 5024 Ave and Gleditsia Dr. at the LDS Church.

The Plant Swap is September 24th at the Bear Park Pavilion from 10 am to noon.

Code Enforcement

Did you know that each municipality has its own set of zoning ordinances? It's like the rulebook that ensures our communities stay safe, clean, and organized. These rules determine where we can build our homes, set up businesses, and maintain the charm of our neighborhoods.

From clearing clutter to maintaining lawns, and even snow removal, these rules play a vital role in creating the vibrant community we cherish.

The MSD Code Enforcement team is here to support you. Our goal is to ensure everyone understands and follows these important zoning rules.

To keep things running smoothly, here are a few common issues we often tackle:

- **Snow removal from sidewalks and driveways**
 - Clear the snow or ice from driveways and sidewalks as soon as you can after the storm passes. Don't forget to clear your ramps as well.
 - Do not put snow in the road or in the storm drains. Instead, throw snow onto the landscaped areas.
 - Assist senior citizens, people with disabilities, and residents who need help if you can.
 - These efforts help protect the safety of everyone who uses the sidewalk.
- **On-street parking during the winter**
 - Most municipalities prohibit parking on the street when it's freezing or when the snow is on the streets from November to April.
 - Parking on the street prevents snowplows from clearing the roads and puts your vehicle at risk of being hit, if there's a problem with vehicles parked on winter streets in your neighborhood, contact your local police for enforcement.

Short-Term Rentals Reminder - In most jurisdictions, renting a home for 30 days or less is prohibited. Please check your specific ordinances for more details.

WHAT TYPES OF PLASTICS GO INTO RECYCLING CONTAINERS?

Recycling plastics can be confusing, but this guide will help you become a recycling pro!

PET #1 and HDPE #2 Containers of this resin type are widely accepted and include beverage, food, and detergent bottles, food tubs, milk jugs, and similar containers. Small to medium containers labeled #1 or #2 are generally recyclable.

PP #5 This includes yogurt and cottage cheese containers, and bottles, and some food-grade jugs. NOT: If it does not match the shape of the items listed above, it is not food grade. These shapes, if they are not accepted in single-stream recycling.

OTHER PLASTICS Generally, these are not accepted in single-stream recycling. Look for "Recycle Right" label at www.therecyclingright.com for specific recycling options and to confirm if your item is accepted in single-stream recycling.

Reminder: Leaves are not accepted in blue recycling cans. Small to medium containers labeled #1 or #2 are generally recyclable.

Recycling plastics can be confusing, but this guide will help you become a recycling pro!

- 1 PET
- 2 HDPE

Some Okay

- 5 PP

Bad

- 3 PVC
- 4 LDPE
- 6 PS
- 7 OTHER

Only certain grades of PP are accepted in the single stream recycling.

Food containers like deli cups, yogurt containers, and food tubs are accepted PP.

Deodorant's, Cleaners's, Wipes, Shampoo's and Conditioners are not accepted in blue recycling.

Beverage bottles, food containers, and food tubs are accepted PP.

If the plastic material does not fall into the listed #1 or #2, it is not accepted in the single stream recycling.

We are limited to accepting items that are accepted by the mill.
