3. Review minutes from last meeting:

4. City Council Meeting Reports:

- a. Committee report for City Council Meeting
 - i. July Meeting: *(By Carrie)* Carrie was not able to attend. LeeAnne listened and reported That Mayor talked about Councils of Community asking businesses to report to the council. Councilman Shelton reported about the Jordan River Commission and that he attended the Senior Advisory Committee meeting. There was public comments about problems with an Air B n B. They did an annual report of the state of financial risk. Schaefermeyer spoke about public relations items and some are concerned about stationary housing and senior housing and the city is trying to comply and have affordable housing. There were some problems with daybreak and another neighborhood near 10400 S and 3200 W they moved to resolve a situation.
- b. Director Report: *(By Janell)* A couple things coming up in the recreation Department. There is a Healthy South Jordan Community Coalition that has initiatives they are working on. Trying to get more community members to join the group. They will have a booth at the National Night out against Crime that will be held on Aug 6 in front of the Public Safety Building. We are partnering with Live Daybreak to put on the End of Summer Bash at Bingham Creek Park with lots of events starting at 6:30 PM. We have our summer activities Movies in the Park and Farmers Market. Jamie asked about getting leftover food from the farmers market donated to the senior center. She will talk to Natalie, but it is managed by the Farm Bureau.
- c. City Council report: *(By Councilman Shelton)* Bees baseball stadium is on schedule. They are still working on the senior center and have talked about it in a closed meeting. They have all the partners still on board there's just a lot of things to work out. There is a spot they have picked, but the owners have to work on getting over some hurtles. He cannot share the location.

5. Old Business:

- a. Pocket calendars *(By Jamie)* Found 2 types of packet calendars. One is the same as last year, one is similar but missing the pad of paper. Sent the info to Midge in an email, her vote was to get the calendar without the notepad. Carrie would prefer a notepad. Billie likes the notepad. LeeAnne would prefer the one without the notepad. All agreed to purchase the one without the notepad, and Jamie will see about purchasing some notepads on the side. If they are \$78 or more, we will go without. All agreed to purchase approximately 200 calendars based on if there is a deal.
- b. Clothing Exchange *(By Jamie)* Will be held Monday, Aug 12. Carrie will be there to help, LeeAnne will be at the boutique. Susan will be helping at the clothing exchange as well. Billie and Jamie will be there at 7, Carrie will be there at 8. Jamie can reach out to Youth Council to help and LeeAnne has a rack we can use, if needed.
- c. Health Fair Giveaway *(By Jamie)* Talked about getting a canvas bag. Canvas is very expensive. Found a different one that is grocery store material with a pocket. Showed an

example with the imprint. It would be \$713 for 200 of them. They only have 100 of the color purple we can do another color as well. Midge's input is to buy 100 purple and 100 blue. Presented the Discount Mug catalog for options. We have some bags leftover from previous years. We could use them up and decrease the number of new ones we buy. Jamie will count the old bags and report back. They would prefer to purchase less new ones. If we decrease the number we will only be able to choose 1 color. Purple is 1st choice, blue 2nd, dark green 3rd.

- d. Wendover trip cancelled (*By Jamie*) Have chosen not to pursue Wendover due to conflicts with Healthy South Jordan initiatives and because other centers are going. Looking into doing an overnight trip to Shakespeare Festival. There are lots of things going on in the state that we can choose from.
- e. Birthday coupons. In addition to the 9 leftover from last month we have had 15 more submitted, bringing it to a total of 24 at \$96 (\$4 per lunch). Approved and signed by Billie and LeeAnne.
- f. Guest Speaker update (*By Jamie*) No update, have not made the calls.

6. New Business:

- a. Crosswalks on Redwood (*By Carrie*) Carrie lives across the street at the Gardens and she wants to have a crosswalk put in across redwood not at an intersection. Walking to a safe place to cross is approximately a quarter of a mile to each light at Towne Center Drive and at 11000 So. Carrie had a close call with a vehicle. Councilman Shelton said he can bring it up with the City Manager. Redwood is owned by the State, so we would have to make a compelling argument for it, and then we would pay for it, if approved.
- b. Pioneer Lunch Review (*By Jamie*) Less than expected due to it being on Tuesday and then changing the entertainment close to the event.
 - i. amount served: 109
- c. Art Show (*By Jamie*) Will be Aug 21-Sep 30 open to the public who are 60+.
 - i. Propose the committee reach out to the Arts Council for support. They generously donated \$200 last year. Ask them to judge and donate for prizes again. Billie will attend the Arts Council meeting on Aug 8. Jamie will invite the Mayor and City council to come. It was decided to have 1st, 2nd, 3rd, Mayor's choice, and people's choice as the awards. Will see what the Art's council will do and supplement anything as needed and ask the chair and vice chair to be judges.
 - ii. Artist reception is on Aug 20 at 1:00 PM then the show opens on the 21st.
