
This letter explains the accreditation for Stevens-Henager College as we arrange for our students to take their LPN and RN examinations. Our Dean of Nursing, Stephanie Slater, has contacted you and we are answering your request.

On July 23, 2014, we received a denial letter from ACEN for our associate degree RN program's reaccreditation. To say the least, we were stunned and dismayed to receive this negative news. The site visitors and review panels each recommended to the board of ACEN that the nursing program receive eight (8) years of renewed accreditation with the warning status removed.

We have exercised our right to appeal and include the letter from ACEN received August 28, which grants us the opportunity to appeal this decision. According to the rules of appeal, the accreditation status of "accredited with warning" has been restored, as noted on ACEN's web site. We have apprised the students who are requesting to take their LPN examination and those who wish to take the NCLEX examination during this period of appeal that they may do so and become licensed under the rules of Utah. We have retained legal counsel to work with ACEN's counsel to relieve the program of this action and restore accreditation to the program. If we are not successful in our appeal, we will immediately enter our application for candidacy to maintain an accredited status for our program as have several programs in Utah.

Our letter granting the appeal accompanies this request. Thank you for your assistance in helping our students to become licensed practical nurses and registered nurses.
