Ms. Bailey made a motion to open the meeting. Ms. Schilleman seconded the motion. All Committee members voted in favor of the motion. The meeting was opened at 11:39 a.m.

Ms. Forster-Burke reported the Committee's unanimous recommendation is to immediately suspend Scott Rennie's RN nursing license until: 1) the Respondent successfully completes a neuropsychological evaluation conducted by an evaluator pre-approved by the Division, 2) the evaluator must issue a statement clearly stating that the Respondent can safely practice as an RN, 3) that Respondent must comply with any recommendation that the evaluation/evaluator recommends the Respondent complete before the suspension is lifted; and 4) meet with the Board of Nursing and the Board determines that the Respondent can safely practice as an RN. Committee members would like to recommend to the Board of Nursing that when the Respondent meets with the Board, that the Board require completion of an anger management course and an ethics course.

Ms. Forster-Burke stated Committee members found that the conduct of this nurse poses an immediate threat to the public health, safety and welfare, and requires immediate action by the Division.

Mr. Jones presented a draft copy of the Order for Committee member review. Committee members suggested under the Findings of Fact, adding to number three, "on or about Sunday, July 13, 2014." In

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
number four add that the hall lights were on, in number eight change elbow to forearm, add to number sixteen that the patient was transferred to ICU and that restraints were available in the room, and add to number twenty the date of the incident at the Utah County hospital. Committee members approved the Emergency Order with those changes.
