READ AND REVIEWED THE MARCH 22, 2024 MEETING MINUTES

JEFF GRAY ASKED HOW OFTEN LAW ENFORCEMENT IS TAKING PEOPLE TO THE RECEIVING CENTERS, INSTEAD OF THE ER. MONTE MEMMOTT GAVE A BRIEF EXPLANATION ON THE FUNCTION OF THE RECEIVING CENTERS.

BEN VAN NOY READ THE MISSION STATEMENT.

BEN VAN NOY GAVE A BRIEF EXPLANATION ON THE WEBER COUNTY PRE-TRIAL PROGRAM. THEY HAVE 3 SWORN DEPUTIES AND 2 CIVILIANS. SOFTWARE THAT AUTO TEXTS DEFENDANTS OF COURT DATES, TIME FOR DRUG TESTING, ETC. THEY DIDN'T HAVE THE STAFF TO ENFORCE.

MONTE MEMMOTT: PRE-TRIAL ISN'T ABOUT TREATMENT, IT'S MORE ABOUT MONITORING. HE ALSO TOURED WEBER COUNTY AND SALT LAKE COUNTY PROGRAMS.

JEFF GRAY: FEELS THAT PRE-TRIAL SERVICES IS MORE ABOUT BAIL REFORM, INSTEAD OF IMPOSING BAIL. THEY CAN BE RELEASED TO PRE-TRIAL SERVICES AND THEY MAKE SURE THEY APPEAR.

BEN VAN NOY: WASATCH COUNTY WAS AWARDED A GRANT FOR SOFTWARE TO USE IN THEIR PRE-TRIAL PROGRAM. \$59,000

CHIEF ADAMS: WOULD EVERBRIDGE WORK FOR THE PRE-TRIAL SERVICES?

CHRISTIANA WAGSTAFF: WOULD LIKE ANKLE MONITORS BECAUSE OF THE VIOLENCE.

5. Discuss 2024 Strategic Plan & Community Resources Map

CHRISTIANA WAGSTAFF: HAS A SUGGESTION FOR THE 2024 STRATEGIC PLAN. DOMESTIC VIOLENCE IS A BIG PROBLEM IN THIS COUNTY. WOULD LIKE TO SHARE HER PLAN AT THE NEXT MEETING. WILL SEND OUT HER POWER POINT AHEAD OF THE MEETING.

6. Discuss Pretrial Services/Pretrial Release

STATE LEGISLATORS CREATED STATEWIDE MAGISTRATE STATUTES THAT GIVE THE DUTY OF SETTING BAIL TO THE JUDICIARY TO REVIEW PROBABLE CAUSE STATEMENTS. STATEWIDE SOFTWARE WAS CREATED, OFFICERS FILL OUT PROBABLE CAUSE STATEMENT, REVIEWED BY THE JUDGE. THIS REPLACED THE SCREENING PROCESS IN PRE-TRIAL SERVICES. THE ONES THE JUDGES DO RELEASE IS WHERE WE NEED THE MONITORING, AND THIS IS THE PIECE THAT IS MISSING IN UTAH COUNTY. WE DON'T NEED OUR ENERGY IN SCREENING, BECAUSE THAT IS BEING TAKEN CARE OF.

JEFF GRAY: WHAT IS MOST NEEDED?

JUDGE PARKIN: PRE-TRIAL SERVICES WITH MONITORING, LIKE A PROBATION OFFICER. JUDGES WOULD BE MORE INCLINED TO RELEASE THEM IF SOMEONE WILL SUPERVISE.

JEFF GRAY: LET'S START WITH NOTIFICATION, A PHASED-IN APPROACH. IT DOESN'T NEED TO BE A DEPUTY OR EVEN THE SHERIFF'S OFFICE.

JUDGE PARKIN: IF THEY HAVE BEEN ARRAIGNED, THEY WILL RECEIVE NOTIFICATIONS FROM THE COURT VIA TEXT AND EMAIL, THIS IS A STATEWIDE PROGRAM. THE "GAP" IS BEFORE THEY ARE ARRAIGNED, BEFORE THE FIRST APPEARANCE IS WHERE HELP IS NEEDED.

COMMISSIONER BELTRAN: MOTION TO MOVE FORWARD WITH IMPLEMENTING THE NOTIFICATION PROCESS.

JEFF GRAY: 2ND

THE ISSUE THEY ARE HAVING IS THE SHERIFF'S OFFICE IS BY-PASSING THE JUDGES. FEELS LIKE THE SHERIFF'S OFFICE IS OVEREXTENDING THEIR AUTHORITY.

WOULD LIKE THIS TO BE ON THE NEXT MEETING AGENDA AND BEN VAN NOY WILL REACH OUT TO THEM.

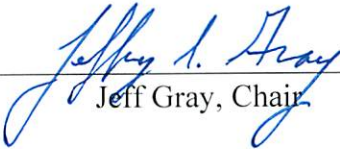
