6. Hydro Corp Back Flow Presentation – *Andy Ruben*

Andy Ruben gave a presentation on backflow prevention and how his company could assist in complying with Utah State Code to prevent contamination. This will be added to the agenda for the next city council meeting, where a vote will be held to consider accepting their services from Hydro Corp.

7. Discussion/Action on the following items:

a. Veteran's Memorial – *Russell Keisel*

Christensen Ready Mix has volunteered to handle the concrete work and has lined up contractors for the cement. Susan Dean published a favorable article in the newspaper. Dave Oxman mentioned that the city could contribute \$100,000 to the memorial, but that would require council approval. Councilman Keisel is seeking a vote to authorize the city's \$100,000 contribution. He also noted that if enough funds were raised, they could reimburse the city. However, Councilman Beck expressed concern about how much more the city might need to contribute and whether a spending cap would be set. Mayor Olsen voiced his support for the memorial but was worried the overall cost might be too high. It was decided that we would match the Mormon Pioneer National Heritage Area.

Motion: Action: To Approve up to \$30,000 to match the MPNHA commitment to start the Veterans Memorial.

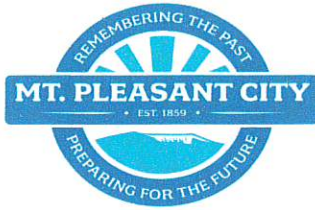

Russell Keisel:

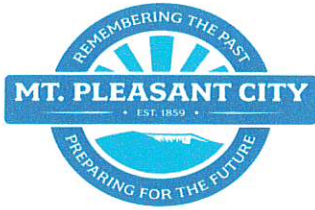
- High school swim team has started, with Brittany doing a great job.

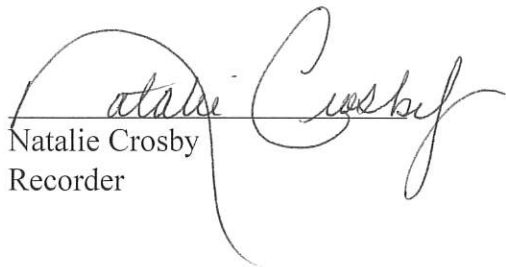
