Mayor Scott O'Hare said Good evening, everybody. We like to welcome everybody to the when is it? Wednesday, October 9, 2024, Snowville Town Hall meeting for our council members, I am Mayor O'Hare. I would like to welcome everybody here tonight. We also like to recognize Rod McGarry. Council members, Rod McGarry, Heather O'Hare and LuAnn Johnson Trish Arbon is walking in the door at this time, so we also like to recognize her. We'd also like to recognize our Deputy Clerk, Stacey Hill. We'd like to recognize Chief Pugsley from the fire department, as well as AJ Morgan, our water department director. We're going to start with the pledge that's going to be led by Heather O'Hare, and then we have a prayer that will be given by Rod McGarry.

Heather said I pledge allegiance to the flag of the United States of America and to the republic for which it stands, one nation under God, indivisible with liberty and justice for all.

Rod said our dear kind, Heavenly Father, we thank thee at this time where we meet together as a town council and friends and family and members of the town. We thank thee for this opportunity. We pray for thy guidance and thy spirit. Be with us that we may build to help govern the affairs and the matters concerning the town that we may build to provide the services and the needed resources for the members here, we thank thee for all things, for thy goodness in our lives, for the blessings and opportunities that were afforded each day, for this wonderful Earth And for the blessings of health and strength and blessings in our lives, and those about us pray for all and we ask for these blessings in the name of thy savior, Jesus, Christ. Amen.

Mayor Scott O'Hare said Amen.

Thank you, Rod. Thank you, Heather, and I apologize. I need to also recognize Deputy Shaw that's here. Deputy Shaw is with the sheriff's department and is the liaison for Snowville, the town people, I'm sorry, council members were sent the agenda for tonight, as well as the minutes from tonight. Also, you were sent the minutes from September. Did you get a chance to look at those as well? LuAnn said Yeah.

Mayor Scott O'Hare said Okay, everybody got Okay.

Does anybody have any additions they need for the agenda for tonight? No, okay, I'm going to be adding a water sampling fee. We need to add that. I think that's the only thing that we need, oh, sorry, I don't see it on here, but we also need to add, we'll put towards the end here, our prosecutor. I talked to him today on the phone, so I'll give you an update on that as well as good council members, the update on that. So if we don't have any more just need a motion to accept the agenda for this month as well as the minutes from September and August, no September and October, October,

Rod said I'd like to make a motion that we accept the agenda for the month of October And the minutes from September and August.

Trisha said I second.

Mayor O'Hare said we need to redo that. The agenda is for November, I'm sorry, October, and the minutes are from September and August.

Stacey said the minutes in September. There's also one special meeting.

Mayor O'Hare said Gotcha.

Stacey said and then,

Mayor O'Hare said okay,

Stacey said the regular meeting was last month.

Mayor O'Hare Okay, so we got a Rod's first, Trisha, second, all in favor, aye, any opposed?

Mayor O'Hare said Okay, it's passed at this time. We'd like to welcome Pastor Jim Pitts with us. And could you introduce your two friends to you?

Pastor Jimmi said, I'm Jimmi Pitts. This is Jared and this is Colton. They go to our church and just hang out with me. When I do things, they keep me in line. That's why I bring them.

Mayor O'Hare said and then if you could come up here, that's good.

Pastor Jimmi said Yeah. So I appreciate you guys having me and hearing me out today. We're just a congregation in Ogden that loves its community, state and the world. So we do a lot of different things throughout our community. Weber County, you can call the mayor. I actually volunteer for the Sheriff's Department, Roy. PD, I'm their chaplain and stuff. So the things we do, there's no strings attached, but we want to just show people that you can love your neighborhood in different ways. And so one of the things we were hoping to do was during, around Christmas time, we're used to our congregation packs these boxes. There's about 350 of them, and so they take them home at the first last Saturday, so last Sunday in November, they take them, fill them up, bring them back about three weeks later, and there's this suggested list, and they're just Christmas gifts for businesses generally. We're doing the Weber County Health Department. This year. We're doing another facility, and so for all the employees, another facility, it's called Rise, which works with the mentally challenged. And so we're doing Durham employees, so but then I was thinking, you know, I feel like small towns are forgotten and they're deeply loved because they have a lot of bit of the roots of just what Utah is and just maybe how life used to be, but they get so forgotten because they're small. And so I thought it would be a great idea for us to be able to bless your town, your town is of a certain size, where we can give everyone in your town a Christmas gift, no strings attached. We don't want anything you can call anyone in Weber County that works for the Sheriff's Department, even the mayor, and they'll verify that we don't. We just love people because we believe in loving God and loving people, and that's it. And so we were hoping to coordinate and just make you aware of my ideas. Perhaps I understand, the fire department has, like, a day in which you guys bring Santa Claus and stuff. Maybe.

Mayor O'Hare said yeah, the council members run off Christmas. Christmas time.

Pastor Jimmi asked Is it on Saturday, or something like that.

Mayor O'Hare said this year is on. Is it Saturday?

Stacey said Yeah, December 7.

Mayor O'Hare said December 7, correct?

Pastor Jimmi said I think it's the one I can't do. We're packing 272,000 meals that day. You guys should come down there for that and do that on the 14th.

Mayor O'Hare said I think Santa Claus is booked already

Pastor Jimmi said I can't do it that day. Would it be? You know, my idea is the if we can get basically how many people are in the town, I'll bring that many boxes up for and if we can get their boy or girl or something like that, and then we can have the gifts appropriate, and if their age factors in there too, then we don't mind that. And then I'll bring them up. If we could have a Saturday, maybe on the 14th or the one after that here, then at least we can have the boxes here. I'll bring some food trucks up for the whole town, and weather permitting, we'll just feed everyone in the town to come get a box and eat.

LuAnn said That would be fun.

Pastor Jimmi said Yeah, sure. I mean, once again, it's just expressing our love and gratitude for where you guys are, and too many people blow through your town.

Mayor O'Hare said I don't know if everybody else heard, but can you, can you tell what happened today? I know all of us know because we all got the text message.

Pastor Jimmi said Well, when I came up to meet Stacey the first time, and you know, I was just driving through the town, I saw your school, and I'm like, Well, we do a lot of school drives, like, in our area and stuff. And so I'm like, so I swung by the school and said, Hey, do you guys need some supplies? So then Melissa called me because she wasn't there, because she's over three schools, I guess, in the area, because of the distance. And so then she called me and, and I had to talk her into it, kind of like, we don't want anything. You know you're trying to have convinced people. So we ended up.

LuAnn said really surprising.

Pastor Jimmi said I know the way I look, what do you want? What's this bait switch? I know you want something. So she did, agreeing, and sent me a list through an email and stuff. And so then we brought a trailer load of stuff on Monday, dropped off the school. That's basically a store now for them, that they could sell if they wanted, but with no strings attached. And so I guess they called KSL. KSL is out there right now. I just saw them.

LuAnn said I recorded it,

Pastor Jimmi said because what we like to do is what we should do as people.
LuAnn said Yep.

Pastor Jimmi said right. And so with no strings. And so it's what we do in our community. I was down in Colorado City earlier this year, we rebuilt three homes for ladies who have nothing, who were former FLDS, and they got kicked out. And so they have nothing. So we went down there and rebuilt three of their homes in three days. And then also in Layton, we did 17 homes, 500 of us in three days. As far as renovating them, no strings attached. So you can call the mayor.

LuAnn said Wow.

Pastor Jimmi said we don't look to get anything. We just want to say we love our community too. That's it. So that's a good way to serve. Love you guys.

LuAnn said That's great.

Mayor O'Hare said well, I think the town council would have to decide whether they can we, if we, I say you because, but if we could get this done in the time trying to figure out how many people.

LuAnn said if you're available on the 14th, we'll just make it, happen on the 14th.

Pastor Jimmi said I would be so is primary. Really just us having the boxes available. I don't think it would be a little more intrusive if I went to their homes and had to find them. And the way I look, I get shot at it once or twice in the process, you know, walking up to a farmhouse and, like, What the He doesn't belong here. And so, it would be great if it was a central location that people are familiar with, where they can come pick up a box. If they don't happen to be here

or out of town, we can leave the boxes here for you guys, for them to pick up later. But then it would be we'd bring the food trucks or anything else you guys wanted.

Mayor O'Hare asked Chief Pugsley, would that be something we could use the fire department, the one over here, where we have.

Jed said I am sure I can make it available.

Mayor OHare said Where we have the dog licensing at.

Pastor Jimmi said I'm actually a Weber Fire too. Six years. Jed said yeah, we need more volunteers.

Pastor Jimmi said Okay, I do the prayer on the chaplain.

Jed said we can make it available no problem.

Pastor Jimmi said Okay, awesome. Thank you.

Mayor O'Hare asked, "What's a good time? What would be a good time?"

Pastor Jimmi said it's your town?

Trisha said well, it's December. We're probably gonna shoot for the afternoonish.

Pastor Jimmi said yeah.

Rod said Saturday, one o'clock.

Mayor O'Hare said Saturday one o'clock, 1300 every fire department. Yeah, we can put the food trucks over on this side or somewhere along the side here, as long as it's not blocking the.

Pastor Jimmi said absolutely.

Mayor O'Hare said out there in the front, or the trucks can get out.

Pastor Jimmi aske is there anything else that we can add that would benefit the town. Music, do you want Santa Claus? Do you want? Like we're doing that. So I thought you guys do Santa Claus.

Mayor O'Hare said Yeah.

Pastor Jimmi said we got Santa Claus the elves. I think if you think of anything else, like just Stacey, she can text me, I text more. So just text me and we'll bring it.

Mayor O'Hare said okay.

Stacey said remember we were discussing boundaries. Are we like, are you going to do city limits? Are you going to do Stone and Snowville? Remember we were talking about that?

Pastor Jimmi said so let's say this. We'll commit to 170 boxes, and you determine who they go to.

Stacey said Okay.

Pastor Jimmi said because you guys get to have some goodwill in this too.

Mayor O'Hare said yeah.

Pastor Jimmi said as far as I know, I don't think all 170 will show up anyway. So you guys can just kind of float that out how you want.

Mayor O'Hare said I mean if we do it for just the kids but if we have some elderlies.

Pastor Jimmi said Oh, there'll be a lot of stuff in those boxes.

Mayor O'Hare said for some of the widows and stuff.

LuAnn said yeah,

Pastor Jimmi said but they'll be for you guys too. We appreciate what you guys do. You're not forgot at all.

LuAnn said well, it's really nice what you guys do.

Mayor O'Hare said yeah, that's amazing.

Pastor Jimmi said Very small, super amazing.

LuAnn said It's a gesture that you don't often see,

Pastor Jimmi said yeah, thank you.

Mayor O'Hare said but it's a blessing that'll be returned to you, you know, 10 times tenfold. You know, the Lord always blesses those that have served.

Pastor Jimmi said I feel like it does in my life.

Mayor O'Hare said he does.

Pastor Jimmi said better than I deserve.

Mayor O'Hare said That's one thing about this town. It's this town, you know, we might, we might butt heads with people a lot, but this town, when it's when it comes time, it comes together,

Pastor Jimmi said beautiful.

Mayor O'Hare said It comes together. We, for example, we had a storm out here in 2020, it was on May the 30th. Was it the 30th? We had linear winds clocked at over 120 miles an hour. This chopped down trees, and it took trees. I mean, just this place was a disaster the next day, because it happened at about 10 o'clock at night and the next day. By the time I got off the phone with the weather people in Salt Lake City, they were sending their crew down here to assess because a lot of us thought it was a tornado. You know, before they could get down here, they're like, Wow, you guys cleaned up pretty quick. Now we can't assess to find out really what it was. Now, we got to go back to Salt Lake City and look at our maps and stuff. But the town came together. And, I mean, everybody had their pickups and their trailers and whatever, together, kids, older people, younger people, middle aged people. But, yeah, that's this sounds like that. It's all about service.

You guys absolutely text me too . It's, the best way to get me to.

Mayor O'Hare said okay.

Pastor Jimmi said if you want to add anything to that, seriously.

Mayor O'Hare asked What is the deadline for you guys for that? If they were, if the council decides, if we talked, we said, Well, it'd be good if we did this, and if it's something you guys could help with, what would be the deadline on?

Pastor Jimmi said it just depends on how fast what you're asking for, I can get it.

Mayor O'Hare said Yeah.

Pastor Jimmi said December 7. I mean November 17th, right around there, 18th.

Mayor O'Hare said okay.

Pastor Jimmi said so we'll do the 17th. That gives me a month.

Mayor O'Hare said right.

Pastor Jimmi said that would only be like, probably for food, anything else, it just depends on whether I can get it or not.

Mayor O'Hare said and I don't think there's anything that will, we'll come up with, because I think this is, I think this is plenty, and this is very much appreciated.

Pastor Jimmi said something you want us to bring.

Mayor O'Hare said yeah,

Pastor Jimmi said if you want bounce houses will bring bounce houses.

Mayor O'Hare said No because then we got to get people to, man.

Pastor Jimmi said like, insurance. I know we deal with all that crap too. It is.

Mayor O'Hare said well, that's wonderful.

Pastor Jimmi said but then if you guys have an emergency too, we respond very well. We're a very large congregation, about 2,200 on Sunday morning, so it allows us to be able to reach deep into the community to help.

Mayor O'Hare asked what's the name of your church?

Pastor Jimmi said Washington Heights church.

Mayor O'Hare said Washington Heights.

Pastor Jimmi said non denominations. I've been there for 30 years, I'm not the lead pastor.

Mayor O'Hare asked Is that over on Washington?

Pastor Jimmi said it's just before you drop down the hill.

Mayor O'Hare said Yeah, Okay, I've seen it.

Pastor Jimmi said Yeah, there's, I've been there the longest, but there's a different lead pastor, right? Sink it. If I was the lead pastor, I'm pretty sure.

Mayor O'Hare said well, very good. Does anybody have any questions for Pastor Jimmi?

Pastor Jimmi said throw a party for you.

Mayor O'Hare said we have really do much appreciate it. Thank you.

Pastor Jimmi said Thank you for the time.

Mayor O'Hare said Yes, thank you very much.

Pastor Jimmi said Well, no, it's a privilege. It's a privilege to be in someone's life. So thank you.

LuAnn said that is really nice. Nice to meet you.

Pastor Jimmi said Nice to meet you too.

Stacey said have fun in Mexico.

Pastor Jimmi said on Friday, take care guys.

Mayor O'Hare said thank you very much, Pastor, appreciate you.
Pastor Jimmi said appreciate you. Thank you.

Mayor O'Hare said I think they know each other.
Deputy Shaw said I think the chair was probably going on.

Pastor Jimmi said I know.

Mayor O'Hare said Jared and Colton, thank you.

LuAnn said thank you so much.
Stacey said Thank you.

Mayor O'Hare said next on the agenda we added is the water sampling fee. Did everybody get information on this?

Stacey said I sent it in an email.

Rod said I did see it.

Mayor O'Hare said so basically it's from the Bear River Health Department. As soon as I saw this, I called AJ, and he gave me the information on it. So it really doesn't, this doesn't pertain to us, because it's not going to affect us at all, because AJ is going to now start pulling water samples. So they're not going to come out and pull the water samples.

Rod said I mean, if he wasn't pulling then we'd have to schedule with them.

Mayor O'Hare said and then, yeah, we'd have to pay \$200 for them to come and pull one sample.

LuAnn said you can come to my house anytime, if I go home, just walking.

Mayor O'Hare said so that's not going to pertain to us as far as that goes.
AJ said so I just got a full sample random in the water system somewhere. So

LuAnn said not from a house.

AJ said no, it can be from anywhere.

LuAnn said oh, from outside.

AJ said I can pull it out of the fire hydrant if I want.

LuAnn said Oh, gotcha.

AJ said I just have to have a water sample running every month. And the health department used to do that, but I didn't like the way they were sampling, so I fired him.

Rod and LuAnn said and I think that was a smart choice.

AJ said and the fees are going up anyway. So yeah, it makes a lot of difference.

Rod said and you had to take samples down.

AJ said Yeah, sample. I had to go take repeat samples, and it was just a pain. So yeah, we'll just solve that problem.

LuAnn said okay, that's a good plan.

Rod said Thank you. Appreciate that, sir,

AJ said I have done it for a couple years now. They have the same problem and Howell has been doing it themselves and said it's working out a lot better for me.

LuAnn said well, if you need any help howler.

AJ said it is fine somebody's going to Logan once a month, so.

Rod said appreciate it.

Mayor O'Hare said next on the agenda is the new attorney we have retained. I just gotta pull his name. His name is Todd Godfrey, and he is with Godfrey, Sorry, he's with Hayes, Godfrey, and Bell. They will be our new town attorneys, Todd Godfrey will be appointed to us. He will be sending over what they do is they prorate the year, so they'll be sending over an invoice for the rest of this month, the rest of this year, and then invoice, and then it'll be due every year at the beginning of the year, January 1 will be when we have to sit they'll send us an invoice, we'll pay for the month. So I was thinking it would probably be and it's totally up to the town council if we need to get him over the ordinances. So the ordinances, but going over that and finding out what you know, what all if we need to change anything, if there's stuff in there that needs to be updated, or think we need to go over on what we want to put down as an I. What type of

violations do we want to have to where we're going to start enforcing them? I mean, they all need to be enforced to an extent, but some, you know, we need to. We need to revisit that. With that, I'll go ahead and bring this up to the top prosecutor, Blair Wardel. I talked to him today on the phone, and we spoke about the indemnification that we got, that we all talked about last month. And this is what he told me, so prosecute, an attorney is basically immune and from prosecution, from anything that anything a prosecutor prosecutes, he's immune from being prosecuted, so he has immunity, not saying that somebody can't come and sue him, which has already happened as we tried. Well, it's still sitting in federal but it's not going to go anywhere because it wasn't done properly. And again, the indemnification he said, is that. So even though he's immune from being prosecuted, anybody can sue anybody. Okay, so what he's saying is basically, usually, it's very, very, very rare that it goes any further than somebody filing a lawsuit, and it goes any further than that to where the lawyer, the prosecutor, has to file papers back. And that's where he's talking about, if he was to have to file he would be like in this case, it's a federal they filed a lawsuit federally. Well, he can't file federal papers because he's not he's not licensed to do that. He's licensed for the State. So he would have to hire an attorney to file the papers, and it's usually \$500 well, he only retains us. We retain them for \$1500 so he'd have to take \$500 out of his pocket. And he says that. And then at that point, if I had to do something like that, it's not really worth, you know, worth it for him to continue. He says it's funny, you called and talked to me because Willard called and Perry called because he also represents those towns as well, and they have the exact same questions where what about your malpractice insurance? They don't have they don't lawyers and prosecutors don't have malpractice insurance. They don't offer it, because the prosecutors are immune from being prosecuted for anything unless they do something that they're not supposed to do so if he was to go and do something, prosecute somebody that he's not supposed to, and he knows he's not supposed to, the town's not liable for it, because he went, basically what they call rogue and he went out on his own and did his own thing. But he says if he goes, of course, the council has to decide on what they want to do. He goes. The other towns have once he explained everything to him. They understood and accepted it, and he says he doesn't see this ever happening, but says it does go one step further, and he has to file a paper. He said it usually won't go any further than that, because the judge isn't going to allow somebody to sue and they're going to actually go and

try to prosecute a prosecutor, because he prosecuted them for an ordinance that's on the books.

Rod asked okay, So did he have, like, an idea of what you said, \$500 to file, to hire somebody to file paper.

Mayor O'Hare said That's just to file the papers. Yeah.

Rod said I mean, did he it'd be, it's kind of hard to put something on an open end type thing without knowing if there's any limitations or something like that.

Mayor O'Hare said right.

Rod said yeah, that's my only concern. I would hate to, you know, say yay, and then, then all of a sudden, something comes up, and we're into \$1000s and, you know, \$10s of \$1000s.

Mayor O'Hare said that I don't ever I do when I talk to him about it, he says he doesn't see that happening at all, because, again, he's immune from prosecution. Once he goes to a judge, a judge is going to see it and say, Well, you can't say what the judge is going to say, but prosecutors are immune from being prosecuted or sued.

LuAnn asked so if it's never going to happen, why is he so concerned about us covering him?

Mayor O'Hare said It's just something that they've done that they're putting in. All the prosecutors in the county are starting to do this. He can send us the one from the City to send us one from Davis County, or Salt Lake County prosecutors down there that are working with the towns. They're doing the same thing. They're putting them in, into their indemnifications, into their contracts. More than welcome to send us the one that he's using.

Rod asked but do they have any limitations, or is it still just an open-end type thing? I mean, because you

Mayor O'Hare said means a limitation, as far as

Rod said you know, it is there.

Trisha said it goes further, can't you say yay or nay when the price goes up?

Rod said I mean, I mean if, if there's something that they have to do legally, and they begin the work, and it becomes a long, drawn out process. I could see that, you know, bleeding the town dry because we don't have that deep of pockets. I mean.

Mayor O'Hare said if we well, if a judge allowed it to go that far, then the judge probably sees something that the prosecutor did wrong, and then at that point, we wouldn't be liable for it, because, if our prosecutor, did something he wasn't supposed to do, then we're not liable for it.

LuAnn said but if we signed a paper saying we were going to absorb the cost, then we are liable.

Mayor O'Hare said okay so I can, why don't I see if I can get him to come into the next town meeting?

LuAnn said that whoever Tammie talked to they advised the town not to sign up.

Mayor O'Hare said she talked to the insurance company, and so did Willard, because he told me Willard also had the same. I suggest we talk to our insurance company. And they said, Well, why doesn't he have insurance for himself?" He goes, Well, Willard did the same thing. They talked to their insurance company as well, because I said.

Trisha said why don't you have him come in, then he can explain it terms. Maybe dumb it down for all of us to understand.

Mayor O'Hare said yeah, nope, no problem. I'll call him back tomorrow and get him to come to the meeting in November.

Rod said and if you want to preface it that my personal reservation is, you know, is there a limitation? I mean, you know, we're a small town. We don't have deep pockets,

Mayor O'Hare said right, and I told him that.
Rod said and I think something major.

LuAnn said Well, I'd like to hear a scenario where it could happen.

Rod said yes we'd like to hear the worst case scenario.

Trisha said I would like to hear about it because in this day and age. We need to prepare for the worst.

Mayor O'Hare said yeah,

Rod said so he could give us a worst-case scenario, what we'd be looking at type thing that we could make a good, educated guess.

Mayor O'Hare said okay, perfect.

Rod said Assess.

Mayor O'Hare said I will call him tomorrow and see if he can be down here for that for next month.

Trisha said if you can't make it in person, just something,

Rod said yeah, we could do that.

Mayor O'Hare said a conference call.

Rod said a conference call or a Zoom.

Mayor O'Hare said or zoom

Rod said team, whichever.

Stacey said this next month you're gonna have the we audit. Tammie and I are doing an audit right now, the yearly audit.

Mayor O'Hare said oh, that's next month that'll be a long meeting.

Stacey said yeah,

Mayor O'Hare said okay.

Stacey said it's gonna be at least 20 minutes for Davis and Bott.

Mayor O'Hare said okay, let me see if I can get him on a conference call. We can do a conference call next week sometime. Let me see what his schedule looks like, and then we'll go from there.

Rod said okay.

Mayor O'Hare said it would be after 6:30 pm during the weekdays.

Stacey said just let me know so I can post it on Monday, like, as soon as possible, if you guys only like that special meeting.

Mayor O'Hare said really, even if we meet with the attorney,

Stacey said every time you guys meet.

Mayor O'Hare said So when me when me and Rod went and met with our attorney,

we didn't post it.

Stacey said well, it was just you two. But if you guys all get together.

Stacey said Tammie has always told me she says this, if you guys all get together, you have to have it posted seven days before.

Mayor O'Hare said okay.

Stacey said sorry.

Mayor O'Hare said no, don't apologize. It's the rules.

Rod said Keep us straight. That's what you're for. Keep us straight.

Stacey said that's one of the things on the audit.

Mayor O'Hare said Yeah,okay. Next on the agenda is the violation updates. So everybody's seen the one violation we had over 300 is taken care of. That one's done. Okay? As far as the other one goes, that we had, I spoke to Wardel about this, because I told him. I said, Well, the one violation they've cleaned up the part they were supposed to clean up, and it looks good. They've done it so they're done the other one. I can't tell if anybody's still in the trailer, or if they're not in the trailer, and I can't go on their property. And I'm more than welcome to go over there. A couple of us go there, knock on the door and talk to her and ask her, but you know what the outcome is going to be? Oh yeah, nobody's in there. And there's no way that we can go in and check. We can't. We don't have the right to do that. So on that one there.

Rod asked can we do a wellness check?

Mayor O'Hare said yeah, that might.

Deputy Shaw said those are not gonna steal. I know that.

Mayor O'Hare said I gotta gun.

LuAnn said Oh, yes, seriously.

Mayor O'Hare said I do. I always carry my gun everywhere. So anyway, that's kind of where we're at now. He spoke to the people already. He's talked to him

about the whole thing, and he gets the same response we get. And unfortunately, they keep talking about HUD and all that, and unfortunately, they don't fall under that So, and he's trying to explain that to him, but they don't listen. So it's kind of like we're stuck in a rock and a hard place, almost, with trying to enforce it. No, of course not. So maybe we think about what we can do. Their time's up. Their expiration was on October the ninth. I'm sorry I left my laptop in my truck. I think it's October the ninth.

LuAnn asked what about the other one on the corner? They can't do the sewer system.

Mayor O'Hare said oh yeah, I haven't been able to get a hold with them. And I think they all took off. Oh, that was the other thing I needed to add, and we'll do this. But I think all of them left. I think it's the end of the season for them.

LuAnn said They're on the lake.

Mayor O'Hare said They're on the lake. Are they coming back?

LuAnn said yeah.

Mayor O'Hare said okay well, this is the thing I am off tomorrow. I will be here all day, until about nine o'clock tomorrow night, so I will make a trip over there.

LuAnn said they are not coming back tomorrow, probably.

Mayor O'Hare said well, but the female might be there, and hopefully, if she's there, then I can talk to her because she speaks English. The other one, Jose doesn't speak, sorry. I mean to say that, sorry, the gentleman doesn't speak very good English.

Mayor O'Hare said the other thing I wanted to add, I forgot to add, but I'll go ahead and talk about it because we don't have to vote on it, so not sure who it is. I'm almost positive I know who it is, but 800 North over there, by the old Morgan farm, where OSI now owns, is so much trash all off into the road, across the street, into the other people's yard, and it's beer cans and all this stuff. So I know it's probably coming from OSI, from those trailers that they have there, and the party. They probably had an end-of-the-year party, since they all took the trailers away and there's so much trash over there now.

Rod said we find stuff in our fields all the time.

Heather said yeah.

Rod said that's just bordering their stuff.

Mayor O'Hare said yeah, so I talked to OSI Ryan, right about that, as well as the trees overhanging 800 and she said they would, she would let them know and try to get that cut down if they've done it yet or not. I haven't. I haven't been over there. But I explained to her the trees, that's their trees, their responsibility?

LuAnn asked Is it the one on just after the dip?

Yeah. So when you take the dip down and you come back up, yeah, right there, the trash is just there's so much trash. I got pictures of it, but Heather walks it all the time and brought it to my attention, because she walks the dogs down that road all the time to the Cemetery and back, and it's just flooded with trash. So I don't know what we can do.

Heathers said maybe we can have them sign a disclosure, to clean up after themselves because I don't think we should have to do it.

Mayor O'Hare said yeah.

Heathers said each time.

Mayor O'Hare said so anyway, just want to bring that to your attention. Christmas lights on town hall for Santa.

Rod said we talked last month about some ideas, what we wanted to do for Santa, and our idea was we were going to do an old-time Christmas celebration.

LuAnn said but I don't think we can have it outside.

Mayor O'Hare said yeah, we can't do it outside.

LuAnn said because Santa Claus isn't gonna sit outside.

Mayor O'Hare said so I talked to Jed, Chief Pugsley said that we could use the fire department again.

LuAnn said but we're not gonna be it's not gonna be elaborate. We don't need, all of that room.

Mayor O'Hare said They're not gonna decorate like they did last time. But as far as lights go, Christmas lights, do we? Do we want to put Christmas lights up on the town hall?

Heather said probably should.

Mayor O'Hare said so, when do we want to do that? We'll all get together.

Rod said a Saturday.

Mayor O'Hare said we need to get that company to come out. Here and just put up the perfect Christmas lights that stay up year-round.

Stacey said you can get some like Shanna's.

Mayor O'Hare said what is it called jellyfish?

Stacey said yeah.

Trisha said cheaper versions though.

Mayor O'Hare said yeah.

Trisha said you guys want to look into it.

Mayor O'Hare said yeah.

Trisha said in fact, I think there's do it yourself.

Mayor O'Hare there is.

Trisha said yeah, not too techie those, but I'll have a mixed drink and watch.

Watch you hang him up.

Mayor O'Hare said Scott, a little bit higher. Yeah, that's about right. So do you guys want to? When do you want to put the lights up?

Trisha said I can watch.

Rod said probably on a Saturday is a good time, I think,

Mayor O'Hare asked this Saturday.

Trisha said I didn't say what I was mixing.

Mayor O'Hare said I'm not going to be here.

Heather said Saturday, do you want to put lights up this early?

LuAnn said yeah before it gets freezing cold.

Mayor O'Hare said yeah before it gets freezing cold.

Trisha said I will not be here Saturday.

Mayor O'Hare said Or do you want to do it? The 19th? Will everybody be here?

Stacey said the 19th? I have this town hall rented that night.

Mayor O'Hare said the 26th?

Trisha said, isn't that the Halloween party?

Mayor O'Hare said the Halloween party is on the 20th at night.

Trisha said we can do it during the day.

Mayor O'Hare said yeah, it's during you guys gonna, you're gonna do it at night.

You gotta put Christmas lights up during the day.

Heather said but I work on Saturday sometimes too. Mayor O'Hare said okay, 26th ?

Rod said Yeah that is fine.

Mayor O'Hare said okay Christmas lights up on October, 26 Saturday. What time do you guys want to do it?

Trisha said 10 o'clock.

LuAnn said 10 o'clock in the morning.

Mayor O'Hare said 10am.

Rod asked if someone could send us a reminder that I'm happy to do it. I just tend to forget if I don't get a reminder sometime.

Mayor O'Hare said what I'm going to do.

Rod said I'm forgetful.

Mayor O'Hare asked the council what phones they had so he could make a calendar reminder on their phones.

Rod said on the wall phone.

Mayor O'Hare said I'm gonna send it to.

Rod said a rotary guy.

Heather asked if we even have lights that work.

Stacey said yeah, there's some lights in there.

Rod said they worked last year.

Heather said well, no, I brought my own. All those are mine.

Stacey said the building didn't get any lights last year.

Mayor O'Hare asked You got an iPhone too, right?

Stacey said no.

Mayor O'Hare said you got an iCloud email.

Stacey said I changed.

Mayor O'Hare said okay, So, I'm gonna send you all an email from my Google okay, my Google Calendar, even Trish, that has the iPhone, and then you just save it. Just say when it sends it to you, just say, okay, or save it, or whatever, it'll go onto your calendar. And then you'll get a notification the day before to let you know that the next day, on Friday, you know, Friday, you'll get it, and then, and then 30 minutes before 10 o'clock.

LuAnn said just save it on your own calendar.

Mayor O'Hare said I just sent it to you 26th Yeah. I just said to you.

LuAnn said I will throw up face.

Mayor O'Hare said 10 am okay, next on the agenda is Carson Morgan, the Halloween party, and the Bowery electrical bid.

Carson said I haven't got the bids yet. I'm going to work on that this week. I have two guys coming. One guy is the new family that lives in Gary's house. He really wants to do it. And then Bowman guy.

Mayor O'Hare asked the guy that lives where.

Carson said Gary Frandsen's house.

Stacey said his name is Zach.

Carson said they're a really nice family. He owns a company down in Ogden.

Mayor O'Hare asked and he has a license and all that.

Carson and Stacey both said yes.

Carson said the Halloween party since no one wants to do it, Maddie and I decided we would do it for the community. I just, if you guys have some money you want to donate, you know, we can use some money if you I know I talked, we're gonna use the fire stations, both of them, and talk to Jed and Mayor. We're gonna do burgers and this one, and then Maddie is gonna show a movie, and the other one for the kids hanging out.

Mayor O'Hare said so we don't have a budget. I found that we don't have a budget for Halloween, but that doesn't mean that we can't pull some money from Christmas. I mean, if it's going to be very simple, like that.

Carson said mostly already probably covered. And if I ask the question, if I do have some extra money, can I give it to the town to put in, like, the I don't want extra money, like, I don't say that again, if I have extra money of donations, because I have several donations already from big businesses,

Mayor O'Hare said so you might not need any money from the town.

Carson said it just depends on, you know yeah. But if we could give the money back to the town and put it in, like, the Fourth of July budget, you know.

Mayor O'Hare said yeah.

Carson said if we do get it again.

Mayor O'Hare said yes, you'd have to write a check, right? You got to write a check, though, and on the memo, put a Fourth of July fund, or whatever, that way it's a Donation.

Carson said I don't want it for taxes, I don't want to keep it.

Mayor O'Hare said No, I know that. But we need it for our people that we did it properly.

Carson said If you don't, either the chance we might not use the money, you know. But I've also had people that say that you're in a donate they don't donate.

LuAnn said yeah.

Carson said not really in a position that I want to pay for all myself, either.

LuAnn said no, for sure not.

Trisha asked the church usually do that trunk or treat or whatever.

Carson said I talk to the Bishop a little bit, and they're not. They brushed me off and really gave me the thumbs up.

Rod said they said they weren't going to do it this year. Carson said oh, we do a trunk or treat. I forgot to tell you, and Maddie said that the best person to bring the best trunk treat decoration, will get \$50, and if we get more donations, maybe we'll throw some more into it.

Stacey said that's cute.

Heather asked When is this?

Carson said October 26th trunk or treat starts at 5:30 I believe.

Mayor O'Hare said so at 5:30 okay.

Stacey asked about the best trunk decorations get money.

Carson said 5:30 trunk or treat 6 o'clock dinner show, burgers, and fries, no music, maybe just to play some music.

Heather asked do you guys need help decorating?

Carson said I mean, I don't really want to go extravagant. Trisha said well, they're gonna decorate their trunks. I

call that good.

Carson said I do know the EMS is decorating

g on here, but they were talking about they're gonna pull the ambulance out of service, they're gonna decorate it all up.

Mayor O'Hare said I would suggest that if, yeah, so if we need to donate, it have to be under \$500.

Carson said honestly we might not need it.

Mayor O'Hare said well, I'm just saying it's, it'll have to be under \$500 because we can't vote on it.

Carson said sure.

Mayor O'Hare said and if the town council agrees to that, then if you find yourself needing \$100 bucks, or a couple \$100 bucks, whatever. Then let us know, and then we'll as long as the council is okay with that because if it's not over \$500 we can, we can do that without a vote.

Carson said I really think I do the whole thing for under \$1,500.

Mayor O'Hare said okay.

Carson said yeah, I have had plenty of people donate. A lot of people came out of the woodwork and I was like wow.

Mayor O'Hare said yeah, if you got enough to donate that'd be great.

Stacey said we have a charge account at Kent's if that is ok with the council.

Mayor O'Hare said I mean, if that's okay, as long as it doesn't go over \$500 and if we, I mean, I don't know how much we have for Christmas.

Heather said yeah, cuz that's gonna be \$250 more.

Mayor O'Hare said yeah, because Santa's prices went up to \$250.

LuAnn said \$250 at once. Holy.

AJ said you better get a Brent Santa Claus costume.

Carson said he would do it for \$100.

Mayor O'Hare said yeah, that's for the drive out here and to be here. And to be here for an hour and a half.

LuAnn said oh my goodness.

Heather said it would be cheaper versus buying a costume.

Mayor O'Hare said yeah, buy an outfit. Have somebody be Santa.

Trisha said when it gets a little closer, give us a little final event. I think we're all fine with it, if it's not in excess.

Mayor O'Hare said yeah, it's only a couple of weeks away.

Trisha said so yeah, have your mom give you a little lesson in the bargain shopping area okay? ?not like how you buy your trucks.

Carson said yeah, I got most of the beef and stuff donated. Most of the managers are pretty good about that.

LuAnn said yeah. Stacey said we do have a charge account down there. So where were you getting your beef patties?

Carson said Ryan Poulsen is donating the beef.

LuAnn said Ryan.

Carson said between Ryan and The Rose of Snowville.

LuAnn said so you just need buns. Are you getting hot dogs too, or just hamburgers?

Carson said yeah, probably for the kids, I gotta do buns. And we start with that. Shanna, she called when she's gonna donate all the condiments and everything like that. Jed said the Fire Department can do drinks, but you're only getting canned water.

LuAnn said so all you have to buy is the fries and the buns.

Carson said I don't think I'm gonna do fries. I want to do corn on the cob but I might be too late.

LuAnn said yes corn on the cob you are too late.

Carson said chips.

Mayor O'Hare said yeah, I would just. Do I just get those little single things of chips?

Carson said I figured cheese would be the highest, and cookies.

Trisha said Good god, they're getting truck or treat.

Mayor O'Hare said yeah, they're getting candy. Don't forget cookies. Okay, anything else? Carson, I appreciate it. Thank you so much. Box Elder County, Sheriff Department Deputy Shaw.

Deputy Shaw all right, stats, for what happened in the month of September within the limits of Snowville, there were two tips that were called in. There was a wildlife problem. There were three citizen assists, there were three extra patrols. There were three abandoned vehicles. There was one family fight, one fire assist, and one medical assist. I apologize I do not have the reports. Maybe next time.

Trisha asked can you get your family under control?

Mayor O'Hare said and then you guys also see July and August is here as well. Yes, so you guys can read those unless you have questions about anything.

Deputy Shaw said apologize for not being here for a while. Unfortunately, our staffing is a little lackluster.

Rod said I saw that they had somebody pulled over here on the road just the other day.

Mayor O'Hare said that's good,

Rod said that all that is good presence.

Deputy Shaw said I try to be out here as often as I can.

LuAnn said did you get off the night shift?

Deputy Shaw said No, I got. I finished my regular shift over an hour ago.

Trisha said he wants us to show up because he wants to go home.

Jed said he gets time and a half.

Deputy Shaw said No, I don't get time and a half till after 86 hours.

Mayor O'Hare said all right. Deputy Shaw, thank you. Anything else for us?

That's it? Okay?

Deputy Shaw asked the council do you guys want me to pass along to the rest of the sheriff's office, other deputies?

Mayor O'Hare said anybody?

LuAnn said thank you for always coming around and what you do.

Rod said Yes.

Mayor O'Hare said we definitely appreciate you.

LuAnn said yeah. Thank you very much to all the deputies, because I know a lot of them don't like to come out here, but thank you. Thank you for doing.

Mayor O'Hare said Eric called me today. He's, of course, as you see, he's not here. He had an accident yesterday and lost part of his finger. He was helping somebody with some type of a lift, and they let the lift go, and he had his hand underneath, and it took off the end of his finger.

LuAnn said his birdie finger?

Mayor O'Hare said his middle finger. I said, so next month when he comes to the town council meeting, he'll be showing everybody his finger.

LuAnn asked if they couldn't sow it back on.

Mayor O'Hare said I guess not, lost part of it. So, but I emailed it. I mean, emailed all of you the email that he sent.

Rod said yes.

LuAnn asked said so, and that's on the new well.

Mayor O'Hare said I believe. So, yeah, did you get this one as well? AJ, the one from Marianne from USDA.

AJ said highly possible a while ago, or is it recent? Rod said recent.

Mayor O'Hare said well, he just sent this to me today because he noticed that she didn't put me in the email. So I don't know when it was. Oh, it was sent September 23rd Oh, that was just sent to him. So it wasn't sent to everybody.

AJ said I didn't get an email.

Mayor O'Hare said okay, let me just AJ,

Trisha asked what's the name of that printing place where the signs are?

Mayor O'Hare said did you not get them?

Trisha said No. I haven't had a chance.

Mayor O'Hare said Mountain Valley.

Trisha said I'm gonna try Friday

Mayor O'Hare said they called and they'll fit in your car. They're three feet by two, three feet by four feet

Stacey said if you don't. Trish, I go in every Monday. Let me know.

Trisha said okay.

Mayor O'Hare said I just sent it to you. AJ, but he suggested we either do one or one A.

LuAnn said I can pick them up too. I'm in all the time.

Trisha said I don't work Friday, so I should be able to, sorry, they're not open by the time I got to be working the wheels, by the time I get off.

Mayor O'Hare said they close at five.

Trisha said yeah, so I had to work it around.

Mayor O'Hare said yeah, because they called me again on it, and they said, Alright, coming down to get your sign. Somebody will Friday. I said, somebody

will, don't worry, we'll be down there. There's two signs. So, anyway, you guys got the email from him, so you guys can look at that. We can't do anything about it because it's not on the agenda. So yeah, I guess everybody can get up with AJ and Rod. We'll get with AJ on it as well. Those two can discuss, if you guys have any questions, get with Rod, and then you guys can make a decision on that. Also, He sent me an email. I think he sent it to you as well. Tammie. Uh Stacey, about possible grant money that we could use

LuAnn said for the well.

Mayor O'Hare said no for Potter's Hollow to fix that. Oh, so there's money out there that we can, yeah, I think he sent it to you as well. So there's money out there, this grant that just came available that we can get money for. And he says you probably could get enough money for them to do that, Potter's Hollow, take out that 36-inch pipe and put a big, big old culvert in there, that water will strain right through there. No problem.

LuAnn said would that be a good thing?

AJ said if it's got a hole in it, I think it needs to be fixed. I honestly don't think you need anything bigger than what's there. Your problem with why it backed up is that the screen that was on it plugged up because that's a shiz load of water that a culvert, yeah, would take, and that's the only reason I plugged up. But if you want to get a fix, I'd get a fix. But the only thing I would say is the landowner on the one side is how you're going to keep my cattle from going back through there if you put a big ass culvert in there?

LuAnn said oh, that's true.

AJ said in my defense we are going to have to do something to keep cattle out of there? I don't know what Eric's plan would be, but that would be my concern.

LuAnn said okay.

AJ said and OSI probably have the same concern coming back the other way.

LuAnn said yeah, probably.

AJ said just something to think about.

Mayor O'Hare said I didn't even think about that. Forgot that the cows are out there. Okay, I'm sending you guys this email now from him, so you guys can take a look at it. It was sent five days ago, and you've already got it, Stacey, in your inbox. So about the fire department,

Jed said so a couple of things. Sorry for my absence. The last couple of meetings were a busy time. A couple of quick updates, the switchover for radios for the county. You've got the whole county slated for the 31st of October and the first of November. So what that will entail is shutting down the entire 800 megahertz system that the county has and rolling it into a new P 25 system that's going to update all of our radios and everything, and so they'll be coming out here to flash all of our radios and get them all set.

Mayor O'Hare said okay, I missed the beginning of that.

Jed said so it's a rollover for the 800 megahertz system.

Mayor O'Hare said okay.

Jed said the County and the State are all working together on so it's November 31.

Mayor O'Hare said for everybody to go to the 800.

Jed said Well, it's an update to the 800 systems. What it is.

Mayor O'Hare said so I thought we just got the 800 radios, Jed said we did.

Mayor O'Hare said and now they want us to get different radios.

Jed said no same radios. They just have to come out and flash them and reprogram them.

Mayor O'Hare said so it's not gonna be 800 radios. No more. It's gonna be p 52 whatever.

Jed said P 25 it'll still operate the same. It's just an update, maybe that the government fits stuff.

Mayor O'Hare said they get a handful of cash that they've got to spend before the end of the year.

Jed said well, the issue that we ran into, whatever we got our 800 system. Remember how the system was so backed up with all the accounts, they couldn't put our radios on for a while. They're splitting the bandwidth and opening up 1000s more radios.

Mayor O'Hare said P 25 or whatever it is, okay.

Jed said so it'll be going on, like I said, the 31st and the first. We're going to be down to the EMS conference at that time, but the county is supposed to get it all fixed and worked out.

Mayor O'Hare said No interruption with the there's going to be at this time,click, awesome.

Jed said with that is when they're going to be working on adding the new paging system over at the firehouse. So I don't know if it's going to be that 31st and first deadline, or if it's going to be shortly after, but we're still waiting on that. So we can disconnect here and over there, but we'll just play the waiting game on that see where it goes. I don't think I have anything to vote on, just a couple of informational pieces by the fire department, by-laws, and any changes that are going to be made to those rules and regulations have to be ratified by you as the town council, we have one that we've been discussing about changing training from Wednesday, the first Wednesday, to the first Thursday that has to be voted on by the fire department. Next training meeting, and then I'll be coming to you next. Um. The Town Council meeting to change that. Um, open burns. A residential burn is open till the end of the month. If you have any questions or concerns about that, have them call me. They still do need a permit to burn. No burning on Sundays, everything has to be out by dark. And so it's been pretty quiet as far as residential burns out here, so people have questions or concerns, say I can answer them. Talked about the firehouse for the Halloween party, and we're going to have a few expenses coming up the second week of November. We're going to be holding an extrication training for fire, and EMS had a few Junk Cars donated by people in the community. We're gonna go use my loft over on the corner, smash them up together, and then fire departments are gonna come. LuAnn said with the jaws of life.

Jed said yep then a talk with Western metals, they will send a roll-off out. And so once we get those cars correct, we'll just smash them in the roll-off, and they'll come pick them up and haul them to town.

Mayor O'Hare said are they gonna do that free of charge?" Jed said no, they charge us.

Mayor O'Hare said really, for a volunteer fire department training.

Jed said yeah.

Mayor O'Hare said they can't donate their time in their roll-off. I wish did you had asked them. Or do you want to call them?

Jed said I talked to the guy.

Mayor O'Hare said okay.

Jed said pretty good about it, but we'll get it all situated. Mayor O'Hare said okay.

Jed said so they'll be the good thing about is the people that donated cars don't want anything in return, so once we scrap them, it'll pretty much pay for the roll-off.

Mayor O'Hare said I think about that.

Jed said Yeah, maybe a couple of \$100 bucks for the department.

Mayor O'Hare said okay.

Jed said I did get everything figured out with billing with the county as well, as far as the contract and the new office staff, it's down there and everything. So we did get our fire checks from quite a few of our responses from May till the first week of August came in two weeks ago, just shy of \$25,000.

Mayor O'Hare said nice. That will help your bank account.

Jed said yes, significantly.

Mayor O'Hare said or the fire department's bank account. I should say the fire department's bank account.

Jed said and then next month, I'll have fire hours, so we can pay the firefighters on their yearly funds to go from there. I did get a text from Dave. He's not going to be here. So there's anything from the Fire Department I can address EMS as well.

Mayor O'Hare said anybody got anything for Chief Pugsley from the fire department? Okay? We thank you for that, and we'll let you go ahead and inform us on the EMS.

Jed said I think EMS conference again, we're going to be gone 31st first and second for that down in Provo. Dave just wanted me to make sure that everything was registered in hotels. I think we're all squared away there, though. So with that, just the understanding that both fire department and EMS will be

pretty much shut down for those three days, so responses will be out of Tremonton, most likely.

Rod said so nobody have any issues.

Jed said Yeah.

Mayor O'Hare said to say that again, so we're gonna. It's so the there's not gonna be anybody here to run fire or EMS.

Jed said very few fire, but I'll be gone. I think Eddie, you'll be around.

Carson said I think I'm gonna go down.

Jed said you're going down.

Mayor O'Hare said so, but you gotta have a couple of people if something comes in, so you can't just one person go out there.

Jed said so we're pretty short-staffed.

Mayor O'Hare said okay.

Jed said and the only other one is EMS has ordered new jackets. They should be coming in sometime before training. And I think they've got that all squared away and figured out so any hits up on it.

Mayor O'Hare said perfect.

Jed asked anything about fire EMS that I can answer.

Mayor O'Hare said nope, but don't run off after the meetings over all you do.

LuAnn said yes, thank you.

Jed said I think we're happy to do it most days.

Mayor O'Hare said make sure you let the team know. We all, we all appreciate it.

Mayor O'Hare said Snowville clerk, I'm sorry, does anybody have any questions for EMS.

LuAnn said nope. I don't. Thank you.

Jed said thanks.

Mayor O'Hare said Snowville. Clerk, we will do, clerk and treasure at the same time? Since there's only one of you here.

Stacey said I need some parts for the garbage cans. There's a whole bunch out here that needs some parts, and I know that there are residents around who have said they need new garbage cans because they're starting to break. I don't know how much it's going to cost, but Brandon Garbanati said if you'd help me fix some.

I don't know if I can rob hearts off of them or whatever.

LuAnn asked do we have new garbage cans. Because the. A garbage truck punched a great big, giant hole in the side of my mom's and so the cats get in it now.

Stacey said I know.

LuAnn said so she needed a new garbage can.

Stacey said yeah, there's some out here, but they're like crappy.

Mayor O'Hare said Trish, are you over? You're over garbage right? What do you what would you like to do? Would you like Brandon, which is the guy that takes care of the park, that mows the park and all that. Would you like to utilize him to to fix the garbage cans?

Trisha said as long as he's not spendy.

Mayor O'Hare said Well, he'll get paid his hourly wage. I mean, that's what we have to pay. We have to pay him the hourly wage.

Trisha said how many garbage cans are we looking at?

Mayor O'Hare said how many people say they need garbage cans?

Stacey said right now, I probably have five.

LuAnn said because my mom needs one.

Mayor O'Hare said so he can swap out the garbage cans, and then he can fix the other ones later, when we need them, because we have quite a few garbage cans.

Stacey said we'll see what happens. Then I'll bring it next month or something.

But I just wanted you

to be aware of what was going on.

Mayor O'Hare asked do you want Stacey to go ahead and coordinate with Brandon on that, or did you want to do that?

Trisha said it looks like she's got it under control.

Mayor O'Hare said just wanna make sure.

Stacey said he just comes in and talks to me.

Mayor O'Hare said that's fine.

Trisha said FYI I visited with my mom and dad. We got to get a hold of Jeanie Reeder, to coordinate the times and everything for that.

Stacey said okay, so what Trish is talking about. So Brandon came down the other day, and there's a lot of cleanup over to the park, like branches and stuff like that, and there's no picnic table, and he was gonna have the young women and young men help him, and he said he'd bring his trailer down, and then he could, like, take it down to the dump and put it in for the green waste and stuff like that. So okay, so that's what Trish is talking about because there's a lot of stuff over to the park that needs to be taken care of.

Mayor O'Hare said so you'll just coordinate with Brandon, then with the cans, and then the park and whatever needs to be done.

Stacey said Trish and I will take care of it.

LuAnn said did we decide that we could put that cement in the pit?

Mayor O'Hare said No, I don't think we could put it in the pit.

Jed said it depends on if you ever want to burn the pit.

Mayor O'Hare said yeah, well, we're going to use the pit to burn. That's where the green waste is going to go. And then when it gets to a certain level, excuse me, gosh, when it gets you need to let us know, or let Trish know, what, where you're comfortable burning. You know, I know you don't want that whole thing filled up and you got Bucha so.

Jed said we don't.

Mayor O'Hare said What do you Okay when it gets,

Trisha said that is an easy way to get rid of it.

Mayor O'Hare asked how much cement is there.

LuAnn said I don't know a whole crap ton.

Trisha said I'll hop by 125 and go assess the situation.

Mayor O'Hare said the situation and get back to you. I love it. Okay? AJ Morgan, oh, I'm sorry. Anybody got a question for Stacey? And since we're on this, the expenses sheet she isn't here tonight, so we will have it for next month's meeting.

Stacey said sorry, and it's the new program, and I don't know how to fix it.

Mayor O'Hare said so she'll email them to us. And then we can, we can actually accept them over the email. So if you like it, and you're like, good with it, then just say accepted on the email, return, reply back to Stacey, or reply to everybody. Email, accepted, whatever. And then once you get, once you get everybody's acceptance, and AJ.

AJ said the we've been talking quite a bit about the lead and copper working with Sunrise we've talked about for the last year or so. I think everything is done for the first round. We got all the surveys and stuff in. So we should be good for this first round, which was due the 16th of October. I haven't heard anything back from Sunrise, any additional information they need. So I think we're good there. As far as that, the only other thing is, the generator over at the Well house, I believe, has an issue. When the power goes out, it kicks the SCADA data out and won't restart. It won't start the pumps. I've talked to Thompson's, or I guess it would be Golden Spike Electric, and they haven't been in any big hurry to come out and fix it. Let's just put it that way. It's been three weeks.

Mayor O'Hare said they're the ones that installed it.

AJ said Yes, they said their scheduled maintenance is anytime, so they were just going to put it on their scheduled maintenance, which is okay, that's fine, whatever.

Mayor O'Hare asked but do we have an issue when the power goes out?

AJ said so right now, if the power goes out, the wells will not turn on when the power comes back on, I have to. Or reset it manually to kick the skater back on so I can pretty much so the computer will run the pumps.

Mayor O'Hare said so the generator comes on, but the generator turns on, but.

AJ said the generators, from what I can see, are not producing enough power to kick the wells on, because I can't even kick a well on if I try to bypass it.

Mayor O'Hare said okay.

AJ said so the generators are not putting out. He says that's impossible because it's got too many safety features on it. They shouldn't allow it to do that, even to turn on the generator. I said, Well, I don't know what the problem is, but that's the problem.

Mayor O'Hare asked is there a computer or something in between the generator and the wells.

AJ said I don't, well, I have to SCADA it.

Mayor O'Hare said the SCADA board, right?

AJ said it is all digital that runs everything.

Mayor O'Hare said so when the generator turned on, the power goes out, the generator kicks on, and then it turns on the SCADA.

AJ said the pumps try to kick on, and it kicks the SCADA out because there's not enough power.

Mayor O'Hare asked Is that what the SCADA is saying?

AJ said yeah, or SCADA is dead.

Mayor O'Hare said so it's definitely the generator that's causing this problem.

AJ said that's what I would assume. So I'll keep working with Koby from Mount Valley, who put the SCADA in the update.

Mayor O'Hare said if you can't get anywhere,with.

AJ said I just need to call Tyler, again and harses him again.
Mayor O'Hare said with Golden Spike.
AJ said It is kind of a priority at this time.

Mayor O'Hare said it is a priority.
AJ said yeah.
Mayor O'Hare said because that runs our water.

AJ said that is part of our warranty contract, we have with them anyway, they should be taking care of that.

Mayor O'Hare said if you can't get anywhere by the end of this week, and you get into Monday next week, if you need me, I can call them.

AJ said yeah, just so you guys are aware of that okay, I think that's it.

Mayor O'Hare said Thank you. Any questions for AJ council member McGary, well, I did have one question, are we still deficient on any water meters?
AJ said deficient no.

Rod said I know we needed some. Back a while ago, we said that we needed to replace some.

AJ said oh, no, we're good on meters.

Rod said we're all good on that. Okay, that's all I have.

AJ said yeah, we actually need to put one in for that one that we voted on up here. I need to get a blue stake and dug and get it in. There's no structure there anyway, so he doesn't really need it, so I haven't worried too much about it.
Stacey said he said anytime.

AJ said and he hasn't been complaining. The squeaky wheel gets the grease around my place. He ain't squeaking. He ain't gonna get it done.
Stacey said you guys have been busy.

Mayor O'Hare said Council Member Johnson, okay, so on this bid from Eckoes Paving so I called Parsons. They don't do crack tails anymore, and Anderson, I've called multiple times and talked to the secretary, and nobody ever calls me back. She takes my number every time and doesn't Okay. I'll have so and so and nothing and so. Anyway, this one. So he sent us the same bid twice? Yeah, I was gonna say because he had Cemetery Road on it, and that's County Road, so we don't pay for that. Mayor O'Hare said so it should be cheaper than these.

LuAnn said yeah, it'll be cheaper than this. But I told him we were having a council meeting tonight and we needed the bid. But he sent the same dang one.

Mayor O'Hare said okay.

LuAnn said so I will call him in the morning. He's a super nice kid.

Mayor O'Hare said yeah, just send us over what the new numbers are. And unfortunately, we can't bid on it, or we can't vote on it via email.

LuAnn said Yeah.

Mayor O'Hare said this we have to vote on it in person, so, but this was to be planned for next year, though, right?

LuAnn said we were doing it this year.

Mayor O'Hare said okay,

Stacey asked don't you have to do one when it's a little colder? You said.

LuAnn said yes.

Mayor O'Hare said so we're okay.

LuAnn said yeah, so did you ever, did they ever send you a bill the county on what?

Stacey said I haven't seen anything on our chip seal.

LuAnn said okay, because that was \$25,000 for the chip seal, but I just don't know what it was for the potholes.

Stacey said okay.

LuAnn said and then the crack seal, we were going to just go ahead and do it, because we should have enough money to do that, right? Because we had like seven,

Stacey said there is quite a bit of money in there.

Mayor O'Hare said yeah, the roads have money in there to get stuff done.

LuAnn said so we want, I wanted to get that done this year.

Mayor O'Hare said okay.

LuAnn said and then Brent called the sprinkler guy, and he's going to come winterize it the first of November.

Stacey asked for the Cemetery and the Park.

LuAnn said and the park.

Stacey said okay.

Mayor O'Hare said you said the beginning of November.

LuAnn said the beginning of November. I don't know if it'll be on the exact day of the one. He just said, the first part of November. I'll be there. Brent said don't wait any longer than that.

Mayor O'Hare said can we get Brandon when he does the park? I want Brandon to be aware of it. I actually like Brandon to know how to do both the Park and the Cemetery. If he's going to continue doing the mowing and stuff, that would be good for him to know how to.

LuAnn said we'd have to buy a great big air compressor.

Mayor O'Hare said well, I think I mean.

Stacey said Brandon also said that he would like somebody to come and show him, like, even maybe the sprinkler guys, the set over there to the park in the springtime or something, because some of the parts are not getting water

correctly. So you wanted everything set right. So if he doesn't know, he said he's not a sprinkler guy.

Mayor O'Hare said Oh, okay.

LuAnn said so ours missed quite a few because this is years ago that they put the sprinkler system in, and ours misses quite a few spots. And so that really nice man that I married to water moves the sprinkler by hand multiple times every day, seven days a week, to get the dry spots, I told them, but he said, No, he wanted to make it look good. And he planted a whole bunch of about, I don't know, maybe 60-70, pounds of grass. And it's coming up. A lot of the graves have grass on him right now. That's why you still water. He wants it to look good. That's why he's still watering for a couple more weeks so that it'll get a good start and will not die but it looks really good.

Mayor O'Hare said Anything else?

LuAnn said No.

Mayor O'Hare said Anybody got any questions for Council Member Johnson, okay, Council Member O'Hare, do you have anything?

Heather said no.

Mayor O'Hare said Council Member Arbon,

Trisha said um, I felt like the letter that we sent out saying was pretty self explanatory. I don't know what household waste is. That's really not my problem.

LuAnn aske how did you explain that to her?

Trisha said I said, Why don't you tell me what you want to throw away? And I'll tell you yes or no. But I said, you know, a can or a paper towel that you put in your kitchen garden.

Mayor O'Hare said so what did we decide on that? Do you remember Rod? Well, we decided on those people that are living outside of the town. They are getting town water, so they are paying for utilities from the town.

Trisha said so I figured that out, because I said it's not to be used for daily garbage. I said.

Mayor O'Hare said right.

Trisha said I said, you know, you need to get a can for that. She goes, I have one of those. Then obviously, you know what goes in household waste.

Mayor O'Hare said yeah.

Trisha said I think I'm just gonna have to see what happens there, and then if I have to be blunt, I'll just have to be blunt.

Mayor O'Hare said Yeah, okay.

Rods said okay.

Mayor O'Hare said it sounds good to me.

LuAnn said she'll test you.

Trisha said yeah, not too far. She will not.

Mayor O'Hare said they definitely can't say anything else about our waste drop anymore.

Trisha said right.

Mayor O'Hare said to tell her she can stop crying.

Trisha said I'm just gonna tell her I thought it was her house.

Mayor O'Hare said wow, is that we're gonna put the signs up at? okay, anybody's got any, oh, I'm sorry is that all?

Trisha said That's it.

Mayor O'Hare asked if anybody else got anything for Council Member. Arbon.

Mayor O'Hare said I had an arrow here because I was gonna say something and I forgot what it was. So we're gonna open the floor to public comments. If anybody has anything they need to address, or need to make a comment about. Now's the time, Mr. Vit, did you have something you needed to address? You just came to sit and listen?

Lloyd Vit said that he wanted to talk about Frank Vit's property.

Mayor O'Hare said Oh, okay, we can talk after the meeting on that one.

AJ said I was just gonna.

Mayor O'Hare said AJ.

AJ said I mentioned this to Stacey a little while ago. I don't know what Garrett's plan is with the snow plow. If planning on doing it. I would be interested. I kind of miss doing it, so if Garrett's not gonna do it, I'll do it again.

LuAnn said I don't think he is.

AJ said so whatever we guys want to do, but I'd probably like to do it again.

LuAnn said Do you want Brent to call them?

AJ said oh, I don't care. Whatever you guys want to do, if Garrett wants to do it, knock himself out.

Mayor O'Hare said Garrett, I didn't, I never called him because it was just a one-year thing. It was, you know, we don't really have a contract with, per se, anybody

LuAnn said you missed it.

AJ said Oh, no. I mean, I just, I don't know, but just, I'll be willing to help. I'll just leave it at that.

LuAnn said it sounds good.

Mayor O'Hare said what I mentioned to Stacey is there's, there's nothing saying that we can't have Garrett and AJ both on the snow plow, you know? I mean, there's nobody saying there's not saying that you can't do that.

Trisha asked are we talking Garrett Smith?

LuAnn said well, didn't he move though he's not living with his folks?

AJ said he is living on the flats.

LuAnn said oh, okay.

Mayor O'Hare said So I'll give him a call tomorrow.

AJ said it doesn't make any difference to me.

Mayor O'Hare said I will find out.

AJ said if he wants to do it, knock himself out. But if you're looking for somebody, I'd be willing.

Mayor O'Hare said Yep. Well, we've got you, so I'll give him a call tomorrow. Let me put that on my list. Anybody else have anything for the town council or any comments? Okay, the acceptance of

the expenses we'll have to do next month. Since we do not have them, Stacey will email them to us as soon as she gets them. Have you heard from Tammie about the AC heaters for the building? Did we get bids on those yet?

Stacey said no.

Mayor O'Hare said okay because it's going to get cold here this winter. We need to get those splits in here. Yeah, I know. I hope it stays this way.

AJ said maybe 50 all winter long that would be nice.

Mayor O'Hare said okay.

Jed said if you run this one in the corner, just know that it throws out a ton of carbon monoxide, and it will stink out of here.

Mayor O'Hare said what do you mean?

Carson said you walk in here when it's, like, odd, like, you can tell.

Mayor O'Hare said that thing there. Oh, no, no, we're getting rid of that. We're putting a split.

Jed said if it's gonna get run this winter. Oh, nobody rents it. There's no load of throws out a ton of carbon monoxide.

Mayor O'Hare said yeah, it does because it's propane.

Jed said walk in here at the fore gas and it'll blow up.

Carson said yeah, it's unhealthy.

LuAnn said well, then we probably should unplug it and not use it.

Mayor O'Hare said We need to get Yeah, because if we if we rent this out and they turn that on.

Carson said then it'll blow up.

Jed said it'll give you a headache and make you puke.

Stacey said well, I thought I had carbon monoxide things in here.

Mayor O'Hare said yeah, but it doesn't matter if it's flowing out carbon monoxide, that the only carbon dioxide is going to do is the alarms off. But that thing's blowing carbon dioxide. Maybe we should have the fire department disconnected.

Jed said propane things off.

Mayor O'Hare said there you go.

Stacey asked, isn't there somebody else that can do that? Because I don't know who does it for the churches.

Mayor O'Hare said does what?

Stacey said those splits? There has to be somebody else,

Mayor O'Hare asked Rod who did yours?

Rod said mine was to do yourself. I did my own.

Stacey said oh, you did.

Rod said I did Mr. Cool.

Trisha said well, give us a contract. Mr. McGary.

Stacey said yeah.

Rod said Mr. Cools are easy to put it all right, not that hard.

Mayor O'Hare said especially something this, this size right here, because you only need a small ladder to get up.

Rod said you just have to have a hole from your outside unit into your split and then probably 220 AC hooked up.

Mayor O'Hare said oh, you need a 220.

Rod said well, if it's a small one, they do have 110 they have both.

Mayor O'Hare asked can we get 220 here? Is there?

AJ said yeah, you're gonna have two legs, one hit, so there indeed, you got 220.

Mayor O'Hare said gotcha.

Rod said so.

Carson said you have an electrician in the Valley.

Stacey said he him give us could give us a bid.

Mayor O'Hare said can you get with him and tell him we need a bid for here and for the fire department.

Carson said he just works. Yes, we will get together one night, but he gets home late.

Mayor O'Hare said okay? Ask him what we need. We'll go buy them. We can go buy Mr. Cools at Home Depot right now.

Rod said you just buy them when they deliver Ingrams. Is where we got from.

Mayor O'Hare asked well, were they about \$500 a piece?

Rod said no, they're more than that.

Stacey said I'm sure they're going to be way more than that.

Rod said we did it.

Mayor O'Hare said It's probably one. Must be looking at one for the fire department for the office.

Rod said if you go to the Ingrams, just Google Mr. Cool, Mayor O'Hare said yeah.

Rod said and we used Ingrams when we bought it, and

Mayor O'Hare asked and Ingrams is a store?

Rod said yes.

Mayor O'Hare said okay.

LuAnn said oh, it is. It's not the brand.

Rod said no Mr. Cool is the brand.

LuAnn said Oh.

Rod said it's a do-it-yourself.

Mayor O'Hare asked Ingrams if it in Tremonton.

Rod said No, no, it's online. You buy them online. They ship to you.

Mayor O'Hare said oh, Ingrams is the name of the online store.

Carson said they are selling for \$1,700 to \$2,000.

Mayor O'Hare said so basically, what we need is a, we need a bid on how much it costs and installation, and then we can buy them online. They're electric. No, we won't need propane anymore, we will turn that off. Do you want to look at Ingram's and get the price on how much it costs?

Rod said yeah, how big of one do you want?

Mayor O'Hare said well, we need it for this room.

Rod said okay, this room's probably at 30 by 20, 40 by 20.

Mayor O'Hare said I'd say 40 by 20. So 800 square feet.

Rod said 40 by 20,

Mayor O'Hare said yeah, because of that right there.

Rod said okay, I'll get a price.

Mayor O'Hare asked How big is the office over there at the fire department?

Jed said by 20 by 20? So

Mayor O'Hare said 200 square feet. I do 300 square foot, and then 1000 square foot. That way we're safe.

Carson said \$2,100 bucks.

Mayor O'Hare said \$2100. Are you on Ingrams,

Carson said chill mini flips.com.

Mayor O'Hare said okay, all right, and then we'll bring it for next month.

Rod said once upon a time you talk about floor?

Mayor O'Hare said yeah, redoing the flooring.

Trisha said let's work on one thing at a time we will do heat. We want to put a new floor coming into winter, people tracking in and out of here.

LuAnn said well, it's not going to be carpet.

Mayor O'Hare said yeah, it's going to be flooring.

LuAnn said with rugs.

Trisha asked are they going to be shag?

Mayor O'Hare said let's see how much we have in our budget.

Trisha said I got a good vacuum.

LuAnn asked Can we get a grant to do some repairs in here?

Mayor O'Hare said I don't think repairs.

LuAnn said upgrades.

Mayor O'Hare said yeah, like AC, toilets, plumbing and stuff, but flooring and stuff? No, we, but we could, but we could get a grant to demolish this place and build a new one.

LuAnn said this is the fine day.

Mayor O'Hare said so we can that anybody got anything else? Okay, I need a motion to adjourn.

Rod said I will make a motion to adjourn these expenses first.

Second, all in favor, aye, any opposed, we are adjourned.
