



SUU's 49-year-old Multipurpose Building has numerous building code and life-safety issues of exigent concern, ultimately requiring demolition. The building houses SUCCESS Academy (STEM high school), Upward Bound, graphic arts labs, music practice rooms, dance studios, athletic practice space, locker rooms, and faculty offices—all hindered by inadequate facilities.



Multipurpose Building – Structural and Code Compliance Issues

- No central air conditioning (external cooling systems added)
- Structural deficiencies throughout
 - Foundation settlement
 - Unsubstantiated dance floor substructure
 - Unreinforced masonry sheer walls
 - Lack of code-compliant connections between building structure and sheer walls
- Code deficiencies
 - Dilapidated and obsolete fixtures
 - Damaged interior finishes caused by moisture penetration
 - Antiquated HVAC controls do not comply with energy code requirements
 - Narrow hallways do not meet building code requirements
- Noise and proximity produce challenges for occupants
- Athletic locker rooms do not meet Title 9 statutory requirements




Mechanical systems – Division of Facilities Construction and Management's (DCFM) facilities condition assessment has identified a substantial need for replacement of mechanical distribution systems.

- Steam systems are rapidly failing (cast-in-floor steam piping is inaccessible for repair or inspection)
- Electrical distribution systems have exceeded their expected life
- Air handlers have exceeded their expected life
- Total DCFM condition assessment equals more than \$1 million to correct
