The Governing Board initially convened as the Jordan River Watershed Council, following which members adjourned as the Watershed Council and reconvened as the Governing Board.

Meeting Minutes

Silvia Catten, Chair, called the meeting to order at 10:45 a.m.

1. Welcome & Introductions

Identification of Governing Board members and other meeting participants in person and online

2. Public Comments

There were no public comments.

3. Presentations & Discussion

Jordan River Extra Patrol Program Updates: Jim Winder, newly appointed Chief Law Enforcement Officer with the Division of Forestry, Fire & State Lands, shared an update and led a discussion about the goals, priorities and next steps for the Jordan River Extra Patrol (JREP). This program is funded through the Jordan River Recreation Area ongoing legislative appropriation. Jim reported a significant number of felony arrests along the River, both from felonious activity and outstanding warrants. He expressed a desire to better specify the goals and priorities for this program. Jim also stated that having a common language and better coordination would be important going forward.

Eric McCulley asked if Jim's team utilizes the My Jordan River mobile app.

Jim replied that they are not, partially because some law enforcement data is protected and partially because there are technical challenges involved with sharing certain types of data.

Alcia DeLeon asked if someone could share what website or GIS program was mentioned, linked to monitoring or tracking activities on the Jordan River Trail.

Soren replied that MyJordanRiver.org is a mobile site that the Jordan River Commission uses for all types of crowd-sourced reporting by trail users.

Ben Stireman added that unused past unused funds from this program have been utilized for other purposes along the Jordan River.

Tish Buroker requested that officers in this program use a standardized form of transportation and abide by trail etiquette. She noted that she has seen several officers riding ATV's along the trail, which leads residents to think that ATV's are permitted on the trail.

Jim acknowledged this point.

Kristie Overson asked if there is enough funding available to hire a full-time patrol along the River rather than waiting for volunteers.

Jim replied that he would like to discuss options for full-time patrols with different municipalities because there are some drawbacks to the current model, but also some benefits.

Silvia Catten added that she would anticipate benefits from cities seeing data from along the River more regularly so that they can better allocate resources to address recurrent problems.

Jim agreed that this would be beneficial.

Soren Simonsen noted that dense vegetation sometimes contributes to enforcement issues. He also noted that the Commission provides a structure that could be leveraged for better coordination of efforts.

Utah's Strategic Plan to Address Homelessness & Budget Proposal Updates: Wayne

Niederhauser shared an update on the ongoing implementation of Utah's Plan to Address Homelessness that was adopted earlier this year. This included discussion about current winter overflow programs, coordinated efforts across the Wasatch Front region, a non-congregate shelter pilot project in Salt Lake City, and other coordinated efforts to address the impacts of the growing unsheltered population along the Jordan River Parkway. He noted that homelessness occurs in every city, but becomes concentrated in Salt Lake City partially because other areas lack resources.

Wayne discussed data showing that rates of homelessness are strongly tied to the cost of living across the country. He noted that the majority of people looking for affordable housing will not be able to find it due to large gaps in availability for the population that cannot afford market rates. He also discussed the legislative priorities and budget proposal for the upcoming 2024 General Legislative Session, which was recently presented by Governor Cox and Lieutenant Governor Henderson. He emphasized the need to expand non-congregate shelter options.

Wayne asked the Commission to support the legislative appropriations that will be requested by Governor Cox.

Marissa Beckstrom stated that she would love to be part of a conversation about how they can all do their part. She comes from a background in homeless services, and would love to see more community care in all realms.

4. Commission Business
