- Results Driven Accountability (RDA)
- o SSIP Teams:
  - Baby Watch Team (program manager, data team, education & compliance team)
  - Core Work Team (Baby Watch staff, ECTA staff, representatives of the SSIP Leadership Team (4 parents of a child with special needs))
  - Leadership Team (Baby Watch staff, ECTA staff, state agency representatives, parent advocacy, ICC members, local El program administrators and providers)
  - Broad Stakeholder Group (Baby Watch staff, ECTA staff, Bureau of Child Development staff, ICC members, all local El administrators and providers)
- o SSIP: Phase I "Analysis" (2013-2015) was based on five components:
  - Data Analysis
  - Analysis of infrastructure to support improvement & build capacity
  - State-identified Measurable Result
  - Selection of improvement strategies
  - Theory of action
- Local El programs participated in a root cause analysis to address the identified SiMR.
- o Fishbone Analysis (six El programs chose to participate)
  - Identified common causes for lower social-emotional development among children with diverse cultural backgrounds.
    - Culture
    - Socio economic status (SES)
    - Education level of the family
    - Early Intervention staff training
    - Evaluation tool
- o SSIP: Phase II "Plan"
  - Built on Phase I. Added infrastructure development, support for local El programs and evaluation
- o SSIP: Phase III "Implementation and Evaluation"
  - Built on Phases I and II. Added results of ongoing evaluation and revisions to the SSIP.
- SiMR (State-identified Measurable Result)
  - o Substantially increase the rate of growth in positive

Could support or pursue creating some parent information regarding the coaching principles in the Pyramid model (not calling it Pyramid Model).</li> <li>Funding Subcommittee (Shaun Mower)</li> <li>Worked with USU and on the provider side to procure some additional funding.</li> <li>Update on Building Block - Has been submitted to the Governor's Budget for consideration. We are limited on what can be shared at this time. It is considered confidential until we know if it makes it to the Governor's Budget. This usually happens in December.</li> <li>Continuing to pursue those two avenues of funding. To assist with hiring and retaining staff.</li> <li>Child Find Subcommittee has not met recently</li> <li>Stakeholder Subcommittee (Karen Borg)</li> <li>They have wrapped up and sent recommendations to Baby Watch</li> </ul>
