

ORDINANCE NO: 2024-17
AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE PREVENTION OF
ILLEGAL DUMPING

WHEREAS Lake Point is authorized pursuant to the Utah Code 76-10-2701 to protect public and private property from dumping of trash, garbage and other undesirable materials on public and private property; and

WHEREAS the Lake Point City Council desires to an ordinance governing the dumping of trash and refuse on public and private property and recognizes that this shall be beneficial to the City and its citizens;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Lake Point City Council as follows:

Section 1. Purpose

1. This ordinance Prohibits the disposal of trash, glass, or other materials on public or private land without permission. Violators must immediately remove the material and dispose of it in a receptacle. Destructive or injurious materials on parks, recreation areas, waterways, or other public or private lands.

Section 2. Regulations

1. This ordinance Prohibits the disposal of trash, glass, or other materials on public or private land without permission. Violators must immediately remove the material and dispose of it in a receptacle.
2. Destructive or injurious materials on parks, recreation areas, waterways, or other public or private lands.
3. A person may not throw, deposit, or discard, or permit to be dropped, thrown, deposited, or discarded in any park, recreation, area, or other public or private land, or waterway, any glass bottle, glass, nails, tacks, wire, cans, barbed wire, boards, trash, or garbage, paper or paper, products, or any other substance, which would or could Mah or impaired the scenic aspect or beauty of the lead in the state, whether under private or municipal ownership without the permission of the owner or person having control or custody of the land
4. A person who drops, throws, deposits, or discard, or permits to be dropped, thrown, deposits, or discarded, on any park, recreation, area, or public or private, land or waterway, any destructive, injuries, or unsightly material shall:
 - a. Immediately removed the material, or caused it to be removed; and
 - b. Deposit the material in a receptacle designed to receive the material.
5. A person distributing commercial, hand, bills, leaflets, or other advertising shall take whatever measures are reasonably necessary to keep the material from littering public or private property.
6. A person removing a wrecked or damaged vehicle from a park, recreation, or other public or private land shall remove any glass or other injuries. Substance dropped from the vehicle in the park, recreation, area, or other public private land.
7. A person in charge of a construction or demolition site shall take reasonable steps to prevent the accumulation of litter at the construction or demolition site.
8. A law enforcement officer as defined in section 53 – 13– 103, within the law enforcement officers, jurisdiction:

- a. Shall enforce the provisions of this section;
 - b. May issue citations to a person who violates any of the provisions of the section; and
 - c. May serve an execute, all warrants, citations, and other processes issued by any court enforcing this section.
9. An operator of a park, campground, trailer, park, drive-in restaurant, gasoline, service station, shopping center, grocery store, parking lot, Tavern, parking lot, parking lots of industrial firms, marina, boat, launching area, boat, Mirage, and fueling station, public and private pier, beach, and bathing area shall maintains, sufficient liter receptacles on the premises to accommodate the litter that accumulates.

Section 3. Penalty for littering on a park, recreation, area, waterway, or other public or private land.

1. A person who violates any of the provisions of section is guilty of a class C misdemeanor and shall be fined not less than \$500 for the first violation and \$1000 for each subsequent violation.
2. The sentencing judge may require that the offender devote at least four hours in cleanup:
 - a. Litter caused by the offender; and
 - b. Existing litter from a safe area and designated by the sentencing judge.

Section 4. Repeal and Replace

1. This ordinance shall repeal and replace any previous ordinance or provision thereof in conflict herewith to the extent of such conflict.

Section 7. This Ordinance shall be effective immediately upon its adoption and publication according to law.
