3. Review minutes from previous meetings:

- a. Motion to approve September 30, 2024 minutes by whom: With correction of adding Jamie to the attendance; Linda

4. LeeAnne acknowledged that the point of having shirts for the committee is to be visible and used a public relations strategy. Jamie will give an update on the status of the shirts later in the meeting.

5. City Council Meeting Reports:

- a. Committee report for City Council Meeting
 - i. October Meeting: *(By Billie)*
 - 1. New press release for the new performing arts center. Larry and Gale Miller foundation donated \$25 million. Will be by the new Bee's stadium, the Library and Fire Station. Will be complete 2028.
 - 2. Council meetings will be held only once in November and December (Nov 19 & Dec 3)
 - 3. Talked about the water easement in Daybreak
 - 4. Public works talked about what goes into maintaining the city

- c. City Council report: *(By Councilman Shelton)*
 - i. Update on New Senior Center: Hope to have an announcement early 2025 with a better location. Cannot disclose any more information at this time.
 - ii. Excited for new performing arts center
 - iii. Plan to keep potholes filled as best we can and ADA ramps.

- a. Crosswalks on Redwood update *(By Councilman Shelton)*
 - i. Redwood Rd is owned by the state and they will only put a crosswalk at intersections with lights. Putting one on Redwood would be more dangerous due to the size.
 - ii. 11400 S east of light on Redwood needs to be fixed. Again, it is a state road. Comment from Erie that he has noticed the difference in road maintenance between South Jordan and West Jordan and how well South Jordan does. The city has a great system to address problems as they occur. If you see something, report it to public works and it will get fixed.
- b. Shirt order update *(By Jamie)*

- i. Shirts have been ordered, do not know when they will arrive. I will let you know. Potentially in 2 weeks.
 - ii. Update: The baseball tee logo will be in the corner instead of larger and in the middle of the shirt.
