DISCUSSION ITEM(S)

1. Lightning Safety – Scott Goodman

Scott discussed concerns regarding building codes for home protection in case of lightning strikes. What are the resources for building inspections in electrical grounding? Additionally, when inspecting a house what to look for in grounding safety. What is the process for inspections for building codes?

Bob Van Bibber asked if there are resources for monitoring lightning storms during sports games and outdoor activities? Chief Obrey indicated that would fall under the Parks and Recreation Department and follow-up may be available next month.

Murray City Emergency Manager is Nick Haskins and he would have resources for this topic.

1. School Zone Safety – Scott Goodman

Scott's addressed concerns regarding the safety and necessity of some particular school crosswalks in the Murray area.

Chief Obrey is chairman of the Traffic Safety Committee which has additional representatives from Murray City. The committee meets monthly and he will discuss the questions Scott had regarding the crosswalks with the engineers on the committee and report their findings.

1. Discussion and ideas for educational possibilities regarding walking and biking safety. How can our board assist with education Deb Crane

What can the board do to assist in sharing safety information on bike and walking safety? A suggestion of highlighting different safety tips and information on the Murray police website. Chief Obrey will follow-up on how the information can be placed on the website. Scott Goodman will write up something and send the board to review then to Chief Obrey for posting.

1. Continued discussion on how we can get the word out regarding our meetings that happen each month.

Best practices from other boards – Scott Goodman

Scott discussed the possibility of posting information on the Murray Citizens social media page last month. It was advised that he discuss the procedure with Doug Hill, Murray City Manager. It was determined that there may be different options that would more appropriate for the Advisory Board.
