





ORDER OF THE STATE ENGINEER

For Permanent Change Application Number 57-8549 (a51965)

Permanent Change Application Number 57-8549 (a51965) in the name of White City Water Improvement District was filed on July 25, 2024, to change the points of diversion for 4.31 cubic feet per second (cfs) of water as evidenced by Water Right Numbers 57-8549 and 57-8557. Heretofore, the water has been diverted from the following points:

- 1) Well South 600 feet West 1377 feet from the E¼ Corner of Section 9, T3S, R1E, SLB&M (existing 20-inch well, 1015 feet deep)
- 2) Well North 103 feet East 1231 feet from the W¼ Corner of Section 10, T3S, R1E, SLB&M (existing 20-inch well, 1140 feet deep)
- 3) Well North 260 feet East 2840 feet from the W¼ Corner of Section 8, T3S, R1E, SLB&M (existing 16-inch well, 723 feet deep)
- 4) Well South 790 feet West 890 feet from the NE Corner of Section 17, T3S, R1E. SLB&M (existing 16-inch well, 1120 feet deep)

The water has been used for the following purpose:

- 1) Municipal Sandy year round
- 2) Municipal White City Water Improvement District year round

The water has been used in all or a portion of:

- 1) Service Area of Sandy City
- 2) Service Area of White City Water Improvement District

Hereafter, it is proposed to divert 3122.7 acre-feet of water from points of diversion changed to:

- 1) Well South 47 feet East 1987 feet from the NW Corner of Section 8, T3S, R1E, SLB&M (16-inch well, 915 feet deep)
- 2) Well South 790 feet West 890 feet from the NE Corner of Section 17, T3S, R1E, SLB&M (16-inch well, 1120 feet deep)
- 3) Well South 165 feet East 291 feet from the N¼ Corner of Section 17, T3S, R1E, SLB&M (16-inch well, 515 feet deep)
- 4) Well North 10 feet West 796 feet from the E¼ Corner of Section 8, T3S, R1E, SLB&M (16-inch well, 863 feet deep)
- 5) Well North 260 feet East 2840 feet from the W1/4 Corner of Section 8, T3S, R1E, SLB&M (16-inch well, 723 feet deep)
- 6) Well South 723 feet West 1275 feet from the NE Corner of Section 9, T3S, R1E, SLB&M (20-inch well, 950 feet deep)

- 7) Well North 103 feet East 1213 feet from the W1/4 Corner of Section 10, T3S, R1E, SLB&M (20-inch well, 1140 feet deep)
- 8) Well South 46 feet East 2532 feet from the W1/4 Corner of Section 8, T3S, R1E, SLB&M (16-inch well, 606 feet dcep)

The nature of use will remain the same as heretofore.

The place of use of the water will remain the same as heretofore.

Notice of the change application was published in the <u>Descret News</u> on August 16 and 23, 2024. No protests were received.

The proposed hereafter quantity of water of 3.122.7 acre-feet exceeds the heretofore 4.31 cfs. 4.31 cfs converts to a volume of 3,120.3 acre-feet. Water right 57-8557 is a segregated portion of 57-8549, and 57-8549 was segregated from 57-2338; both 57-8549 and 57-8557 are relevant to this application. The contributions of these rights are summarized in the table below.

These rights were segregated from 57-2388 prior to the parent right being certificated. The original application to appropriate was for year-round municipal use, which has historically allowed 100% depletion; therefore, this change application should be limited by the diversion, and the depletion will be limited on the certificate following the proof of beneficial use.

On June 25, 2002, the Salt Lake Valley Groundwater Management Plan was implemented. The intent of the plan is to provide specific management guidelines under the statutory provisions of Title 73 of the Utah Code. Because of the over-appropriation of the water resources within the Salt Lake Valley and to ensure no impairment of existing rights will occur, the plan directs that all applications proposing a new diversion from the principal aquifer will be rejected. This change meets the conditions set forth by the plan to be considered for approval.

¹ The volume in acre-feet is calculated by multiplying the flow in cfs by 723.97 acre-feet per year/cfs (3,600 seconds per hour x 24 hours per day x 365 days per year / 43,560 square-feet)

In evaluating the various elements of the underlying rights, it is not the intention of the State Engineer to adjudicate the extent of these rights, but rather to provide sufficient definition of the rights to assure that other vested rights are not impaired by the change and/or no enlargement occurs.

It is, therefore, **ORDERED** and Permanent Change Application Number 57-8549 (a51965) is hereby **APPROVED** subject to prior rights and the following conditions:

- 1) Water use under this approval shall be limited to the <u>maximum</u> annual diversion allowance of 3,120.3 acre-feet of water for municipal use.
- 2) Upon filing proof of beneficial use, White City Water Improvement District shall provide data quantifying the depletion resulting from municipal use.
- 3) The applicant shall install and maintain measuring and totalizing recording devices to meter all water diverted from all sources pertaining to this application and shall annually report this data to the Division of Water Rights Water Use Program.
- 4) Inasmuch as this application seeks to divert water from numerous points of diversion, it is necessary that detailed information be provided to the State Engineer to show which sources of supply are actually developed and used and the extent of their usage under this application. Upon the submission of proof, as required by Utah Code § 73-3-16, the applicant must identify every source of water used under this application and the amount of water used from that source. The proof must also show the capacity of the sources of supply and demonstrate that each source can provide the water claimed to be diverted under this right as well as all other water rights which may be approved to be diverted from those sources.
- 5) Whereas this Change Application has been filed to entirely replace and supersede prior approved Change Application Numbers 57-8549 (a40592) and 57-8557 (a38485), with this approval those prior applications are considered to have been WITHDRAWN.

The State Engineer has statutory responsibility to create and maintain water right records based on an administrative process outlined in statute. The State Engineer is not authorized by statute to adjudicate water right title or the validity of established water rights. It is noted that failure to exercise a water right within the statutory period could render all or a portion of a water right invalid through forfeiture. Parties who wish to challenge the validity of a water right are advised that a declaration of forfeiture is a judicial action and the courts are available to pursue such suits (Utah Code § 73-1-4).

As noted, this approval is granted subject to prior rights. The applicant shall be liable to mitigate or provide compensation for any impairment of or interference with prior rights as such may be stipulated among parties or decreed by a court of competent jurisdiction.

This approval is limited to the rights to divert and beneficially use water and does not grant any rights of access to, or use of land or facilities not owned by the applicant.

The applicant is strongly cautioned that other permits may be required before any development of this application can begin and it is the responsibility of the applicant to determine the applicability of and acquisition of such permits. Once all other permits have been acquired, this is your authority to develop the water under the above referenced application which under Utah Code §§ 73-3-10 and 73-3-12, must be diligently prosecuted to completion. The water must be put to beneficial use and proof must be filed on or before **August 31, 2030**, or a request for extension of time must be acceptably filed and subsequently approved; otherwise, the application will be lapsed.

Proof of beneficial use is evidence to the State Engineer that the water has been fully placed to its intended beneficial use. By law, it must be prepared by a registered engineer or land surveyor, who will certify to the location, uses, and extent of your water right. Upon the submission of proof as required by Utah Code § 73-3-16, for this application, the applicant must identify every source of water used under this application and the amount of water used from that source. The proof must also show the capacity of the sources of supply and demonstrate that each source can provide the water claimed to be diverted under this right as well as all other water rights, which may be approved to be diverted from those sources.

Failure on your part to comply with the requirements of the applicable statutes may result in the lapsing of this change application.

It is the applicant's responsibility to maintain a current address with this office and to update ownership of their water right. 1. <u>Call to Order and Determination of Quorum</u> The Board of Trustees Planning Committee meeting was called to order by Chair Paulina Flint on Wednesday, January 15, 2025 at the District Office at 5:00 p.m. It was determined a quorum was present, with Mr. True excused.

Sunrise Engineering Report

- Status of Highland Drive South Project Cliff Linford reported the survey has been completed and analyzed. There is a power line in the corridor which we need to locate. Sunrise has reached out to Rocky Mountain Power to verify the line and discuss relocating it within the corridor. Paulina stated she heard a report that a plan to build a bridge over Dimple Dell may be under discussion. Cliff or Alma will call Blue Stakes to locate the power lines. Paulina suggested Cliff also talk to UDOT regarding future plans.
- Status of Common Aquifer Cliff advised the EPA has accepted our study, and we now need State approval. We have a few items to work through. The EPA did break the aquifer into 2 separate zones. Wells 9 & 10 in the Upper zone, the rest in the lower zone.
- Tax Rate Comparison Cliff reported he has not yet completed the tax rate comparison. He will work on it for next month.
- General Engineering There were no General Engineering items to discuss. Paulina asked Cliff to look at and perhaps add franchise taxes and property value as part of his tax rate comparison. It was moved by Mr. Johansen, seconded by Mr. Cutler the Sunrise Engineering Report be accepted. The motion was approved with the following vote: Ms. Seiger-Webster and Flint, aye; Messrs. Cutler and Johansen, aye.

2024 Annual Water Usage Report - James Lucas reported we produced 27.2 M gallons, billed 20.5M, for 6.7M unaccounted for in December. For the year, we produced 959 M gallons, billed 875 M, a difference of 8.79% unaccounted for,

General Repair & Maintenance - James reported 1 main break on Phlox last month. Operations staff have been changing out setter in the east zone, and are working on capital improvement meters, which should be finish in the next few weeks. Fire protection and fire flows were discussed and James reported all hydrants were dry tested last year. It was moved by Ms. Seiger-Webster, seconded by Mr. Johansen the Operations Manager Report be accepted. The notion was approved with the following vote: Messrs.
