- 246 (c)does not allow a dental provider to {bill}seek payment of the contracted fee for a covered service from the patient {for a service} when the insurer
- denies (the claim) payment for the service, unless under generally accepted practice standards,
- 248 the service performed should not be billed; or
- 249 (d)beginning January 1, 2026, automatically recoups an overpayment unless:
- 250 (i)the recoupment occurs more than 60 days from the day the insurer sends a notice
