4. City Council Meeting Reports:

- a. Committee report for City Council Meeting
 - i. December Meeting: *(By LeeAnne)*
 - 1. Listened to the meeting and had a hard time understanding. A few things she heard, Councilman Shelton briefly reported on the Senior Advisory Committee meetings. People were concerned about crossing Mountain View Corridor safely. Susan Pulsipher was recognized. Introduced Tracy Miller.
 - ii. January Meeting: *(not assigned)*
 - 1. no had a report
 - a. Discussed the schedule of who would be attending future meetings
 - i. Carrie volunteered Feb 18.
 - ii. March will be covered by the Walkers
- b. City Council report: *(By Councilman Shelton)*
 - i. Toured the new Bee's stadium, it is a great facility with incredible views. Suggested Senior Programs to schedule a trip. They will open in April. The new senior center announcement it very close to happening and it is expected to possibly break ground this year. Working on the budget for the next fiscal year. Would be willing to take some time at a future meeting possibly in the fall to explain the accounting process for the city, which is vastly different than corporate accounting. Will need to leave the meeting early.
- c. Director report: *(By Janell)*
 - i. Recreation is gearing up for spring. The Arts Council will be presenting their year in review to City Council on Feb 18. Gearing up for Summerfest and she will let us know when the parade applications are open. Jamie suggested that any committee members available to attend Feb 18 to see how the Arts Council presents so they can get a feel for their own presentation.

- a. Event reviews:
 - i. Light the Night
 - 1. Feedback: Positive feedback and felt like it was a good use of time.
 - ii. Holiday Banquet
 - 1. Served 212-new record! (served 172 last year)
 - 2. Feedback: The amount of calendars was good for the number of people. The way the tables were set up allowed for 20 more people as well as made the audience more attentive to the entertainment.

- iii. Noon Year's Eve Party
 - 1. Served 122- (114 last year), attendance capped to ensure a dance floor.
 - 2. Feedback: All positive
 - iv. Blue Hawaii Luau
 - 1. Served 133- (88 last year)
 - 2. Feedback: Karaoke was fun.
 - v. Councilman Shelton acknowledged the significant increase in attendance for each event. Jamie confirmed it was consistent over all. Councilman Shelton suggested including this into a presentation to the council. Janell informed us of the City Wide Annual Report will be going out any day and it does have information on Senior Programs.

- i. Lunar New Year 1/29/25
 - 1. update on lion dancers (*By LeeAnne & Jamie*)
 - a. LeeAnne and Jamie have both tried to reach out, Jamie did hear from Bingham admin with the email to the Chinese teacher, but still have not heard. Will continue to persist and try to set something up for next year.
 - ii. AARP Tax help 2/6/25 through 4/10/25
 - 1. Sign up schedule for making reminder calls for taxes was passed around. The time is flexible.
 - iii. Valentine Lunch 2/14/25
 - 1. Boutique items have been purchased. The amount to supplement is \$36, 144 items purchased at \$1.25 (supplementing \$0.25 per item). The items will be sold for \$1 at the Valentine's Day Lunch. Boutique will be just by the door. Billie, Carrie, and LeeAnne volunteered to be at the table. Boutique will start at 10 AM volunteers should there at 9:45 AM. We will take cash, but we do have credit card capabilities.
 - iv. Mardi Gras 3/4/25
 - 1. update on history research (*By Carrie*)
 - a. Carrie still working on the history and will have something soon.
 - 2. Booked a dance band for this event
 - v. St. Patrick's Lunch 3/17/25
 - 1. The committee will cover 20 gifts for the game of "Hoy". The committee agreed to a budget of \$100. Jamie and Billie will go purchase items together.

6. New Business:

- a. Oktoberfest event (*By Jamie*)
 - i. Held October 3, booked a German accordion player. Would like to ask for help with the cost of the entertainment as they are out of our budget. The committee unanimously approved to cover \$150 towards the entertainment.
- b. Birdhouse opportunity with American Academy of Innovation (*By Jamie*)

- i. A teacher at American Academy of Innovation approached the center with a service project. He is teaching his 6th and 8th grade math students about triangles so they are building birdhouses. They have also done research about different birds and the different meanings. They wanted to give them to someone who could benefit. Bird watching can be very therapeutic. Working out the details and asking the committee specifically to help with awareness and support and making nominations. They have 8 birdhouses they want to give away. It will be put in the newsletter. Jamie will organize it to create structure and meaning. The reception will be better at the center rather than the school.
