WIC

Nutritional program for pregnant, postpartum, and breastfeeding women, infants, and children up to 5

Immunizations

Child, adult, and travel vaccines both private pay and federally subsidized.


Home Visiting

Evidence based programs to improve pregnancy outcomes, parenting competencies, child health and development, and family self-sufficiency.

Infectious Diseases Disease

Investigation and treatment of TB, Hansen's Disease, acute hepatitis B and C, CJD, and STI.

Funding



WIC

Serves:

- Pregnant women, new mothers, and children under 5
- Households at or below 185% of poverty
(\$57,720/year for a family of 4)

Provides:

- Nutritious foods (grains, dairy, fruits, veggies, beans, baby formula)
- Nutrition education
- Breastfeeding support
- Health & community resource referrals





- WIC Online
 - Shifted to online services over the past year
 - Electronic benefits cards can now be loaded remotely
 - Reduces clinic visits, saving time and improving efficiency
- Celebrated 50 years last September, with the first program at Salt Lake Public Health Center

INFECTIOUS DISEASE

Serves:

- All Salt Lake County residents
- Majority are refugees, immigrants, homeless, and individuals with substance use disorders

Provides:

- Treatment, education, support, and links to care for:
 - Latent and Active TB
 - Hepatitis B and C
 - Hansen's disease (leprosy)
 - Crutchfield Jakob's Disease (CJD)
- Community education and certification for TB skin testing





SEXUALLY TRANSMITTED DISEASE (STD) CLINIC

Serves:

- All Salt Lake County residents
- Focus- low income, uninsured, and those with no medical providers

Offers:

- STI testing and treatment
- HIV testing (rapid and blood)
- PrEP HIV prevention
- Doxy PEP

STI OUTREACH

Mpox


- Outreach to clubs – MILK and Karamba
- 6 cases in 2024
 - All MSM
 - Last case 9/11/2024

Congenital Syphilis

- Most affected
 - SUD, unhoused, transactional sex, lack prenatal care
 - Recently immigrated Latina women
 - 7 cases in 2024, 1 case in 2025

HOME VISITING



Serves:

- Pregnant women & children up to age 5
- Medicaid-eligible or $\leq 185\%$ of poverty

Offers:

- Nurse-Family Partnership
- Parents as Teachers
- Medicaid Early Childhood Targeted Case Management

Provides:

- Education on pregnancy, child development, and family well-being
- Resources to improve self-sufficiency and community engagement

EVIDENCE-BASED HOME VISITING

Program Benefits

- Reduces substance use during pregnancy
- Decreases child abuse & neglect
- Improves school readiness, performance, and attendance
- Enhances self-regulation skills
- Promotes better child health & development
- Increases economic self-sufficiency, with \$6 return for every \$1 spent

Sunn's Journey

- Enrolled at 16 weeks pregnant with twins, delivered early due to preeclampsia
- Struggled with medical bills and homelessness
- Alina helped enroll the family in Medicaid and taught bill management
- I felt lost and was trying to bond with my babies while figuring out how to improve for my family. I wanted to be heard, and Alina listened. She was an emotional mentor, and her support helped me tremendously”

Serves:

- All Salt Lake County residents

Offers:


- Childhood, adult, and travel vaccinations
- Participates in Vaccine for Children program to offset vaccine cost for those who are uninsured or on Medicaid
- Special projects vaccines- Hepatitis A or B, flu, pneumonia, or Tdap (diphtheria/pertussis) free to vulnerable populations



IMMUNIZATIONS

- Outreach Clinics
 - Partnering with community organizations in high-risk areas
- International Travel
 - Tailored education and vaccinations to reduce travel risks
- Outbreak Response
 - Collaboration with other SLCoHD Divisions
 - Vaccination is a key public health intervention used to control vaccine preventable disease outbreaks
