Fortis College PN program proposal:

Ms. Vanessa Lausch campus president at Fortis College and Ms. Cynthia Dunfield the dean of nursing. Ms. Lausch presented a brief overview of the PN program. The Practical Nurse program will be a diploma program with five quarters, a total 82 credits, total clocked hours will be 1,350 and outside class hours will be an additional 1,220 hours.

Fortis College PN program proposal continued:

The program will contain three general education courses a total of six online courses. The percentage of Labs and Clinicals will be 63% and 850 hours. The simulation will be 131 total hours at 9.7% in simulation.

Guiding Practical Nursing Program Principles:

- Clinical Competence
- Communication and Interpersonal Skills
- Holistic Patient Care
- Collaboration and Teamwork
- Ethical and Professional Practice
- Technological Competence
- Program Student Learning Outcomes (Program SLOs)

Faculty Qualifications/Credentials:

- Will have a minimum of 36 months in the Nursing field.
- Will hold a license for which students will be prepared (RN or PN).
- Will complete the required New Faculty Orientation and On-Boarding process for Fortis College. This training ensures that the newly hired faculty will receive training in instruction methods and teaching skills. They will also be required to complete annual training to further develop teaching skills.

Anticipated Enrollments:

Fortis College will have four cohorts starting per year with an anticipated enrollment of 24 students per term.

Clinical Agreement Plans:

Fortis College has 20 clinical affiliation agreements. Will continue to expand their agreements to ensure students have access to a variety of clinical sites.

Accreditation Status and Plans:

Fortis College will seek accreditation through the Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing (ACEN) for the practical nursing program. The associate degree of nursing program is currently ACEN accredited.

Mr. Haskell asked if the clinical sites are more long-term care or acute care. Ms. Lausch advised they have a mixture of both. Mr. Haskell asked if Fortis has an LPN to RN program in the state of Utah. Ms. Lausch advised they do not currently.

Dr. Luther asked if Fortis plans to have a bridge plan put in place so students can move through degrees. Ms. Lausch stated they have a transfer credit system worked out for students who have graduated from an outside LPN program. Fortis will apply the same principles as bridge from LPN to RN program.

Dr. Jones said this is an LPN proposal and could be used as a bridge into an RN program. Ms. Lausch confirmed the proposed LPN program is a stand-alone program. Graduates from the LPN program who want continued education, then would enroll in the RN program.

Dr. Krupa wanted to know if the online classes are going to occur synchronously or asynchronously and how will that facilitation occur. Ms. Lausch advised they have a mix of both. Current RN online classes are Asynchrony and delivered by canvas system and one synchronous lecture once a week.

Mr. Haskell motioned to approve temporary pursuit of candidacy through ACEN for Fortis College PN program.

Dr. Krupa seconded the motion.

The vote in favor was unanimous.

Dr. Jones strongly recommends to adapt a plan for a bridge program to put in place.

Dr. Krupa motioned to approve Fortis College PN program temporary candidacy for qualifying graduates for licensure upon ACEN candidacy status.

Mr. Haskell seconded the motion.

The vote in favor was unanimous.
