SUBJECT: Corrupt Practices

On April 23, 2025 I became aware of a possible fraudulent official work entry into the Equibase system by Trent Caverhill. A printout of the work in question showed that horse Soren Knud (CA) worked 300 yards at Weber Downs in Utah on April 16, 2025 with a time of 15.89 seconds. According to information given to the Wyoming Gaming Commission by the Utah Racing Commission, Weber Downs was not scheduled to have official works done on April 16, 2025.

On April 23, 2025 at approximately 1:30pm I called Trent Caverhill at (435) 230-8852. When Caverhill answered the phone I explained to him that I was calling to verify a work on Soren Knud (CA) for April 16, 2025. Caverhill thought for a second and then stated, "I did put that one in". He then explained that the trainer, Wes Kellett, was running the horse in Pocatello, Idaho on May 3, 2025 and needed a work. I asked Caverhill for more details about the work on April 16, 2025. He told me that Wes' wife, Angie, videoed the horse working and that Caverhill clocked the horse. I asked Caverhill who the starter was on that date at Weber Downs and he could not tell me. Caverhill stated he would call Angie and ask her and that he would call me back and let me know.

Trent Caverhill admitted to entering a work into Equibase from clocking a video taken by Angie Kellett on a day no official works were scheduled at Weber Downs because the necessary licensed officials were not present.
