4. 2025-26 School LAND Trust Plans

The 2025-26 School LAND Trust plans were included for the board's review.

Superintendent Farnsworth recommended approval of the routine business. Sarah Beeson motioned to approve the routine business, Mark Clement seconded it, and the motion passed unanimously.

REPORTS

1. Annual Health Report and Assurances

This report was moved to the study session agenda on June 17th.

Membership Report

Superintendent Farnsworth reported that since October 1, 2024, the elementary enrollment has increased by 250 students, the middle school enrollment has increased by 26 students, and the high school enrollment has decreased by 455 students. The decrease in high school is typical for this time of year.

ACTION ITEM

1. Date Change for July Board Meeting

Superintendent Farnsworth recommended that the July 15th board meeting be moved to July 8th so that all of the board members can be in attendance. **On motion by Ada Wilson and seconded by Stacy Bateman, the motion passed unanimously.**

DISCUSSION/ACTION ITEMS

1. Policy 4069 – Sexual Harassment (retire)

Superintendent Farnsworth recommended the board review and consider retiring Policy 4069. Kraig Brinkerhoff explained this is the last sexual harassment policy than needs to be retired. **Mark Clement made the motion to retire Policy 4069, Sarah Beeson seconded it, and the motion passed unanimously.**

2. Policy 7110 – Bullying Prevention (combined)

Superintendent Farnsworth clarified that the OLAG audit recommended the combining of ASD's bullying policies so they are easier to access by patrons. Kraig Brinkerhoff, Executive Director of Legal Services, said the requests from the OLAG report were included in the policy, as well as resources from student support services for easier accessibility for patrons. Kraig recommended this be left as a discussion item because the links in the document are still being finalized.

3. Policy 7150 – Sexual Harassment (revised)

Superintendent Farnsworth recommended approval of the revisions to Policy 7150 – Sexual Harassment. Kraig Brinkerhoff said this policy is applicable to all people in the district. It is in line with Title IX framework that we have been directed by the OCR and the Department of Education to follow. **Sarah Beeson made the motion to approve Policy 7150, Stacy Bateman seconded it, and the motion passed unanimously.**

BOARD MEMBERS' AND SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORTS AND INFORMATION ITEMS

Superintendent Farnsworth thanked all who helped and supported the graduating class of 2025. There will be 15 graduation ceremonies held next week.

Ada Wilson shared her appreciation to the principals and school community councils for their outstanding LAND Trust reports that reflect ownership for the learning in their buildings.

Stacy Bateman thanked Tyler Vigue and the Alpine Foundation for their work in honoring employees and the teachers of the year.

Joylin Lincoln shared appreciation for the support of the parents for the 84,000 students in the district.

Summary of Budget Changes

May 2025

The following is a summary of the budget changes of interest for ASD during May 2025.

- During the month of May, the budget team had limited rebudgeting transactions due to finalizing the budget changes in the previous month and preparing to release the Comprehensive Annual Budget Report.
- Adjusted Capital Outlay budgets in Program 0000 for the cost of land in Eagle Mountain and Saratoga Springs.
- Adjusted revenue for property tax and the State guarantee to reflect the State's final estimates.
- Adjusted budgets in Fund 49 by \$200,000 for additional equipment purchases.

The following is a summary of the budget changes of interest for ASD during April 2025.

- During the month of April, the budget team completed its final re-budgeting process in various funds and programs to reflect changes in revenue and projected expenditures. We anticipate one final adjustment in Program 0000, once the State sends the final legislative estimates in the month of May.
- Received Teacher Training Award for \$40,000 in Program 0016, Teacher Training.
- Pre-loaded \$2.3 million of the approved \$3.4 million into Program 0499, Textbooks, for Literacy Textbook adoption. The balance of the remaining approved budget will be allocated in FY26.
- Allocated additional funding of \$254,000 in Program 0500 to address Westlake CTE Farm & FFA deficit.
- Allocated budget in Program 5390, Fiscal Flexibility, to address the deferred revenue and pending transfer.
- Adjusted Trustland funds in Program 5420 for schools with approved plan amendments.
- Adjusted TSSA funds in Program 5678 to schools with approved plans.
- Increased the budget \$6 million in Fund 32 under land/property category for the Saratoga Springs High School.
- Adjusted budget in EARS due to change in allowable indirect costs.
- Adjusted budget in Fund 30 in anticipation of upcoming bond sale.

The following is a summary of the budget changes of interest for ASD during March 2025.

- Waived unused funds of \$60 from Program 5654, Period Products, back to the State.
- Adjusted TSSA funds in Program 5678 to schools with approved plans.
- Allocated budget of \$7,812 in Program 5808, Capitol Field Trips, for schools awarded bus reimbursements.
- Allocated budget of \$20,000 in Program 7685, Project Aware, for an award through DHHS for School Based Integrated Health Grant.
- Adjusted fuel budgets in the amount of \$14,795 for various District departments.
- Preloaded budgets in Fund 32, Program 0000 and various 9XXX programs for FY26 approved capital purchases.

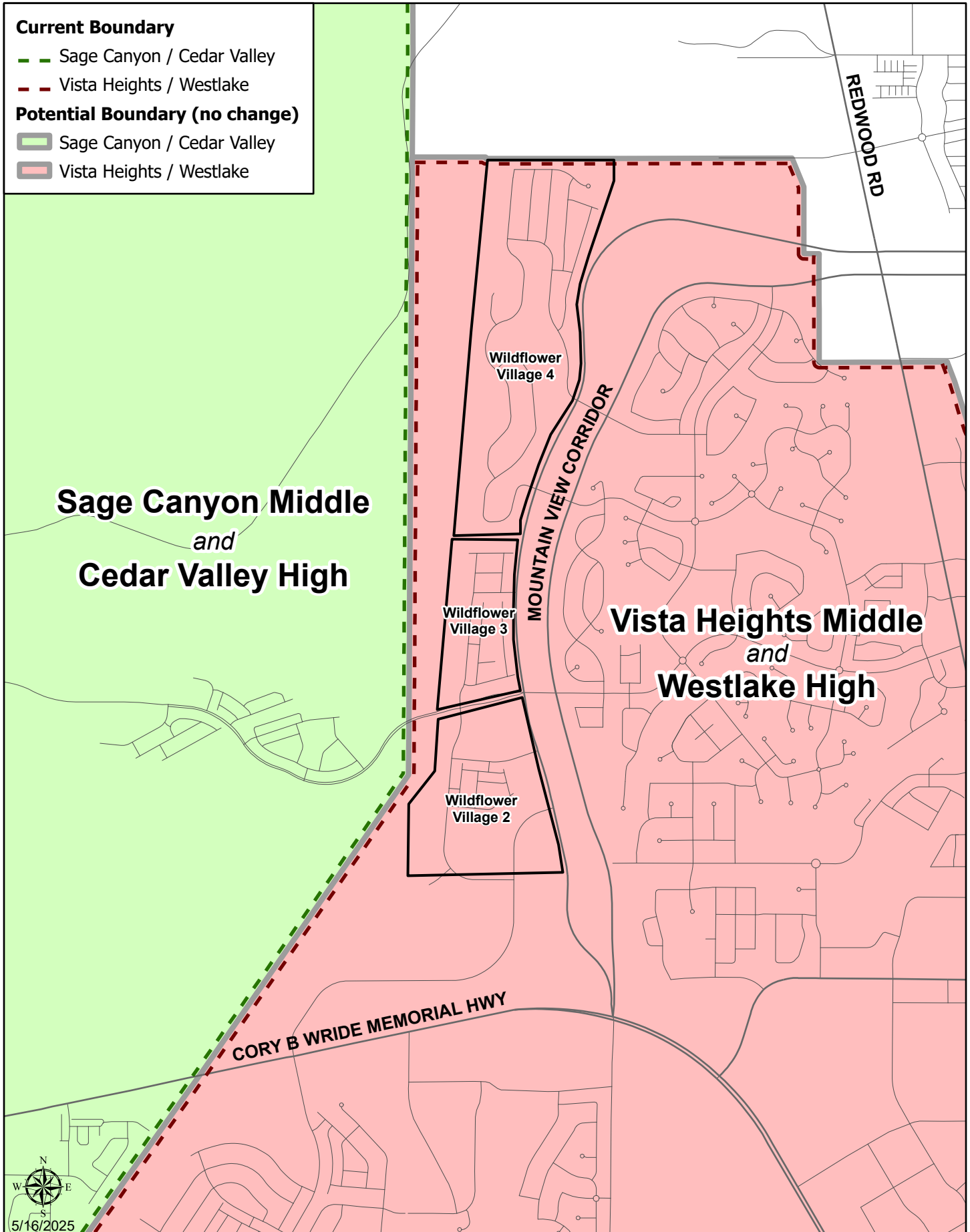

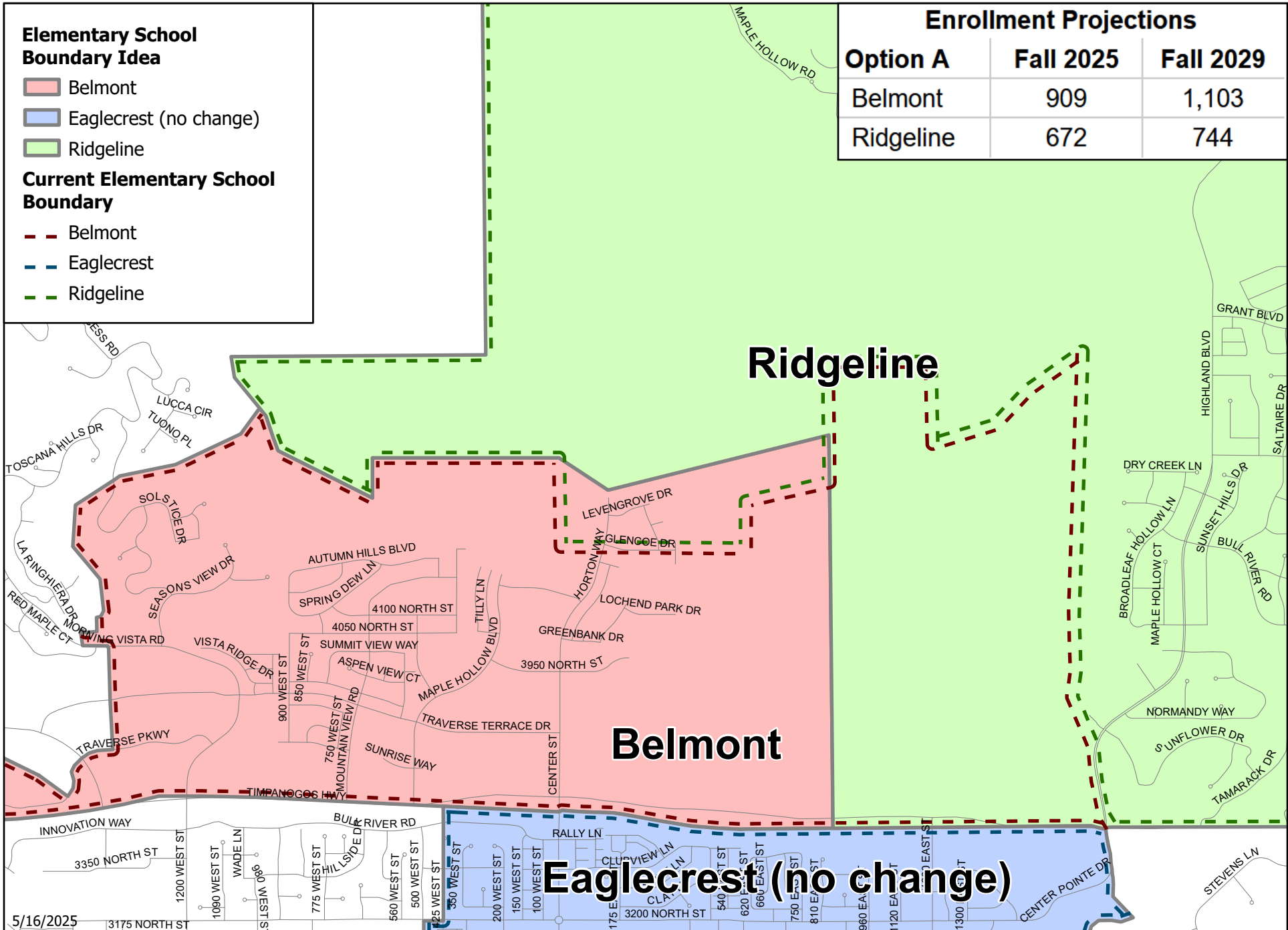
Potential Middle/High School Boundary



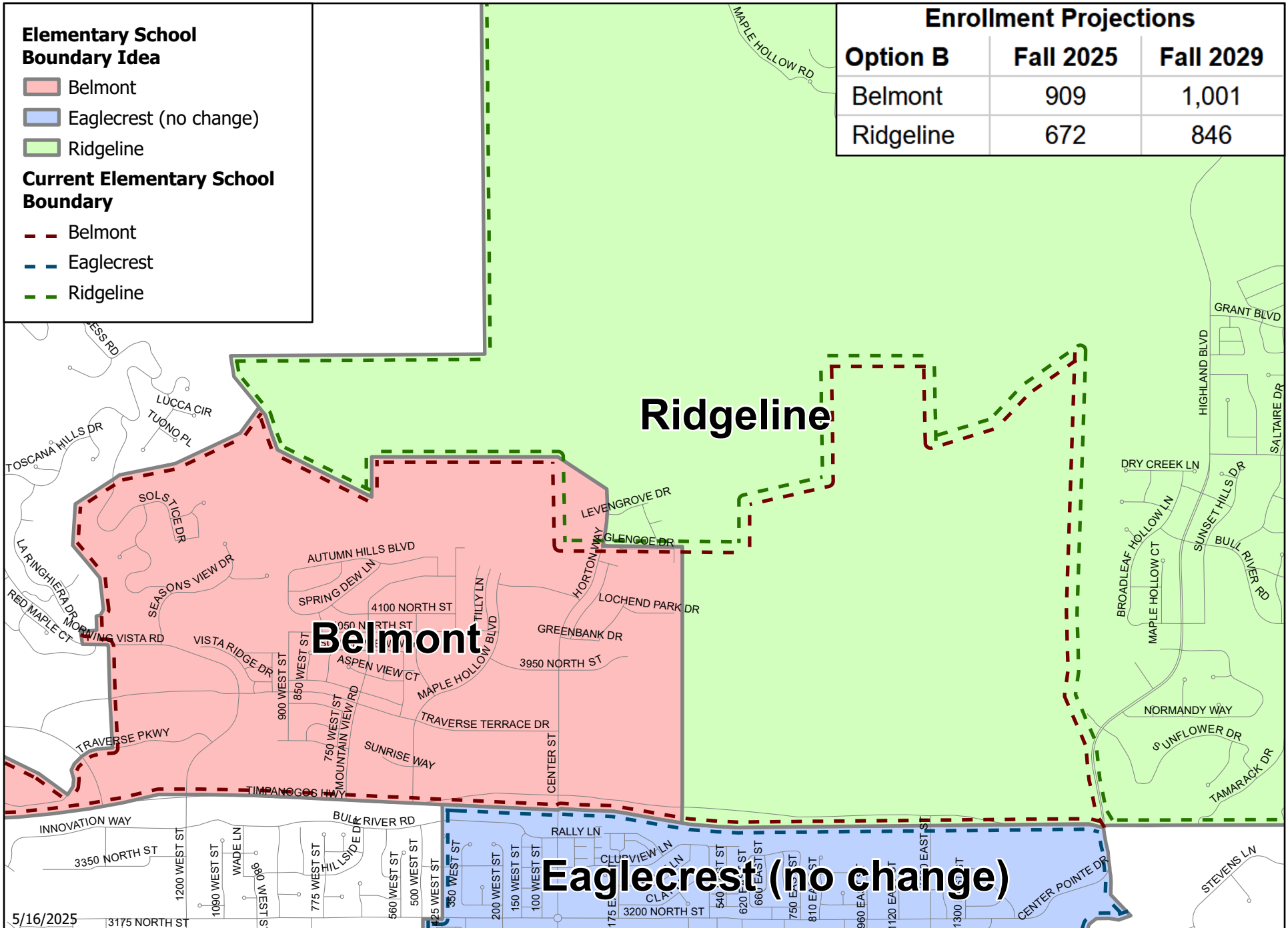
Option B (no change) Potential Middle/High School Boundary



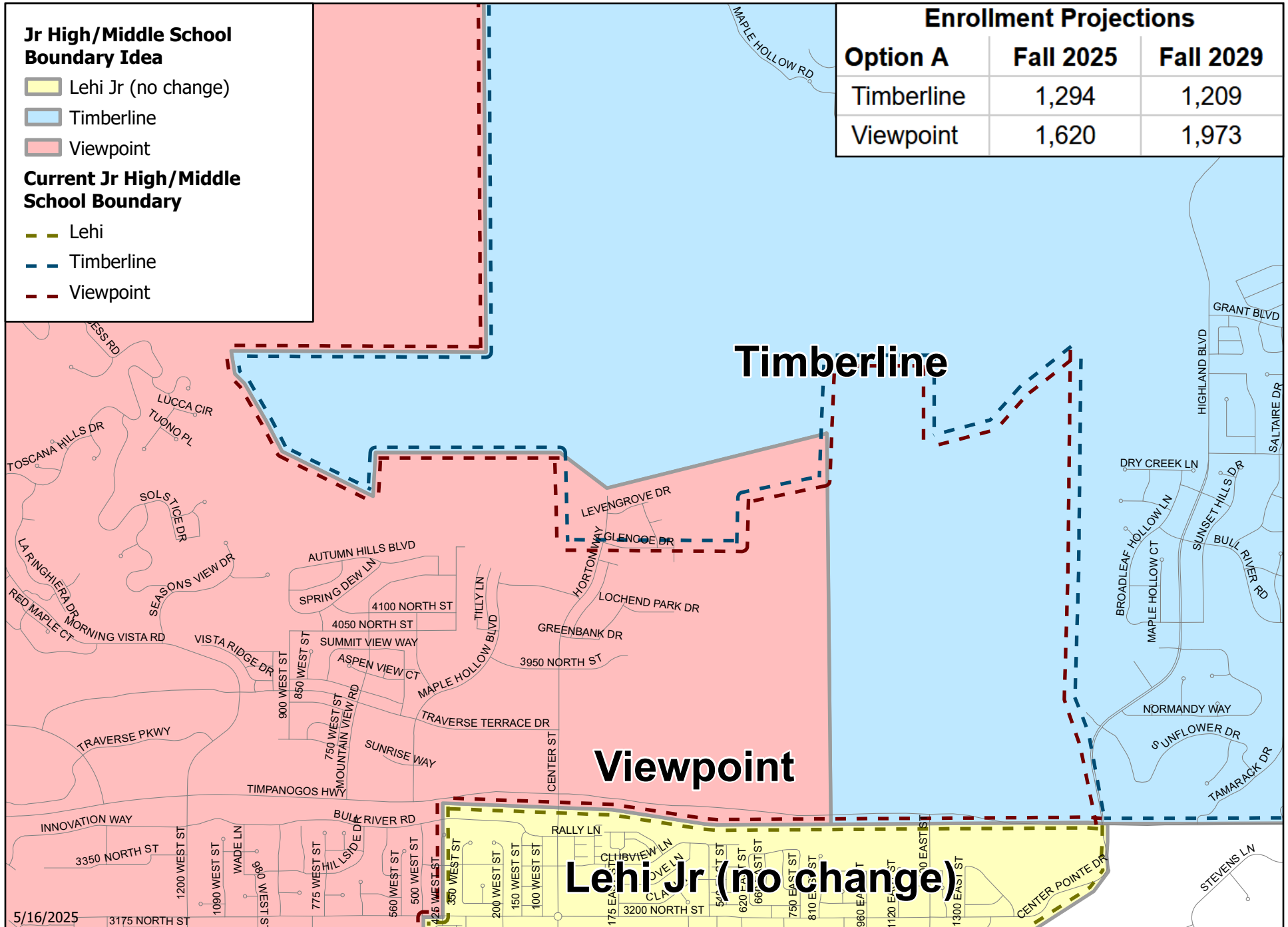
Elementary School Boundary - Option A



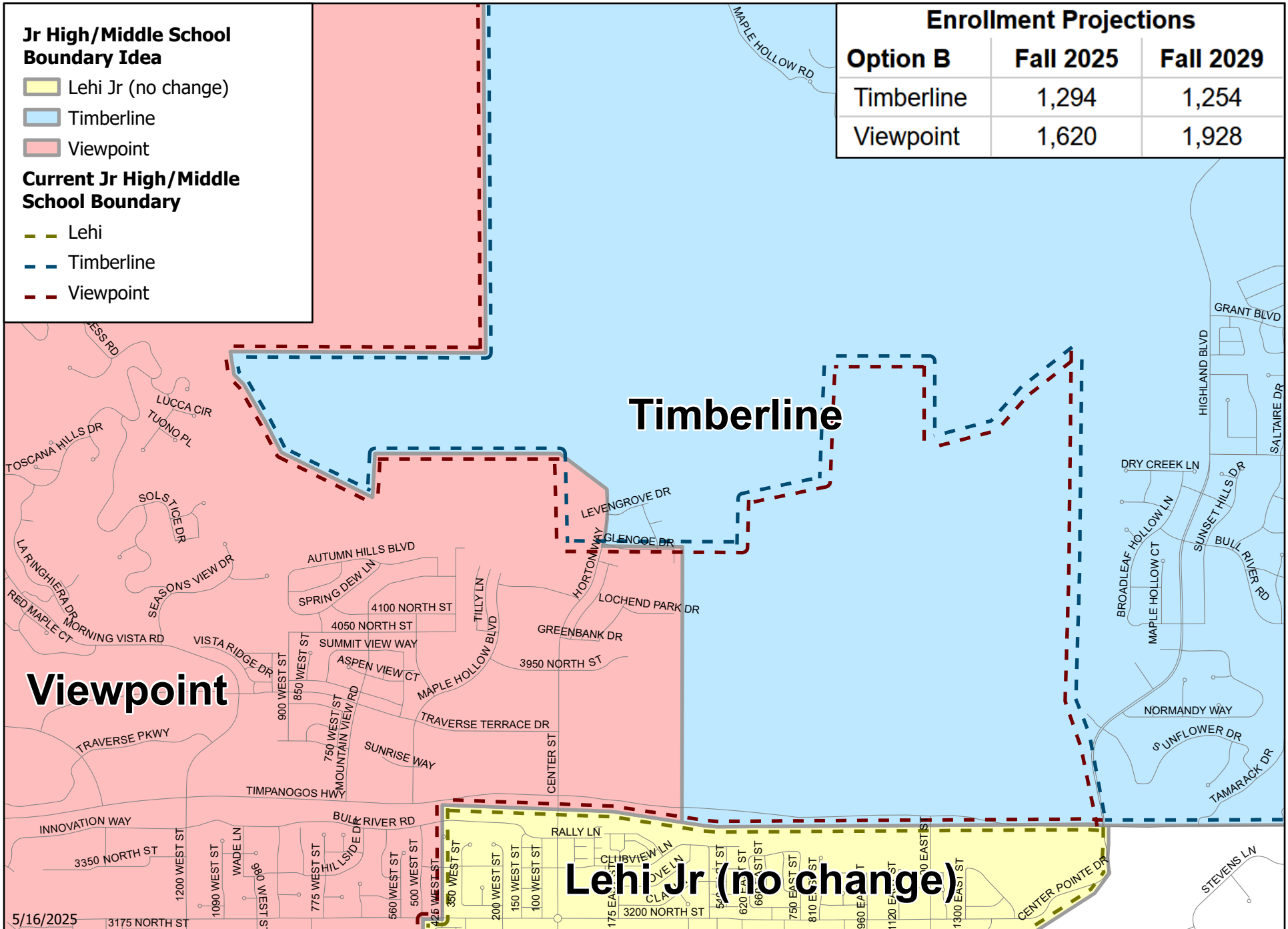
Elementary School Boundary - Option B



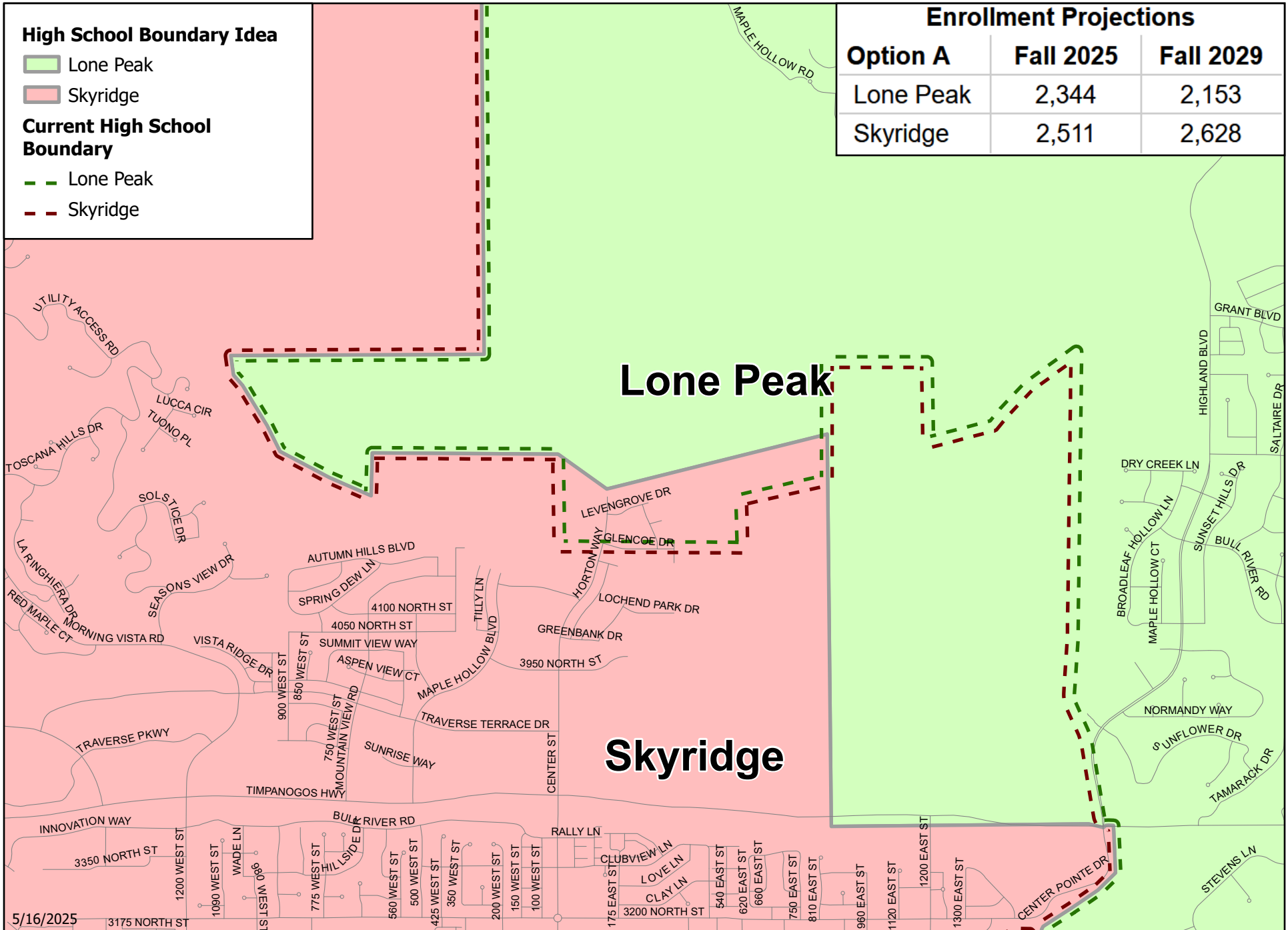
Jr High/Middle School Boundary - Option A



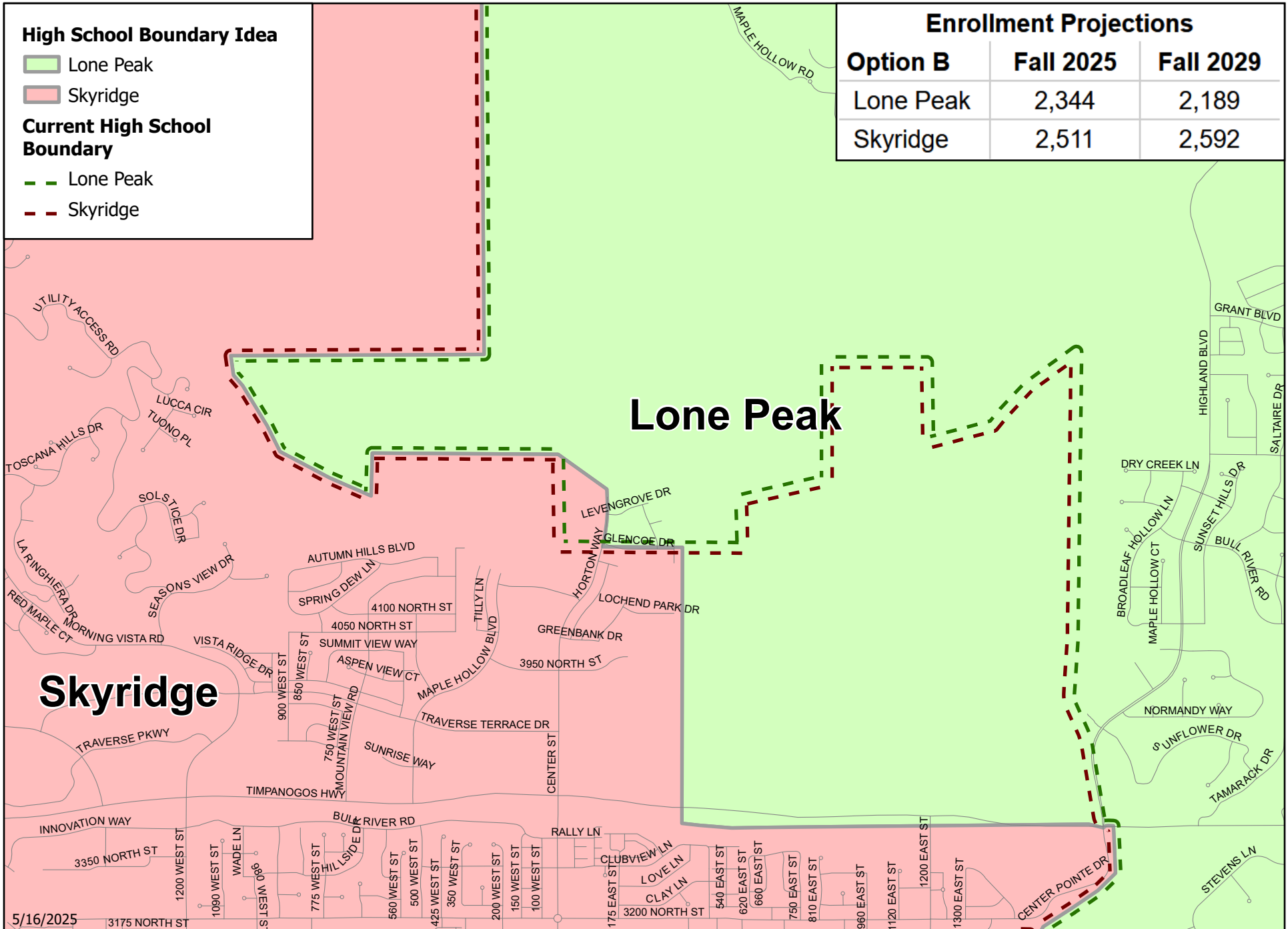

(b) **Buyer's Right to Cancel or Resolve Objections.** If Buyer determines, in Buyer's sole discretion, that the results of the Due Diligence are unacceptable, Buyer may either: (i) no later than the Due Diligence Deadline referenced in Section 24(b), cancel the REPC by providing written notice to Seller, whereupon the Earnest Money Deposit shall be released to Buyer without the requirement of further written authorization from Seller; or (ii) no later than the Due Diligence Deadline referenced in Section 24(b), resolve in writing with Seller any objections Buyer has arising from Buyer's Due Diligence.

(c) **Failure to Cancel or Resolve Objections.** If Buyer fails to cancel the REPC or fails to resolve in writing with Seller any objections Buyer has arising from Buyer's Due Diligence, as provided in Section 8.1(b), Buyer shall be deemed to have waived the Due Diligence Condition, and except as provided in Sections 8.2(a) and 8.3(b)(i), the Earnest Money Deposit shall become non-refundable.

8.2 APPRAISAL CONDITION. Buyer's obligation to purchase the Property: IS IS NOT conditioned upon the Property appraising for not less than the Purchase Price. This condition is referred to as the "Appraisal Condition." If checked in the affirmative, Sections 8.2(a) and 8.2(b) apply; otherwise they do not.

8.3 FINANCING CONDITION. (Check Applicable Box)

(a) **No Financing Required.** Buyer's obligation to purchase the Property IS NOT conditioned upon Buyer obtaining financing. If checked, Section 8.3(b) below does NOT apply.

(i) **Buyer's Right to Cancel Before the Financing & Appraisal Deadline.** If Buyer, in Buyer's sole discretion, is not satisfied with the terms and conditions of the Loan, Buyer may, after the Due Diligence Deadline referenced in Section 24(b), if applicable, cancel the REPC by providing written notice to Seller no later than the Financing & Appraisal Deadline referenced in Section 24(c); whereupon \$----- of Buyer's Earnest Money Deposit shall be released to Seller without the requirement of further written authorization from Buyer, and the remainder of Buyer's Earnest Money Deposit shall be released to Buyer without further written authorization from Seller.

10.3 Condition of Property/Seller Acknowledgements. Seller acknowledges and agrees that in reference to the physical condition of the Property, Seller agrees to: (a) disclose in writing to Buyer defects in the Property known to Seller that materially affect the value of the Property that cannot be discovered by a reasonable inspection by an ordinary prudent Buyer; (b) carefully review, complete, and provide to Buyer a written Seller property condition disclosure as stated in Section 7(a); (c) deliver the Property to Buyer in substantially the same general condition as it was on the date of Acceptance, as defined in Section 23, ordinary wear and tear excepted; (d) deliver the Property to Buyer in broom-clean condition and free of debris and personal belongings; and (e) repair any Seller or tenant moving-related damage to the Property at Seller's expense. The provisions of Section 10.3 shall survive Closing.

11. FINAL PRE-SETTLEMENT WALK-THROUGH INSPECTION. No earlier than seven (7) calendar days prior to Settlement, and upon reasonable notice and at a reasonable time, Buyer may conduct a final pre-Settlement walk-through inspection of the Property to determine only that the Property is "as represented," meaning that the items referenced in Sections 1.1, 1.2 and 8.1(b)(ii) ("the items") are respectively present, repaired or corrected as agreed. The failure to conduct a walk-through inspection or to claim that an item is not as represented shall not constitute a waiver by Buyer of the right to receive, on the date of possession, the items as represented.

12. CHANGES DURING TRANSACTION. Seller agrees that except as provided in Section 12.5 below, from the date of Acceptance until the date of Closing the following additional items apply:

12.1 Alterations/Improvements to the Property. No substantial alterations or improvements to the Property shall be made or undertaken without prior written consent of Buyer.

12.2 Financial Encumbrances/Changes to Legal Title. No further financial encumbrances to the Property shall be made, and no changes in the legal title to the Property shall be made without the prior written consent of Buyer.

12.3 Property Management Agreements. No changes to any existing property management agreements shall be made and no new property management agreements may be entered into without the prior written consent of Buyer.

12.4 Long-Term Lease or Rental Agreements. No changes to any existing tenant lease or rental agreements shall be made and no new long-term lease or rental agreements, as defined in Section 6.1(a), may be entered into without the prior written consent of Buyer.

12.5 Short-Term Rental Bookings. If the Property is made available for short-term rental bookings as defined in Section 6.1(b), Seller **MAY NOT** after the Seller Disclosure Deadline continue to accept short-term rental bookings for guest use of the property without the prior written consent of Buyer.

13. AUTHORITY OF SIGNERS. If Buyer or Seller is a corporation, partnership, trust, estate, limited liability company or other entity, the person signing the REPC on its behalf warrants his or her authority to do so and to bind Buyer and Seller.

14. COMPLETE CONTRACT. The REPC together with its addenda, any attached exhibits, and Seller Disclosures (collectively referred to as the "REPC"), constitutes the entire contract between the parties and supersedes and replaces any and all prior negotiations, representations, warranties, understandings or contracts between the parties whether verbal or otherwise. The REPC cannot be changed except by written agreement of the parties.

15. MEDIATION. Any dispute relating to the REPC arising prior to or after Closing: SHALL MAY AT THE OPTION OF THE PARTIES first be submitted to mediation. Mediation is a process in which the parties meet with an impartial person who helps to resolve the dispute informally and confidentially. Mediators cannot impose binding decisions. The parties to the dispute must agree before any settlement is binding. The parties will jointly appoint an acceptable mediator and share equally in the cost of such mediation. If mediation fails, the other procedures and remedies available under the REPC shall apply. Nothing in this Section 15 prohibits any party from seeking emergency legal or equitable relief, pending mediation. The provisions of this Section 15 shall survive Closing.

16. DEFAULT.

16.1 Buyer Default. If Buyer defaults, Seller may elect one of the following remedies: (a) cancel the REPC and retain the Earnest Money Deposit, or Deposits, if applicable, as liquidated damages; (b) maintain the Earnest Money Deposit, or Deposits, if applicable, in trust and sue Buyer to specifically enforce the REPC; or (c) return the Earnest Money Deposit, or Deposits, if applicable, to Buyer and pursue any other remedies available at law.

16.2 Seller Default. If Seller defaults, Buyer may elect one of the following remedies: (a) cancel the REPC, and in addition to the return of the Earnest Money Deposit, or Deposits, if applicable, Buyer may elect to accept from Seller, as liquidated damages, a sum equal to the Earnest Money Deposit, or Deposits, if applicable; or (b) maintain the Earnest Money Deposit, or Deposits, if applicable, in trust and sue Seller to specifically enforce the REPC; or (c) accept a return of the Earnest Money Deposit, or Deposits, if applicable, and pursue any other remedies available at law. If Buyer elects to accept liquidated damages, Seller agrees to pay the liquidated damages to Buyer upon demand.

17. ATTORNEY FEES AND COSTS/GOVERNING LAW. In the event of litigation or binding arbitration arising out of the transaction contemplated by the REPC, the prevailing party shall be entitled to costs and reasonable attorney fees. However, attorney fees shall not be awarded for participation in mediation under Section 15. This contract shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Utah. The provisions of this Section 17 shall survive Closing.

18. NOTICES. Except as provided in Section 23, all notices required under the REPC must be: (a) in writing; (b) signed by the Buyer or Seller giving notice; and (c) received by the Buyer or the Seller, or their respective agent, or by the brokerage firm representing the Buyer or Seller, no later than the applicable date referenced in the REPC.

19. NO ASSIGNMENT. The REPC and the rights and obligations of Buyer hereunder, are personal to Buyer. The REPC may not be assigned by Buyer without the prior written consent of Seller. Provided, however, the transfer of Buyer's interest in the REPC to any business entity in which Buyer holds a legal interest, including, but not limited to, a family partnership, family trust, limited liability company, partnership, or corporation (collectively referred to as a "Permissible Transfer"), shall not be treated as an assignment by Buyer that requires Seller's prior written consent. Furthermore, the inclusion of "and/or assigns" or similar language on the line identifying Buyer on the first page of the REPC shall constitute Seller's written consent only to a Permissible Transfer.




20. INSURANCE & RISK OF LOSS.

20.1 Insurance Coverage. As of Closing, Buyer shall be responsible to obtain casualty and liability insurance coverage on the Property in amounts acceptable to Buyer and Buyer's Lender, if applicable.

20.2 Risk of Loss. Performance dates and times referenced herein shall not be binding upon title companies, lenders, appraisers and others not parties to the REPC, except as otherwise agreed to in writing by such non-party.

22. ELECTRONIC TRANSMISSION AND COUNTERPARTS. The REPC may be executed in counterparts. Signatures on any of the Documents, whether executed physically or by use of electronic signatures, shall be deemed original signatures and shall have the same legal effect as original signatures.

title and an established right to sell, lease or exchange the Property. The Seller agrees to execute the necessary documents of conveyance. The Seller agrees to furnish buyer with good and marketable title, and to pay at Settlement, for a policy of title insurance in accordance with the terms of any real estate purchase contract entered into between buyer and Seller. The Seller agrees to fully inform the Seller's Agent regarding the Seller's knowledge of the condition of the Property. The Seller is advised that it is up to the Seller in the Seller's sole discretion to choose third-party services that meet the needs of the Seller and not to rely on any recommendations given by the Company or the Seller's Agent.

7. DISPUTE RESOLUTION. The parties agree that any dispute, arising prior to or after a Closing, related to this Listing Agreement, [] SHALL [X] MAY AT THE OPTION OF THE PARTIES first be submitted to mediation. If no box is checked, then the parties agree that "may at the option of the parties" shall be the default option. Mediation is a process in which the parties meet with an impartial person who helps to resolve the dispute informally and confidentially. Mediators cannot impose binding decisions. 





6. TITLE & TITLE INSURANCE.

6.1 Title to Property. Seller represents that Seller has fee title to the Property and will convey marketable title to the Property to Buyer at Closing by general warranty deed. Buyer does agree to accept title to the Property subject to the contents of the Commitment for Title Insurance (the "Commitment") provided by Seller under Section 7, and as reviewed and approved by Buyer under Section 8.

(a) Long-Term Lease or Rental Agreements. Buyer agrees to accept title to the Property subject to any long-term tenant lease or rental agreements (meaning for periods of thirty (30) or more consecutive days) affecting the Property not expiring prior to Closing. Buyer also agrees to accept title to the Property subject to any existing rental and property management agreements affecting the Property not expiring prior to Closing. The provisions of this Section 6.1(a) shall survive Closing.

(b) Short-Term Rental Bookings. Buyer agrees to accept title to the Property subject to any short-term rental bookings (meaning for periods of less than thirty (30) consecutive days) affecting the Property not expiring prior to Closing. The provisions of this Section 6.1(b) shall survive Closing.

6.2 Title Insurance. At Settlement, Seller agrees to pay for and cause to be issued in favor of Buyer, through the title insurance agency that issued the Commitment (the "Issuing Agent"), the most current version of the ALTA Homeowner's Policy of Title Insurance (the "Homeowner's Policy"). If the Homeowner's Policy is not available through the Issuing Agent, Buyer and Seller further agree as follows: (a) Seller agrees to pay for the Homeowner's Policy if available through any other title insurance agency selected by Buyer; (b) if the Homeowner's Policy is not available either through the Issuing Agent or any other title insurance agency, then Seller agrees to pay for, and Buyer agrees to accept, the most current available version of an ALTA Owner's Policy of Title Insurance ("Owner's Policy") available through the Issuing Agent.

7. SELLER DISCLOSURES. No later than the Seller Disclosure Deadline referenced in Section 24(a), Seller shall provide to Buyer the following documents in hard copy or electronic format which are collectively referred to as the "Seller Disclosures":

- (a) a written Seller property condition disclosure for the Property, completed, signed and dated by Seller as provided in Section 10.3;
(b) a Lead-Based Paint Disclosure & Acknowledgement for the Property, completed, signed and dated by Seller (only if the Property was built prior to 1978);
(c) a Commitment for Title Insurance as referenced in Section 6.1;
(d) a copy of any restrictive covenants (CC&R's), rules and regulations affecting the Property;
(e) a copy of the most recent minutes, budget and financial statement for the homeowners' association, if any;
(f) a copy of any long-term tenant lease or rental agreements affecting the Property not expiring prior to Closing;
(g) a copy of any short-term rental booking schedule (as of the Seller Disclosure Deadline) for guest use of the Property after Closing;
(h) a copy of any existing property management agreements affecting the Property;
(i) evidence of any water rights and/or water shares referenced in Section 1.4;
(j) written notice of any claims and/or conditions known to Seller relating to environmental problems and building or zoning code violations;
(k) In general, the sale or other disposition of a U.S. real property interest by a foreign person is subject to income tax withholding under the Foreign Investment in Real Property Tax Act of 1980 (FIRPTA). A "foreign person" includes a non-resident alien individual, foreign corporation, partnership, trust or estate. If FIRPTA applies to Seller, Seller is advised that Buyer or other qualified substitute may be legally required to withhold this tax at Closing. In order to avoid closing delays, if Seller is a foreign person under FIRPTA, Seller shall advise Buyer in writing; and

8. BUYER'S CONDITIONS OF PURCHASE.

8.1 DUE DILIGENCE CONDITION. Buyer's obligation to purchase the Property: [X] IS [] IS NOT conditioned upon Buyer's Due Diligence as defined in this Section 8.1(a) below. This condition is referred to as the "Due Diligence Condition." If checked in the affirmative, Sections 8.1(a) through 8.1(c) apply; otherwise they do not.

(a) Due Diligence Items. Buyer's Due Diligence shall consist of Buyer's review and approval of the contents of the Seller Disclosures referenced in Section 7, and any other tests, evaluations and verifications of the Property deemed necessary or appropriate by Buyer, such as: the physical condition of the Property; the existence of any hazardous substances, environmental issues or geologic conditions; the square footage or acreage of the land and/or improvements; the condition of the roof, walls, and foundation; the condition of the plumbing, electrical, mechanical, heating and air conditioning systems and fixtures; the condition of all appliances; the costs and availability of homeowners' insurance and flood insurance, if applicable; water source, availability and quality; the location of property lines; regulatory use restrictions or violations; fees for services such as HOA dues, municipal services, and utility costs; convicted sex offenders residing in proximity to the Property; and any other matters deemed material to Buyer in making a decision to purchase the Property. Unless otherwise provided in the REPC, all of Buyer's Due Diligence shall be paid for by Buyer and shall be conducted by individuals or entities of Buyer's choice. Seller agrees to cooperate with Buyer's Due Diligence. Buyer agrees to pay for any damage to the Property resulting from any such inspections or tests during the Due Diligence.

(b) Buyer's Right to Cancel or Resolve Objections. If Buyer determines, in Buyer's sole discretion, that the results of the Due Diligence are unacceptable, Buyer may either: (i) no later than the Due Diligence Deadline referenced in Section 24(b), cancel the REPC by providing written notice to Seller, whereupon the Earnest Money Deposit shall be released to Buyer without the requirement of further written authorization from Seller; or (ii) no later than the Due Diligence Deadline referenced in Section 24(b), resolve in writing with Seller any objections Buyer has arising from Buyer's Due Diligence.

(c) Failure to Cancel or Resolve Objections. If Buyer fails to cancel the REPC or fails to resolve in writing with Seller any objections Buyer has arising from Buyer's Due Diligence, as provided in Section 8.1(b), Buyer shall be deemed to have waived the Due Diligence Condition, and except as provided in Sections 8.2(a) and 8.3(b)(i), the Earnest Money Deposit shall become non-refundable.

8.2 APPRAISAL CONDITION. Buyer's obligation to purchase the Property: IS IS NOT conditioned upon the Property appraising for not less than the Purchase Price. This condition is referred to as the "Appraisal Condition." If checked in the affirmative, Sections 8.2(a) and 8.2(b) apply; otherwise they do not.

(a) Buyer's Right to Cancel. If after completion of an appraisal by a licensed appraiser, Buyer receives written notice from the Lender or the appraiser that the Property has appraised for less than the Purchase Price (a "Notice of Appraised Value"), Buyer may cancel the REPC by providing written notice to Seller (with a copy of the Notice of Appraised Value) no later than the Financing & Appraisal Deadline referenced in Section 24(c); whereupon the Earnest Money Deposit shall be released to Buyer without the requirement of further written authorization from Seller.

(b) Failure to Cancel. If the REPC is not cancelled as provided in this section 8.2, Buyer shall be deemed to have waived the Appraisal Condition, and except as provided in Sections 8.1(b) and 8.3(b)(i), the Earnest Money Deposit shall become non-refundable.

8.3 FINANCING CONDITION. (Check Applicable Box)

(a) No Financing Required. Buyer's obligation to purchase the Property IS NOT conditioned upon Buyer obtaining financing. If checked, Section 8.3(b) below does NOT apply.

(b) Financing Required. Buyer's obligation to purchase the Property IS conditioned upon Buyer obtaining the Loan referenced in Section 2.1(c). This Condition is referred to as the "Financing Condition." If checked, Sections 8.3(b)(i), (ii) and (iii) apply; otherwise they do not. If the REPC is not cancelled by Buyer as provided in Sections 8.1(b) or 8.2(a), then Buyer agrees to work diligently and in good faith to obtain the Loan.

(i) Buyer's Right to Cancel Before the Financing & Appraisal Deadline. If Buyer, in Buyer's sole discretion, is not satisfied with the terms and conditions of the Loan, Buyer may, after the Due Diligence Deadline referenced in Section 24(b), if applicable, cancel the REPC by providing written notice to Seller no later than the Financing & Appraisal Deadline referenced in Section 24(c); whereupon \$ _____ of Buyer's Earnest Money Deposit shall be released to Seller without the requirement of further written authorization from Buyer, and the remainder of Buyer's Earnest Money Deposit shall be released to Buyer without further written authorization from Seller.

(ii) Buyer's Right to Cancel After the Financing & Appraisal Deadline. If after expiration of the Financing & Appraisal Deadline referenced in Section 24(c), Buyer fails to obtain the Loan, meaning that the proceeds of the Loan have not been delivered by the Lender to the escrow/closing office as required under Section 3.2, then Buyer shall not be obligated to purchase the Property and Buyer or Seller may cancel the REPC by providing written notice to the other party.

(iii) Earnest Money Deposit(s) Released to Seller. If the REPC is cancelled as provided in Section 8.3(b)(ii), Buyer agrees that all of Buyer's Earnest Money Deposit, or Deposits, if applicable (see Section 8.4 below), shall be released to Seller without the requirement of further written authorization from Buyer. Seller agrees to accept, as Seller's exclusive remedy, the Earnest Money Deposit, or Deposits, if applicable, as liquidated damages. Buyer and Seller agree that liquidated damages would be difficult and impractical to calculate, and the Earnest Money Deposit, or Deposits, if applicable, is a fair and reasonable estimate of Seller's damages in the event Buyer fails to obtain the Loan.

8.4 ADDITIONAL EARNEST MONEY DEPOSIT. If the REPC has not been previously canceled by Buyer as provided in Sections 8.1, 8.2 or 8.3, as applicable, then no later than the Due Diligence Deadline, or the Financing & Appraisal Deadline, whichever is later, Buyer: WILL WILL NOT deliver to the Buyer's Brokerage, an Additional Earnest Money Deposit in the amount of \$ 0.00. The Earnest Money Deposit and the Additional Earnest Money Deposit, if applicable, are sometimes referred to herein as the "Deposits". The Earnest Money Deposit, or Deposits, if applicable, shall be credited toward the Purchase Price at Closing.

9. ADDENDA. There ARE ARE NOT addenda to the REPC containing additional terms. If there are, the terms of the following addenda are incorporated into the REPC by this reference: Addendum No. 1 Seller Financing Addendum FHA/VA Loan Addendum Other (specify) _____

10. HOME WARRANTY PLAN / AS-IS CONDITION OF PROPERTY.

10.1 Home Warranty Plan. A one-year Home Warranty Plan WILL WILL NOT be included in this transaction. If included, the Home Warranty Plan shall be ordered by Buyer Seller and shall be issued by a company selected by Buyer Seller. The cost of the Home Warranty Plan shall not exceed \$ 700.00 and shall be paid for at Settlement by Buyer Seller.

10.2 Condition of Property/Buyer Acknowledgements. Buyer acknowledges and agrees that in reference to the physical condition of the Property: (a) Buyer is purchasing the Property in its "As-Is" condition without expressed or implied warranties of any kind; (b) Buyer shall have, during Buyer's Due Diligence as referenced in Section 8.1, an opportunity to completely inspect and evaluate the condition of the Property; and (c) if based on the Buyer's Due Diligence, Buyer elects to proceed with the purchase of the Property, Buyer is relying wholly on Buyer's own judgment and that of any contractors or inspectors engaged by Buyer to review, evaluate and inspect the Property. The provisions of Section 10.2 shall survive Closing.

10.3 Condition of Property/Seller Acknowledgements. Seller acknowledges and agrees that in reference to the physical condition of the Property, Seller agrees to: (a) disclose in writing to Buyer defects in the Property known to Seller that materially affect the value of the Property that cannot be discovered by a reasonable inspection by an ordinary prudent Buyer; (b) carefully review, complete, and provide to Buyer a written Seller property condition disclosure as stated in Section 7(a); (c) deliver the Property to Buyer in substantially the same general condition as it was on the date of Acceptance, as defined in Section 23, ordinary wear and tear excepted; (d) deliver the Property to Buyer in broom-clean condition and free of debris and personal belongings; and (e) repair any Seller or tenant moving-related damage to the Property at Seller's expense. The provisions of Section 10.3 shall survive Closing.

11 FINAL PRE-SETTLEMENT WALK-THROUGH INSPECTION. No earlier than seven (7) calendar days prior to Settlement, and upon reasonable notice and at a reasonable time, Buyer may conduct a final pre-Settlement walk-through inspection of the Property to determine only that the Property is "as represented," meaning that the items referenced in Sections 1.1, 1.2 and 8.1(b)(ii) ("the items") are respectively present, repaired or corrected as agreed. The failure to conduct a walk-through inspection or to claim that an item is not as represented shall not constitute a waiver by Buyer of the right to receive, on the date of possession, the items as represented.

12. CHANGES DURING TRANSACTION. Seller agrees that except as provided in Section 12.5 below, from the date of Acceptance until the date of Closing the following additional items apply:

12.1 Alterations/Improvements to the Property. No substantial alterations or improvements to the Property shall be made or undertaken without prior written consent of Buyer.

12.2 Financial Encumbrances/Changes to Legal Title. No further financial encumbrances to the Property shall be made, and no changes in the legal title to the Property shall be made without the prior written consent of Buyer.

12.3 Property Management Agreements. No changes to any existing property management agreements shall be made and no new property management agreements may be entered into without the prior written consent of Buyer.

12.4 Long-Term Lease or Rental Agreements. No changes to any existing tenant lease or rental agreements shall be made and no new long-term lease or rental agreements, as defined in Section 6.1(a), may be entered into without the prior written consent of Buyer.

12.5 Short-Term Rental Bookings. If the Property is made available for short-term rental bookings as defined in Section 6.1(b), Seller MAY NOT after the Seller Disclosure Deadline continue to accept short-term rental bookings for guest use of the property without the prior written consent of Buyer.

13. AUTHORITY OF SIGNERS. If Buyer or Seller is a corporation, partnership, trust, estate, limited liability company or other entity, the person signing the REPC on its behalf warrants his or her authority to do so and to bind Buyer and Seller.

14. COMPLETE CONTRACT. The REPC together with its addenda, any attached exhibits, and Seller Disclosures (collectively referred to as the "REPC"), constitutes the entire contract between the parties and supersedes and replaces any and all prior negotiations, representations, warranties, understandings or contracts between the parties whether verbal or otherwise. The REPC cannot be changed except by written agreement of the parties.

15. MEDIATION. Any dispute relating to the REPC arising prior to or after Closing: SHALL MAY AT THE OPTION OF THE PARTIES first be submitted to mediation. Mediation is a process in which the parties meet with an impartial person who helps to resolve the dispute informally and confidentially. Mediators cannot impose binding decisions. The parties to the dispute must agree before any settlement is binding. The parties will jointly appoint an acceptable mediator and share equally in the cost of such mediation. If mediation fails, the other procedures and remedies available under the REPC shall apply. Nothing in this Section 15 prohibits any party from seeking emergency legal or equitable relief, pending mediation. The provisions of this Section 15 shall survive Closing.

16. DEFAULT.



16.1 Buyer Default. If Buyer defaults, Seller may elect one of the following remedies: (a) cancel the REPC and retain the Earnest Money Deposit, or Deposits, if applicable, as liquidated damages; (b) maintain the Earnest Money Deposit, or Deposits, if applicable, in trust and sue Buyer to specifically enforce the REPC; or (c) return the Earnest Money Deposit, or Deposits, if applicable, to Buyer and pursue any other remedies available at law.

16.2 Seller Default. If Seller defaults, Buyer may elect one of the following remedies: (a) cancel the REPC, and in addition to the return of the Earnest Money Deposit, or Deposits, if applicable, Buyer may elect to accept from Seller, as liquidated damages, a sum equal to the Earnest Money Deposit, or Deposits, if applicable; or (b) maintain the Earnest Money Deposit, or Deposits, if applicable, in trust and sue Seller to specifically enforce the REPC; or (c) accept a return of the Earnest Money Deposit, or Deposits, if applicable, and pursue any other remedies available at law. If Buyer elects to accept liquidated damages, Seller agrees to pay the liquidated damages to Buyer upon demand.

17. ATTORNEY FEES AND COSTS/GOVERNING LAW. In the event of litigation or binding arbitration arising out of the transaction contemplated by the REPC, the prevailing party shall be entitled to costs and reasonable attorney fees. However, attorney fees shall not be awarded for participation in mediation under Section 15. This contract shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Utah. The provisions of this Section 17 shall survive Closing.

18. NOTICES. Except as provided in Section 23, all notices required under the REPC must be: (a) in writing; (b) signed by the Buyer or Seller giving notice; and (c) received by the Buyer or the Seller, or their respective agent, or by the brokerage firm representing the Buyer or Seller, no later than the applicable date referenced in the REPC.

19. NO ASSIGNMENT. The REPC and the rights and obligations of Buyer hereunder, are personal to Buyer. The REPC may not be assigned by Buyer without the prior written consent of Seller. Provided, however, the transfer of Buyer's interest in the REPC to any business entity in which Buyer holds a legal interest, including, but not limited to, a family partnership, family trust, limited liability company, partnership, or corporation (collectively referred to as a "Permissible Transfer"), shall not be treated as an assignment by Buyer that requires Seller's prior written consent. Furthermore, the inclusion of "and/or assigns" or similar language on the line identifying Buyer on the first page of the REPC shall constitute Seller's written consent only to a Permissible Transfer.

20 INSURANCE & RISK OF LOSS.

20.1 Insurance Coverage. As of Closing, Buyer shall be responsible to obtain casualty and liability insurance coverage on the Property in amounts acceptable to Buyer and Buyer's Lender, if applicable.

20.2 Risk of Loss. If prior to Closing, any part of the Property is damaged or destroyed by fire, vandalism, flood, earthquake, or act of God, the risk of such loss or damage shall be borne by Seller; provided however, that if the cost of repairing such loss or damage would exceed ten percent (10%) of the Purchase Price referenced in Section 2, either Seller or Buyer may elect to cancel the REPC by providing written notice to the other party, in which instance the Earnest Money Deposit, or Deposits, if applicable, shall be returned to Buyer.

21. TIME IS OF THE ESSENCE. Time is of the essence regarding the dates set forth in the REPC. Extensions must be agreed to in writing by all parties. Unless otherwise explicitly stated in the REPC: (a) performance under each Section of the REPC which references a date shall absolutely be required by 5:00 PM Mountain Time on the stated date; and (b) the term "days" and "calendar days" shall mean calendar days and shall be counted beginning on the day following the event which triggers the timing requirement (e.g. Acceptance). Performance dates and times referenced herein shall not be binding upon title companies, lenders, appraisers and others not parties to the REPC, except as otherwise agreed to in writing by such non-party.

22. ELECTRONIC TRANSMISSION AND COUNTERPARTS. The REPC may be executed in counterparts. Signatures on any of the Documents, whether executed physically or by use of electronic signatures, shall be deemed original signatures and shall have the same legal effect as original signatures.

23. ACCEPTANCE. "Acceptance" occurs only when all of the following have occurred: (a) Seller or Buyer has signed the offer or counteroffer where noted to indicate acceptance; and (b) Seller or Buyer or their agent has communicated to the other party or to the other party's agent that the offer or counteroffer has been signed as required.

Health and Disability

Statement of Policy

The Alpine School District Board of Education recognizes that health and disability leave for employees may be needed. Therefore, the Board provides such leave as an important fringe benefit to its employees. The Board has designated the Business Administrator and the Executive Director of Human Resources to work collaboratively to apply this policy.

Definition

1. "Calendar day" includes contract days, weekends, and holidays combined.

1. HEALTH AND DISABILITY

- 1.1. Educators with less than three years of continuous current experience in the district, are granted health and disability leave as follows:
 - 1.1.1. A maximum of up to seven (7) working days may be granted annually in the event of health or disability absence.
 - 1.1.2. Health and disability may accumulate up to a maximum of twenty-one (21) working days at the beginning of the third year of employment.
 - 1.1.2.1. During the absence of an educator for health or disability reasons, the educator's full salary shall be paid for the cumulative days used.
 - 1.1.3. Beyond the cumulative health and disability leave, when an educator is absent because of health or disability reasons, an educator's salary shall be paid as follows:

1.1.3.1. A certified educator's salary shall have the cost of a personal day deducted for any health or disability leave taken beyond the earned cumulative days up to a combined maximum of 180 calendar days.

1.2. Educators who have completed three or more current consecutive years of employment with the district, are granted health and disability leave for 180 calendar days beginning with the first day of disability

1.2.1. An educator who has exhausted the 180 calendar days of health and disability leave and returns to work on the 181st calendar day must obtain a release to return to work letter from their primary care physician, releasing them to return to work without restriction, or reasonable accommodation.

1.2.1.1. Any accommodation must be in place before the 181st calendar day of absence. (This will mean that accommodations must be requested with enough advance notice for the District to comply.

1.2.1.2. The employee who uses 180 calendar days of health and disability leave and returns to work will be placed on sick leave probation. Sick leave probation begins with the upcoming year and extends to the employee 21 calendar days annually, of health and disability leave for two years. These days are not cumulative. Upon successful completion of sick leave probation, the employee will have their 180 calendar days of health and disability leave restored.

1.2.2. Should an employee be unable to return to work on the 181st calendar day of health and disability leave, they will be separated from employment.

1.2.3. Health and disability leave will be recorded relative to the percent of contract of the employee. (A .5 teacher who takes a sick day is charged one full day of health and disability leave.) There is not an

intent to extend to part-time employees more health and disability leave than full-time employees.

1.2.4. Employees who use ten (10) consecutive contract days of health and disability leave, or establish a pattern of sick leave usage, which may indicate misuse, will, upon the recommendation of the principal/supervisor and at the discretion of Human Resources, trigger the beginning count of the 180 calendar days of sick leave usage. The calendar count will begin with the first day of the illness/disability for which the 180-day sick leave count is considered. The 180 days of sick leave count may only go back for two years, unless a recommendation by the sick leave panel to go beyond the two years is reached.

1.2.4.1. Employees whose sick leave usage indicates a possible misuse will be notified in writing of the triggering of the 180 calendar days of health and disability leave.

1.2.5. A retired career educator will not be eligible for the 180 days of sick leave benefit. They will earn seven (7) days of sick leave per year which may accrue to a maximum of 21 days. Individuals other than retired Alpine employees who were hired prior to March 1, 2006, are eligible for the 180 days of sick leave benefit.

1.3. An educator who is absent from work for a period of ten (10) consecutive contract days for health or disability reasons must upon the request of the principal/supervisor, supply the Human Resources department with a medical doctor's statement regarding the exact nature of the disability and shall include the doctor's prognosis of when the employee can return to work.

1.4. An educator who has taken ten (10) consecutive contract days or more of health and disability leave in any one school year or who establishes a pattern of sick leave use which might indicate a possible misuse, will, upon the request of the principal/supervisor, have the reasons for leave reviewed by Human Resources. If Human Resources determines after an initial review that there is possible misuse, a panel consisting of three

administrators to be appointed by the superintendent will make a formal review of the situation. The employee may be asked to appear before the panel and in all cases will have an opportunity to provide an explanation. In the event it is determined that the benefit is being misused, the panel will make recommendations for action to the superintendent and to the employee.

- 1.5. If the spouse, child, or parent of an educator has surgery or is hospitalized, the educator may be excused for up to three days for the admittance, release and the day of surgery, but unless the patient is critical the educator should be in school during the period of recovery.
- 1.6. An educator may be excused for up to a maximum of two working days annually in the event of a dependent, immediate family member illness.
 - 1.6.1. Dependent members of the immediate family may include mother, father, child, brother, sister and person living in the same immediate household.
 - 1.6.2. An absence taken under this policy will be construed as health/disability leave.
 - 1.6.2.1. Health and disability leave will be recorded relative to the percent of the contract of the employee. (An educator with a .5 contract who takes a sick day is charged one full day of health and disability leave.) There is not an intent to extend to part-time employees more health and disability leave than full-time employees.
- 1.7. All special requests for health/disability leave beyond that which is specified in this policy shall be referred to the principal for individual consideration. At the principal's discretion up to 5 additional days may be allowed or denied. Upon denial, the employee may appeal directly to the Superintendent to request additional days.
- 1.8. Upon approval of Workman's Compensation (Policy 4224), the Health and Disability leave as described in this policy will run concurrently.

- 1.9. Release to return to work after prolonged illness or disability will be determined by the educator's attending physician. In the event of a conflict with the attending physician and the District administration, a second physician may be consulted at school board expense. In the event of a disagreement between the two doctors, a third doctor may be consulted to determine disposition of the case.
- 1.10. When poor health seems to impair an educator's ability to carry on work in a satisfactory manner, the Board of Education may request the educator to have a complete physical examination by a competent doctor of medicine.
- 1.11. Educators should plan their work and provide lesson plans so that their work will progress normally whenever they must be absent themselves from school.
- 1.12. Sick leave data is protected by HIPPA and will not be shared with any unqualified District employee or employee representative without written consent of the employee.
- 1.13. Employees may use sick leave for organ donation.

2. LONG TERM DISABILITY

- 2.1. Educators shall be provided with a long-term disability insurance policy with the full cost of the premium being paid by the Board of Education for a full time employee. The benefits of this policy become effective following the expiration of the 180 days on health and disability leave. The employee must apply and meet the qualification of Educators Mutual (EMI Health).
- 2.2. Individuals who were on Long-Term Disability prior to the 1988-89 contract year and who qualify to stay on Long-Term Disability beyond the initial two (2) years shall have a waiver of premium to age 65.
- 2.3. Individuals who qualify for Long-Term Disability during the 1988-89 contract year and qualify to stay on Long-Term Disability beyond the initial two (2) years shall be provided a conversion policy for health and accident

insurance only to age 65. This benefit will discontinue at the close of the employee's 1988-89 contract year, but no later than August 31, 1989.

- 2.4. Employees who qualify for Long-Term Disability and qualify to stay on Long-Term Disability beyond the initial two (2) years shall be provided a supplemental conversion policy to their Medicare coverage for health and accident insurance for a three (3) year period. This benefit will discontinue five (5) years from the date the individual qualified for Long-Term Disability. This is a benefit to the employee only and is effective to most employees qualifying subsequent to the 1988-89 school year.
- 2.5. Employees who qualify for Long-Term Disability after June 30, 2011 will no longer be provided a supplemental conversion policy to their Medicare coverage for health and accident coverage for a three (3) year period.
- 2.6. Beginning September 26, 2015 Tier 1 employees (as defined by the Utah Retirement System) who qualify for Long-term Disability (LTD) will have an elimination period of 120 days. Tier 2 employees (as defined by the Utah State Retirement System) who qualify for Long-Term Disability (LTD) will have an elimination period of 180 days.

~~3. POSTPARTUM LEAVE~~

Procedures

1. EXTENDED SICK LEAVE

- 1.1. An employee absent from work for a period of ten (10) consecutive contract days for health or disability reasons must, upon request of his/her principal/supervisor, supply Human Resources with a medical doctor’s statement regarding the exact nature of the disability and shall include the doctor’s prognosis of when the employee can return to work.
- 1.2. Those employees who have been required to supply a medical doctor’s statement to substantiate extended health and disability leave are not to be permitted to return to work without a doctor’s release. If the employee is given only a partial release, please check with the Human Resource office before allowing the person to return to work. Principals/supervisors are to forward these releases without delay to the Human Resource office so they may be placed in the employee’s medical file.
- 1.3. Employees who have been absent for an extended period shall not be allowed to return to work for a day or a few days and then be absent due to health or disability reasons for another extended period of time without proper medical documentation. Principals/supervisors will need to monitor this type of situation.

2.5. Limits on leave

2.5.1. Leave for adoption is granted per adoption decree.

2.5.2. This leave may be taken before the actual placement or adoption of a child if an absence from work is required for the placement for adoption to proceed. For example, the employee may be entitled to leave to attend counseling sessions, appear in court, consult with his or her attorney or the birth parent's representative, submit to a physical examination, or travel to another country to complete an adoption before the actual date of placement.

2.5.3. Leave to bond with a child after placement must be taken as a continuous block of leave. The continuous block of leave must begin within one week of the adoption placement.

2.6. Required documentation

2.6.1. The employee is required to provide notification at least thirty days prior to the anticipated leave when the date is known.

2.6.2. A letter from the applicable agency will be sufficient until an adoption decree is available.

3. PARENTAL LEAVE

The following section is implemented as a continuing pilot for the 2024-2025 school year:

3.1. Policy statement

3.1.1. It is the policy of the Board of Education to enable employees of the Alpine School District to obtain paid parental leave immediately following the birth of a child or children. The interest of the board is to provide reasonable paid leave for employees while protecting the welfare of students and the continuity of their education.

Definitions

~~“Eligible employee” means a contracted employee of the Alpine School district who has been employed by the district for 12 or more consecutive months~~

~~3.2.— Educator Maternity Leave~~

~~3.2.1.— All educators who give birth shall receive six weeks of maternity leave.~~

~~3.2.2.— This leave shall run concurrently with the employee’s Health and Disability Leave.~~

~~3.2.3.— This leave is a consecutive calendar count (including weekends and all holidays).~~

~~3.2.4.— The maternity leave count begins the day of the child’s birth.~~

~~3.2.5.— A request for additional days may be approved when accompanied by a doctor’s note and for postpartum issues.~~

2. Parental Leave

2.1. Definitions

- 2.1.1. "Parental leave" means leave hours provided to a parental leave eligible employee to bond with a child or, in the case of a guardianship appointment, an incapacitated adult.
- 2.1.2. "Parental leave eligible employee" means an employee who, on the date an event described in Subsections 2.1.2.4.1 through 2.1.2.4.5 occurs:

- 2.1.2.1. is a contracted district employee;
- 2.1.2.2. is in a position that accrues paid leave benefits that can be used in the current and future calendar years;
- 2.1.2.3. is not reemployed as defined in Section 49-11-1202;
- 2.1.2.4. is assuming a parental role with respect to the child or the incapacitated adult for which parental leave is requested; and
 - 2.1.2.4.1. is the child's biological parent;
 - 2.1.2.4.2. is the spouse of the person who gave birth to the child;
 - 2.1.2.4.3. is the adoptive parent of the child, unless the employee is the spouse of the pre-existing parent;
 - 2.1.2.4.4. is the intended parent of the child and the child is born under a validated gestational agreement in accordance with Title 78B, Chapter 15, Part 8, Gestational Agreement; or
 - 2.1.2.4.5. is appointed the legal guardian of the child or the incapacitated adult
- 2.1.3. "Postpartum recovery leave" means leave provided to a postpartum recovery leave eligible employee to recover from childbirth that occurs at 20 weeks or greater gestation. (Such leave is offered in satisfaction of the period of parental leave and, if applicable, consecutive period postpartum recovery leave required under 53G-11-209(2) and 63A-17-511(2)-(4)).
- 2.1.4. "Retaliatory action" means to do any of the following to an employee:
 - 2.1.4.1. dismiss the employee;
 - 2.1.4.2. reduce the employee's compensation;
 - 2.1.4.3. fail to increase the employee's compensation by an amount that the employee is otherwise entitled to or was promised;

- 2.1.4.4. fail to promote the employee if the employee would have otherwise been promoted; or
- 2.1.4.5. threaten to take an action described in Subsections 2.1.4.1 through 2.1.4.4.
- 2.1.5. "Postpartum recovery leave eligible employee" means an employee who:
 - 2.1.5.1. Would otherwise qualify as a "parental leave eligible employee" and
 - 2.1.5.2. gives birth to a child.
- 2.1.6. "Qualified employee" means:
 - 2.1.6.1. a parental leave eligible employee; or
 - 2.1.6.2. a postpartum leave eligible employee.
- 2.2. Except as provided in Subsections 2.5 and 2.6, the district shall:
 - 2.2.1. allow a parental leave eligible employee to use up to three work weeks of paid parental leave for:
 - 2.2.1.1. the birth of the parental leave eligible employee's child;
 - 2.2.1.2. the adoption of a child; or
 - 2.2.1.3. the appointment of legal guardianship of a child or incapacitated adult; and
 - 2.2.2. allow a postpartum recovery leave eligible employee up to six (6) consecutive calendar weeks (30 days) of paid Maternity Leave for vaginal birth or up to eight (8) consecutive calendar weeks (40 days) of paid Maternity Leave for cesarean birth.
- 2.3. A qualified employee who is part-time may use the amount of parental leave available to the qualified employee under this section on a pro rata basis as determined by the percentage of his/her contract.
- 2.4. Leave will be recorded relative to the percent of contract of the employee. (A .5 teacher who takes a day of parental leave is charged one full day of

parental leave.) There is not an intent to extend to part-time employees more health and disability leave than full-time employees.

2.5. Parental leave described in Subsection 2.2.1:

2.5.1. may not be used before the day on which:

2.5.1.1. the parental leave eligible employee's child is born;

2.5.1.2. the parental leave eligible employee adopts a child; or

2.5.1.3. the parental leave eligible employee is appointed legal guardian of a child or incapacitated adult;

2.5.1.4. may not be used more than six months after the date described in Subsection 2.2.1;

2.5.2. may not be used intermittently, unless:

2.5.2.1. by mutual written agreement between the district and the parental leave eligible employee; or

2.5.2.2. a health care provider certifies that intermittent leave is medically necessary due to a serious health condition of the child;

2.5.3. runs concurrently with any leave authorized under the Family and Medical Leave Act of 1993, 29 U.S.C. Sec. 2601 et seq.; and

2.5.4. runs consecutively to postpartum recovery leave.

2.6. The amount of parental leave authorized under Subsection 2.2.1 does not increase if a parental leave eligible employee:

2.6.1. has more than one child born from the same pregnancy;

2.6.2. adopts more than one child; or

2.6.3. is appointed legal guardian of more than one child or incapacitated adult.

2.7. A parental leave eligible employee may not use more than three work weeks of paid parental leave within a single 12-month period, regardless of whether during that 12-month period the parental leave eligible employee:

- 2.7.1. becomes the parent of more than one child;
 - 2.7.2. adopts more than one child; or
 - 2.7.3. is appointed legal guardian of more than one child or incapacitated adult.
- 2.8. Postpartum recovery leave described in Subsection 2.2.2:
- 2.8.1. shall be used starting on the day on which the postpartum recovery leave eligible employee gives birth, unless a health care provider certifies that an earlier start date is medically necessary;
 - 2.8.2. shall be used in a single continuous period, unless otherwise authorized in writing by the Executive Director of Human Resources;
 - 2.8.3. runs concurrently with any leave authorized under the Family and Medical Leave Act of 1993, 29 U.S.C. Sec. 2601 et seq.; and
 - 2.8.4. includes any claim to parental leave.
- 2.9. The amount of postpartum recovery leave authorized under Subsection 2.2.2 does not increase if a postpartum recovery leave eligible employee has more than one child born from the same pregnancy.
- 2.10. Except as provided in Subsection 2.10.3, a qualified employee shall give the district notice at least 30 days before the day on which the qualified employee plans to:
- 2.10.1. begin using parental leave or postpartum recovery leave under this section; and
 - 2.10.2. stop using postpartum recovery leave under this section.
 - 2.10.3. If circumstances beyond the qualified employee's control prevent the qualified employee from giving notice as described, the qualified employee shall give each notice as soon as reasonably practicable.
- 2.11. Except as provided in Subsections 2.5.3 and 2.8.3, the district will not charge parental leave or postpartum recovery leave under this section against any other leave a qualified employee is entitled to.

- 2.12. The district will not compensate a qualified employee for any unused parental leave or postpartum recovery leave upon termination of employment or if not used when eligible.
- 2.13. Following the expiration of a qualified employee's parental leave or postpartum recovery leave under this section, the district shall ensure that the qualified employee may return to:
 - 2.13.1. the position that the qualified employee held before using parental leave or postpartum recovery leave; or
 - 2.13.2. a position within the district that is equivalent in seniority, status, benefits, and pay to the position that the qualified employee held before using parental leave or postpartum recovery leave.
- 2.14. If during the time a qualified employee uses parental leave or postpartum recovery leave under this section the district experiences a reduction in force and, as part of the reduction in force, the qualified employee would have been separated had the qualified employee not been using the parental leave or postpartum recovery leave, the district may separate the qualified employee in accordance with any applicable process or procedure as if the qualified employee were not using the parental leave or postpartum recovery leave.
- 2.15. During the time a qualified employee uses parental leave or postpartum recovery leave under this section, the qualified employee shall continue to receive all employment related benefits and payments at the same level that the qualified employee received immediately before beginning the parental leave or postpartum leave, provided that the qualified employee pays any required employee contributions.
- 2.16. The district will not:
 - 2.16.1. interfere with or otherwise restrain a qualified employee from using parental leave or postpartum recovery leave in accordance with this section; or
 - 2.16.2. take retaliatory action against a qualified employee for using parental leave or postpartum recovery leave in accordance with this section.

- 2.17. The district shall provide each employee written information regarding a qualified employee's right to use parental leave or postpartum recovery leave under this section.
- 2.18. Up to 3 days may be allowed for an eligible employee for the placement of a foster child.

HEALTH AND DISABILITY LEAVE INTERPRETATION (NOT POLICY)

Guidelines for administering the health/disability policy are:

1. The principal shall review the health/disability leave policy with the entire staff during the first month of each school year.
- ~~2. All special requests for health/disability leave beyond that which is specified in this policy shall be referred to the principal and the superintendent for individual consideration.~~
- ~~3. Absence caused by serious or emergency illness of a spouse, children or parents of contracted educators can be granted by the principal. The following examples are provided as guidelines to educators and principals so that educators may know when to request additional time off for the illness of a family member and principals may have a basis upon which to grant such requests:~~

~~Example A. If the spouse or child of an educator has surgery, the educator may be excused the day of surgery but unless the patient is critical the educator should be in school during the period of recovery.~~

~~Example B. If the child of an educator has a cold or communicable disease and is not seriously ill, the educator should be in school.~~

~~Example C. If a newborn child has an illness but the parent is physically able to return to work and the child is not critically ill, the educator should be at work.~~

~~Example D. If an educator must be absent from work for maternity reasons for a period beyond fifteen working days, then a doctor's statement must be submitted to the educator's supervisor identifying the actual~~

~~complication which might prevent the educator's return to work. In most cases, in the normal birth of a child, the educator shall return to work within fifteen working days or the cost of a substitute's pay shall be withheld from the educator's pay.~~

Health and Disability Leave

Statement of Policy

The Alpine School District Board of Education recognizes that health and disability leave for employees may be needed. Therefore, the Board provides such leave as an important fringe benefit to its employees. The Board has designated the Superintendent or designee to apply this policy.

Education Support Professionals

Definition: Calendar day includes contract days, weekends and holidays combined.

1. HEALTH AND DISABILITY LEAVE

- 1.1. Provisional contracted employees, those with less than three years continuous, current, experience in the District, are granted health and disability leave as follows:
 - 1.1.1. A maximum of up to seven (7) working days may be granted annually in the event of health or disability absence.
 - 1.1.2. Health and disability may accumulate up to a maximum of twenty-one (21) working days at the beginning of the third year of employment.
 - 1.1.2.1. During the absence of a contracted employee for health or disability reasons, the employee's full salary shall be paid for the cumulative days used.
 - 1.1.2.2. Beyond the cumulative health and disability leave, when the contracted employee is absent because of health or disability

reasons, an contracted employee's salary shall be paid as follows:

- 1.1.2.2.1. A contract employee salary shall have the cost of a personal day deducted (\$30) for any health or disability leave taken beyond the earned cumulative days up to a combined maximum of 180 calendar days.
 - 1.1.3. A contracted Education Support Professional, hired on or after July 1, 2011 and who has retired from a government agency, will not be eligible for the 180 days sick leave benefit. They will earn seven (7) days of sick leave per year, which may accrue to a maximum of 21 days.
- 1.2. Career employees, those who have completed three or more current consecutive years of employment with the district, are granted health and disability leave for 180 calendar days beginning with the first day of disability. (For example: An absence on Friday will count as three sick days, if the employee returns on Monday. Each calendar day counts as an absence, including holidays, as a sick leave day.)
 - 1.2.1. An education support professional career employee who has exhausted the 180 calendar days of health and disability leave and returns to work on the 181st calendar day must obtain a release to return to work letter from their primary care physician, releasing them to return to work capable of fulfilling all essential functions without restrictions.
 - 1.2.1.1. The employee who uses 180 calendar days of health and disability leave and returns to work will be placed on sick leave probation. Sick leave probation begins with the upcoming year and extends to the employee 21 calendar days annually, of health and disability leave for two years. These days are not accumulative. Upon successful completion of sick leave probation, the employee will have their 180 calendar days of health and disability leave

restored.

- 1.2.2. Should an employee be unable to return to work on the 181st calendar day of health and disability leave, they will be separated from employment.
- 1.2.3. Employees who use ten (10) consecutive contract days of health and disability leave, or establish a pattern of sick leave usage, which may indicate a misuse, will, upon the recommendation of the principal/supervisor and at the discretion of Human Resources, trigger the beginning count of 180 calendar days of sick leave usage. The calendar count will begin with the first day of the illness/disability for which the 180 days sick leave count is to be considered. The 180 day sick leave count may only go back for two years, unless a recommendation by the sick leave panel to go beyond the two years is reached.
 - 1.2.3.1. Employees whose sick leave usage indicates a possible misuse will be notified in writing of the triggering of the 180 calendar days of health and disability leave.
- 1.2.4. An employee absent from work for a period of ten (10) consecutive contract days for health and disability reasons in one contract year must, upon the request of the principal/supervisor, supply the Human Resource department with a medical doctor's statement regarding the exact nature of the disability and shall include the doctor's prognosis of when the employee can return to work.
- 1.2.5. An employee who has taken twelve (12) cumulative days or more of health and disability leave in any one contract year or who establishes a pattern of sick leave use which may indicate misuse, will, be required to submit medical justification upon request of the immediate supervisor to Human Resources and may have the reasons for leave reviewed by the administration and in the event the leave is not legitimate the employee's health and disability leave may be restricted. In the event it appears the benefit is being

misused the superintendent or his designee will refer the case to a review panel consisting of two employees to be determined by the education support professional association and a designee determined by the superintendent. The employee will be asked to appear before the panel. In the event it is determined that the benefit is being misused, the panel will make the recommendations for action to the superintendent and to the employee. This review panel will be reviewed annually by the association and the district for its effectiveness and fairness.

- 1.3. Employees shall be provided with a long-term disability insurance policy with the full cost of the premium being paid by the board of education for full time employees as long as the employee has not waived the benefit. The benefits of this policy become effective following the expiration of the 180 day health and disability leave. The employee must make an application to both the social security office and the insurance carrier.
- 1.4. Fitness to return to work after a prolonged illness or disability shall be determined by the employee's attending physician. A letter from the physician is required before the employee shall be allowed to return to work. In the event of a conflict with the attending physician and the district administration, a second physician may be consulted at the Board of Education's expense. In the event of a disagreement between the two doctors, a third doctor may be consulted to determine disposition of the case at the Board of Education's expense.
- 1.5. When poor health seems to impair an employee's ability to carry on his or her work in a satisfactory manner, the Board of Education may request them to have a complete physical examination by a competent doctor of medicine at the board's expense, to determine fitness for duty.
- 1.6. If the spouse, ~~or~~ dependent child, or parent of an employee has surgery or is hospitalized, the employee may be excused for up to three days (if the admittance, day of surgery, and release are separate days), but unless the patient is critical the employee should be at work during the period of recovery.

- 1.7. An employee may be excused for up to a maximum of two working days annually in the event of a dependent, immediate family member illness.
 - 1.7.1. Dependent members of the immediate family may include mother, father, child, brother, sister and person living in the same immediate household.
 - 1.7.2. An absence taken under this policy will be construed as health/disability leave.
 - 1.7.2.1. Health and disability leave will be recorded relative to the percent of the contract of the employee. (An employee with a .5 contract who takes a sick day is charged one full day of health and disability leave.) There is not an intent to extend to part-time employees more health and disability leave than full-time employees.
- 1.8. Absence caused by the death of members of immediate families may be construed as health/disability leave. (See policy 4416)
 - 1.8.1. Absences caused by the death of a family member may not be counted as part of the twenty-one (21) consecutive days that would trigger the 180 calendar day count of health and disability leave.
- 1.9. Employees shall provide plans so that their work shall progress normally whenever they must absent themselves from their places of employment.
- 1.10. Employees who schedule treatment, or surgical procedures which are not deemed medically necessary by a doctor, will not be granted sick leave. Any cosmetic or voluntary procedures that are not medically necessary will not be granted sick leave and days must be taken as personal leave, comp time or vacation.

(Intent-to discourage abuse of sick leave and preserve current benefit)
- 1.11. A supervisor may request medical certification if sick leave is taken before or after a holiday or vacation day.

- 1.12. Sick leave data is protected by HIPPA and will not be shared with any unqualified employee or employee representative without the written consent of the employee.
- 1.13. Upon approval of Worker's Compensation (Policy 4409), the Health and Disability leave as defined in this policy will run concurrently. If extenuating circumstances exist as a result of a workplace injury, an employee may request in writing to the executive director of human resources a review by a panel the sick leave usage and availability in returning to work as a result of workplace injury.
- 1.14. Beginning September 1, 2015 Tier 1 employees (as defined by the Utah Retirement System) who qualify for Long-Term Disability (LTD) will have an elimination period of 120 days. Tier 2 employees (as defined by the Utah Retirement System) who qualify for Long-Term Disability (LTD) will have an elimination period of 180 days.

1. EXTENDED SICK LEAVE

- 1.1. An employee absent from work for a period of ~~ten (10)~~ ~~twenty one (21)~~ calendar days for health or disability reasons must, upon request of his/her supervisor, supply the supervisor with a medical doctor's statement regarding the exact nature of the disability and shall include the doctor's prognosis of when the employee can return to work (Policy No. 4412, 1.2).

The statements from the medical doctor, if requested, are to be forwarded to the Personnel Office for review and placement in the employee's personnel file. (Note: This is a change from earlier directives which required a letter from the employee's physician when the employee had been off work for health or disability reasons for fifteen consecutive days. The principal or district level work-unit supervisor of the employee will now determine if such written notice is required.)

- 1.2. Those employees who have been required to supply a medical doctor's statement to substantiate extended health and disability leave are not to be permitted to return to work without a doctor's release. If the employee is given only a partial release, please check with the Personnel Office before allowing the person to return to work. Principals/supervisors are to forward these releases without delay to the Personnel Office so they may be placed in the employee's personnel file.
- 1.3. Employees who have been absent for an extended period shall not be allowed to return to work for a day or a few days and then be absent due to health or disability reasons for another extended period of time without proper medical documentation. Principals/supervisors will need to monitor carefully this type of situation.

For example, the employee may be entitled to leave to attend counseling sessions, appear in court, consult with his or her attorney or the birth parent’s representative, submit to a physical examination, or travel to another country to complete an adoption before the actual date of placement.~~

~~2.5.3.— Leave to bond with a child after placement must be taken as a continuous block of leave. The continuous block of leave must begin within one week of the adoption placement.~~

~~2.6.— Required documentation~~

~~2.7.— The employee is required to provide notification at least thirty days prior to the anticipated leave when the date is known.~~

~~2.8.— A letter from the applicable agency will be sufficient until an adoption decree is available.~~

~~3. PARENTAL LEAVE~~

The interest of the board is to provide reasonable paid leave for employees while protecting the welfare of students and the continuity of their education.~~

Definitions

~~“Eligible employee” means a contracted employee of the Alpine School district who has been employed by the district for 12 or more consecutive months~~

~~3.2.— Educator Maternity Leave~~

~~3.2.1. All educators who give birth shall receive six weeks of maternity leave.~~

~~3.2.2. This leave shall run concurrently with the employee's Health and Disability Leave.~~

~~3.2.3. This leave is a consecutive calendar count (including weekends and all holidays).~~

~~3.2.4. The maternity leave count begins the day of the child's birth.~~

~~3.2.5. A request for additional days may be approved when accompanied by a doctor's note and for postpartum issues.~~

~~3.2.5.1. Additional days of leave may be taken by FMLA eligible employees as provided in policy 4161 (where both parents work for the District, leave is limited to a combined total of 12 weeks).~~

~~3.3. Educator Parental Leave~~

~~3.3.1. Employees who are the spouse of the child bearer or parent of the new born child shall receive up to five contract days of leave.~~

~~3.3.2. This leave shall run concurrently with the employee's Health and Disability Leave.~~

~~3.3.3. This leave is continuous contract days beginning with the first day taken.~~

~~3.3.3.1. These days must begin within a week of the birth or the first day that the child is brought home if the child has an extended hospital stay.~~

~~3.4. Educators using parental leave may use any accumulated personal days in addition to the five days provided with this policy.~~

~~3.5. Additional days of leave may be taken by FMLA eligible employees as provided in policy 4161 (where both parents work for the District, leave is limited to a combined total of 12 weeks).~~

~~3.6. Employees seeking additional days for extenuating circumstances may make a request to the Executive Director of Human Resources.~~

~~3.7. An absence taken under this policy may be construed as health/disability leave.~~

~~3.7.1. Health and disability leave will be recorded relative to the percent of contract of the employee. (A .5 teacher who takes a sick day is charged one full day of health and disability leave.) There is not an intent to extend to part-time employees more health and disability leave than full-time employees.~~

~~3.8. Additional days of leave may be taken by FMLA eligible employees under the Family and Medical Leave (FMLA) Policy, which allows most eligible employees to take up to 12 weeks of unpaid leave to care for newly born or adopted children~~

~~3.9. Required documentation~~

~~3.9.1. The employee is required to provide notification at least thirty days prior to the expected due date when the date is known.~~

~~3.9.2. Once the child is delivered, a letter from your attending doctor with the date of birth and the recommendation for recovery should be provided to the Human Resources Department.~~

4. Parental Leave

4.1. Definitions

4.1.1. "Parental leave" means leave hours provided to a parental leave eligible employee to bond with a child or, in the case of a guardianship appointment, an incapacitated adult.

4.1.2. "Parental leave eligible employee" means an employee who, on the date an event described in Subsections 2.1.2.4.1 through 2.1.2.4.5 occurs:

4.1.2.1. is a contracted district employee;

4.1.2.2. is in a position that accrues paid leave benefits that can be used in the current and future calendar years;

4.1.2.3. is not reemployed as defined in Section [49-11-1202](#);

- 4.1.2.4. is assuming a parental role with respect to the child or the incapacitated adult for which parental leave is requested; and
 - 4.1.2.4.1. is the child's biological parent;
 - 4.1.2.4.2. is the spouse of the person who gave birth to the child;
 - 4.1.2.4.3. is the adoptive parent of the child, unless the employee is the spouse of the pre-existing parent;
 - 4.1.2.4.4. is the intended parent of the child and the child is born under a validated gestational agreement in accordance with Title 78B, Chapter 15, Part 8, Gestational Agreement; or
 - 4.1.2.4.5. is appointed the legal guardian of the child or the incapacitated adult
- 4.1.3. "Postpartum recovery leave" means leave provided to a postpartum recovery leave eligible employee to recover from childbirth that occurs at 20 weeks or greater gestation. (Such leave is offered in satisfaction of the period of parental leave and, if applicable, consecutive period postpartum recovery leave required under 53G-11-209(2) and 63A-17-511(2)-(4)).
- 4.1.4. "Retaliatory action" means to do any of the following to an employee:
 - 4.1.4.1. dismiss the employee;
 - 4.1.4.2. reduce the employee's compensation;
 - 4.1.4.3. fail to increase the employee's compensation by an amount that the employee is otherwise entitled to or was promised;
 - 4.1.4.4. fail to promote the employee if the employee would have otherwise been promoted; or
 - 4.1.4.5. threaten to take an action described in Subsections 2.1.4.1 through 2.1.4.4.

- 4.1.5. "Postpartum recovery leave eligible employee" means an employee who:
 - 4.1.5.1. Would otherwise qualify as a "parental leave eligible employee" and
 - 4.1.5.2. gives birth to a child.
- 4.1.6. "Qualified employee" means:
 - 4.1.6.1. a parental leave eligible employee; or
 - 4.1.6.2. a postpartum leave eligible employee.
- 4.2. Except as provided in Subsections 2.5 and 2.6, the district shall:
 - 4.2.1. allow a parental leave eligible employee to use up to three work weeks of paid parental leave for:
 - 4.2.1.1. the birth of the parental leave eligible employee's child;
 - 4.2.1.2. the adoption of a child; or
 - 4.2.1.3. the appointment of legal guardianship of a child or incapacitated adult; and
 - 4.2.2. allow a postpartum recovery leave eligible employee up to six (6) consecutive calendar weeks (30 days) of paid Maternity Leave for vaginal birth or up to eight (8) consecutive calendar weeks (40 days) of paid Maternity Leave for cesarean birth.
- 4.3. A qualified employee who is part-time may use the amount of parental leave available to the qualified employee under this section on a pro rata basis as determined by the percentage of his/her contract.
- 4.4. Leave will be recorded relative to the percent of contract of the employee. (A .5 teacher who takes a day of parental leave is charged one full day of parental leave.) There is not an intent to extend to part-time employees more health and disability leave than full-time employees.
- 4.5. Parental leave described in Subsection 2.2.1:
 - 4.5.1. may not be used before the day on which:

- 4.5.1.1. the parental leave eligible employee's child is born;
 - 4.5.1.2. the parental leave eligible employee adopts a child; or
 - 4.5.1.3. the parental leave eligible employee is appointed legal guardian of a child or incapacitated adult;
 - 4.5.1.4. may not be used more than six months after the date described in Subsection 2.2.1;
- 4.5.2. may not be used intermittently, unless:
 - 4.5.2.1. by mutual written agreement between the district and the parental leave eligible employee; or
 - 4.5.2.2. a health care provider certifies that intermittent leave is medically necessary due to a serious health condition of the child;
- 4.5.3. runs concurrently with any leave authorized under the Family and Medical Leave Act of 1993, 29 U.S.C. Sec. 2601 et seq.; and
- 4.5.4. runs consecutively to postpartum recovery leave.
- 4.6. The amount of parental leave authorized under Subsection 2.2.1 does not increase if a parental leave eligible employee:
 - 4.6.1. has more than one child born from the same pregnancy;
 - 4.6.2. adopts more than one child; or
 - 4.6.3. is appointed legal guardian of more than one child or incapacitated adult.
- 4.7. A parental leave eligible employee may not use more than three work weeks of paid parental leave within a single 12-month period, regardless of whether during that 12-month period the parental leave eligible employee:
 - 4.7.1. becomes the parent of more than one child;
 - 4.7.2. adopts more than one child; or
 - 4.7.3. is appointed legal guardian of more than one child or incapacitated adult.

- 4.8. Postpartum recovery leave described in Subsection 2.2.2:
 - 4.8.1. shall be used starting on the day on which the postpartum recovery leave eligible employee gives birth, unless a health care provider certifies that an earlier start date is medically necessary;
 - 4.8.2. shall be used in a single continuous period, unless otherwise authorized in writing by the executive director of Human Resources;
 - 4.8.3. runs concurrently with any leave authorized under the Family and Medical Leave Act of 1993, 29 U.S.C. Sec. 2601 et seq.; and
 - 4.8.4. includes any claim to parental leave.
- 4.9. The amount of postpartum recovery leave authorized under Subsection 2.2.2 does not increase if a postpartum recovery leave eligible employee has more than one child born from the same pregnancy.
- 4.10. Except as provided in Subsection 2.10.3, a qualified employee shall give the district notice at least 30 days before the day on which the qualified employee plans to:
 - 4.10.1. begin using parental leave or postpartum recovery leave under this section; and
 - 4.10.2. stop using postpartum recovery leave under this section.
 - 4.10.3. If circumstances beyond the qualified employee's control prevent the qualified employee from giving notice as described, the qualified employee shall give each notice as soon as reasonably practicable.
- 4.11. Except as provided in Subsections 2.5.3 and 2.8.3, the district will not charge parental leave or postpartum recovery leave under this section against any other leave a qualified employee is entitled to.
- 4.12. The district will not compensate a qualified employee for any unused parental leave or postpartum recovery leave upon termination of employment or if not used when eligible.
- 4.13. Following the expiration of a qualified employee's parental leave or postpartum recovery leave under this section, the district shall ensure that the qualified employee may return to:

- 4.13.1. the position that the qualified employee held before using parental leave or postpartum recovery leave; or
- 4.13.2. a position within the district that is equivalent in seniority, status, benefits, and pay to the position that the qualified employee held before using parental leave or postpartum recovery leave.
- 4.14. If during the time a qualified employee uses parental leave or postpartum recovery leave under this section the district experiences a reduction in force and, as part of the reduction in force, the qualified employee would have been separated had the qualified employee not been using the parental leave or postpartum recovery leave, the district may separate the qualified employee in accordance with any applicable process or procedure as if the qualified employee were not using the parental leave or postpartum recovery leave.
- 4.15. During the time a qualified employee uses parental leave or postpartum recovery leave under this section, the qualified employee shall continue to receive all employment related benefits and payments at the same level that the qualified employee received immediately before beginning the parental leave or postpartum leave, provided that the qualified employee pays any required employee contributions.
- 4.16. The district will not:
 - 4.16.1. interfere with or otherwise restrain a qualified employee from using parental leave or postpartum recovery leave in accordance with this section; or
 - 4.16.2. take retaliatory action against a qualified employee for using parental leave or postpartum recovery leave in accordance with this section.
- 4.17. The district shall provide each employee written information regarding a qualified employee's right to use parental leave or postpartum recovery leave under this section.
- 4.18. Up to 3 days may be allowed for an eligible employee for the placement of a foster child.

All special requests for health/disability leave beyond that which is specified in this policy shall be referred to the principal/supervisor for individual consideration. At the principal's discretion, up to 5 additional days may be allowed or denied. Upon denial, the employee may appeal directly to the Administrator of Human Resources to request additional days. The following examples are provided as guidelines to employees and administrators so that employees may know when to request additional time off for the illness of a family member and administrators may have a basis upon which to grant such requests:~~

~~Example A. If the spouse or child of an employee has surgery, the employee may be excused the day of surgery but unless the patient is critical the employee should be in school during the period of recovery.~~

~~Example B. If the child of an employee has a cold or communicable disease and is not seriously ill, the employee should be in school.~~

~~Example C. If a newborn child has an illness but the parent is physically able to return to work and the child is not critically ill, the employee should be at work.~~

~~Example D. If an employee must be absent from work for maternity reasons for a period beyond fifteen working days, then a doctor's statement must be submitted to the Human Resources department identifying the actual complication which might prevent the employee's return to work. In most cases, in the normal birth of a child, the employee shall return to work within fifteen working days.~~

Example E. Employees may take the day a dependent child or spouse is admitted to, or released from the hospital as family illness upon receiving verification from the hospital.

Electronic Communication & Entertainment Devices

Statement of Policy

The Alpine School District Board of Education acknowledges the value of electronic communication devices as learning tools, ~~and. The Board also~~ recognizes that electronic communication devices such as cell phones, tablets; ~~earbuds,~~ and ~~smart~~watches are commonly used by parents and their children to communicate with each other. ~~While electronic communication devices can assist in crisis response, provide essential medical functionalities, and facilitate certain 504 or IEP accommodations, t~~These same devices have the potential to ~~of~~ disrupting the orderly operation of the school, ~~increasing student anxiety while distracting students from learning. In accordance with UCA 53G-7-226, t~~The Board ~~hereby enacts this policy implementing the restrictions outlined herein in order to govern~~directs each school to establish rules allowing the possession and use ~~of electronic communication devices in accordance with the following rules and regulations.~~

Procedures

No procedures have been established at this time.

Rules & Regulations

1. DEFINITIONS

- 1.1. “Classroom hours” means time during which a student receives scheduled, teacher-supervised instruction that occurs in a physical or virtual classroom setting during regular school operating hours as part of an approved educational curriculum. The term “classroom hours” does not include:
 - 1.1.1. lunch periods;
 - 1.1.2. recess;
 - 1.1.3. transit time between classes;
 - 1.1.4. study halls (unless directly supervised by a teacher);
 - 1.1.5. after-school activities (unless part of an approved extended learning program); or
 - 1.1.6. independent study time occurring outside scheduled instruction.
- 1.2. “Electronic communication device” means a non school-issued electronic device, such as a cellphone, tablet, smartwatch, or other portable device, that can be used for entertainment or communication, regardless of whether or not such device is connected to a network. Fitness trackers which receive notifications but are incapable of responding to notifications are not electronic communication devices.
 - 1.2.1. School-issued electronic devices, including Chromebooks and other devices such as laptop computers, tablets, or e-readers that are “checked-out” or loaned to students, are not “electronic communication devices.” for the purpose of this policy.
- 1.3. “Permitted use” means the use of an electronic communication device for the following purposes:

- 1.3.1. to respond to an imminent threat to the health or safety of an individual;
- 1.3.2. to respond to a school-wide emergency;
- 1.3.3. to use the SafeUT Crisis Line;
- 1.3.4. for a student's IEP or Section 504 accommodation plan, as authorized by the student's IEP or Section 504 team; or
- 1.3.5. to address a medical necessity. [UCA 53G-7-226](#)

2. PROHIBITED AND PERMITTED USES

- 2.1. In accordance with state law, students are prohibited from using electronic communication devices during classroom hours, except for a permitted use.
- 2.2. Schools are encouraged to establish clear parameters governing student use of electronic communication devices in situations of permitted use, based on the following principles:
 - 2.2.1. Students responding to an imminent threat to the health or safety of an individual should immediately notify a school employee of the threat.
 - 2.2.2. School employees should permit a student's use of an electronic communication device only to the extent explicitly required by the student's IEP or Section 504 accommodation plan. IEP and 504 teams are encouraged to thoughtfully consider whether alternative accommodations, other than access to electronic communication devices, may more effectively address the student's needs.
 - 2.2.3. Students may use electronic communication devices to address a medical necessity (such as the monitoring of blood sugar levels or responding to seizure activity) when supported by medical documentation provided by the student or their parent/guardian to the school.

- 2.3. Student use of electronic communication devices which goes beyond a permitted use is prohibited by law and this policy and may subject the student to discipline (for example, a student may be disciplined for using their electronic communication device to access social media, even if the device was initially accessed by the student to address a documented medical necessity).
- 2.4. School employees may verify and confirm authorized uses in ways which are consistent with general student expectations of privacy.

3. LEVELS OF RESTRICTION BASED ON GRADE LEVEL

3.1. Framework for Elementary Schools:

- 3.1.1. Electronic devices, except as otherwise described in this policy shall remain in the students backpack from bell to bell and shall not be seen or heard. Fitness trackers shall be set, so that notifications are not received.
- 3.1.2. If a student needs to communicate with their parent during the school day, they may use their electronic device either in the front office or counseling office, with permission. Permission will be limited to urgent or crisis situations and will not allow for routine or non urgent situations.
 - 3.1.2.1. Electronic devices may not be used while using a hall pass.

3.2. Framework for Middle Schools:

- 3.2.1. Electronic devices, except as otherwise described in this policy shall remain in the students backpack and not be seen or heard. Any watches will be set so that notifications are not received.
- 3.2.2. Electronic devices may be used before and after school, or at lunch.
- 3.2.3. If a student needs to communicate with their parent at any other time, they may use their electronic device either in the front office or

counseling office, with permission. Permission will be limited to urgent or crisis situations and will not allow for routine or non urgent situations.

3.2.3.1. Electronic devices may not be used while using a hall pass.

3.3. Framework for High Schools:

3.3.1. Electronic devices, except as otherwise described in this policy shall remain in the students backpack and not be seen or heard. Any watches will be set so that notifications are not received.

3.3.2. Electronic devices may be used before and after school, in between class bells and at lunch.

3.3.3. All electronic devices must be put away in a backpack, purse or other bag during class.

3.3.4. Watches shall be set, so that notifications are not received during class time.

3.3.5. If a student needs to communicate with their parent at any other time, they may use their electronic device either in the front office or counseling office, with permission. Permission will be limited to urgent or crisis situations and will not allow for routine or non urgent situations.

3.3.5.1. Electronic devices may not be used while using a hall pass.

4. CONSEQUENCES FOR STUDENT VIOLATIONS

4.1. Teachers may remind students at the beginning of class to silence and put away electronic communication devices at the beginning of class, and to warn students of the consequences for violations of this policy as needed.

4.2. Student violations of this policy will result in disciplinary action, including:

4.2.1. First Offense: The student will place their electronic communication device in a container, which will be closed by the teacher. The student will keep the closed container throughout the remainder of

the school day. At the end of the school day, the student may access their electronic communication device;

4.2.1.1. The incident will be recorded as a disciplinary incident in Skyward;

4.2.1.2. The electronic communication device will not be confiscated from the student;

4.2.2. Second Offense: The school will follow the same process as the first offense, but the administrator will contact and notify the student's parent of the second offense;

4.2.2.1. The incident will be recorded as a disciplinary incident in Skyward;

4.2.2.2. The electronic communication device will not be confiscated from the student;

4.2.3. Third Offense: The school will follow the same process as the second offense, but the parent and student will be required to meet with a school administrator to create an electronic communication device plan for supporting the student in complying with state law and following this policy;

4.2.3.1. The incident will be recorded as a disciplinary incident in Skyward;

4.2.3.2. The electronic communication device will not be confiscated from the student;

4.2.4. Repeated violations of this policy may result in escalated consequences, including suspension or full loss of electronic device privileges.

4.2.5. Students who refuse to lock up their electronic communication devices when prompted by a teacher to do so will be referred to school administration.

- 4.2.6. The school and district accept no responsibility for the loss of or damage to any device.

5. SCHOOL RULES

- 5.1. The Board further permits ~~a~~ ~~directs~~ the school to establish more restrictive guidelines to enforce reasonable rules relating to electronic communication and ~~entertainment devices~~ in public schools. Rules established at each school may, among other things:
 - 5.1.1. Impose a bell-to-bell restriction on student use of electronic communication devices;
 - 5.1.2. extend the existing restrictions on student use of electronic communication devices (for example, by prohibiting use during lunch or recess);
 - 5.1.3. establish acceptable places for students to maintain electronic communication devices during classroom hours (for example, requiring students to keep electronic communication devices in their backpacks, or requiring students to check electronic communication devices into school-provided receptacles);
 - 5.1.4. outline different procedures for allowing electronic communication devices to students in the event of an imminent threat to the health or safety of an individual, a school-wide emergency, a medical necessity, or as necessary to use the SafeUT Crisis Line or to access an IEP or 504 accommodation;
 - 5.1.5. establish more strict consequences for student violations; and
 - 5.1.6. establish procedures for the confiscation and return of electronic communication devices which are used in violation of this policy.
- 5.2. For the avoidance of doubt, school-specific rules or guidelines may not prohibit a student from using an electronic communication device for the purposes listed in Section 2.1, but may establish parameters for such approved uses (for example, by establishing how electronic communication

devices will be allowed in the event of a school-wide emergency or determining a process for students to access their electronic communication devices to use the [SafeUT Crisis Line](#)).

- 5.3. The school principal and leadership team are encouraged to involve teachers, staff, parents, students, and school community members in establishing the guidelines and recommending revisions as needed ([R277-495-3\(3\)](#)).
- 5.4. Parents and students shall receive ~~written~~ notice of any school based rules or policies that further limit the use of electronic communication devices established by this district policy.
- 5.5. Notice of the school rules regarding electronic communication devices, shall be made available to parents and students (i) in writing, and (ii) on the school's web page or in the student handbook.
- 5.6. The notice of rules shall include a statement that the school and district accept no responsibility for the loss of or damage to any device.
 - 5.6.1. ~~School rules may prohibit, except as exempted in 2.3 below, use of personal electronic devices during instructional time regardless of whether the use is to send or receive messages.~~
 - 5.6.2. ~~A disruptive or interfering device includes a device or object which does not constitute a weapon or explosive but may, if used or engaged, interfere with the educational process. Examples of such objects include any electronic devices such as cameras, laser pens or pointers, ipods, or other electronic equipment or devices.~~

6. GUIDELINES FOR SCHOOL RULES

- 6.1. When creating schools based policies, the school should reference in their policy or guidelines the requirements found within Utah [Administrative Rule R277-495-4](#) for electronic device use.

- 6.2. The principal of the school is hereby given the authority to make determinations as to **additional** specific locations and situations where possession or use of electronic communication devices and cameras are prohibited.
- 6.3. Exceptions to this policy ~~may~~ shall be granted as school administration works with parents to accommodate students with a physical or mental disability, family emergency or medical necessity that would require **access to** an electronic communication device.
- 6.4. Administrators, ~~and~~ classroom teachers, **and coaches** may prohibit the possession or use of such devices at specific times and in specific circumstances **as outlined in this policy and the school policy (if applicable)**.
- 6.5. Electronic communication devices and cameras may not be ~~possessed~~, activated or utilized in school situations where a reasonable expectation of personal privacy exists. These locations include but are not limited to locker rooms, shower rooms, restrooms and any other areas where students or others may change clothes or be in any stage or degree of disrobing or changing clothes.
- 6.6. At no time at school or in connection with a school activity may an electronic communication device be used by any student in a manner that violates [Policy No. 5181 | Bullying Prevention](#) ~~Policy 5181 (Bullying)~~ or that might reasonably create in the mind of another person who is associated with the school an impression of being threatened, humiliated, harassed, embarrassed or intimidated.
- 6.7. At no time can pornography be disseminated or accessed through electronic **communication** devices.
- 6.8. The school administrator may take appropriate disciplinary action when a student violates a rule on an electronic **communication** device.
- ~~6.8.1. Schools must include in their guidelines procedures to report the misuse of electronic devices; and~~

- ~~6.8.2. Schools must include potential disciplinary actions toward students or employees for violation of local policies regarding the use of electronic devices.~~
- 6.8.3. Punishment for violation of electronic **communication** device rules may include the **process described in Section 3 of this policy** ~~immediate confiscation of the electronic communication device. The confiscated device shall be given to the principal or his designee. The principal may return the device at the closing of the day or make arrangements to notify and meet with the parent/guardian for pick-up of the device. Rules regarding confiscation may include the requirement for a parent meeting prior to the return of the device.~~
- 6.8.4. The use of an electronic communication device to threaten, intimidate, or embarrass another, or to capture and transmit test information or any other information in a manner constituting fraud, theft, or academic dishonesty, will result in suspension as referenced in [Policy No. 5180 | Discipline](#). Authority: [R277-495-1](#) (Authority, ~~and Purpose~~ **and Oversight Category**); **and** [R277-495-4](#) (LEA Electronic Device Policy Requirements)

7. COMMUNICATION WITH STUDENTS

- 7.1. Because not all students have access to a school-issued electronic device or personal electronic communication device, when a school is using electronic means to send communications to students, the school should also take care to ensure that students have non-electronic notification of and access to:
- 7.1.1. school activities and events, including:
 - 7.1.1.1. schedule changes;
 - 7.1.1.2. extracurricular activities; and
 - 7.1.1.3. sporting events; and
 - 7.1.2. emergency response plans.

- 7.2. If the school provides each student with a school-issued electronic device, and the school-issued electronic device is capable of receiving electronic notification of and access to school activities and events as described in [Section 5.1](#), then the school may provide electronic communications. If an emergency, unforeseen circumstance, or other incident arises and an LEA cannot reasonably provide timely non-electronic notification, the school should make its best effort to communicate essential information to all students through any means available.
- 7.3. The school may not require the use of a privately owned electronic device to complete course work. [UCA 53G-4-402\(22\)](#)

Bullying/Harassment/Hazing

Statement of Policy

Alpine School District is committed to provide students and employees with safe and secure learning and working environments. A student's ability to achieve academically and an employee's quality of performance can be reduced by bullying, cyberbullying, harassment, hazing, and/or retaliation. Such actions and behaviors can impact a student's or employee's attendance as well as his/her sense of well-being and may result in physical illness, mental and emotional anguish and long term social consequences.

Alpine School District prohibits bullying, cyberbullying, harassment, hazing, and retaliation of employees by students or employees at school/work or at school/work related functions (Ref: [Utah Code Rule R277-613](#)). All victims of such incidences and all persons with knowledge of such incidences should report them immediately.

1. DEFINITIONS

- 1.1. Bullying is defined as aggressive behavior that causes harm or distress, exists in a relationship in which there is an imbalance of power or strength and is repeated over time.
 - 1.1.1. Physical bullying includes, but is not limited to, pushing, grabbing, pinching, shoving, poking, tripping, kicking, hitting, and destroying property.
 - 1.1.2. Verbal or written bullying includes, but is not limited to, name calling, unwelcome teasing, spreading false rumors, intimidation, sexual comments, harassing and threatening comments which are communicated verbally, in writing, or through electronic media (cyberbullying).
- 1.2. Cyber-bullying is defined as using the internet, a mobile phone, or another device to send or post text, video, or an image with the intent or

knowledge, or with reckless disregard, that the text, video, or image will hurt, embarrass, or threaten an individual, regardless of whether the individual directed, consented to, or acquiesced in the conduct, or voluntarily accessed the electronic communication.

- 1.3. Harassment is defined as repeatedly communicating to another individual, in an objectively demeaning or disparaging manner, statements that contribute to a hostile learning or work environment for the individual. This includes rumor spreading and social aggression intended to demean and disparage another individual and that contributes to a hostile learning or work environment for the individual.
- 1.4. Hazing is defined as intentionally or knowingly committing an act that:
 - 1.4.1. Endangers the physical health or safety of a school employee or student,
 - 1.4.2. Involves any brutality of a physical nature such as inappropriate touching, whipping, beating, branding, calisthenics, bruising, electric shocking, placing of a harmful substance on the body, or exposure to the elements,
 - 1.4.3. Involves requiring or forcing the consumption of any food, liquor, drug, or other substance
 - 1.4.4. Involves physically obstructing a school employee's or student's freedom to move,
 - 1.4.4.1. And is done for the purpose of initiation or admission into, affiliation with, holding office in, or as a condition for, membership or acceptance, or continued membership or acceptance, in any school sponsored team, organization, program, or event, or
 - 1.4.4.2. If the person committing the act against a school employee or student knows that the school employee or student is a member of, or candidate for a school sponsored team, organization, program, or event to which the person committing the act belongs to or participates in.

1.4.5. Retaliation is defined as:

1.4.5.1. Retribution against a person for reporting bullying, cyberbullying, harassment, or hazing; or

1.4.5.2. Tampering with the investigation of, or the response to, a report of bullying, cyberbullying, harassment or hazing.

Procedures

1. PROCEDURE FOR REPORTING/INVESTIGATING EMPLOYEE HARASSMENT

- 1.1. Individuals affected by harassment are afforded avenues for filing complaints which are free from bias, collusion, intimidation or reprisal.
- 1.2. Complainants are encouraged to verbalize disapproval of the action(s) to the harasser. Complainants should document the occurrences(s), identifying such things as time, date, place, what was said, witnesses and other relevant circumstances surrounding the event.
- 1.3. The complainant should submit a written complaint directly to the immediate supervisor. However, in cases where the supervisor is the alleged harasser, the complainant should make the complaint to his/her supervisor's supervisor or to the Administrator of Human Resources.
- 1.4. The school administrator or supervisor has the responsibility to conduct a preliminary review when an informal complaint is received or alleged harassment is observed. This is separate from, but may lead to, a formal investigation. Steps the supervisor is advised to follow include:

- 1.4.1. Interview the complainant and document the conversation. Instruct the complainant to have no contact or communication with the alleged harasser.
 - 1.4.2. Interview the alleged harasser and inform him/her that a complaint has been made and, if the behavior has occurred, it must cease. If it appears likely that harassment has occurred, write a letter of warning stating that a complaint has been made and indicating directives to cease harassment.
 - 1.4.3. Report back to the complainant notifying him/her as to what has been done and that the behavior is expected to stop.
 - 1.4.4. If the complainant wishes further investigation, notify him/her to put the complaint in writing to be considered for a formal investigation. The supervisor should document the notification.
 - 1.4.5. The supervisor must sometimes exercise discretion as to the severity or pervasiveness of the conduct in determining whether a formal investigation is necessary regardless of the complainant's desires. If a blatant violation is determined to have occurred, the complaint should be referred to the formal level.
- 1.5. Formal Investigation
 - 1.5.1. If the supervisor feels that a formal investigation is necessary due to the severity of the harassment or due to a repeated offense, the supervisor will work with a Human Resources director to conduct a formal investigation.
 - 1.5.2. If the formal investigation reveals that harassment has occurred, corrective action ranging from a verbal or written warning to the accused specifying the nature of the complaint, up to a recommendation for termination may be taken.
 - 1.5.3. If the formal investigation results in findings of bad faith/false claim, the person filing such shall be subject to corrective or disciplinary action.

Alpine School District is dedicated to providing safe, respectful, and inclusive learning and working environments for students and employees. Acts of bullying, cyberbullying, hazing, abusive conduct, or retaliation **are prohibited, as they** undermine these environments and may negatively affect attendance, performance, safety, and well-being. The District is committed to timely intervention and parental involvement. ~~An action plan will be created and communicated with the individual parent(s) if their student is involved in an incident, in accordance with state law. Utah Code § 53G-9-605.5~~

1. DEFINITIONS

1.1. **Abusive Conduct** is defined as:

1.1.1. verbal, nonverbal, or physical conduct of a parent or student directed toward a school employee that, based on its severity, nature, and frequency of occurrence, a reasonable person would determine is intended to cause intimidation, humiliation, or unwarranted distress.

1.1.2. A single act does not constitute abusive conduct.

1.2. **Bullying** is defined as **“student bullying” and “staff bullying”** ~~intentionally committing a written, verbal, or physical act against a school employee or~~

~~student that a reasonable person under the circumstances should know or reasonably foresee will have the effect of: [Utah Code § 53G-9-601](#).~~

~~1.2.1. causing physical or emotional harm to the school employee or student;~~

~~1.2.2. causing damage to the school employee's or student's property;~~

~~1.2.3. placing the school employee or student in reasonable fear of:~~

~~1.2.3.1. harm to their physical or emotional well-being; or~~

~~1.2.3.2. damage to their property;~~

~~1.2.4. creating a hostile, threatening, humiliating, or abusive educational environment due to:~~

~~1.2.4.1. the pervasiveness, persistence, or severity of the actions; or~~

~~1.2.4.2. a power differential between the bully and the target; or~~

~~1.2.5. substantially interfering with a student having a safe school environment that is necessary to facilitate educational performance, opportunities, or benefits.~~

1.3. **“Complainant”** refers to an individual making an allegation.

1.4. **Cyber-bullying** is defined as using the internet, a mobile phone, or another device to send or post text, video, or an image with the intent or knowledge, or with reckless disregard, that the text video, or image will hurt, embarrass, or threaten an individual, regardless of whether the individual directed, consented to, or acquiesced in the conduct, or voluntarily accessed the electronic communication.

1.5. **Hazing** is defined as intentionally, knowingly or recklessly committing an act, or causing another individual to commit an act, **regardless of whether the school employee or student against whom the conduct is committed directed, consented to or acquiesced in the conduct**, that:

~~1.5.1. includes one of the following:~~

- 1.5.2. endangers the **mental or** physical health or safety of a school employee or student;
- 1.5.3. involves any brutality of a physical nature **including such as** ~~inappropriate touching,~~ whipping, beating, branding, calisthenics, bruising, electric shocking, placing of a harmful substance on the body, or exposure to the elements;
- 1.5.4. involves the consumption of any food, **alcoholic product** ~~liquor,~~ drug, or other substance or activity that endangers the person's mental or physical health and safety; or
- 1.5.5. involves any activity that would subject an employee or student to extreme mental stress, such as sleep deprivation, extended isolation from social contact, or conduct that subjects them to extreme embarrassment, shame, or humiliation; and
- 1.5.6. **E**ither:
 - 1.5.6.1. is done for the purpose of initiation or admission into, affiliation with, holding office in, or as a condition for, membership ~~or acceptance, or continued membership or acceptance,~~ in **any** school or school-sponsored team, organization, program, club, or event; or
 - 1.5.6.2. is directed toward a school employee or student whom the individual who commits the act knows, at the time the act is committed, that the school employee or student is a member of, or candidate for a school or school sponsored team, organization, program, club, or event to which the person who commits the act also ~~belongs or~~ participates.
- 1.6. **Physical bullying** includes, but is not limited to, pushing, grabbing, pinching, shoving, poking, tripping, kicking, hitting and destroying property.
- 1.7. **Retaliation** is defined as an act or communication intended:

- 1.7.1. as retribution against a person for reporting bullying, cyberbullying, ~~or~~ hazing or abusive conduct; or
- 1.7.2. to improperly influence the investigation of, or the response to, a report of bullying, cyberbullying, ~~or~~ hazing or abusive conduct.

1.8. **Staff Bullying** is defined as:

- 1.8.1. a school employee, with the intent to cause harm, repeatedly committing a written, verbal, or physical act against a student or another school employee, or engaging in a single egregious act toward another employee involving an imbalance of power, that:
 - 1.8.1.1. creates an environment that a reasonable person would find hostile, threatening, or humiliating; and
 - 1.8.1.2. substantially interferes with a student's or employee's educational or professional performance, opportunities, or benefits.
- 1.8.2. Staff bullying does not include instances of:
 - 1.8.2.1. ordinary teasing, horseplay, argument, or peer conflict;
 - 1.8.2.2. reasonable correction of behavior by a school employee; or
 - 1.8.2.3. reasonable coaching strategies and techniques by a school employee who is a coach.

1.9. **Student Bullying** is defined as:

- 1.9.1. one or more students, with the intent to cause harm, repeatedly committing a written, verbal, or physical act against another student, or engaging in a single egregious act toward another student involving an imbalance of power, that:
 - 1.9.1.1. creates an environment that a reasonable person would find hostile; and

1.9.1.2. interferes with a student's educational performance, opportunities, or benefits.

1.9.2. Student bullying does not include instances of:

1.9.2.1. ordinary teasing, horseplay, argument, or peer conflict;

1.9.2.2. reasonable correction of behavior by a school employee; or

1.9.2.3. reasonable coaching strategies and techniques by a school employee who is a coach.

1.10. **Verbal or written bullying** includes, but is not limited to, name calling, unwelcome teasing, spreading false rumors, intimidation, sexual comments, and harassing or threatening comments which are communicated verbally, in writing, or through electronic media (cyberbullying).

1.10.1. Sex-based bullying or harassment should be reported to the Title IX Coordinator and resolved as outlined in [Policy No. 7150 | Sexual Harassment](#).

2. PROHIBITION OF BULLYING AND ABUSIVE CONDUCT

2.1. Alpine School District prohibits bullying, cyberbullying, hazing, abusive conduct and retaliation toward students, ~~parents~~, or employees by other students, parents, or employees at school/work or at school/work related functions **regardless of legal status** ([Utah Code Rule R277-613](#)). All victims of such incidences and all persons with knowledge of such incidences should report them immediately.

2.1.1. It is also a violation of this policy to share recordings or videos of acts of bullying, cyberbullying, hazing, abusive conduct or retaliation, in order to impact or encourage future incidents. Appropriate discipline will be in accordance with the district discipline [policy 5180](#).

- 2.2. A school employee or student may not engage in bullying a school employee or student:
 - 2.2.1. On school property;
 - 2.2.2. At a school related or sponsored event;
 - 2.2.3. On a school bus;
 - 2.2.4. At a school bus stop; or
 - 2.2.5. While the school employee or student is traveling to or from a location or event described above.
- 2.3. A school employee or student may not engage in cyberbullying or hazing a school employee or student at any time or in any location.
- 2.4. The district has the authority to discipline students and employees/volunteers for violations of this policy (and its accompanying administrative procedures) which take place at an LEA sponsored event. Off-site violations that significantly impact an individual's learning or working environment may also be addressed through this process. Any violation by a student will result in appropriate discipline, in accordance with student discipline policy [5180](#) and employee discipline policies [4132](#) and [4432](#) . Violations may also affect a student's participation in extracurricular activities and the assignments given to employees/volunteers. ~~In addition, conduct by a student that rises to the level of suspected criminal activity will be referred to law enforcement.~~
- 2.5. Following a substantiated incident of bullying or other misconduct prohibited under this policy, professionally licensed employees may be referred to the Utah Professional Practices Advisory Commission (UPPAC), with supporting evidence, for investigation and possible disciplinary action against their license.
- 2.6. Disciplinary actions and appeal procedures to be taken pertaining to students are also outlined in [Policy No. 5180 | Discipline](#) and [policies 4132, 4432 and 7300](#)~~its associated Procedures and Rules & Regulations.~~

- 2.7. Disciplinary actions pertaining to employees will follow procedures outlined in employee policies and Human Resource policies.

Procedures

1. REPORTING BULLYING

- 1.1. Individuals affected by bullying are afforded avenues for filing complaints which are free from bias, collusion, intimidation or reprisal.
- 1.2. An individual ~~student~~ who has suffered bullying should talk to a trusted adult, (i.e. teacher, counselor, administrator) or may report via phone, email, SafeUT or any manner that will alert the school or district administration. In order to facilitate the District's investigation and resolution of bullying reports, individuals reporting a bullying incident are encouraged to specifically describe the behavior as "bullying."
 - 1.2.1. In cases where the teacher, counselor, administrator is the alleged bully/harasser, the complainant should make the complaint to the bully/harasser's supervisor or to the Administrator of Human Resources.
- ~~1.3. Disciplinary actions for bullying by students shall follow the procedures outlined in [Policy No. 5180 | Discipline](#)~~
- 1.4. Complainants are encouraged to verbalize disapproval of the action(s) to the bully/harasser. It is recommended, complainants document the occurrences(s), identifying such things as time, date, place, what was said, witnesses and other relevant circumstances surrounding the event.
- 1.5. Damage towards a person or property and/or other **conduct resulting in** illegal activities may be referred to law enforcement.
- 1.6. Complaints may be submitted anonymously, but must contain enough detail—such as the names of the victim and alleged offender, and a description of the behavior—for the school to conduct an investigation. Formal disciplinary action cannot be taken based solely on an anonymous

complaint, unless the school is able to investigate and substantiate the allegations.

- 1.7. Incidents of knowingly and/or intentionally making false reports are also prohibited.

2. PARENTAL NOTIFICATION

- 2.1. School personnel shall notify a parent ([Utah Code § 53G-9-604](#)) ~~via email or verbal communication~~ as soon as reasonably possible, including by email or in writing, and follow the procedures in the [ASD guidelines](#), including implementation of an action plan to address the incident, if:
 - 2.1.1. the parent's student threatens suicide; or
 - 2.1.2. the parent's student is involved in an incident of bullying, cyberbullying, hazing, abusive conduct or retaliation.
- 2.2. If a school notifies a parent of an incident or threat required to be reported, they shall:
 - 2.2.1. produce and maintain a record in the district's student information system that:
 - 2.2.1.1. verifies that the parent was notified of the incident or threat; and
 - 2.2.1.2. tracks the implementation of the action plan and updates parents addressing the incident, if applicable.
 - 2.2.1.3. An [action plan](#) will be created using the provided template and communicated with the parent(s) if their student is involved in an incident, in accordance with state law. [Utah Code § 53G-9-605 and 605.5](#); and shall:
 - 2.2.1.4. provide the parent with resources found in our [ASD guidelines](#), including:
 - 2.2.1.4.1. Suicide prevention materials and information; and

2.2.1.4.2. information on ways to limit the student’s access to fatal means including a firearm or medication.

2.2.1.5. As part of the action plan parents will be notified regarding:

2.2.1.5.1. the outcome of the school or LEA’s investigation;

2.2.1.5.2. A discussion of safety considerations for the student who is the subject of the incident; and

2.2.1.5.3. An explanation of the process for addressing the incident.

2.3. If a school employee, agent, or school resource officer believes a student is at risk of attempting suicide, physically self-harming, or harming others, the school employee, agent, or school resource officer shall notify that student’s parent or legal guardian and may intervene and/or ask the student questions regarding the student’s suicidal thoughts, physically self-harming behavior, or thoughts of harming others for the purposes of:

2.3.1. referring the student to appropriate [prevention services](#);

2.3.2. informing the student’s parent or legal guardian; and/or

2.3.3. de-escalating the emergency situation.

2.4. At the request of a parent, a school may provide information and make recommendations related to an incident or threat described above.

2.5. A school shall also, upon request, provide a student a copy of a record maintained under this policy and expunge the record under this policy if the student:

2.5.1. Has graduated from high school; and

2.5.2. Requests the record be expunged.

3. CONSEQUENCES ~~OF ABUSIVE CONDUCT~~

Abusive Conduct

- 3.1. Disciplinary actions for abusive conduct by students shall follow the procedures outlined in [Policy No. 5180 | Discipline](#).
- 3.2. Any parent/guardian who engages in abusive conduct, as described herein, or in [Policy No. 7150 | Sexual Harassment](#), is in violation of this policy and may be subject to the following:
 - ~~3.2.1. the parent/guardian may be issued a trespass notice prohibiting them from coming onto school or District property;~~
 - 3.2.2. the parent/guardian may be subject to communication protocols wherein parameters and restrictions are placed upon them in regards to communicating with school or District personnel;
 - 3.2.3. the parent/guardian may be subject to other appropriate school or District imposed restrictions;
 - 3.2.4. the parent/guardian may be issued a trespass notice prohibiting them from coming onto school or District property; and/or
 - 3.2.5. the parent/guardian may be subject to appropriate legal action.
 - 3.2.6. Employees subjected to abusive conduct by parents should immediately work to have other staff present, allow for safety protocols, express their discomfort and may choose to terminate any meeting, call, or communication in favor of other more appropriate means of communication or conflict resolution.

Bullying

- 3.3. Disciplinary actions for bullying by students shall follow the procedures outlined in [Policy No. 5180 | Discipline](#). These may include:
 - 3.3.1. Tracking and monitoring student behavior individually, by class, by school
 - 3.3.2. Evaluation of the student's placement
 - 3.3.3. Parent/student conferences with counselor, student advocate, educator and/or administrator

- 3.3.4. Individual student contracts and no contact contracts
 - 3.3.5. Referrals to School and/or district resources including counseling
 - 3.3.6. Special placement
 - 3.3.7. Detention
 - 3.3.8. Suspension (in school)
 - 3.3.9. Suspension (out of school)
 - 3.3.10. Assignment to home study
 - 3.3.11. Referral to an alternative program
 - 3.3.12. Expulsion
- 3.4. Nothing in this part prohibits a victim of bullying, cyber-bullying, hazing, abusive conduct, or retaliation from seeking legal redress under any other provisions of civil or criminal law.
- 3.5. This section does not create or alter tort liability.

4. APPEAL and GRIEVANCE PROCESS

- 4.1. A ~~parent/student or the parent of a student or school employee~~ who has experienced an incident of ~~bullying/abusive conduct~~, and is not satisfied with one or more of the consequences included in an action plan may appeal said consequences by submitting ~~initial efforts to resolve the issue; may submit~~ a written appeal or through due process procedures outlined in [ASD Policy 5180 - Discipline](#), ~~namely: grievance with the school's principal within thirty (30) calendar days of the incident.~~
- 4.1.1. The parent/student shall have the right to appeal the decision and/or discipline.
 - 4.1.2. The parent/student shall prepare a written statement and submit it to the principal/supervisor.
 - 4.1.3. After reviewing the case, the principal/supervisor shall inform the parent/student of the appeal decision.

- 4.1.4. Further appeals may be made to the Superintendent or his designee.
- 4.1.5. The superintendent or superintendent's designee next level supervisor's written response to the appeal shall be the final administrative action in the matter.
- 4.2. A school employee who has experienced an incident of abusive conduct shall follow the grievance process found in ASD policy [4130](#) or [4431](#).
- ~~4.3. The written grievance described in Subsection (1) shall include:
 - ~~4.3.1. the date of the incident;~~
 - ~~4.3.2. circumstances of the incident; and~~
 - ~~4.3.3. the signature of the complainant submitting the grievance to the principal.~~~~
- ~~4.4. Within ten (10) business days of receiving the written grievance, the complainant's immediate supervisor/principal shall meet with the complainant to discuss the grievance and possible resolutions.~~
- ~~4.5. Within ten (10) business days after the meeting described in Subsection (2.3), the immediate supervisor/principal shall respond to the complainant in writing explaining the immediate supervisor/principal's position and offer options for substantive resolution of the complaint.~~
- ~~4.6. If the response by the immediate supervisor/principal described in Subsection (2.4) does not satisfactorily resolve the issue, the complainant may appeal the immediate supervisor/principal's response in writing within ten (10) business days after receipt of the response to the next level of supervision (e.g. teacher to principal, principal to district supervisor, district supervisor to district leadership team).~~
- ~~4.7. Within ten (10) business days after receipt of the grievance appeal described in Subsection (5), the next level supervisor shall meet with the complainant to employee to discuss the grievance and possible resolutions.~~

~~4.8. Within fifteen (15) calendar days after the meeting, the next level supervisor shall respond in writing with a final resolution of the grievance.~~

~~4.9. The next level supervisor's written response shall be the final administrative action in the matter.~~

Rules & Regulations

 - 1.3. This policy must be included in school and employee handbooks and be provided to parents.
