Water System Update

- *700 south*
 - *Pulling pump and motor*
 - *Delay due to drop pipe*
- *Freeport*
 - *Both wells are operating*
 - *Small booster pump out of service(fire)*
 - *Large booster*
 - *New VRD drive*
 - *Currently fine-tuning flows*
- *Hill Field*
 - *Well is operating, the tank is full, & waiting for Bac-T results*
- *Pressure Regulator Valves(PRV's)*
 - *Currently in the process of adjusting pressures*



Bridge Inspection Program

- *UDOT inspects local government In-Service bridges every two years.*
- *They'll send us a report detailing the health index made from the condition of the deck, structure, and underground members.*
- *Health index ranks from 0-100*
 - *800 North: 72.02*
 - *Center Street: 84.45*
 - *300 North: 43.52*



Bridge Inspection Program

- *300 North is our poorest bridge and the report listed superficial repair recommendations:*
 - *Apply Deck Overlay*
 - *Extend Drains Below Superstructure*
 - *Repair Beam/Girder*
 - *Repair Pier Wall*
 - *Repair Abutment Backwall*
 - *Remove Debris from Joints*
 - *Replace Joint Seal*



Bridge Inspection Program

- *From the newly completed Transportation Master Plan:*

"Clearfield City should work with UDOT to better understand the expected lifespan and approach to rehabilitation/replacement of their bridges. The City should begin discussions with UDOT's Director of Region One, Region One Program Manager, and Local Government Program to best determine the appropriate course of action. Replacement costs could be as much as the City's entire 2025 annual budget at approximately \$40M."

UDOT is going to put the bridge on their "Off System Project" list

- *What is the FBI National Academy*
 - *Internationally known for its academic excellence, the National Academy offers 10 weeks of advanced communication, leadership, and fitness training. Participants must have proven records as professionals within their agencies to attend. On average, these officers have 21 years of law enforcement experience and usually return to their agencies to serve in executive-level positions.*
 - *A total of 56,180 graduates have completed the FBI National Academy since it began in 1935. The National Academy is held at the FBI Training Academy in Quantico, the same facility where the FBI trains its new special agents and intelligence analysts.*

- *Training/Education:*
 - *FBI Academy instructors, special agents, and other staff with advanced degrees provide the training; many instructors are recognized internationally in their fields. Since 1972, National Academy students have been able to earn undergraduate and graduate credits from the University of Virginia, which accredits all the National Academy courses offered.*

- *Session 294:*
 - *Two hundred and thirty-nine law enforcement officers graduated June 5th from the FBI National Academy in Quantico, Virginia. The 294th session of the National Academy consisted of men and women from 48 states and the District of Columbia. The class included members of law enforcement agencies from 14 countries, six military organizations, and four federal civilian organizations.*

Crime Reduction Unit

- *Enhance public safety*
- *Identify, analyze, and address criminal activity*
- *Intelligence-led policing principles*
- *Reduce crime, deter criminal behavior, and foster safer environment*
- *Follow standard operating procedures*
 - *deconfliction, debriefing, administration review (risk mitigation)*
- *On-going investigations*
 - *Confidential informants*
 - *Additional leads during investigations*

Crime Reduction Unit

- *Drug Offense – 25 grams of marijuana, 47 grams of methamphetamines, 40 misc. pills*
- *Drug Offense – 3 gram of marijuana, 38 grams of methamphetamines, 25 misc. pills*
- *Felony warrant – suspect wanted for evading officers. Located counterfeit money, controlled substances and drug paraphernalia.*

Signage Regulation Education / Outreach

- **June 2016** – Educational materials mailed to businesses
- **May 2024** – Code Enforcement contacted businesses about non-compliant signs; removed A-frames and signs in park strips
- **Ongoing** – Planning discusses sign regulations with new businesses
- **2024** – Six RFCs issued; Code began assisting PD with parking violations
- **Title 11** – Temporary sign regulations currently outlined
- **Advertising Benches** – South Clearfield Elementary / Library (06/19)
- **Next Steps** – Council direction on future enforcement and education
