### DIVISION OF WATER QUALITY UTAH DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY PUBLIC NOTICE OF INTENT TO RENEW A UPDES PERMIT

#### **PURPOSE OF PUBLIC NOTICE**

The purpose of this public notice is to declare the Director of the Division of Water Quality's intention to renew a Utah Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (UPDES) Permit under the authority of the Utah Water Quality Act, Utah Code § 19-5-106(2)(g). The draft Permit and the Fact Sheet (collectively, the draft Permit documents) are available for review and comment.

#### **BACKGROUND**

The Castle Valley Special Service District (CVSSD) operates Ferron Lagoons (Ferron) to treat domestic sewage for the City of Ferron. The Ferron system is located approximately 2.25 miles east of the City of Ferron off Highway 10 in Emery County, Utah. Ferron consists of four cells totaling 33 acres in area with a chlorination pond for disinfection and also provides for the addition of a future cell if needed. To date there has been no discharge from this facility and none are anticipated for at least the next five years. The Ferron Lagoons have a design flow of 0.5 million gallons per day (MGD) with a single discharge point of Outfall 001.

#### **PUBLIC COMMENTS**

Pursuant to Utah Admin. Code R317-8-6(6.6), any interested person may submit written comments on the draft permit documents and may request a public hearing if no hearing has already been scheduled. A request for a public hearing shall be in writing and shall state the nature of the issues proposed to be raised in the hearing. All comments will be considered in making the final decision and shall be answered as provided in Utah Admin. Code R317-8-6(6.12).

Commenters have an affirmative obligation to raise all reasonably ascertainable issues and submit all reasonably available arguments and factual grounds supporting their position, including all supporting material. Supporting material must be included in full and may not be incorporated by reference, unless the material is already part of the administrative record.
