**APPROVAL OF MEETING MINUTES**

**Ms. Rasmussen Moved** to approve the meeting minutes as presented. **Mr. MacKay Seconded** the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

**APPEARANCES**

Logan Ludvigson – Award Presentation

Fairview City Police Chief Logan Ludvigson appeared before the Council and explained that recently one of Fairview City's part-time officers was involved in a service call where he ended up saving the life of someone in distress. Logan presented the officer, Daniel Spencer, with a Life Saving Award in recognition of his efforts.

### Rickie Stewart – North Sanpete Special Service District

Mayor Brad Welch explained that Rickie Stewart was unable to make it to this City Council meeting but is planning on attending the next regularly scheduled meeting.

## **REPORTS/ACTION ITEMS**

### Burn Pit / Green Waste Pile

Brandon Ulibarri explained that the public-dump limb pile north of the upper cemetery is completely filled and can handle no more dumping. He stated this is a frequent issue and the City should develop a policy on when, if at all, the public can dump their green waste.

The City Council discussed and decided residents could dump at the waste pile during the State's open burn season, and it would be closed after that. The Council instructed Brandon Ulibarri to hang signs around the premises and install security cameras to help with enforcement.

### Public Hearing // Presentation and Approval of 2025-2026 FY Budget

Mr. Nelson presented the FY 2025-2026 Budget to the Council and ran through notable changes. He stated that changes to the budget are small, and even though Fairview is taking over financial responsibility of the library, expects it to be a pretty standard financial year.

Mayor Welch opened the public hearing at 8:03PM.

Erma Lee Hansen appeared before the City Council and asked how many employees the library will have. Mr. MacKay responded they have two paid employees.

Hearing no further public comments, Mayor Welch closed the public hearing 8:06PM and turned the item back to the City Council for further discussion.

**Mr. MacKay moved** to approve the FY 2025-2026 Budget. **Mr. St. Jacques seconded** the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

### Pioneer Days Event Planning and Updates

The City Council went over the upcoming Pioneer Days events and generally discussed their operation plans.
