1.	Fiscal Year 2026 Tentative Budget The Council will present the tentative budget for Fiscal Year 2026 (beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2026).	Jed Hansen, representing the Gunnison Fire Department, addressed the Council and public regarding a proposed \$5,000 increase to the department's budget, of which Mayfield Town's portion is \$800. He cited rising equipment costs and noted that the department responded to 28 call-outs in the past year.		
2.	Opening and Amending the Fiscal Year 2025 Budget The Council proposes to amend the current budget to reflect updated expenditures in the following categories: - Highways and Public Improvements - Parks, Recreation and Public Property	Clerk Amanda Bennett continued the public hearing by presenting the Fiscal Year 2025 budget report and summarizing the proposed Fiscal Year 2026 budget. Public questions and comments were received and addressed during this segment of the meeting. Mayor Anderson introduced four proposed ordinances:

1.	Public Comments Time set aside for the council to receive public comments- See Note	David and Tamara Sorensen appeared before the Council to report ongoing issues related to dog disturbances. Mark Hopkins, the Town's Animal Control Officer, will follow up on and address the matter. Rhonda Adair expressed concern regarding fire hazards caused by overgrown weeds on vacant lots. She inquired whether the Town could take measures to mow and mitigate the risk. Mark Hopkins also recommended that fireworks be prohibited this year due to safety concerns. John Andrews requested the enforcement of a noise ordinance to prohibit the use of jake brakes within town limits. He also raised concerns about the fly population originating from neighboring properties housing horses. Pat Fordham addressed the Council regarding a late fee assessed for a dog license, seeking clarification or possible reconsideration. Catherine Bartholomew inquired whether anyone was aware of a service opportunity that the Gunnison Valley Cares Coalition could incorporate into their upcoming Day of Service initiative.	
2.	Discussion and Action Items a. White's Sanitation- annual update	Taylor White appeared before the Council to provide details regarding the proposed five-year contract renewal for garbage collection services in Mayfield Town. The current rate is \$10.75 per household. Mr. White explained that the proposed contract includes a flat rate increase to \$13.00, with two implementation options: A one-time increase to \$13.00 immediately; or An incremental increase, beginning with a \$1.25 increase in the first year,	

b. Discussion and approval of Grand Marshal 2025	followed by \$0.50 annual increases over the next three years, which ultimately puts it at \$14.00. He noted that other communities continue to pay higher rates than those proposed by White's, and the \$4.00 landfill fee will remain an additional charge on top of the base rate. Due to an error in the agenda listing, no action could be taken at this meeting. The item will be placed on the next agenda for official consideration. The Grand Marshal nomination list was reviewed by the Council. It was unanimously decided to honor Sylvia Christiansen as the Town's Centurion in recognition of her contributions and longevity in the community. For the 2025 Grand Marshal, the Council prioritized the following individuals: 1. Ace Robertson – First Choice 2. Doug Bjerregaard – Second Choice 3. Joe Frischknecht – Third Choice Krista will contact the nominees in the listed order to confirm availability and finalize the selection.	
c. Discussion and amendment of Fiscal Year 2025 Budget	Amanda presented the Fiscal year 2025 Quarter 4 financial report which reflects a balance in all funds of \$728,334.71. Motion to approve was made. Resolution 2025-C – FY2025 Budget Amendment The Council read Resolution 2025-C into the record, outlining proposed amendments to the Fiscal Year 2025 budget as follows: Highways and Public Improvements: Increased from \$87,762 to \$147,744.90 Parks, Recreation, and Public Property: Increased from \$6,825 to \$7,184.56 Public Safety: Increased from \$28,442 to \$29,879.25 A motion to amend the FY2025 budget as presented was made.
