### Coulson Rich-Building Permit-Danish Meadows Phase 1 Lot #13

## Brittney Fisher-

Councilwoman Fisher gave an update on the Harvest Moon Festival. The committee would like to add a band this year. The committee has been told they can borrow Gunnison's smaller white shade tent for the event, and will let them use all the tables and chairs they have and use for the fourth of July celebration. Planning on food trucks & vendors, with a fee payable to the city and a refundable deposit. Other events planned are a silent auction, line dancing, hay rides but increasing numbers of 4-wheelers, bounce houses (that have their own liability insurance), with wristbands for a fee. All money goes to the bounce house company. Depending on how popular it is the committee will reevaluate for next year. They would like the youth council to help with the games. Also planning a chili cook off, pumpkin carving cost and fireworks.

Rachel Jensen and Kiersten Smith, committee members came to discuss the parade. The committee feels like it is really hard to get parade entries. One reason being is they are asking local businesses for donations for silent auction items as well as to sponsor games, so they can keep that part free. Wondering about doing a children's parade or something else. Mayor Leatherwood would like them to move forward with the parade this year and suggested getting Gunnison City's list of entries for their parade and making contact with those individuals.
