- IV. City Council Report -- Mindy Wright: Lots happening by the high school, fields basically completed. Planning shade structures. Working 1200 W to make a through street. “Ninja” park being worked on, patterned after a park in St George. 6 more pickleball courts have been added. Arts Park amphitheater, just got a grant for \$750,000 to upgrade the park. 620 N being turned into a two-way stop (not on Canyon Rd). Jazz basketball court going in at Al Curtis Memorial Park, hoops and painting to come, anticipated ribbon cutting in August.
- V. Friends of the Library Report – David: Semiannual meeting August 7, 7-8pm. Book Sale from Art City Days generated \$7471.66, highest sales total to date. 501(c)(3) status approved. Farmers market booth to encourage community involvement. Summer lunches serve an average of 150 meals daily.
- VI. Director Report – Find ways to volunteer for community events (Celebrate, farmer’s market, summer lunches, etc). State library division benchmark for last year. 332,712 library visits in 2024. We do really well in visits (checkouts, meeting rooms, programs, events, etc) and the turnover rate (how much we are circulating in comparison to the size of your collection). We want to be high in this area, keeping things fresh, delivering the best bang for their buck for the community. Over 44,000 people visited the library in June, a record! There have

been a lot of wasps, working with facilities team to treat for that - maybe have an activity or presentation for kids and the community to learn about wasps and their benefits, and what to do to avoid disturbances and stings. There will come a time in the future where our growth will reach numbers that will require us to look at solutions like a satellite location. Fun thought: part of the library's storage is the community's homes. Dan gave a good explanation of Beehive Consortium.
