**ACTION**: R277-111 Sharing of Curriculum Materials by Public School Educators

(Continuation and Amendment)

### Background:

- 1. R277-111 Sharing of Curriculum Materials by Public School Educators is due for its five-year review and continuation consistent with the Utah Administrative Rulemaking Act. The rule must be approved for continuation by the Board or it will expire on May 8, 2015. Staff have reviewed R277-111 and determined that the rule continues to be necessary.
- 2. R277-111 *Sharing of Curriculum Materials by Public School Educators* is amended to update terminology and remove unnecessary language.

# **Key Points:**

- 1. R277-111 continues to be necessary because it provides provisions encouraging public school employees to share materials they develop to benefit public education generally.
- 2. The amendments to R277-111 provide minor terminology changes and delete one unnecessary sentence about LEAs.

## Anticipated Action:

- 1. It is proposed that the Law and Licensing Committee consider approving R277-111 for continuation on first reading and, if approved by the Committee, the Board consider approving R277-111 for continuation on second reading.
- 2. It is proposed that the Law and Licensing Committee consider approving R277-111, as amended, on first reading and, if approved by the Committee, the Board consider approving R277-111, as amended, on second reading.

- 4 R277-111-1. Definitions.
- 5 A. "Board" means the Utah State Board of Education.
- 6 B. "Creative Commons License" means copyright licenses
- 7 that grant certain rights such as the right to distribute the
- 8 copyrighted work without changes, at no charge. Works
- 9 licensed under a Creative Commons License is protected by
- 10 copyright applicable law. Creative Commons Licenses are
- 11 non-exclusive and non-revocable.
- 12 <u>C. "LEA" means a local education agency, including local</u>
- 13 school boards/public school districts, charter schools and,
- 14 for purposes of this rule, the Utah Schools for the Deaf and
- 15 the Blind.
- 16 [C]D. "[District/]LEA materials" means materials
- 17 purchased or developed by an [school district/charter
- 18 school]LEA using [district]LEA funds or resources, including
- 19 materials, resources or activities which the [district]LEA
- 20 requested employees to create, develop or compile during the
- 21 employees' contract time.
- 22  $[\theta]$ E. "Material(s)" means all copyrightable works,
- 23 including writings, lectures, musical or dramatic
- 24 compositions, sound recordings, films, videotapes and other
- 25 pictorial or technological reproductions, computer programs,
- 26 listings, charts, manuals, codes, instructions and software.
- 27 [臣]F. "Non-commercial use" means use or exchange without

#### 39 R277-111-2. Authority and Purpose.

- 40 A. This rule is authorized by Utah Constitution Article
- 41 X, Section 3 which vests general control and supervision of
- 42 Public Education in the Board, Section 53A-1-401(3) which
- 43 allows the Board to adopt rules in accordance with its
- 44 responsibilities, and by Section 53A-1-402(1)(e) which directs
- 45 the Board to encourage school productivity and cost
- 46 effectiveness measures.
- B. The purpose of this rule is to provide information and
- 48 assurance to public school educators about sharing materials
- 49 created or developed by educators primarily for use in their
- 50 own classes or assignments. The intent of this rule is to
- 51 allow or encourage educators to use valuable time and
- 52 resources to improve instruction and instructional practices
- 53 with assistance from appropriate materials developed by other
- 54 educators.

#### 55 R277-111-3. Educators Sharing Materials.

- A. Utah educators may share materials for noncommercial
- 57 use that educators have developed primarily for use in their
- 58 own classes, courses or assignments.
- 59 B. Utah educators may only share materials that they
- 60 developed personally and may not unilaterally share materials
- 61 that were purchased or developed by or on behalf of their
- 62 public employer or the State.
- 63 C. Utah educators may only share materials that are
- 64 consistent with R277-515 Utah Educator Professional Standards.
- 65 For example, educators may not share materials that advocate
- 66 illegal activities or that are inconsistent with their legal
- 67 and role model responsibilities as public employees and
- 68 licensed educators.

- D. Utah educators may share materials under a Creative Commons License and shall be personally responsible for understanding and satisfying the requirements of a Creative Commons License.
- The presumption of this rule is that materials may be shared. The presumption is that Utah educators need not seek permission from their employers to share personally-developed materials.[

  However public school employers may provide notice to employees that materials developed with public school funds or during public school employment must be reviewed by the employer prior to sharing or distribution.]
- F. Public educators may not sell teacher curriculum materials developed in whole or in part with public education funds or developed within the employee's scope of employment to Utah educators.

## 84 R277-111-4. [School District/Charter School] LEA Rights.

- 85 A. Utah [school districts or charter schools] LEAs may 86 develop and make available a policy that directs employees to 87 seek review and approval before employees share materials that 88 were developed on contract time, developed partially 89 jointly with [school district/charter school]LEA funding, part of an [district/charter school]LEA assignment or if 90 91 materials reference or imply [school district/charter school]LEA use or endorsement. 92
- 93 B. Utah [school districts/charter schools]LEAs may 94 prohibit their employees from sharing materials that were 95 purchased with [school district]LEA funds or which are 96 licensed specifically for [school district/charter school]LEA 97 use.
