Homes which are accessible, safe and welcoming to all ages and abilities.




DURABILITY

Critical Home Repair Program (CHiRP)

- Addresses health and safety concerns in the home.
- 13+ years of program experience.
- We have helped over 466 families and anticipate reaching 550+ by the end of the fiscal year 2026.
- FY 2025 -19 families in Davis Co. and 4 in Clearfield
- Current -11 in progress in Davis Co. and 1 in Clearfield
- This includes children, seniors, veterans, and people with disabilities and/or chronic illnesses.



How it works

- Our CHiRP team performs a 100-point inspection of the home
- The team then creates a project scope of work and manages all construction details
- Qualifying applicants may receive a grant up to \$20,000
- Remainder is repaid, interest free, when the name on the title changes

Eligibility


- U.S Citizen/legal resident
- Owns home
- 80% AMI and below
- Home must be on a foundation
- Live in Salt Lake, Tooele, or Davis County

Funding

- Funding for Clearfield is yet to be determined

Before and After CHiRP

This project was done for a wheelchair-bound double amputee who struggled to get in and out of her bathtub. We gave her a wheel-in shower with safety grab bars, a comfort height toilet, replaced the uneven flooring, and installed a new water heater, among other updates.



- **Damaged or worn-out roof**
 - Leaks cause mold, mildew, and interior damage.
 - Can harm structural integrity.
- **Missing Gutters**
 - Poor drainage causes exterior damage and moisture in the home.
- **Window replacement**
 - Fire hazards
 - Poor air quality
 - Mold, mildew
- **Plumbing**
 - Can create internal structural damages
 - Lead to mold and mildew
 - Pest infestations
- **Electrical**
 - Fire hazards
 - Prevents proper heating in the winter and cooling in the summer.



This Clearfield family was referred to the Critical Repair Program by another homeowner in Davis Co who was also working with the CHiRP team. The initial reason they applied was to address the roof that had wind damage. The family has been in the home for about 20 years. Jake is 69 with hyperthyroidism but is in good health. His wife, Lucy, is 58 and has hyperthyroidism as well as high blood pressure. They have a 16-year-old son who is severely autistic.

We were able to address the roof and the windows through the HAF grant. The family deeply appreciated the support from Habitat through the process. Lucy mentioned that she never thought they would be able to get their roof fixed, and that she would never forget everything that was done for the family.


