

PRIMARY ELECTION INFORMATION

- **When is the 2025 Municipal Primary Election?**

The election is on Tuesday, August 12, 2025.

- **When will ballots be mailed out?**

Ballots will be mailed to all eligible voters starting July 22, 2025.

- **What happens if a physical address is used instead of a P.O. Box as the mailing address?**

If a voter does not provide a P.O. Box, the ballot will be mailed to their physical address. In most cases, this results in the ballot being returned to the county office.

- **How can I check my voter registration status and track my ballot?**

You can check your registration status, track your ballot, and learn about candidates online at www.vote.utah.gov or by calling the County Clerk's Office at (435) 676-1100.

- **Do I need postage if I'm voting by mail?**

No, all envelopes are pre-stamped by the County Clerk's Office.

- **What is the deadline for my mailed ballot to be valid?**

To be valid, the Garfield County Clerk's Office *must* receive your ballot on or before 8:00 p.m. on Election Day. Postmarks no longer count due to a change in state law.

- **Where can I find information about Primary Election Candidates?**

Voters can participate in the "Meet the Candidates" night at the Boulder Community Center on Tuesday, July 29, at 6:30 p.m. The evening's format will allow each candidate to introduce themselves and explain why they are running, followed by an opportunity for audience members to ask a question. EARLY VOTING AND BALLOT BOX INFORMATION

- **Where and when can I vote early?**

Early voting is available at the Garfield County Courthouse from July 29 to August 11, during regular office hours, Monday through Friday, from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

- **Can someone else drop off my ballot for me?**

Yes, there are no restrictions on someone dropping off a ballot on behalf of another person, either by mail or at a county dropbox.

- **Can voters use the Boulder Town Office ballot box at times not specified in the notice if a clerk is present?**

Voters are welcome to drop off their ballots at any time the drop box is available. Please note that there is also a 24-hour drop box in Escalante.

- **What does scanning mean for the county? Does it mean tracking the ballot or counting the vote?**

When the county clerk's office receives ballots, they scan the barcode to verify the voter's signature. This process is for tracking the ballot, not for counting the vote.

- **How frequently are ballots collected from the ballot boxes? Additionally, when are the ballots collected from the ballot box scanned?**

The County Clerks do not have a set schedule for collecting ballots from ballot boxes. In previous presidential elections, they have done multiple pickups during the election period,

but haven't finalized plans for this year. It depends on the volume of ballots each town is receiving. Ballots are scanned upon receipt at the county clerk's office.

- **Will the ballot box in Boulder be collected on Election Day, Tuesday, August 12? If not, when will it be collected?**

Generally, the County Clerks retrieve the ballot box at the close of business on the last day it has been advertised as open by the town. So, for Boulder, that would be the Wednesday before the election, August 6, 2025. If it is a later date, the town clerks will post a notice.

- **What are the ballot box locations and their availability?**

ELECTION DAY VOTING

- **Where can I vote on Election Day?**

On Election Day, Tuesday, August 12, 2025, you can vote at the Garfield County Courthouse from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Dropboxes at the Garfield County Courthouse, Escalante City Office, and Tropic Town Office will be available until 8:00 p.m.

- **Can I obtain a ballot at the request of a voter?**

Yes, you can obtain a ballot on behalf of a voter if they meet any of the following criteria: Confined in hospice care; Confined in a treatment facility; Confined to a long-term care institution facility; Due to age or illness is restricted in the ability to travel from their permanent or temporary residence. If the voter meets any of these conditions, you will need to contact the County Clerk's office to receive instructions and complete the necessary paperwork on the voter's behalf.
