#### **APPROVAL OF MINUTES OF May 28, 2025 Meeting**

**Motion**: Jill Jones motioned to approve the meeting minutes.

Joe Havasi seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously

#### **EXECUTIVE SECRETARY REPORT**

Mr. Mackey addressed the Board with the following updates:

- Mr. Mackey explained that the EPA has published draft guidance on the implementation of the Supreme Court decision Maui v Hawaii Wildlife Fund. The decision addresses functional equivalent of a discharge. In this case, Maui used a deep well injection for disposal of treated effluent. Further information is available on the meeting recording at <u>June Meeting Recording</u>.
- Mr. Mackey discussed the President's proposed budget, which includes a 90% cut to the Clean Water State Revolving Fund (SRF) appropriation. This would reduce the annual capitalization grant to about \$1.4m, which reduces the amount of money the Board can award for projects. The grant represents about 1/3 of annual revenue for project. Further information is available on the meeting recording at June Meeting Recording.
- Mr. Mackey discussed the Harmful Algal Bloom (HAB) season. The Division is seeing warning level concentrations in some of the waters around the State. With increasing temperatures and upcoming holiday recreation, the Division has monitoring crews out collecting samples.
