Stressing the importance of handicap parking around the school and stripping parking around the schools. Increased issues with kids speeding mini bikes through town, parents need to explain the importance of following the laws. The mayor thanked all the council and employees for help during Memorial Day and getting the rodeo grounds ready for Heritage days. With budget approved, a new vehicle will be purchased for the workers. Public thank you to Jenene Hasen for all her hard work and dedication.

Agenda Item 18. Departmental Report

Fire Chief: Chase Majors thanked Jenene Hansen for her help with grant writing and the city council for supporting sandbagging and July 4th preparations. The department was recognized for professionalism in responding to the Clawson fire. An after-action meeting showed the five responding firefighters are doing well. The department received \$5,609 from the district, used to purchase

firefighting equipment. Thanks were also given to Council Member Tom Kay and the city for supporting high standards. A concern was raised about a sunken parking lot corner causing water to flood a neighbor's property, which Mayor Norton wants addressed.

Maintenance Dept.: Scott Gordon reported that the whole town has been sprayed for weeds and starting on the second pass. There was a repair done on the flower water truck. Memorial Day went well and they are now working on rodeo and Heritage days.

Agenda Item 19. Youth City Council's Reports

Council member G Wilson YCC cleared the flowers off the graves. Had help from the church group that was in town doing service projects. Finding numbers are fewer in YCC due to graduation and busy schedules. Surveyed around town with Gary to narrow down the new sidewalks this fall. Ice cream is ordered for ice cream social and cookies for Glee club.

Agenda Item 20. Council's Report

Council member Beagley acknowledged the hard work of the Desert Edge youth group, who painted the pavilions at the city park and ballpark. Flowers were replaced in front of the city building, and the splash pad's power panel was successfully installed and is functioning well. It was also noted that the Emery County Rec Board will be undergoing some changes. Council member D Wilson Memorial Day went well and thank you to Kemple family for putting flags out for Veterans. Thank you to American Legion for doing the service, which had a large turnout. Audit committee was rescheduled due to certain people being unable to make it. Council member Kay thanked the Desert Edge and Colorado youth group for their volunteer work, and Home Town for donating ice and drinks. Community service crews painted curb stripes, cleaned leaves at the park, and worked on watering and painting the rodeo grounds. Appreciation was also given to Robert, Scott, Jenene, and Gary for their help. Council member Miller thanked Tom for all his help with the rodeo. New rodeo event was added, a wild pony race. Castleview Hospital called to sponsor the rodeo. Thank you to Marissa Fausset for doing the rodeo royalty, which went well. All Council members thanked Jenene for all she has done for the council and city workers.

Agenda Item 21. Zoning Administrator Report

Gary Arrington reported he did two more zoning clearances and removed vehicles off the streets. Software to help with code enforcement was brought up; it would cost \$2,400.00 annually and a setup fee of \$1,300.00.
