## SANPETE COUNTY SPECIAL SERVICE DISTRICT #1 MEETING

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July 1, 2025 2 5:00 P.M. 3 Members present for the meeting are Commissioner Scott Bartholomew, Stan 4 Jensen, Ben Black, Doug Christiansen. Robert Staker and Loni Hammond. 5 Secretary Kristine Frischknecht-Christensen and Road Department Supervisor 6 Tom Seely are present. Garrick Willden is present representing Jones and DeMille 7 Engineering. 8 Meeting is called to order by Commissioner/Chairman Scott Bartholomew. 9 Minutes for the meeting held on May 20, 2025, were distributed prior to the 10 meeting. Upon review, a motion is made by Stan Jensen to approve the minutes. 11 The motion is seconded by Ben Black and the motion passes. 12 A claim was made after the last meeting which was for the final payment on the 13 Landfill Road loan from Community Impact Board. In order to avoid late fees, a 14 check was made in the amount of \$15,000.00. Motion is made Loni Hammond to 15 ratify the payment previously made in the amount of \$15,000.00 to Community 16 Impact Board (CIB) for the final payment on the Landfill Road. The motion is 17 seconded by Doug Christiansen and the motion passes. 18 The following claims were submitted for consideration of approval: 19 Sanpete News (Notice of Public Hearing) \$140.00 20 Sanpete News (Notice of Public Bonds) \$165.00 21

- 27 (It is noted that the last payment for Staker Parsons although approved will not be
- paid until after the loan closing and funds are received from CIB.
- Motion is made by Doug Christiansen to approve the other claims as submitted.
- The motion is seconded by Ben Black and the motion passes.
- A financial report is given at this time. There was a check previously received for
- 32 the Secure Rural School payment that was not near what we budgeted. A second
- check in the amount of \$180,115.19 which brings us closer to the amount
- budgeted. The unobligated is currently at \$415,045.10. Motion is made by Loni
- Hammond to accept the financial report. The motion is seconded by Robert Staker
- and the motion passes.
- 37 Consideration is given to an Agreement for Jones and Demille to work on three
- water crossings in Sanpete County. In a letter addressed to Commissioner
- 39 Bartholomew from Jones and Demille outlines the scope of work, schedule and
- 40 fees associated with the design and construction of the water crossings. The three
- water crossings are on Upper Dover Road, West of Fayette, Big Spring Road, west
- of Ftn. Green and Water Hollow Road, 100 North east of Ftn. Green. The costs are
- as follows: Preconstruction Services \$59,675, survey construction staking in the
- amount of \$15,175 and construction engineering services in the amount of \$78,500

- for a total of \$153,350. The board budgeted \$160,000 for a project with the Road
- Department this year and those funds can be used for the design of the water
- crossings. Doug Christiansen makes a motion to approve the agreement for the
- design for all three water crossings using the \$160,000 budgeted for this year's
- 49 project with the Road Department. The motion is seconded by Robert Staker and
- the motion passes.
- The Moroni T Road is discussed. The project is done and Garrick reports things
- went very well. They were very surprised and pleased that there were no soft spots.
- Garrick believes this is a solid road and should last for years. Garrick expresses his
- appreciation to the Road Supervisor on this project. Garrick distributes the budget
- sheet for the project. The funding sought out from this project was for
- \$4,550,000.00. The board contributed a match in the amount of \$500,000.00, grant
- was received in the amount of \$2,097,000.00 and a loan in the amount of
- \$1,458,000.00. Garrick explains that the cash match is spent first, then the loan and
- then the grant. Garrick states that there is \$367,000 left in contingency. He states
- that the chip seal has not been done yet and estimates approximately \$280,000.00
- plus \$30,000.00 for engineering. The chip seal was not in the original design.
- 62 Garrick wonders if they want to bid it back out or do a change order and have
- Hales Sand and Gravel do the chip seal. If awarded to Hales Sand and Gravel it
- would avoid the costs of advertising again. The chip seal was in the original scope
- of work. Motion is made by Loni Hammond to use the contingency to have Hales
- Sand and Gravel chip seal and strip the Moroni T Road. The motion is seconded by
- Ben Black and the motion passes.
- This is the time and place as we advertised to hold a public hearing for the purpose
- of receiving input from the public with respect to the issuance of Bonds and any
- 70 potential economic impact to the private sector from the construction of the Project

- to be funded by the Mineral Lease Revenue Bonds in the amount not to exceed
- \$1,900,000 for financing the construction of road improvements to the Moroni T
- 73 Road. Garrick offers the following relative to the project:

## BACKGROUND

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- 75 The traffic type and volume along the Moroni T Road has changed significantly
- within the past few years. For many years, the Moroni T Road mainly facilitated
- 77 residential vehicles traveling to and from the small towns of Wales and Freedom in
- northern Sanpete County. The road is 2.65 miles in length and varies in width from
- 22 to 26 feet. Within the past few years, a logging company, a gravel pit and other
- businesses have developed in this area and heavily use this road to transport
- materials. The original asphalt contains cold mix oil that does not cure as hard as
- 82 hot mix asphalt. This cold mix prevents cracking but under heavy loads fails and
- causes major rutting. This rutting is dangerous to drivers as it creates an uneven
- road surface and causes water to pond in the travel lanes of the roadway. This
- creates a less safe condition than a smoothly crowned roadway with proper slopes
- to drain water away from the travel lanes. In addition, there are a few areas in the
- lower valley along the roadway that are saturated and where the substructure of the
- road has failed and is causing minor pumping within the roadway.

## PROPOSED PROJECT

- In order to improve safety and facilitate heavy traffic loads we are proposing to
- remove the existing cold mix asphalt and replace it with hot mix asphalt. This will
- be accomplished by rotomilling up the cold mix asphalt and hauling it off site.
- After the asphalt is removed the underlying base will be reviewed to identify
- saturated soft areas. This saturated material will be excavated and replaced with

the appropriate depth of granular fill, then a leveling course of roadbase will be 95 placed and compacted followed by the placement of the hot mix asphalt. The 96 asphalt roadway will be widened from approximately 24 feet to 30 feet. In some 97 areas additional granular borrow and road base may be needed to develop the 98 needed substructure under the widened shoulders. No additional right of way will 99 be required for this widening. Existing driveways will also be paved. Existing 100 culverts may be replaced to prevent future disturbance of the roadway 101 surface. Following the paving of the road, the new asphalt surface will be chip 102 sealed and then paint stripped to define the new travel lanes. Additional signs and 103 safety features may also be added as needed. No one is present from the public 104 and no comment is received. The hearing is closed and the regular meeting 105 resumes. 106

Garrick distributes a budget sheet for the North Sugar Factory Bridge project. The original contract was \$699,000.00 and with the \$170,000.00 approved in this meeting there has been \$539,000.00 of work completed. Garrick states that the Bridge is complete with the exception of epoxy coating for the top of the concrete deck, the approach slab, removal of old bridge and tying in the irrigation. They can't complete this until the road complete next summer. The bridge was fitted in a tight area without hitting any concrete. The concrete contractor did an amazing job. There is some contingency that could go to the road project next year.

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An application was received from Shaun Edwards for dust suppression for the length of .25 miles at 10886 West 9300 S near Centerfield. There is a brief discussion relative to the many requests received for dust suppression knowing that they build on a dirt road. Tom states that dust suppression is a temporary and a bridge to doing something better. Loni believes the Road Department is doing a great job with dust suppression. The board agrees to add this to the list to look at

- next year. Motion is made by Ben Black to add this road to the Road Priority List.
- The motion is seconded by Robert Staker and the motion passes.
- Jody Woods is present to discuss the application she submitted for dust suppression
- at 8250 East West of Mt. Pleasant. The application was addressed in a previous
- meeting and was added to the Road Priority List. Jody discusses the problems they
- are having with dust. She distributes a paper discussing dust as a health hazard.
- Her husband Ron Wood is a farmer. They moved from Colorado to Utah at the
- time of the death of her son, who was killed in the war in Iraq. They purchased 20
- ac. several years ago. When they moved here there was hardly any traffic and no
- one living in this area. She states that the Philpot's bought property above where
- they live. Speeding has become a problem with people coming down this road
- from the property the Philpots own. Tom has put up speed signs and they have
- written a letter about the problem and given to the property owners. She estimates
- there are 10 families that live on the property that Philpot bought. Additionally,
- there are a number of construction people going to and from. She states dust goes
- 75 ft in the air. Tom explains the problem with water, funding and timing. The
- roads for dust suppression application have been done for this year with the
- funding we had budgeted. The board can't do anything this year but will look at
- her road in the spring.
- 140 With no further business before the board, the motion to adjourn the meeting is
- made by Robert Staker. The motion is seconded by Ben Black and the motion
- passes.
