Discussion and Consideration: Ordinance 25-26—Rezone Parcel 03-017-0019, Located at 1405 W 3200 S from Residential (R-2) to Residential (R-2A)

- setbacks requirements and building code
- fire safety
- availability of public water utilities
- traffic and speeding issues
- · communication with the local school district
- the calculation of gross verses net developable acreage
- open space subdivisions

- the calculation of allowable density within the subdivision
- the proposed use for the dedicated open space
- the structural integrity of the existing agricultural buildings within the dedicated open space and the cost for renovation

Mayor Larry Jacobsen also asked Mr. Joshua Low, the applicant, of 201 S MAIN ST STE 800 SALT LAKE CITY UTAH 84111, about proposed house sizes for the subdivision.

Councilmember Norman Larsen motioned to approve Ordinance 25-26—Rezone Parcel 03-017-0019, Located at 1405 W 3200 S from Residential (R-2) to Residential (R-2A) for first reading. Councilmember Kay Sweeten seconded the motion.

Councilmember Norman Larsen talked about his desire to see the lot size increase within the proposed subdivision between first and second reading. He also voiced his concern with the setbacks within the subdivision and the proximity of the lots to one another and existing developments. He talked about the value of the use of the dedicated open space within the proposed subdivision. Councilmember Larsen asked to see some visual representation of the flood mitigation measures for the proposed development during the second reading of the ordinance.

Mayor Larry Jacobsen talked about working with the developer to reconsider the lot sizes and setbacks within the proposed subdivision.

Councilmember Sweeten talked about her desire to understand more about the inresidence and outside culinary water usage for comparable lot sizes.

Councilmember Erin Mann expressed interest in learning more specifics about Morgan Farm's proposed plans for the dedicated open space at the second reading of this ordinance.

Seeing no further discussion, Mayor Larry Jacobsen called for a vote.

Discussion and Consideration: Ordinance 25-27—Development Agreement for The Fields at Nibley, a 70-Lot Open Space Subdivision on Approximately 19.23 Acres, at 1405 W 3200 S

City Planner Levi Roberts used an electronic presentation titled *Development Agreement* for The Fields at Nibley (a printed copy of the presentation is included in the printed record copy of the meeting minutes). The topics Mr. Roberts addressed in his presentation included the following: background information, open space and consideration for acquisition, and Planning and Zoning and staff recommendation. Mr. Roberts also reviewed the Development Agreement and the Preliminary Plat for the proposed subdivision.

Councilmember Garrett Mansell expressed his desire to amend the Development Agreement to include requiring the developer to cover the cost of addressing the deficiencies identified in the Cartwright Engineers structural assessment.

Councilmember Norman Larsen motioned to approve Ordinance 25-27—Development Agreement for The Fields at Nibley, a 70-Lot Open Space Subdivision on Approximately 19.23 Acres, at 1405 W 3200 S for first reading. Councilmember Erin Mann seconded the motion.

Councilmember Garrett Mansell moved to amend the main motion to approve Ordinance 25-27—Development Agreement for The Fields at Nibley, a 70-Lot Open Space Subdivision on Approximately 19.23 Acres, at 1405 W 3200 S for first reading with a condition that the developer cover the cost of addressing the deficiencies identified in the Cartwright Engineers structural assessment and bringing the structures into compliance with current building code. Councilmember Norman Larsen seconded the amendment to the motion.

Councilmember Garrett Mansell talked about his desire to lessen the financial burden on the City when accepting dedicated open space and existing structures.

Mr. Joshua Low, the applicant, of 201 S MAIN ST STE 800 SALT LAKE CITY UTAH 84111, discussed his desire to open a dialog with the Council about the structural deficiencies identified by the Cartwright Engineers. Mayor Larry Jacobsen also wanted to discuss the proposed use of the open space more during the second reading of the ordinance.

City Engineer Tom Dickinson talked about working with the City Building Official Austen Powell to identify specific costs for plumbing and electrical upgrades to the existing structures between first and second reading of the ordinance.

The Council discussed working on specific verbiage and amendments to the Development Agreement between the first and second reading of the ordinance.

Councilmember Kay Sweeten made a substitute motion to approve Ordinance 25-27—Development Agreement for The Fields at Nibley, a 70-Lot Open Space Subdivision on Approximately 19.23 Acres, at 1405 W 3200 S for first reading. Councilmember Erin Mann seconded the substitute motion.

Councilmember Norman Larsen also talked about addressing dust mitigation measures and parking for the dedicated open space within the proposed subdivision. City Engineer Tom Dickinson provided clarification.

Councilmember Erin Mann asked about the requirement for the developer to install curb and gutter along the roadways in the development.

Seeing no further discussion, Mayor Larry Jacobsen called for a vote.

City Manager Justin Maughan provided background information concerning the proposed water revenue bond for culinary water system improvements and water impact fees on the adopted Consolidated Fee Schedule. City Attorney Eric Johnson provided further details concerning the water revenue bond.

Mayor Larry Jacobsen opened the public hearing at 9:56 PM.

City Planner Levi Roberts reviewed the municipal boundary adjustment document and provided background information to the Council.
