There will be two tents, a kick-off for collection of Centerville Women histories and stories circa 1847 to 1947, pioneer crafts for the children. One of the women featured will be Vivian Myrtle Butler Evans, a nurse who was in France during Word War I, and Evelyn Engen, whose husband was Alf Engen who started the Alta Ski Resort and ski school, and played a large role in making Utah a ski state. Both women called Centerville home.
