## Certificate of Historic Appropriateness: Replace Window & Repaint at 549 25<sup>th</sup> St

Mr. Hansen stated in his report the applicable standards are described in Section 17-4-1 of the Landmarks Ordinance to be considered, which include standards B. Character and F. Repair. He included staff analysis, findings of fact, possible commission findings and actions and Landmark Staff's recommended action. The applicant will retain the wood trim around the window to maintain visual consistency and historic character.

Staff recommends the to replace one aluminum window on the front of the building with an operable Anderson 100 Series window and to paint the siding and trim on the rear addition a historically appropriate color at 549 25th Street meets the criteria found in OMC 17-4 and approve the request subject to the conditions laid out in the report.

The following items were also discussed: Window replacement and color scheme Concerns about visibility of interior frames Flexibility on paint colors and trim work

Mr. Mike Vowles, applicant, responded to questions from the commission.

COMMISSIONER WILKERSON MOVED TO GRANT A CERTIFICATE OF HISTORIC APPROPRIATENESS TO REPLACE WINDOWS & REPAINT AT 549 25<sup>TH</sup> ST PER THE FINDINGS OF FACT AS LISTED INCLUDING THE REQUIREMENTS FROM PLANNING: 1) THAT THE REPLACEMENT WINDOW BE A BE CASEMENT WINDOW, CREATING AS LITTLE VISUAL CHANGE AS POSSIBLE BETWEEN THE CURRENT WINDOWS AND THE NEW WINDOW; 2) THAT THE NEW WINDOW HAVE A SASH COLOR THAT WILL MATCH THE OTHER WINDOWS ON THE BUILDING; 3) THAT AN APPROPRIATE SIZED WINDOW IS INSTALLED, KEEPING THE WINDOW OPENINGS CONSISTENT; 4) THAT THE WOOD TRIM AROUND THE WINDOW IS PRESERVED. AND THE FINAL PAINT SCHEME BE RUN BY STAFF SO THERE IS A RECORD OF IT. COMMISSIONER SHALE SECONDED, AND THE MOTION PASSED UNANIMOUSLY WITH ALL VOTING AYE BY ROLL CALL VOTE: CHAIR LANGSDON, VICE CHAIR SHALE, COMMISSIONER WILKERSON, COMMISSIONER CREEGER, COMMISSIONER PANTONE.

## 5. Marilyn Drive National Historic District Nomination

Mr. Hansen provided an overview of the Marlyn Drive Historic District Nomination for the National Register. This nomination is the first historic district listed on the National Register since 2005. The district features a map outlining boundaries and the overwhelming percentage of contributing buildings within it. The district includes subdivisions like Oak Crest Park Addition, Maule Addition, Highland Addition, and Denver Place Addition.

COMMISSIONER WILKERSON MOVED TO APPROVE AND RECOMMEND THE MARILYN DRIVE NATIONAL HISTORIC REGISTER DISTRICT NOMINATION.

COMMISSIONER SHALE SECONDED, AND THE MOTION PASSED UNANIMOUSLY WITH ALL VOTING AYE BY ROLL CALL VOTE: CHAIR LANGSDON, VICE CHAIR SHALE, COMMISSIONER WILKERSON, COMMISSIONER CREEGER, COMMISSIONER PANTONE.

Commissioner Wilkerson mentioned the need to act on the Exchange Building or 2508 Van Buren.

Chair Langsdon and other commissioners discussed the need for grant money to save buildings. Mr. Hansen brought up an architectural historian for the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints announced an open house at 740 21 st for the Historic LDS church for the deaf.

The open house will be held from 4pm to 8pm on August 1st showcasing the restored Prairie School style building.
