UAMPS (Utah Associated Municipal Power Systems):

- Full-service interlocal agency
- 49 Members: CA, NV,
 ID, WY, NM, AZ, UT
- Some larger members:
 Lehi, Logan, St. George,
 Springville (1985),
 Murray
- 16 projects
- Peak 2024 systemMW=1,243





Significant Changes to UAMPS Operations:

The California Independent System Operator (CAISO) Extended Day-Ahead Market (EDAM) and Southwest Power Pool (SPP) Markets + introduced tariffs with Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC). CAISO EDAM has received FERC approval and PacifiCorp is moving forward with entry by May 2026 with other utilities also announcing planned participation. Because UAMPS is embedded within the PacifiCorp Balancing Area Authority (BAA), UAMPS is obligated to meet the new EDAM requirements per the PacifiCorp EDAM Tariff. There will be significant operational changes within UAMPS to meet this obligation.



Significant Changes to UAMPS Operations:

SUVPS (Southern Utah Valley Power Systems):

- Interlocal agency
- Springville, Spanish Fork,
 Payson, Salem, SESD
- Nonprofit, focused on reliable electricity transport to/through member cities
- Springville represents 1/3 of the organization
- Approximately monthly bill:\$1.4 MM





SUVPS Updates:

- \$50 MM bond issuance in 2025
- 1600 S + Dry Creek substation
- Upgrade of transmission line through Spanish Fork, creates redundancy (a bypass)
- True-up completed 2025
