R432. Health and Human Services, Health Care Facility Licensing.

R432-103. Specialty [Hospital] Facility - Rehabilitation.

R432-103-1. Authority and Purpose.

This rule is adopted pursuant to Title 26, Chapter 21, Health Care Facility Licensing and Inspection Act.

#### R432-103-2. Purpose.

(1) Section 26B-2-202 authorizes this rule.

(2) The purpose of this rule is to promote public health and welfare through the establishment and enforcement of program standards for the operation of rehabilitation hospitals.

### <del>[R432-103-2. Compliance.</del>

Any facility licensee governed by this rule [shall]must be [in full compliance at the time of licensure]fully compliant with this rule to receive a license.]

# R432-103-[4]2. Definitions.

[(1)-]Terms used in this rule are defined in [Section]Rules R432-1[-3-] and R380-600. Additionally:

[(2)](1) "Specialty [Hospital" is]hospital" means the same as defined in Subsection R432-101-4([2]13).

### R432-103-[5]3. Licensure.

In accordance with Rule [R432-2]R380-600, a license is required for the operation of a rehabilitation hospital.

### R432-103-[6]4. General Construction[-Rules].

Any facility subject to th[e]is rule shall comply with the requirements related to the physical construction of a facility in Rule R432-9.

# R432-103-[7]5. Organization and Staff.

- (1)(a) The [lieensee]facility shall ensure [that]the hospital is staffed, organized, and operated to coordinate any services offered.
- ([a]b) A <u>facility shall ensure a</u> trained rehabilitation counselor or other licensed [health care]healthcare professional with board-approved training or experience [shall be]is responsible for the overall administrative direction of the hospital.
- [ (b) A] (c) As permitted by law and hospital policy, a trained rehabilitation counselor or other professionally licensed staff member [ as permitted by law and hospital policy, ] shall serve as the primary therapist.
- ([e]d) The [ $\frac{1}{1}$  The [ $\frac{1}{1}$  shall ensure that there is [ $\frac{1}{1}$ ] a multi-disciplinary team responsible for program and treatment services that includes a:
  - (i) physician[;];
  - (ii) registered nurse[;]; and
  - (ii) rehabilitation counselor.[-to be responsible for program and treatment services.]
- (2) The licensee shall develop policies and procedures that are approved by the board and reviewed annually that address[-at-least the following]:
  - (a) [staff and their responsibilities] patient assessment;
  - (b) program services;
  - (c) [patient assessment]staff and their responsibilities; and
  - (d) treatment and discharge.
- (3)(a) The [licensee] facility shall organize, staff, and support the hospital's rehabilitation services [of the hospital according to the nature, scope, and extent of the services provided.
- (b) The facility shall ensure that [E]each professional staff member is [shall be] licensed, registered[s], or certified by the Utah Department of Commerce for their respective disciplines.
- (4) The governing body shall appoint a licensed physician, who is a member of the medical staff, as the individual to be responsible for the medical direction of the rehabilitation care and services of the hospital.

### R432-103-[9]7. Rehabilitation Services.

- (1) The [lieensee] facility shall ensure that a qualified physician on the medical staff who is knowledgeable, experienced, and trained in rehabilitative medicine [the delivery of ]provides physical rehabilitation services. [is provided by a qualified physician on the medical staff who is knowledgeable, experienced, and trained in rehabilitative medicine.]
- (2) [Qualified] The facility shall provide qualified, competent professional, and support personnel [shall be provided by the licensee and] who are available to meet the objectives of the service and the needs of the patients.
  - (3) The [licensee] facility shall ensure that:
- [ (a) a qualified professional for providing physical rehabilitation services completes a functional assessment and evaluation for each patient;
- (b) (a) a treatment plan is developed based on an evaluation that includes an assessment of functional ability appropriate to the patient;
- (c) measurable functional or behavioral goals are established for the patient, and include time frames for achievement;
  - (d) (b) patient progress and response to treatment is documented in the medical record;
- (c) patient progress and the results of treatment is assessed at least monthly for outpatients and at least every two weeks for inpatients; [-and]
- (c) patient progress and response to treatment is documented in the medical record.
- (d) there are measurable functional or behavioral goals established for each patient that include time frames for achievement; and
- (e) there is a qualified professional for providing physical rehabilitation services who completes a functional assessment and evaluation for each patient.

### R432-103-[<del>10</del>]8. Occupational Therapy.

- (1) The licensee shall ensure that occupational therapy services include the assessment and treatment of occupational performance to include:
  - (a) educational skills:
  - (b) independent living skills;
- (b) prevocational or work skills;
- (c) <del>[educational skills;</del>
  - (d) leisure abilities; and
  - (d) prevocational skills;
    - (e) social skills; and
  - (f) work skills.
- (2) The [lieensee] facility shall ensure that occupational therapy services include the assessment and treatment of performance components, to include:
  - (a) [neuromuseular;
  - (b) sensori-integrative;
    - (c) cognitive;
  - (d) psychosocial skills:
    - (e) any therapeutic interventions, adaptations, and prevention; and
    - ([f]b) cognitive skills:
- (c) individualized evaluations of past and [eu]pr[+]esent performance, based on observations of individual or group tasks, standardized tests, record review, interviews, or activity histories[-]:
  - (d) neuromuscular skills;
  - (e) psychosocial skills; and
  - (f) sensori-integrative skills.
- (3) The [lieensee] facility shall ensure that staff who provide occupational therapy services document and monitor [the extent to which] patient goals[-are met] regarding assessing and increasing patient functional abilities in daily living and preventing further disability.

## R432-103-[11]9. Clinical Services.

- (1) The [licensee] facility shall [have the ability to-] provide emergency first aid treatment to [patients] each patient, staff[, visitors] member, visitor, and [to people] a person who may be unaware of or unable to [immediately-] reach services in other facilities immediately.
  - (2) The [licensee] facility shall provide:
  - (a) a [treatment room]communication hookun;
  - (b) [storage for supplies and equipment;
- (c) provisions for reception and control of patients;
- (d) a convenient patient toilet room;
- (e) communication hookup; and
- (1
  - (c) a treatment room;
- <u>(d)</u> access to a poison control center[:];
  - (e) provisions for reception and control of patients; and
  - (f) storage for supplies and equipment.
- (3) The licensee shall comply with [appropriate]applicable sections of Rule R432-100 if providing any additional or expanded emergency services.
  - (4) The licensee shall provide protocols for contacting local emergency medical services.

### R432-103-[14]12. Penalties.

Any person who violates this rule may be subject to the penalties [enumerated in Sections 26-21-11] in Rule R380-600 and [R432-3-6] Title 26B, Chapter 2, Part 7, Penalties and [be charged with violation of a class A misdemeanor as authorized in Section 26-21-16] Investigations.
