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- a. Discussion and Possible Action – Proposal to Close City Hall for ½ Day on Fridays-
Natalie Crosby

The council discussed the potential benefits of closing City Hall early on Fridays. Natalie Crosby noted that many surrounding cities, as well as the county, currently operate with reduced Friday hours. The council expressed support for implementing the change, provided City Hall remains open until 1:00 p.m. on Fridays and the new schedule does not take effect until September. Under the revised hours, City Hall will be open Monday through Thursday from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., and Fridays from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m.

9. Public Participation

Members of the public may address the City Council on matters not listed on the agenda. Those interested should sign up on the form just inside the council room door prior to the start of the meeting. Participation is limited to three minutes. Each participant will be allowed to address the Council and may submit documents outlining their issue. The Council cannot take legal action on public comment at this time. At the conclusion of each comment, the Council will have time to respond to criticism made by those who have addressed them, may ask staff to review a matter or may ask that a matter be placed on a future agenda. All City Council meetings are recorded.

Shane Ward provided an update regarding the recent power outage caused by Rocky Mountain Power. He reported that Unit 4 is back in operation; however, the gearbox, which was recently returned, is leaking oil. To reduce costs, he suggested repairing the gearbox on-site rather than shipping it out. He also discussed the quote for repairs to Unit 1, noting that it will be a more extensive and involved project.

Casey Larsen reported that he is unable to meet grade requirements on the sewer line. He turned in his Outside of City Limits Water Connection Application. This matter will be placed on the agenda for the next council meeting for a formal vote.

10. Council Reports:

Paul C. Madsen

- Inquired about the timeline for hydroseeding the park.
- Discussed the location of the conduit for the Power Department at the park.
- **Colter Allen** stated he would like to seed the park in mid-September.
- Colter will obtain bids for the hydroseeding work.



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Russell G. Keisel

- There was a Veterans Memorial fundraiser was held at Skyline Mountain Golf Course.
- Plans are underway to meet and organize a concert at the Contoy Arena as an additional fundraiser.
- The goal is to have the memorial completed in time for the 250-year celebration on July 4th next year.

Rondy G. Black

- Reported that the draft for Transportation Plan has been completed.
- Feedback and reviews are expected to take approximately two weeks, after which the final draft will be completed and submitted for grant funding.
- The goal is to begin the projects next spring.

11. Mayor Report

- The high school has requested permission to water one additional day to meet their concussion protocol. Mayor did not see an issue, especially with the new well coming online. Colter Allen stated that he would like to see the school use less water on the school field by the elementary.
- Debbie James discussed some of the events she will be having that will require road closures. These events include a 3-on-3 basketball tournament, a truck or treat and another event that will be held at the pool in October. None of the council opposed.
- Shane Ward also added that congressmen Owens is coming to town and asked if anyone wanted to sign up to be a part of that. It will be on the 25th at 1:00 pm in Fairview at the City Hall.
